Nightmare Affair (Out of Place) came flying on the outside to land the \$500,000 Smile Sprint H. at Calder, with favored Lost in the Fog (Lost Soldier) a wellbeaten ninth. He had won the GIII Carry Back S. a year ago, but couldn't match that effort this time. "It's disappointing," trainer Greg Gilchrist admitted. "There was a lot to overcome with the 125 [pounds] and the trip, but if he finished second or third, you could understand. But to run like this, we'll have to talk about his future. We'll take him back home and see if there is anything physical that comes out to explain this performance." Cont. p5

NEWLY MINTED Malibu Mint had rattled off three straight wins at Calder late last year, culminating in the Chaposa Springs H. on New Year's Eve. That streak came to an end with a fourth-place finish on the turf Feb. 6, and the chestnut didn't run again until Apr. 12, when she was a tired eighth to Dubai Escapade in the GII Vinery Madison S. at Keeneland. Another try on the turf proved fruitless in the Giant's Causeway S. at the Lexington oval, and she stumbled at the start of the GI Humana Distaff H. at Churchill May 6, losing her rider and grabbing a guarter. Malibu Mint got back on track with a game runner-up effort in the Winning Colors H. at Churchill May 27, missing by a neck to Ever Elusive, but was ignored here despite her good Calder form. Content to race a few lengths off the lead disputed by Hot Storm and Dubai Escapade through splits of :21.79 and :44.51, the four-year-old swung to the far outside approaching the stretch and ran by everyone for her first Grade I tally. "She grabbed a quarter pretty good in the race on [Kentucky] Derby Day and missed 10 or 12 days training, which didn't help her when she just got beat in the Winning Colors," winning trainer Jim Chapman explained. "She's trained great since, working bullets almost every time, and I thought she'd run great today. She obviously handles the track here very well, but I don't think that mattered today." Dubai Escapade proved reluctant to change leads when the real running began, and wasn't persevered with in the final furlong when she was already beaten. Trainer Eoin Harty was at a loss to explain her performance. "I'm very disappointed," he said. "[Jockey] Edgar [Prado] said she didn't feel like herself today. I can't blame the heat; it's hot in New York, and we just got here yesterday. I can't see anything wrong with her, but I'm going to go back to the barn and see."

ALEXANDROVA ALL SET Trainer Aidan O'Brien issued an upbeat bulletin about Alexandrova Friday. "She is lovely and in great form," he told *PA Sport* about the three-year-old filly. "I don't think the [good to firm] ground will bother her--she didn't mind it at Epsom, although she does bend her knee. There have been no problems and so far everything has been good, touch wood."

From Ascot to Ireland...

It has been 12 years since Bolas (GB) followed up a success in Royal Ascot's G2 Ribblesdale S. with victory here, and Tony Hirschfeld, Des Scott & Lester Piggott's **Mont Etoile** bids to emulate that feat. Runner-up to Time On (GB) in the Listed Cheshire Oaks at Chester May 10, she produced a late burst to get the better of Ballymacoll Stud's **Scottish Stage** by a neck at the Royal fixture. "There are only six runners, but it is still a tough race," conditioner William Haggas told *PA Sport*. "She is improving and stays well, so fingers crossed."

Sunday Stage...

Sir Michael Stoute, who has won this race six times, will be hoping that Scottish Stage can add to that tally. Runner-up to Race for the Stars in the Listed Oh So Sharp S. at Newmarket in October, she was slow to come to hand this spring, but reemerged with a head defeat of Guilia (GB) in the Listed Swettenham Stud Fillies' Trial S. at Newbury May 19. She had looked the winner of the Ribblesdale until caught close home, and is bred to improve with experience. Gary Tanaka's Rising Cross has to rebound from an unplaced effort in the G1 Oaks d'Italia at the San Siro June 18, but trainer John Best is hopeful she can prove up to this task. "Our filly's in great form; she's come back from Italy fine, but it's tough," he told PA Sport. "At home you wouldn't say she was a Group 1 horse, but she's proved it. We've got to take our chances when we can. I hope she can prove herself on Sunday. She's working really well and everything's fine. She travels well when you go anywhere like this, so I'm hoping she'll run her race and, hopefully, Alexandrova may be on a bad day."

Never off the board in eight previous starts, Go Between earned his second graded stakes victory with an excellent turn of foot and set a new course record in the process. The Peter Vegso homebred graduated in his seasonal bow Feb. 17 at Gulfstream and promptly added the GIII Palm Beach S. Mar. 12 over the same course. Second in Tampa's Sophomore Turf S. Apr. 8, the chestnut missed by a neck to Stream Cat in the GIII Crown Royal American Turf S. May 5 at Churchill Downs and was given a brief freshening. He got caught a bit in traffic before running third in the \$1-million Colonial Turf Cup June 24, and was third choice this time. Always in striking position, the Florida-bred angled out for running room in the stretch and accelerated smartly for a convincing success. He marks the third Virginia Derby win for his connections, who also won in 2002-2003 with the full brothers Orchard Park and Silver Tree. Go Between joins an honor roll which includes not only his fellow Vegso colorbearers, but also Kitten's Joy, the champion turf horse of 2004; and English Channel, the 2005 winner who already has two Grade I victories this year.

Too Much Bling has come a long way since beginning his career in his native Ohio. Purchased privately follow-



ing a 19 1/2-length romp in a Thistledown maiden last July, the grey ran third to First Samurai and Henny Hughes in the GI Hopeful S. Aug. 27, a race which marked his first outing for trainer Bob Baffert. But a pair of subsequent outings in New York saw the colt get well beaten,

and he was given some time to regroup following a sixth to Bluegrass Cat in the GIII Nashua S. Oct. 28. He resurfaced Jan. 8 with a sharp victory in the San Miguel S. at Santa Anita, then added a game tally in the GII San Vicente S. Feb. 12 at the same track. Baffert sent the three-year-old back to New York for the GIII Bay Shore S. Apr. 8. Too Much Bling relished the sloppy going that day and trumped Songster by nine lengths, but, following a two-month layoff and a tough trip, was forced to settle for second behind that colt in the GII Woody Stephens Breeders' Cup S. at Belmont June 10. Away smoothly here, the Ohio-bred kept the pacesetters within his sights down the backstretch. He took aim three wide approaching the stretch, put away Mach Ride at the eighth pole and kept a steady rhythm to the wire. Baffert, who didn't accompany the colt to Florida, wasn't sure when Too Much Bling would next face the starter. "I'm not going to run him too often now," the trainer said by phone. "I want to keep him fresh for the [GI] Breeders' Cup Sprint [Nov. 4, Churchill], and then take him to Dubai next year." Since Dapple Bloodstock purchased Fleet Indian for \$290,000 at this year's Keeneland January sale on behalf of Paul Saylor, the five-year-old mare has been unbeatable. Moved to Todd Pletcher's barn after the sale, the strapping mare--who had concluded 2005 with two wins--annexed the GIII Next Move H. at Aqueduct Mar. 26. She aired by 12 1/2 lengths in the Apr. 22 GIII Sixty Sails H. and by 7 3/4 lengths in the Obeah S. over this strip June 17, which should set her up nicely for this 10-furlong event. "We needed her to run somewhere and we knew we were focused on the Delaware H., so we felt like running her in the Obeah was a much better alternative then maybe running her at a mile and a sixteenth around one turn here at Belmont," explained Pletcher. "She is training well. We just try to keep her happy and so she has had a few nice maintenance breezes and everything looks on schedule." Fleet Indian's primary competition figures to come from stablemate La Reason, who ran second in the GII Louisville BC H. May 5 and fourth in the GII Fleur de Lis H. June 17. "We think the distance should suit her very well," said Pletcher. "She is a very consistent, hard-knocking mare and horses get tired sometimes going that far, but the last eighth of mile she should still be running."




