BARBARO STRUCK WITH ACUTE LAMINITIS

The condition of injured GI Kentucky Derby winner Barbaro (Dynaformer) has taken a turn for the worse as the colt has developed acute laminitis in his left hind foot. "It's basically as bad a laminitis as you can have,"

said Dr. Dean Richardson, who has been overseeing Barbaro's recovery from fractures suffered to his right hind in the May 20 GI Preakness S. at the University of Pennsylvania's New Bolton Center. "We did a hoof wall resection, which basically means we removed a large portion of his hoof wall because it wasn't connected to his coffin

bone," Richardson said. "He probably only has about 20 percent of his hoof wall that is still attached to his coffin bone. At the same time, he is reasonably comfortable. He is in a foot cast with foam padding and antiseptic dressings." A painful condition often brought on by uneven weight distribution, laminitis occurs when the laminae--the soft tissue holding the coffin bone in place--begins to separate, causing the coffin bone to rotate away from the hoof wall. "From the outset, we knew this was a risk, and we were doing everything to avoid it," said Richardson. "The horse had no real problems with the left hind foot until he started having some problems in terms of comfort in his right hind at about seven weeks [last weekend]." Richardson said that Barbaro would have to essentially regrow a new hoof wall, a lengthy process. "We're talking months and months and months," he said. Richardson added that he had seen horses recover from laminitis as acute as Barbaro's, but gauged his chances of recovering as "poor." But he added, "It isn't unheard of. As long as the horse is not suffering, we're going to continue to try. We think it's worth the effort. We're putting a lot of effort into this horse, and it might make the difference." Barbaro is now spending several hours a day in a sling in order to get weight off his hind feet and is being treated aggressively for pain management. "The pain-management techniques are working well--so far," said Richardson. "If they stop working, we are going to quit on the horse. It's as simple as that."

CROWNED PRINCE

Sultan Ahmad Shah's Strategic Prince (GB) (Dansili (GB)) finished fifth in the G2 Norfolk S. over Royal Ascot's five furlongs, but relished the extra panel of the G2 July S. and Newmarket's uphill finish to surge to a convincing success yesterday. An error in the system cost him a run in the six-furlong G2 Coventry S., but the 16-1 chance offered some compensation when quickening past Armigerent (Ire) (In the Wings {GB}) in the final 100 yards and on to a 1 3/4-length success. "Six furlongs suited him down to the ground and he picked up really well," jockey Eddie Ahern said. "He ran well in the Norfolk considering he was drawn badly, but I think six furlongs is the key and he gave me a good feel today." Of the winner, trainer Paul Cole said, "His brother was unlucky in the Melbourne Cup, his other brother was a two-miler and I trained the dam, so the feeling was that he wanted a trip, but he has an awful lot of speed. He'll definitely head to Goodwood for the [Aug. 2] G2 Vintage S. over seven furlongs or [Aug. 4] G2 Richmond S. over six." July S. cont. p2

TARGET SET

Joe Janiak's Takeover Target (Aus) (Celtic Swing (GB)) may have missed out on the Royal Ascot double completed by Choisir (Aus), but he is primed to go one better than that pioneer in today's G1 July Cup at Newmarket. Choisir met his match in Oasis Dream (GB) in a vintage renewal of this premier sprint three years ago, but connections are hoping that the latest sensation from Down Under can revive the memory of his June 20 G2 King's Stand S. success at the Royal meeting. "Everything seems to be going well and he should find this a true test," jockey Jay Ford told the Racing Post. "He has had two runs and three weeks to freshen up and he feels in terrific form." Takeover Target arrived in Berkshire the winner of the three main Flemington sprints, having added the Feb. 4 G1 Lightning S. and Mar. 11 G1 Newmarket H. to his win in the 2004 G1 Salinger S. His considerable home reputation preceded his run in the King's Stand and he did not disappoint, showing tenacity to win in a thriller. Subsequently third behind Willie McKay's Les Arcs (Arg) and Balthazaar's Gift (GB) (Xaar {GB}) in the G1 Golden Jubilee S. four days later, he may have been feeling Tuesday's exertions, but has had the break to recover. "He said he could have been placed, but I was quite pleased, as I really wanted to run in the Coventry and there was a hiccup over the entry. Today I didn't want to bust him, so I said to Eddie to give him as much chance as he could and he gave him a great ride." "He's a real honest colt and, although it's taken a while for the penny to drop with him, because he's so laid back, he's getting there," Darley explained. "As we came out of the dip I thought they might get him with a turn of foot, but he stuck his neck out and battled really well. I think after that he could possibly be a [Sept. 9] G1 St Leger horse and he's still learning." Trainer Mark Johnston is considering that Classic, run at York this year, while not ruling out the possibility of a tilt at the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot in 16 days' time. Les Arcs caused an upset in the six-furlong G1 Golden Jubilee, where he had a neck to spare over the fastfinishing Balthazaar's Gift. That represented an improvement on his form, which included a defeat of Michael Hill's Quito in the Listed Cammidge Trophy at Redcar Mar. 25. Trainer Tim Pitt is hopeful he can maintain the progression. "He was a bit stiff and sore after Ascot, as you'd expect, but he had a nice little break and did a very nice piece of work on Saturday--and also had a nice breather on Wednesday too," Pitt told PA Sport. "He's in good heart and it would be nice to have another big win after what happened at Ascot." Pivotal Point underlined the strength of the King's Stand form when reversing form with Benbaun and capturing Saturday's G3 Sprint S. at Sandown, while the other Australian raider Falkirk has a chance to better his share of fourth at the Royal meeting. Godolphin have yet to win this race and rely on last year's G2 Park S. winner Iffraaj, who performed with credit on his return when seventh in the Golden Jubilee. "We have been pleased with the progress that Iffraaj has made since Royal Ascot," Racing manager Simon Crisford commented. "He has been working well and we are hoping for a good run."

He had previously bested the subsequent G1 Derby Italiano winner and G1 Irish Derby runner-up Gentlewave (Ire) in the G2 Prix Hocquart at this venue May 8. Last year's winner Ostankino may struggle to handle the top-flight Shamdala, but will find improvement on his latest fourth in the Vicomtesse Vigier. Bellamy Cay took the Listed Prix de la Porte de Madrid at Saint-Cloud Apr. 18 before adding the G3 Prix d'Hedouville to his tally here May 8. 

FALLON APPEAL DISMISSED Kieren Fallon learned vesterday that his appeal against his suspension from riding in Britain has been dismissed by the Horseracing Regulatory Authority. Following the hearing on Wednesday evening, at which the leading human rights barrister David Pannick QC made representations, the panel upheld the original decision not to grant Fallon a licence. A HRA statement read, "The board received the panel's decision and reasons and mindful of the serious criminal charges now outstanding against Kieren Fallon, decided that the panel's decision to decline to consider any of the presently available evidence was correct. Further, that the decision to prohibit him from riding in races in Great Britain until the conclusion of his trial or further order was justified. The appeal is dismissed." Fallon issued a statement of his own soon after through his solicitors, BCL Burton Copeland. "I am deeply disappointed by the refusal of the HRA to overturn my suspension from riding in the UK," it read. "I will now take the matter to the High Court, and beyond if necessary, to reinstate my rights to earn a living in the UK and participate in the sport that I love. Until I have the chance to prove my innocence in court, it is grossly unfair that I am being denied a living in Britain." Legal representatives of Coolmore's retained rider, who was charged with conspiracy to defraud Betfair customers by the City of London Police last Monday, will receive written reasons from the HRA for its decision and are expected to proceed to the High Court in a matter of weeks.

WRITERS UP

PROJECTING FRESHMEN

By Bob Fierro & Jay Kilgore, DataTrack International

The two-year-old in training sales season has just about come to an end with the conclusion of the OBS June sale. Here we have an excellent opportunity to assess the "form" of the first crop of the Freshmen Sires of 2006. We will do this with the aid of **BreezeFigs*** The service we developed a few years ago that synthesizes into a "speed fig" time, stride length, power and other factors captured by our digital video programs during breeze shows at the sales.

We separate them into "groups," which further refine the *BreezeFigs* by analyzing which horses have more of a balance of physical racing properties likely to make them more successful on the track. The system is used by buyers, sellers, and handicappers--*Daily Racing Form* has just entered its second year of offering *BreezeFigs* as an on-line betting tool.

We thought it would be interesting to see how the offspring of the Freshmen of 2006 performed at these sales by distilling the *BreezeFigs* for eight sales (*) and then attempting to project which stallions will succeed this year, and which will be in position to last for the long haul. We used several statistical yardsticks, but relied on the percentage of offspring that qualified in our Group 1 category, using a minimum of 10 breezes per sire. That's 10 breezes, not 10 horses, for a reason: Some horses will breeze twice at sales (sometimes at two different sales) and throw in different *BreezeFigs*. It's only fair, and statistically accurate, to use all their efforts, not just their best breezes, for a study like this. We offer two conclusions:

- (1) How the top half of the stallions ranked in order, with comments on what we think their prospects are strictly on the basis of the two-year-old sales. Though not listed in order, we have also selected those in the second half to watch closely. With the assistance of our colleague Frank Mitchell, these comments include insights based on our biomechanical programs for the stallion himself that compare him to other successful stallions of his size and type, and how he matches up with mares biomechanically.
- (2) Our selections for Leading Freshmen Sires and Leading Long-Term Sires from this crop.

Stallions Ranked by 2-Year-Old BreezeFigs...

ORIENTATE and STREET CRY (IRE) actually tied for the top spot, even though the former had more than twice the number of breezes. They are oxymorons in all respects--Orientate was a closing sprinter who got better as he got older; Street Cry was a Classic hopeful who was actually a terrific two-year-old. Both benefited from very well managed first books (they had the highest Comparable A-EI indices for mares in their first book of all sires in this crop). Orientate will need those mares, and is likely to be a solid, consistent sire of sprinter/milers with an occasional good two-turn horse. He will challenge for Freshman honors but, like his sire line (Mt. Livermore), will likely get better with age. Street Cry will probably be more inconsistent, but is likely to come up with the big horse more often than not and should be very well-received internationally.

THREE WONDERS and MAX'S PAL--OK, here's a surprise, unless you were at the sales. Three Wonders is the latest Storm Cat who could come out of the woodwork of the Florida Pines to throw winner after winner before August gets under way. More than likely, they will get better as they get older and get onto the grass. Max's Pal is at a short-term disadvantage because of a weak first book of mares and almost half the number of foals as Three Wonders. He could surprise occasionally.

RED BULLET and PURE PRIZE dead-heat here, and the latter already has two winners. He could be one of those mid-level Kentucky Storm Cats that raise eyebrows early on, and his chances are decent based on his quality book and the way his babies breezed. Red Bullet looks to be right there as the "average" horse on all his numbers--solid two-year-old figures, solid biomechanics that suggest versatility. Not as many foals as you'd like, but the mares were good and he should be in the hunt by the end of the year.

Freshmen Projections, 2...

GRAEME HALL is sort of an enigma--good horse, very well-managed as a stallion, only a few sent to market, but the ones who went were quite impressive across the board. He's part of an exceptionally strong Florida contingent and likely to come on strong next year.

JOHANNESBURG has everything going for him, including a huge book, lots of two-year-olds at the sales, good sales figures, but will benefit more from the good (and ample number) of mares in his first book than consistency. He will get good runners, but the question is at what percentage of foals?

FRENCH ENVOY--who? Another Floridian, he's a full to the one that got away, French Deputy. He might be worth watching--there were few of them, but they breezed consistently well, which his biomechanical profile suggested they would. Problem is weak mares and relatively small book.

YONAGUSKA overwhelmed them with numbers--had the most breezes, often the fastest times, and with 102 foals and a very good first book is going to be absolutely in the hunt for top Freshman Sire. How far they'll go after that is the question, and it's likely to be not all that far beyond a mile.

That's the Top 10--"Huh? Where's Officer? How about Buddha? Where's Came Home?"

Here are the answers:

OFFICER is on the cusp here--he showed he is likely to get a somewhat later maturing runner, like in the fall, than a ton of brilliant early sprinters. His biomechanical profile is mixed, but he is likely to be in the hunt. **BUD-DHA** had so many pinhooks out there that he suffered in the averages, and is likely to follow his sire's somewhat inconsistent profile. **CAME HOME** is a yearling sire, *i.e.*, his yearlings were so pricey they made poor pinhook prospects, and there were few of them. Those yearling sales were out of good mares, so look out for them.

Three to look out for: **UNBRIDLED TIME**, another from Florida, threw in consistency in the later sales; they will probably be a little late. **TEXAS GLITTER**, who is at or near the top on all of our biomechanical charts, suffered from a relatively small book of undistinguished mares--but he's a Glitterman and they tend to come on late. We'll see. Finally, the one stallion of all those that did not meet the minimums who looks like he might very well do--but not early: New York-based **WHEELAWAY**, who had the highest percentage of

breezes in the top percentile of all Freshmen we tracked at these sales. That means something, and he should be watched.



"We thought she was one of two good mares in the catalogue and I think she would have made 250,000gns on Wednesday," Galpin said. "She's been bought from some of the best people in the business, which is a big help. She's a balanced, strong mare and there was an innocent reason why she did not race." French winner Autumn Promise (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) is set to go jumping, most probably in Ireland, after selling for 125,000gns to agent John O'Byrne. The sale concludes today with a session starting at 9:30 a.m.
