A filly from the first crop of Japanese champion King Kamehameha (Jpn) (Kingmambo) attracted a worldrecord bid of \$5,217,391 (¥600,000,000) to top yester-

day's first foal session of the Japan Racing Horse Association's Select Sale at Northern Horse Park on Hokkaido. The filly is out of Japanese champion To the Victory (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), who was second behind Captain Steve in the 2001 G1 Dubai World Cup. Tokvo-based Nobutaka Tada signed the ticket for the

record foal on behalf of a group of unnamed Japanese buyers. "My clients asked me to find a horse who can win the Arc, and we have all agreed this was the one to get," Tada said. "But now we have an earlier target,

the Prix Diane. She is beautiful, she has everything and we fell in love with her. I am not surprised with the price, because we understand she is worth that amount of money." Northern Farm consigned the bay. Riki Takahashi, representing Darley Japan, was the underbidder. During his stellar racing career, King Kamehameha won the Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) and NHK Mile Cup. He was named Japan's top three-year-old of 2004. Takahashi had better luck

The gray foal, out of Blue Avenue, is a full brother to Japanese champion Kurofune and to American multiple graded stakes winner Bella Bellucci. "This is the one we thought we had to acquire," Takahashi said of his purchase on behalf of Darley. "As we are looking for horses capable of winning the Dubai World Cup, this was a lot we could not miss." After the first of two foal sessions of the auction, the average price was up 23.5 percent from a year ago, while the median fell 5.1 percent. ROUND ONE

The high point, at least so far this century, of Fasig-Tipton's July yearling sale came in 2004, the second year in history we reckon the "major Northern Hemisphere Thoroughbred auction marketplace" (as defined by us) topped the \$1-billion mark. Having hit that mark for the first time in 2000, the Kentucky sales found the next three years to be especially problematic due to a combination of the crash in Internet investing (I remember going to a Houghton yearling sale in Newmarket one year and marveling how everybody I talked to was in some kind of Internet deal) and--even worse for Kentucky--MRLS, which cost Kentucky breeders as much as 30 percent of two foal crops, with estimated losses over \$300 million in sales.

By 2004, things were improving on both fronts, and Fasig July opened the 2004 season with a blockbuster sale. From a catalogue of 495 yearlings, of which 452 went through the ring, 338 sold, grossing \$38,620,000 and averaging \$114,260--massive increases on the previous year of 37 percent in gross and 23 percent in average. The 75-percent clearance rate of those sent through the ring was four points higher than the previous year, and fully 10 percentage points higher than any other year so far this century.

It's a tried and true maxim of the Thoroughbred market over the last 25 years that, if something works well one year, everybody rushes in to repeat the same program and, invariably misjudging how thin this market really is, this causes the plan to blow up in their faces. That used to regularly happen in the two-year-old sale market, and it seems to happen to the Fasig July sale every year they catalogue over 500 horses. Last year, buoyed by the 2004 successes which launched an overall record-breaking year in the auction market, Fasig catalogued what I think was a record 679 yearlings. It was a major disappointment, relatively speaking: with 184 more yearlings catalogued and 149 more sent through the ring, they managed to sell only 30 more than in 2004. The gross actually dropped \$1.5 million and the average dropped back down to just over the \$100,000 mark. Considering the 11-sale "key auction markets" grew by over 15 percent, to \$1.175 billion, clearly something had gone wrong in the Fasig July formula. Company officials knew right away what the problem was--too many catalogued in a sale which has traditionally done great when the book is the right size-and, voila, this year's catalogue is back down to 477.

The key figure next week is therefore going to be the number sold, and the target figure for the two days is 310--65 percent of the catalogue. We expect the sale to hit or even surpass that target (325 sold would equal the 2004 percentage, 68 percent of the catalogue), with a gross of \$35 million-\$40 million, and an average over \$110,000. Tuesday usually averages higher than Monday (it was 30 percent higher in 2004), so don't be surprised if that's the case. In four of the last five years, Monday has averaged between \$95,000 and \$99,000. If, at the close of business Monday, there are six figures in the average, it will be a very good to record-breaking sale.

Monday's New Sire Showcase, featuring first- and second-season stallions, may not average quite as much as Tuesday, but it has been a roaring success over the years at doing just what it intends to--showcasing new sires. Last year it seemed like Florida week, but this year it is much more Kentucky, with 16 of the 20 stallions with three or more catalogued in their first crops (counting Fasig July and Saratoga) resident in the Bluegrass State. There are five major new prospects in Kentucky whose first yearlings we project will average over \$100,000 this year.

Fasig tends to showcase stallions more in the mid-range stud fee scale, but let me first mention this


sire crop's probable commercial leaders. Lane's End's Mineshaft, 2003 Horse of the Year when he won four Grade I races and ran seven consecutive Beyers of 114–118 (the top about a Timeform 130, by my reckoning), doesn't get into action until later. He has none at FTK, and just one at Saratoga.

The year-younger Empire Maker, triple Grade I winner of the Belmont S., is going to be given a major chance by Prince Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte Farms, one of the world's most powerful owner-breeders. So whatever he does at the sales, that's not going to tell the whole story; he has one at Fasig and three at Saratoga.

Vindication, the unbeaten champion two-year-old colt of 2002 and Seattle Slew's second-best chance (after A.P. Indy) to have a major sire son representing him, has three at Fasig, and another eight at Saratoga. Also coming out of Vindication's 2002 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, with their first yearlings at Fasig, are Kafwain, Hold That Tiger, Van Nistlerooy, Whywhywhy and Zavata. Of this crop's likely commercial big five, the two with a little bit bigger representation at Fasig are Sky Mesa and Aldebaran, with six each. Sky Mesa then has another seven at Saratoga and Aldebaran has another three. Sky Mesa, a son of Pulpit out of a triple Grade III- winning sister to successful sire Bernstein (and also a half-sister to the dam of Wiseman's Ferry, who has seven catalogued at Fasig), missed Vindication's Breeders' Cup Juvenile, but was probably still the second-best two-year-old in 2002, having won the GI Hopeful and GII Lane's End Futurity before being sidelined by injury.

Aldebaran is the last major son of Mr. Prospector to go to stud, and a few of the Judges, having seen the foals, are predicting big things. He was champion sprinter at five in 2003, when he contested eight Grade I/Grade II races in eight starts, winning five and placing in two more. In the 2003 GI Forego at Saratoga, he registered a Beyer 122, which translates to about a Timeform 134.

Whatever happens at Fasig, there will be more later from all of these, whereas Fasig usually highlights stallions standing more in the \$10,000-\$20,000 range, and even under, which describes all five of the first-season sires with 10 or more catalogued at Fasig.

Airdrie, which traditionally does well at this sale, has three of the 20 sires with three or more catalogued, including MGISW and \$3.6-million earner Harlan's Holiday (17); 2002 Kentucky Derby second Proud Citizen (13), by budding sire-of-sires Gone West; and the crack speedster Yankee Gentleman (7), by Storm Cat.

Ashford introduces two sons of Storm Cat: Hold That Tiger (15 catalogued), winner of the G1 Grand Criterium in France and third in Vindication's Breeders' Cup Juvenile; and Van Nistlerooy (10), a \$6.4-million yearling who was a good seven-furlong two-year-old, and is inbred 3x3 to Northern Dancer, as well as having three crosses of Almahmoud--two through Northern Dancer and another through Halo.

Cheveley Park Stud's Peeress is currently 2-1 up on Soviet Song, having taken advantage of that rival's lack of match-fitness in last year's Windsor Forest and in the Lockinge this term. The latter success represented her first major achievement against the colts and excuses were made for her subsequent fourth in the June 20 G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot. Cheveley Park Stud, who collected this with Lovers Knot (GB) in 1997, also have the impressive June 23 G1 Coronation S. heroine Nannina in the artillery lined up against Soviet Song. Having bested the subsequent G1 Epsom Oaks winner Alexandrova (Ire) in the G1 Fillies' Mile on the Rowley Mile here in September, she found the testing conditions of the May 7 G1 1000 Guineas against her on her return to this venue. Allowed to coast home when her chance had disappeared there, she rebounded in style last time when besting a stellar line-up in authoritative fashion back on her favored quicker surface.

All carry 124 pounds, bar Gilded at 127. Gilded faces a stiff task attempting to emulate Chicarica in 1990 and the 2003 heroine Attraction (GB) in defying a penalty here. Unstoppable since graduating at Warwick Apr. 4, she took her winning run to five when beating Simply Perfect (GB) by a length in the G2 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot last time June 21. She steps up a panel and takes on a deep field headed by G3 Albany S. scorer Sander Camillo, who bids to provide trainer Jeremy Noseda with a second renewal after the success of Wannabe Grand (Ire) in 1998. She had Silk Blossom 1 1/2 lengths back in second when breaking her maiden in the Royal Ascot contest last time she ran June 23 and carries stable confidence. "She has come out of her race at Ascot well and she appears ready for action," Noseda said. "Looking at the forecasts, it is likely to be pretty fast ground, which should be fine for her." Silk Blossom, who had previously taken a Rowley Mile maiden on debut Apr. 19, was drawn high at Ascot and should have a level playing field as she re-opposes here, while Hope'n'charity went twofor-two in the Listed Empress S. over course and distance last time July 1. "She's done absolutely nothing wrong so far and the ground was very quick at Newmarket, where she was a bit fresh and well in herself," trainer Clive Cox explained. "She quickened again when it mattered there and has been in great form since." Michael Jarvis is represented by the impressive York maiden winner Alderney. "She has done well since she won at York and she is fit and well," Jarvis told PA Sport. "It is a very hot race and we will be very happy if she runs in the frame. She was impressive at York, but it was a maiden race--though she couldn't have done it nicer and we feel she is entitled to take her chance. We'll know a lot more about her [todav]."

Those foals are now two-year-olds and will begin running late this fall." Added John Greely IV of Wintergreen, "Being by Relaunch, Honour and Glory is a great outcross to most of the mares in America." The winner of the GII Breeders' Futurity at two and the GI Met Mile H. and GII San Rafael S. at three for owner Michael Tabor and trainer D. Wayne Lukas, the dark bay retired with a record of 17-6-5-2 and earnings of \$1,202,942. He went to Ashford Stud in 1997 and produced champion two-year-old filly Caressing from his very first crop. He has sired a total of 28 stakes winners, including graded winners Keyed Entry, Blues and Royals, Put It Back, Discreet Hero and Battle Won. His progeny have earned more than \$28 million. His 2006 fee at Ashford was \$12,500. A 2007 Northern Hemisphere fee has not yet been announced.

Despite being a Grade I-winning son of Mr. Prospector from an outstanding family, Smart Strike never seems to have been regarded as among the most glamorous of stallions. In part, it's probably because he has not tended to get sales toppers or two-year-old sensations. What he does get, and get with tremendous consistency, is quality racehorses. This point was underlined again at the weekend when his son English Channel staked his claim as North America's leading turf specialist with a win in the GI United Nations S., and his daughter Strike Softly captured the Ontario Damsel S.

Smart Strike certainly took plenty of stallion credentials to stud with him. Other than its brevity, there was certainly little to quibble about with regard to his race record. He started eight times, and won all but the first and last of those outings.

Unraced at two, Smart Strike ran four times at three, winning a maiden race at Keeneland, and a pair of allowance races at Woodbine, accounting for Langfuhr in the first, and the talented pair of All Firmed Up and Kiridashi in the second. Away for 13 months, Smart Strike returned at four to take a Woodbine allowance in 1:21 1/5. Moving into stakes company, he then added the GIII Salvator Mile H. and GI Philip H. Iselin H., which he took by 2 1/4 lengths from Eltish, with Serena's Song third.

Smart Strike's final start came in the GI Woodward S. There, after pressing the pace in the early stages, he dropped back to finish fourth, beaten 5 1/4 lengths by the winner, Cigar.

Smart Strike's pedigree is also hard to knock. In addition to being by Mr. Prospector, he is half-brother to Dance Smartly, heroine of the Canadian Triple Crown and the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, and a U.S. champion three-year-old filly, as well as Horse of the Year and champion two- and three-year-old filly in Canada. Smart Strike is also a brother to major stakes winners Full of Wonder and Strike Smartly, and three-parts brother to Queen's Plate victors Scatter the Gold and the filly Dancethruthedawn--both by Mr. Prospector out of Dance Smartly.

For good measure, Smart Strike's dam, Classy 'n Smart, was also champion three-year-old filly in Canada, and a half-sister to champions Sky Classic, Regal Classic and Grey Classic.

Smart Strike'd first-crop foals of 1998, got their sire off to a fine start, producing 10 stakes winners, including the multiple graded stakes-winning millionaire Tenpins; Fleetstreet Dancer, successful in the Japan Cup Dirt and multiple graded-stakes placed in the U.S.; and the GIII Connaught Cup winner Fly Smartly.

Smart Strike now has six crops aged three-year-old or up, and from 343 foals, and 278 starters, they have yielded 39 stakes winners (11.3-percent stakes winners to foals, and 14-percent stakes winners to starters).

In addition to those mentioned, his best also include the GI Personal Ensign S. heroine Shadow Cast; Soaring Free, a winner of over \$2 million and Horse of the Year, champion sprinter and champion turf horse in Canada; and other Canadian champions Eye of the Sphynx, Portcullis, Added Edge and Gold Strike.

All this good work has not gone unrecognized, and in 2006, Smart Strike was booked full at fee of \$50,000, his highest to date.

Last year, English Channel closed out his sophomore campaign in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, where he ran a creditable fifth as the first three-year-old across the line, and the first U.S.-trained finisher. One imagines that event will again be his principal target this year, and the way he galloped out after the 11-furlong United Nations, combined with his head second to the older Shakespeare in last year's GI Turf Classic at 1 1/2 miles, suggests that the distance is certainly not beyond him.

On the other hand, the evidence of English Channel's two other victories this year would make the GI Breeders Cup Mile a realistic alternative. He opened up the season in the 8 1/2-furlong Canadian Turf H. at Gulfstream Park, winning in a very quick 1:39 after passing the mile mark in 1:33.52, and then gained his first Grade I triumph in the nine-furlong GI Turf Classic.

That English Channel should possess something of a blend of speed and stamina is not that surprising when one looks at the pedigree of his dam, Belva. She is by Theatrical, who was runner-up in the G1 Irish Derby at three, but who peaked at five, earning honors as champion turf horse and capturing four 12-furlong Grade I events, including the Breeders' Cup Turf.

On the other hand, Belva's dam, Theatrical's one time stable companion, Committed, was a stellar speedster. A sprint champion in England, Ireland and France, Committed took back-to-back renewals of the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp, Europe's leading five-furlong event, and captured three other group events, including the G1 William Hill Sprint Championship. She also made three starts in the U.S., breaking Hollywood Park's sixfurlong course record while taking the Matching S.

Belva never ran, but matings between Theatrical and Committed had a better racetrack return in the shape of her sister, Pharma, and brother, Hap. Pharma, like her sire and dam, was a later-maturer, and took the GI Santa Ana H. and GII Wilshire H. as a five-year-old.

Hap captured six graded events at four and five, including the GII Keeneland Turf Mile.

By Olden Times' son, Hagley, a good two-year-old and miler who subsequently was a very successful regional sire in Maryland, Committed had a stakes-winning juvenile brother in Christiana Hundred. Her Stage Door Johnny half-sister, Wooing, was a listed winner who also took second in the GII Diana H., and produced Irish stakes winner Stage Affair, while another half-sister, Gossiping, became dam of Musicale, a four-time English group winner.

Committed's dam, Minstinguette, was unplaced in one start, but was half-sister to the GI Vanity H. victress Miss Toshiba. A daughter of Boldnesian, Minstinguette owned a rather interesting pedigree as her third dam, Leading Home, was a half-sister to Sailing Home, the granddam of Boldnesian's son Bold Reasoning, the sire of Seattle Slew.

As a Mr. Prospector son, free of Northern Dancer, Smart Strike was an obvious mate for Northern Dancer-

line mares, especially as he was a half-brother to a champion by a son of Northern Dancer. That formula has proved to be a highly successful one, and Smart Strike has 22 stakes winners, and 15 group or graded winners, out of Northern Dancer-line mares. The formula has produced stakes winners out of mares from a

wide range of Northern Dancer branches, including, in addition to the Nureyev cross which produced English Channel, crosses with Vice Regent, Danzig, Nijinsky II, Sovereign Dancer, Dixieland Band, Lyphard and Northern Baby.

In addition to the Mr. Prospector/Northern Dancer cross, we can also note one other potentially important connection in English Channel's pedigree. Boldnesian, the sire of his third dam, is a reverse Nasrullah/Polynesian cross to Mr. Prospector, his grandsire.


tember's GI Woodward S. "He's doing fabulous," trainer Nick Zito told Daily Racing Form. "The owner is getting excited, the help is getting excited, and the trainer is getting excited. He is ready to run now. It took a long time to get him back." Commentator finished a well-beaten third in the Woodward to eventual Horse of the Year Saint Liam, but had displayed

his class earlier in the summer with a neck victory over that foe in the GI Whitney H.--his first Grade I win. With the West clearly under Lava Man's domain, the five-year-old gelding jumps into the fray in the hopes of joining Flower Alley and Invasor (Arg) as leaders in the Eastern handicap division. However, Zito stressed to the *Form* that, despite the horse's obvious talent, he'd be taking a cautious approach with Commentator in the hopes of ensuring a lengthy career. "I want this horse to be around for a long time," he said. "[We] have to exercise a lot of patience. We have to find the right distances that won't aggravate his injury, and keep him around." Today's Mugatea, contested at 6 1/2 furlongs on the main track, has attracted a field of six and is the third race on the card.

HORSE RACING SAFE AS INTERNET GAMBLING BAN PASSES

The United States House of Representatives passed the Internet Gambling Prohibition and Enforcement Act July 11 by a vote of 317-93, but defeated an amendment that would extended the proposed ban on Internet gambling to horse racing and state lotteries by apparently superseding existing federal law. The legislation, which also modernizes the Wire Act of 1961, attempts to stymie Internet gambling by outlawing use of credit to make bets and mandating criminal penalties. Its primary target is offshore online casinos that take wagers from U.S. residents. Chances for introduction and passage of an Internet gambling bill by the Senate remain unclear. Republican Sen. Jon Kyl of Arizona has championed similar legislation in his chamber since the late 1990s. The National Thoroughbred Racing Association and its lobbying firm, The Alpine Group, along with the American Horse Council, have regularly lobbied to protect horse racing's interests, particularly in the area of account wagering.
