JUNIOR HEADS ECLIPSE NINE

Roldvale Ltd's **David Junior** (Pleasant Tap) will take on eight rivals in tomorrow's G1 Coral-Eclipse S. at Sandown, with connections announcing the purchase of Royal Alchemist (GB) (Kingsinger {Ire}) to help his cause. Lack of a strong early pace was blamed for his fourth behind Lord Derby's Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot June 21 and Roldvale's David Sullivan has stepped in to secure the front-running Royal Alchemist, who was third in the G2 Windsor Forest S, at the Royal meeting on the same afternoon. Trainer Brian Meehan believes the filly, who was formerly trained by Mark Usher, warrants her place in the line-up and played down suggestions that David Junior needs a fast pace. "She's a very nice filly with excellent form in her own right," he said yesterday. "She deserves her chance in the race and, if it works out that the pace suits David Junior, so be it, but I don't particularly think it's a concern for him." Meehan described himself as "confident" that the G1 Champion S, and G1 Dubai Duty Free scorer would prove up to the rematch with Ouija Board. "He's done his last piece of work this morning and he's very well," he continued. "He's in very good shape and everything's fine and he goes there ground-permitting. There is a lot of rain around and, if it was to turn heavy--which I can't see--he will turn up. He's fit and ready, as we've just kept him ticking over since Ascot. There are a lot of ways to look at that race--maybe it was just the way the race panned out off a lean pace which didn't quite suit [him] and he got a bit tightened up, but it was still a good run. Ouija Board is an exceptional filly and a legend, so there was no disgrace in that. We'll take her on again and I think we've got a good chance of reversing the form. This is what the game's all about--we're not going to run and hide, just because he got beaten." Aidan O'Brien yesterday scratched three of his four entries, including Ace (Ire) (Danehill), leaving Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Faisal Salman's May 14 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) winner Aussie Rules (Danehill) as the sole representative. Connections are waiting on this morning's decision by the Horseracing Regulatory Authority as to whether Kieren Fallon will have the suspension on his licence lifted. Field, p.3

NEW JERSEY BUDGET WOES SOLVED An agreement on the New Jersey state budget has finally been reached, but it is uncertain whether Monmouth Park

will be back in business today or if they will have to wait until tomorrow. Bob Kulina, the vice president and general manager of Monmouth, was waiting yesterday afternoon to get the OK to resume racing. "It looks like the budget problems have been solved,

but as far as when we will be back up and running, I'm not sure," Kulina said. "All the parties are in agreement, but we still don't have a clear-cut word on when we can race again. Until the budget is signed, the executive order shutting down all non-essential services will not be lifted. Until they finalize the agreement, we can't get back to work." He added, "I feel real good about Saturday's card. I don't think that will be an issue, and the United Nations will go on as expected. Friday's card is more problematic. We are trying to get a decision on that now, but, to be honest, it's still up in the air. We are still waiting to see if we can go back to work [today]." Monmouth drew a 10-race card for Saturday, highlighted by the GI United Nations S. The \$750,000 event has attracted an elite seven-horse field, including Grade I winners Cacique (Ire), English Channel, Relaxed Gesture (Ire) and Better Talk Now, who won the race last year. Trainer Dallas Stewart, stabled at Churchill, gambled that Monmouth would be back in operation this weekend and put his U.N. candidate, '05 runner-up Silverfoot, on a plane yesterday. "It's a screwy situation," Stewart said. "But if we're not there, we can't run. It's a great race and my horse loves the distance. This is a step up for him--it shapes up as a tough race this year--but he is doing well, so we are willing to take a shot." Field, p3

INTERCONTINENTAL RETAINS PALOMAR WIN

Southern California Stewards issued a unanimous decision Wednesday stating that **Intercontinental (GB)** (Danehill), winner of the Sept. 3 GII Palomar Breeders'

Cup H. at Del Mar, will retain her title in that race. It was concluded that Juddmonte's filly "did not gain an unfair advantage when [she] raced with a late treatment of prerace bleeder medication." Stewards Darrel McHargue, Albert Christiansen and Martin Hamilton conducted a hearing June 5 to address protests

filed by Jim Cassidy, trainer of third-place finisher Ticker Tape (GB); Valerie Naify, co-owner of runner-up Amorama (Fr); and Jim Ford, who co-owns Palomar fourth-place getter Katdogawn (GB). The plaintiffs sought to have the eventual champion disqualified and the purse money redistributed after they learned the filly had received furosemide 20 minutes closer to the race than is allowed by the California Horse Racing Board rules and policy. In an 11-page statement, stewards ruled that the furosemide administered was a "legal pre-race day medication," and the contention that the late administration of the authorized medication prodvided an edge to Intercontinental was found to be "unsupported by any evidence, scientific or otherwise."

PROCLAMATION TO MISS SUSSEX DATE

Godolphin have put the brakes on the four-year-old campaign of **Proclamation (Ire)** (King's Best) and revealed yesterday that he will not defend his crown in the Aug. 2 G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood. Only third in the June 20 G1 Queen Anne S. on his debut for new connections at Royal Ascot, he will now be prepared for the second half of the racing year. "We were not happy with Proclamation's action after the Queen Anne and we will look for other options for him later in the season," Racing Manager Simon Crisford said.

According to Gilchrist, the four-year-old will gallop at Calder next week. Joey P. (Close Up) is also slated to make his next start in the Smile; jockey Joe Bravo will make the trip down from Monmouth Park to ride the four-year-old for trainer Ben Perkins Jr. According to Perkins, the New Jersey-bred, who is owned by John Petrini, will arrive at the Miami oval the day before the race. The colt turned in a solid five-furlong work at Monmouth Sunday, going in 1:00 2/5. He has recorded wins in nine of 12 lifetime starts, including last year's GIII Jersey Shore Breeders' Cup S. "He's a naturally fast horse, but doesn't need the lead," said Perkins. "He's probably best just sitting off a fast pace."


