SIX-FURLONG PRIORESS SHOULD SUIT 'LADY'

Given some time off after a disappointing showing in the May 5 GI Kentucky Oaks, **Diplomat Lady** (Forestry) looks to get back to winning ways in Saturday's six-furlong GI Prioress Breeders' Cup S. at Belmont. The dark bay has been made the 122-pound highweight for the race and will spot eight other rivals from two to six pounds. The drop back in distance--from the Oaks' nine furlongs--may be just what the doctor ordered for the three-year-old filly, who has been lackluster in three routes this season despite showing versatility at two when she won the 1 1/16-mile GI Hollywood Starlet S. "We've gotten her back into the six-furlong mindset with her training and have put more speed into her," confirmed her trainer, Christopher Paasch. Diplomat Lady began 2006 with well-beaten efforts in the one-mile GI Las Virgenes S. and nine-furlong GI Santa Anita Oaks. Returned to sprinting in her next, she captured the GII Stonerside Beaumont S. at Keeneland in mid-April, but trailed home 13th, beaten 28 1/4 lengths, in the 1 1/8-mile Oaks. Paasch gave her a brief vacation after that at his Hollywood Park base. UNITED NATIONS MAY BE CANCELLED

With no end in sight to the budget impasse that has shut down state government in New Jersey, Monmouth Park is expected to be closed today and Saturday's GI United Nations H. may be cancelled. Dennis Dowd, the senior vice president of racing for the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, which operates Monmouth and the Meadowlands, said yesterday that it is highly unlikely that Monmouth will be allowed to reopen as long as the state government remains shut down. Tracks are not allowed to operate without employees of the New Jersey State Racing Commission present. Those employees include stewards and state veterinarians. Declared "nonessential" state employees, they currently are not allowed to work. Yesterday was a regularly scheduled dark day at Monmouth, but simulcasting was cancelled. Its neighbor to the north, the Meadowlands, cancelled its harness racing card. The Atlantic City casinos have been shut down, as has the New Jersey state lottery. For now, the racing office will continue to take entries, but Dowd said if the dispute stretches on, that office will be shut. "We may have to cancel the U.N. this year," Dowd said of the \$750,000 race, one of two Grade I events run in the state. "Horses who are pointing for a race of that caliber will find somewhere else to race. It's not a good thing." The NJSEA is obligated to conduct 120 days of Thoroughbred racing each year. Dowd said those dates will be made up, even if they have to be held some time in the fall.

MASTER GOLFER (Mr. Greeley) debuts in the colors of Ryder Cup Racing, a syndicate managed by Ian Woosnam, captain of the European Ryder Cup team who made the serious investment of €190,000 for this colt at the Goffs Orby Million Sale in September. His granddam is the high-class runner and prolific stakes producer Regal Gal and Barry Hills has been entrusted with the task of getting him to his ultimate goal, the inaugural Goffs Million.



SOUMILLON ON BOARD Christophe Soumillon has been named as the latest jockey to partner Lord Derby's **Ouija Board (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) in Saturday's G1 Coral-Eclipse S. at Sandown. With previous partners Frankie Dettori, Kieren Fallon, Jamie Spencer and Olivier Peslier already on duty, Ouija Board will now be paired with France's reigning champion jockey for the 10-furlong contest. Soumillon had bested the five-year-old aboard Shirocco (Ger) in Epsom's G1 Coronation Cup, before her success under Peslier in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. Trainer Ed Dunlop explained the decision to the *Racing Post*. "Olivier Peslier has engagements for the Wertheimers, but I heard that Mr. Soumillon is available, so we have booked him," he told the *Post*. "Ouija Board seems very versatile and I am sure Mr. Soumillon will get on with her. He is not only a world-class rider, but he has had the benefit of having ridden against her, just like Olivier Peslier."

QUINN QUILTS Jockey Richard Quinn has announced his retirement from the saddle, ending a career spanning 27 years. The 44-year-old, who rode three domestic Classic winners and had spells with Paul Cole and Henry Cecil, had not been seen in public since receiving a suspension when riding his final winner on Young Mick (GB) in the Duke of Edinburgh S. at Royal Ascot. "I've been thinking about it for some time and when you're thinking that way, it's time to get out," Quinn said yesterday. "I thought about it last year, but with the news that Ascot was redeveloping, I thought it was a new challenge. However, it seems I've exhausted my opportunities and you get to a time in life when it's time to move on to pastures new. I couldn't have scripted it better with Young Mick winning at such a wonderful place." Quinn, who rode his first winner at Kempton in 1981, accumulated over 2000 successes and won the 2000 G1 Epsom Oaks with Love Divine (GB) and two renewals of the G1 St Leger, aboard Snurge (GB) in 1990 and Millenary (GB) in 2000. He also captured the 1992 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches aboard Culture Vulture, 1990 G1 Irish Oaks with Knight's Baroness (GB), two G1 Irish St Legers courtesy of Strategic Choice in 1995 and Ibn Bey (GB) in 1990 and a G1 Prix Royal-Oak with Assessor (Ire) in 1992. Quinn enjoyed the majority of his success with Paul Cole in the 1990s before moving on to Warren Place at the turn of the century. "I rode my first winner for Paul Cole and many after and I will always be grateful for that," the reflective former champion apprentice said. "There have been so many highlights and it's been a wonderful way of life. Henry [Cecil] was and still is a gentleman to have anything to do with and it was unfortunate for all of us that it didn't work out as we hoped." Cole added his own tribute yesterday. "When we were together, everything was so exciting and we had a fantastic time together," he commented. "He was very good and battled through criticism and came through it to become one of our top jockeys. He was top-class and a horseman as well as a jockey." Quinn revealed that he is to take up show jumping as his next career. "It's a new challenge and, if I can get to the same level of success as I did in racing, it will be a real buzz."

'DIVA' INDUCTED TO AUSSIE HALL OF FAME

Top racemare **Makybe Diva (GB)** (Desert King {Ire}), three-time winner of the G1 Melbourne Cup and the all-time leading earner in Australia, was inducted into that country's Hall of Fame during a ceremony at the Crown Palladium in Melbourne Tuesday night. Following a third consecutive win in last November's Melbourne Cup that solidified her status as one of Australia's favorite equine daughters, the six-year-old mare was retired with seven Group 1 victories to her credit and earnings of over A\$14.5 million. "What a mighty mare!" her owner, Tony Santic, exclaimed to *Thoroughbred Village*. "This is a tremendous honour in its own right. She's achieved what no other horse has done before and whether it be this year, next year, or the year after, we had always hoped she would gain her place in racing's Hall of Fame. 'Mum' thoroughly deserves it."
