#### **BACK IN ACTION?**

After two days of cancellations due to New Jersey budget woes, racing at Monmouth Park is likely to return to action today just in time for the GI United

Nations S. The Jersey Shore's premier turf event has attracted a stellar field, which includes last year's winner Better Talk Now (Talkin Man). The 2004 GI Breeders' Cup Turf hero came flying to win Belmont's GI Man O' War S. Sept. 10, but closed out the season with a seventh-place effort in the Breeders' Cup Turf Oct. 29 and a 12th-place finish

in the G1 Japan Cup Nov. 27. He resurfaced in the GII Dixie S. on the Preakness undercard and didn't disappoint, rallying to a head victory over Dreadnaught and Artie Schiller last out. "Better Talk Now might even be better this year than he was last," said trainer Graham Motion. "He's learned to relax a little bit better and that should only help in this race and other races coming up." Standing in the reigning champ's way are the June 10 GI Manhattan H. first, second and fourth-place finishers: Cacique (Ire) (Danehill), Relaxed Gesture (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) and English Channel (Smart Strike). Cacique, out of the blue-hen mare Hasili (Ire), earned his first victory at the highest level in the Manhattan while making his third start in the U.S. He was a multiple graded-stakes winner in France prior to moving to Bobby Frankel's barn. "Even if he gets beat, it won't hurt him for the [GI] Arlington Million [Aug. 12]," Frankel told Daily Racing Form.

#### CAN 'LAVA' STRIKE GOLD TWICE?

Lava Man (Slew City Slew) looks to run his 2006 record to a perfect five-for-five while defending his title in today's GI Hollywood Gold Cup. The five-year-old gelding stormed to an 8 3/4-length Gold Cup triumph over Borrego last year, but had to settle for third behind that rival in the GI Pacific Classic. Well beaten in both the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup and the G1 Japan Cup Dirt to end the season, he rebounded on his home turf, winning the Jan. 28 Sunshine Millions Classic and Mar. 4 GI Santa Anita H. The dark bay switched to the grass to add victories in the Apr. 30 Khaled S. and June 10 GI Charlie Whittingham H., but showed he could still handle the main track when working six furlongs in a bullet 1:11 4/5 June 30. "He's doing awesome," trainer Doug O'Neill said. "I think the grass races kind of helped freshen him up. His training has been as good as it has been going into the last few races and we are expecting a really big effort. Knock on wood, I can't recall him ever being better. Hopefully we are saying that after Saturday."

Ouija Board's illustrious career has been well-documented and, despite a summer-long low caused by injury last year, she has maintained a level of consistency in no less than seven different countries. Already a four-time Group 1 winner, the five-year-old added the Prince of Wales's to her formidable tally despite the presence of Electrocutionist, Manduro (Ger) and David Junior. Trainer Ed Dunlop is convinced she is ready to take on the boys again. "Touch wood, so far, there have been no hiccups going into the race," Dunlop said. Sir Michael Stoute, who has won this four times since 1993, saddles a duo in Khalid Abdullah's Notable Guest and Anthony and David de Rothschild's Notnowcato. While the former has to improve on his fifth behind Shirocco (Ger) and Ouija Board in the June 2 G1 Coronation Cup, Notnowcato has the progressive profile of his trainer's past winners. Successful in the Apr. 19 G3 Earl of Sefton S. at Newmarket and G3 Brigadier Gerard S. over course and distance May 30, he was beaten only two lengths when fifth in the Prince of Wales's last time. Aidan O'Brien is chasing his fourth renewal since 2000 with G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains winner Aussie Rules. The three-year-old bids to join an elite list comprised of Giant's Causeway, Hawk Wing and Oratorio (Ire). Following his Longchamp Classic score May 14, he floundered when only seventh in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club June 4. Blue Monday would emulate the 1995 hero Halling if he can annex this contest a year after taking the Cambridgeshire H. at Newmarket. He has made strides this term, beating subsequent G2 Hardwicke S. runner-up Mountain High (Ire) by three lengths in the Listed Festival S. at Goodwood May 26 before following up in the June 15 G3 la Coupe at Longchamp. Fourth as highweight in the Listed Wolferton H. at Royal Ascot on his latest outing June 23, he has been supplemented for his biggest test here. Clive Brittain, well-known for orchestrating the career of Pebbles, relies on Hattan, whose dam is a half to the recently deceased Warrsan (Ire), runner-up in this two years ago. He has to improve on his fourth in the June 18 G1 Gran Premio di Milano to figure. Previews cont.

FALLON BARRED UNTIL TRIAL Six-time champion jockey Kieren Fallon, as well as fellow riders Fergal Lynch and Darren Williams, learned yesterday that their expired licences will not be renewed due to pending charges that they committed conspiracy to defraud Betfair customers. The judgement came at a special hearing of the Horseracing Regulatory Authority at their London headquarters. While Lynch and Williams will not be allowed to ride anywhere until the results of next year's trial are known, Fallon has been cleared to compete in Ireland during that period. The latest twist in the corruption saga sent shockwaves throughout the racing community yesterday, as trainer Alan Berry was licensed by the HRA Tuesday, despite being charged with the same offense. "We merely observe that, after extensive investigations and after receiving powerful representation on behalf of Kieren Fallon, the CPS special crime division has decided to prefer the charge of conspiracy against him as we have described," HRA Board Director Sir Michael Connell explained. "We further observe that this is a substantially different case to that of Alan Berry, who is charged in connection with only one race." For Fallon, the ruling was a major blow to his commitments to Ballydoyle and Coolmore, starting with the ride on Aussie Rules in today's G1 Coral-Eclipse S. at Sandown. "I am obviously devastated by the HRA decision," Fallon said in a statement. "I always thought that a man was innocent until proved guilty. I cannot understand this decision as I am confident that I have done nothing wrong, and my lawyers are confident that the case against me has no validity whatsoever. In fact, I am utterly amazed the police were able to charge me based on the evidence I have seen and the questions that they have been asking me this year. My livelihood is dependent upon racing and I will be appealing against this decision, as it is extremely harsh and inconsistent given the HRA panel's verdict on Alan Berry published earlier this week." John Blake, chief executive of the Jockeys' Association, reacted to the measures vesterday by pledging support to the trio's planned appeals. "Public perception and confidence in our sport is absolutely vital and all licenced people have a responsibility to that, but it's obviously a question of balancing the prejudice to the individuals' careers and whether it's prejudicial to the sport's reputation to be able to carry on," Blake said. "We were very hopeful they would be able to pursue their careers, but that is not the case."







## Barbaro Update

#### BARBARO RECEIVES THIRD CAST

On Wednesday, July 5, Dr. Dean Richardson, chief of surgery, replaced the cast on Barbaro that he had received Monday, July 3.

"Barbaro was not comfortable with the second cast, so we decided it would be best to replace it sooner rather than later," said Dr. Richardson. "His appetite is healthy, and we are continuing to monitor him closely for an elevated temperature or other signs of discomfort."

New Bolton Center continues to receive requests for additional information on Barbaro's condition. Below are some of the most recent questions asked with responses from his medical team.

#### Q. Why was Barbaro's cast changed again?

A. For several days before the second cast change, Barbaro showed a slight elevation in body temperature and his hind legs appeared uncomfortable, which led to Dr. Dean Richardson's decision to reassess the leg and then change the cast. He was still not as comfortable as he had been so a new cast was applied on Wednesday.

## Q. Why were two screws replaced and three new ones added?

A. Two previously implanted screws that cross the pastern joint were bent, so Dr. Richardson, who had predicted that bent screws in that area were likely, replaced them and added three new screws for additional support. Barbaro has been very active on his cast, and the repairs were needed as a result of force and motion in the affected area. The screws are bridging the pastern joint. They are not part of the repair of the primary fractures. The pastern joint needed to be fused because the proximal phalanx (long pastern bone) was so badly broken that the middle phalanx (short pastern bone) was needed to anchor the distal (lowest) part of the plate.

## Q. What do the radiographs show about how well Barbaro is healing?

A. Barbaro's new radiographs show excellent progressive bone healing, a very positive sign.

#### Q. Were the repairs considered major surgery?

A. Barbaro was put under general anesthesia for the procedure. The repairs themselves were made under fluoroscopic control, which gives surgeons a live-X-ray view of the patient. This means that small one-centimeter incisions were made rather than any large incision.

#### Q. Did Barbaro have an abscess on his foot?

A. During the examination, doctors found a small infection on the sole of Barbaro's uninjured left hind hoof near the frog, a V-shaped cushiony growth that helps absorb shock. Dr. Richardson is treating the infection topically; in addition, Barbaro is on systemic antibiotics, which is common post-surgical practice. He also has a new protective shoe.

## Q. What is laminitis and what are you doing to prevent it in Barbaro?

A. Laminitis is a painful condition in horses that can be the result of a number of causes, including excessive weight bearing in one limb. It occurs when laminae, the strong connecting tissues that attach the pedal bone and the inner hoof wall, are inflamed. Laminitis is very serious and can result in severe consequences. To reduce this risk, we applied a supportive shoe to Barbaro's left hind foot immediately following the surgery for the fracture of his right hind leg.

#### Q. How long will Barbaro have to stay in a cast?

A. Barbaro will remain in a cast until we believe that the fracture and joint fusions have developed adequate strength.

#### Q. How long will Barbaro remain in Intensive Care?

A. Barbaro will remain in the Intensive Care Unit at the George D. Widener Hospital as long as necessary. Even though he is progressing well and has not had major complications, he is not out of danger. Even if things progressed perfectly from this point forward, it is likely that he would be here two more months.

Over the last five years, we have seen where the NTRA and Breeders' Cup can be most effective. We are now entering a new era. Breeders' Cup purses have been increased to \$20 million. We have a new network television relationship that will deliver more national and international promotion of the sport than ever before. We continue to attract new sponsors and marketing partners, and our ability to shape public policy to the benefit of our members has never been stronger."

Was a nice three-year-old with a late developing pedigree (see sire profile) when he was claimed by owner Steve Kenly using Thoro-Graph data. Trainer Doug O'Neill immediately moved the gelding up, and he went from strength to strength, eventually winning the Gold Cup with an enormous figure, before tailing off badly last fall. He signaled a return to form with a nice forward move in the Sunshine Millions, then returned to his best in the Big Cap, in a huge effort that was much better than it looked. He spotted seven pounds and many lengths of ground loss to the second-place finisher. His last two have been on the grass, and while not quite as good, enough to make him the best grass horse in the country. But Lava Man will have his work cut out for him here. For starters, he once again spots serious weight--five pounds is worth one point on the Thoro-Graph scale and equates to two lengths at this distance. Lava Man will spot at least that to all the others. Second of all, he will have spent 24 hours in the detention barn, which may or may not be a factor. But most importantly, other than the two isolated huge figures, none of the other efforts in his career make him more than just a contender here, because of the weight. Lava Man may very well need his best to take this, and he doesn't run that well very often.

#### 2 Magnum (Arg) El Compinche (Arg) 2-1

Came to this country last summer and put together a string of solid efforts for the rest of the year, before leaping way forward in his first start this season. Surprisingly, he didn't bounce. He ran right back to that level in the Big Cap, getting close to Lava Man because he saved ground and got a weight pull. Since then, he's gotten better. His last in the mud at Lone Star was a new lifetime top, and at the weights, a repeat of that effort would make Magnum an extremely likely winner here. In fact, since Lava Man isn't that likely to run his best, even a return to Magnum's previous level would give him a very big shot at the weights. All of which makes Magnum a very strong contender.

#### 3 Seek Gold Touch Gold 8-1

Has always been a couple of cuts below top stakes horses, and only won the Foster H. because Borel gave him one of his patented ground-saving rides. When we did the math, Seek Gold earned only the fourth best Thoro-Graph figure in the race.

He has several things going against him today. An ouchy pattern that makes it likely he'll bounce off his last on only three weeks rest, an east-west cross-country trip that has dulled many, and worst of all, a top that's probably too slow even if he fires his best shot.

#### 4 Ace Blue (Brz) Coax Me Clyde 20-1

Ran some decent figures last year, and has a reasonable recovery pattern going into this. But he hasn't run anywhere near his top in seven months, and even if he does, he probably won't crack the exacta.

#### 5 Super Frolic Pine Bluff 4-1

Improved at two, three, four, and five, and by last summer had run some Grade I level figures under the radar at Calder and Delaware. So we stepped in and advised client Ro Parra to purchase him at a reasonable price, and the horse quickly earned several times that in the Hawthorne Gold Cup and Breeders' Cup Classic. His next two, in Florida and Dubai, were much worse, but after a break, he came back with a nice forward move in the Californian. It's interesting to note how similar this pattern is to Lava Man's before the Big Cap. Big efforts, followed two very bad ones when shipped long distances, followed by a nice stepping-stone effort a few points off their respective tops. Since second off a layoff is also Cerin's strongest category (see trainer profile), Super Frolic should run well, which at the weights makes him a strong contender.

<u>Bottom Line</u> – Lava Man certainly is a major contender, but he's also a major underlay at odds-on. Magnum and Super Frolic are the prime contenders, and the value.

Teigland, had his own practice from 1983-87. He turned in his stethescope for a stopwatch in 1987 and saddled his first winner, Chachi Man, at Calder later that year. Kimmel has earned seven individual training titles in New York, leading the standings for the year in 1999 with 71 victories. He was also the top conditioner in earnings in New York for three straight years, 1997-99. He guided Hidden Lake to the Eclipse Award as top older mare in 1997, and has also handled Grade I winners including Catinca, Fabulously Fast, Friends Lake, Golden Bri, Pompeii and Twist Afleet.
