SPRINT CHAMP RETURNS TO 'SUMMIT'

Reigning sprint champion **Lost in the Fog** (Lost Soldier) notched last season's GII Carry Back S. on the Summit of Speed card and returns for today's GII Smile Sprint H. The Harry Aleo colorbearer suffered his first career defeat when seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint Oct. 29 and began his four-year-old campaign with a disappointing second in the Golden Gate Sprint Apr. 22. Heavily favored at 1-2 to get back on track in Churchill's June 3 GIII Aristides Breeders' Cup H., the blazed-faced colt delivered with a 1 1/4-length tally over **Kelly's Landing** (Patton). **Cont. p7**

HOME ON THE RAIL

Rail Link (GB) (Dansili {GB}) capped a night to remember for Khalid Abdullah's operation with a convincing success in the G1 Juddmonte Grand Prix de Paris last night at Longchamp. Having started off on the wrong foot when his rider was unseated on debut at Saint-Cloud Apr. 10, he found only the subsequent G2 Oppenheim-Union-Rennen runner-up Lauro (Ger) too strong in a conditions event at Chantilly May 10. The bay colt got off the mark back at Saint-Cloud 19 days later and added the G3 Prix du Lys to his tally in style over this course and distance last time June 20. Settled in mid-divison off the tempo carved out by Frankie Dettori on Red Rocks (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), he strode forward to challenge in the straight and loomed large approaching the eighth pole. The three-year-old took over there and was pushed out by Christophe Soumillon to assert from the game long-time leader, who fought hard to keep the runner's-up spot from Sudan (Ire) (Peintre Celebre). After creating a shock at Royal Ascot, Willie McKay's Les Arcs showed he was no flash in the pan by following up here. Just as they had in the closing stages of the G1 Golden Jubilee S. at the Royal meeting June 24, connections had to pray for the line as Iffraaj (GB) closed fast, but the six-year-old held on by a head at odds of 10-1. "He's amazing, an absolute superstar of a horse," trainer Tim Pitt said. "He's proven that the Golden Jubilee was no fluke and he's a serious horse in his own right."

Les Arcs' unorthodox metamorphosis into a top-rank sprinter has been well-documented, with a try over hurdles and a campaign over middle distances preceding a rich spell of success on Polytrack during the last all-weather season. Transforming that form to the turf when capturing the Listed Cammidge Trophy at Redcar Mar. 25, he looked to have found his ceiling when runner-up in the Apr. 18 Listed Abernant S. on the Rowley Mile here and when down the field in the G2 Temple S. at Sandown May 30. The dark bay was not beaten far when off the board the G2 King's Stand S. on the Tuesday of Royal Ascot, and returned on the Saturday of the Royal meeting to spoil the party of Takeover Target (Aus) (Celtic Swing {GB}), swooping past that foe before clinging to a fast-diminishing margin over Balthazaar's Gift (Ire) (Xaar {GB}). Restrained throughout the early stages here by John Egan, he tracked the leaders before getting the breaks to collar Takeover Target with 150 yards remaining. Les Arcs asserted as that rival tired over the rising ground, and though he was running out of real estate as Frankie Dettori rallied on Iffraaj, he held on to complete the ambitious double. "To win at Ascot and then here is just unbelievable," Egan said. "[Trainer] Tim [Pitt] got him here in great form, although I was hoping I would be drawn near Takeover Target. When he was drawn in one I went from having what I thought was a bad draw to a good draw, as it's definitely better in the center. I thought I'd track Frankie [Dettori], but that didn't pan out. I was hoping for a split, but they always come when you're going well. Horses make fools of you, but some are capable of anything, and this lad's just gone from strength to strength." Jockey Jay Ford said of the 9-2 favorite Takeover Target, "It was a very below-par performance from him. He travelled well off the two leaders early on, but when I asked him for an effort he could not go faster. And when he came off the bridle he was pretty much going up and down in the same spot. He had worked very well beforehand, but it wasn't to be."

Halicarnassus was perhaps the least expected winner of this fascinating line-up, but that proved the punters' misfortune as he produced a rattle from rear to cause an upset. He had dead-heated with Norisan (GB) in a course-and-distance maiden June 24 prior to this steep climb in class, and overcame greenness to rescue a seemingly helpless cause midway through this contest. Shuffled out the back by halfway, he appeared to be struggling before picking up his rivals with a wide flourish and grabbing success in the final 50 yards. "He went down bucking and was so green," winning jockey Tony Culhane said. "It wasn't that he wasn't quick enough -- I had plenty of horse, but he wouldn't face their heels, especially going downhill. I thought I'd give him a bit of daylight and if it didn't work out, I'd just float him up, but he got his momentum and finished up very well. He's probably going to be a nice horse next year and end up a middle-distance horse." Winning trainer Mick Channon revealed that his charge may be rested for an autumn campaign, with tilts at the G2 Royal Lodge S. at Ascot Sept. 23 and G1 Racing Post Trophy at Newbury Oct. 21.

Bellamy Cay took part in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris exactly a year ago and was not disgraced in fifth on that occasion. Subsequently sixth in the G3 Prix du Prince d'Orange back here in September, he rounded off with a win in the Listed Prix Vulcain at Deauville the following month. The Juddmonte homebred returned to annex the Listed Prix de la Porte de Madrid at Saint-Cloud Apr. 18 and followed up with a win at this venue in the May 8 G3 Prix d'Hedouville before failing to give Policy Maker (Ire) five pounds when third in the June 4 G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly. Stalking the early pace towards the inner under Kieren Fallon, he was angled off the rail soon into the straight and seized the advantage passing the furlong marker. He was chased by Montare in the drive to the line, but had enough left to resist that challenge. "He's a good, hard-knocking horse who stays well," Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe said. "He's always looked as if he can win one of these, and will probably go to Deauville next for either the [Aug. 20] G2 Prix Kergorlay or [Aug. 27] G2 Grand Prix de Deauville."

BARBARO STABLE DESPITE LAMINITIS

According to a statement issued by the University of Pennsylvania's New Bolton Center yesterday, Kentucky



Derby hero **Barbaro** (Dynaformer) was comfortable last night despite the development of laminitis in his left hind foot. The three-year-old underwent an extensive resection of the hoof wall and is now in a hoof cast, but was handling the latest complications as well as could be expected. "Barbaro was out of his sling for more than 12 hours yes-Equi-Photo terday, and he had a calm, rest-

ful night, sleeping on his side for more than four hours," said Dr. Dean Richardson. But, he cautioned, "While his condition is stable, it remains extremely serious."

During Thursday's press conference, Richardson emphasized that, while every effort will be made to save him, Barbaro will not be allowed to suffer. "We

are only going to go on with this horse as long as everyone involved is convinced that they can come in every day, look at this horse and be convinced that on that day and the next day that he is going to be acceptably comfortable," he said. "That doesn't mean that the horse is not having any discomfort at any Barbaro winning the Derby time--that is the nature of the disease. But the fact is that the horse is within our understanding


of well-being...if he's eating, drinking, [has a] reasonable heart rate, is able to get up and down, move around the stall, act like a normal horse, then I think that we're going to go on." Barbaro's regular jockey Edgar Prado paid the colt a visit Friday. "He looked much better than I though he would," Prado said. "He is very smart and he knew me right away. I fed him, walked with him and he put his head on my shoulder and fell asleep...It is a very bad situation, but he has the will to overcome this."

He could be out there on his own once again today, but will have to try and hang on for an extra sixteenth of a mile. **Seaside Retreat**, first in the Display S. on Woodbine's main track last November, is unbeaten in two starts on the lawn. The bay won an allowance on the Woodbine weeds in September and returned to the turf after finishing 10th in the May 6 GI Kentucky Derby to win the June 25 Charley Barley S. in Toronto. **Spider Power** was caught in traffic on the final turn in the June 9 GIII Hill Prince S. at Belmont, but still got up to be second, beaten just a length and a half.



Thoro-Graph Race of the Week by Jerry Brown

He then ran much better than it lookedin the Derby [he was 6w on the turn]. Form over theTurfway polytrack often translates on turf, and sure

enough Seaside Retreat ran well in his grass debut last time. A repeat of that effort from the rail would give him a good shot, and a move back to his top would make him tough to beat. Strong contender.

2 Go Between Point Given 5-1 Had a nice pattern, but wasn't that fast going into his last, and was one of the many to encounter a tough trip in the Colonial Turf Cup, though a wide trip was nothing unusual for him. When we get done factoring in ground loss he had jumped way forward, and a repeat of that effort would put him right in this. It's a tough call as to whether he will do that, three year olds often pair up tops. Grass horses and Mott horses do as well, but again, it's a big jump. Contender, but no value at the price.

3 Spider Power (Ire) Royal Applause (GB) 12-1 Jumped up with the rest of the McLaughlin barn recently, and paired tops in his last two. The last looks better than it was due to an inside trip. He'd have to improve quite a bit to seriously contend here.

4 Steppenwolfer SCRATCHED

5 Manchu Prince <u>Gone West</u> 12-1 Is lightly raced and improved in his return from a layoff, but he has many lengths to make up, and Pletcher horses don't tend to improve that much through a campaign.

6 Kip Deville Kipling 9-2

Was purchased after a big one in Texas, and ran well last time despite sprinting away in 1:08:60. He gets a major rider switch to Bejarano, and should save ground on the lead again, a significant edge worth a point or two in this big field. There is no reason to expect a bounce, and a new top is possible for Dutrow--strong contender.

7Proudinsky (Ger)Silvano (Ger)8-1Jumped forward in his American debut, and nowcomes back only two weeks later after shipping. Arepeat isn't good enough, and a bounce likely.

8 Readily <u>More Than Ready</u> 50-1 Has never run fast enough to compete here.

9 Sir Classic Chris Catienus 20-1 Has run 12 times in eight months, working his way to a good grouping in his last five. That much racing and development makes another forward move unlikely in the short term, but he could be a candidate for a check.

10 Genre (GB) <u>Orpen</u> 5-1 Showed moderate ability in Europe last year, then took advantage of a weak California turf 3yo division in his last few. This horse will be way overbet. He's several points too slow going in, and since he's heavily raced, unlikely to jump forward. Bet against.

11 Roman Dynasty <u>Theatrical (Ire)</u> **12-1** Has a classic late-developing grass pedigree, and wisely wasn't raced at two. He's moved forward gradually this year, and ran very well in his turf debut last time. This one is lightly raced with a good pattern, and is probably the most likely horse in the race to run a new top. The post is an issue, but he's a contender. And if he gets buried with a wide trip, we'll look for him later.

12 Yate's Black Cat Has done a lot of developing, and in his last ran much better than it looked. He was another that was wide. Romans' barn has moved way up over the last couple of months, so a pair-up is possible, but he will still need to find a way to overcome the post.

Bottom Line – Proudinsky and Genre are worth playing against. Seaside Retreat, Kip Deville and Roman Dynasty are strong, and there are several that could be used underneath them in exotics.

'GEORGE' ON THE COMEBACK TRAIL Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's George Washington (Ire) (Danehill) has completed his first piece of work since his injury, according to Racing Post yesterday. "He is progressing well, but it is still too soon to be talking about when he might be back on the track. Things are going well with him so far, but he was held up for a long time and we are not going to rush him."

TATTS JULY CONCLUDES RECORD RUN

FALLON BACKED BY O'BRIEN

Following Thursday's dismissal of his appeal to continue riding in Britain, jockey Kieren Fallon yesterday received the full support of trainer Aidan O'Brien. The Ballydoyle conditioner spoke out for his retained rider in respondse to the ruling by the Horseracing Regulatory Authority. "Kieren is the most unbelievable jockey we have ever had," he told PA Sport. "I have never known anybody who wants to win so badly, but he still puts the welfare of the horse first. It is terrible for us not to be able to use him in England. He is a master of his craft--nobody I have known loves horses as much or wants to win so badly, and that is not just one race, it is every race. With everything he rides he always comes back and explains exactly why he has done what he has done, and I find the whole thing hard to believe. Kieren has been there everyday, and losing him is like taking a wheel off. Kieren is so open and he doesn't speak to people deviously--he tries to help everyone. People should celebrate him rather than pushing him into the ground. I just hope that the most unbelievable talent we have had doesn't get destroyed." Fallon is likely to seek an injunction in the High Court following the HRA's decision, which was explained vesterday. Board Chairman Sir Roger Buckley said, "The panel's judgment was that the potential damage to racing by permitting Mr. Fallon, now charged with conspiracy to defraud in connection with the actual running of races, to continue to participate in race riding until the law has resolved the charge, outweighed the prejudice to him. We do not regard that as a disproportionate response." Fergal Lynch and Darren Williams, who also received bans last week as a result of being charged with conspiracy to defraud betfair.com customers, will appeal to the HRA. No dates have been set for their hearings.

SPENCER TOPS JOCKEY TABLE

Jamie Spencer earned the Ritz Club July Festival Top Jockey honors at Newmarket yesterday with three wins at the three-day meeting. Britain's reigning champion jockey was also leading jockey at Royal Ascot before partnering David Junior to success in last Saturday's G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown. "It is nice after Ascot to come to the next big meeting and be leading rider," Spencer said. "I suppose, in some ways, that I'm a bit disappointed with the week because my big guns just didn't happen. Last weekend I was the underdog with David Junior. This week, I was on all the fancied ones and they got beaten, but that is the way racing goes." There was a sting in the tail for Spencer this week, however, as he has been referred to the Horseracing Regulatory Authority under the "totting-up" procedure as a result of being handed another ban during the festival. With 20 days of suspensions already against his name in 2006, he was found guilty of careless riding in a maiden Thursday, and could face a minimum suspension of 14 days from the disciplinary panel of the HRA. Ryan Moore already heads the title race, and any cumulative ban for Spencer would seriously jeopardise his chances of bridging the gap.
