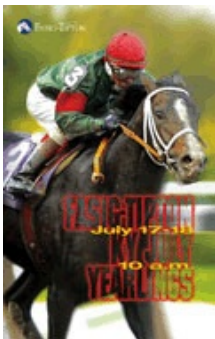

Blood-Horse

LESS COULD BE MORE AT FASIG-TIPTON

With a slimmed-down catalogue of 477 horses, officials at Fasig-Tipton are making an effort to narrow the gap between supply and demand as the yearling season kicks off with the company's Kentucky July Yearling Sale at the Newtown Paddocks today. "We made a conscious decision to reduce the numbers some and to



try to improve the overall quality," explained Boyd Browning Jr., the executive vice president and chief operating officer for Fasig-Tipton. "We basically cut them from the bottom. We feel very good about the catalogue." The company catalogued a whopping 679 youngsters for its two-day auction last year, a number some 30 percent greater than this catalogue, and too many horses, from the auction house's standpoint, failed to find homes. The buyback rate of 38.8 percent was dis-

appointing to sales officials, even if the average remained above the \$100,000 mark for a second consecutive year, while the median dropped by just six percent. "I think we would have pled guilty last year to having a few more horses that didn't belong physically than in previous years," Browning continued. "The buyers are pretty smart and pretty sophisticated, and just because you put it in the catalogue doesn't mean it necessarily belongs in the catalogue. Some years we've grown numbers and had a reduced buyback rate, so it doesn't always go hand-in-hand. We'll be disappointed if we haven't reduced the RNA rate a little bit by reducing the number of horses and eliminate some of those horses that didn't suit buyers last year."

Nonetheless, the calendar says it's the middle of July, and the hustle and bustle on the grounds--despite soaring temperatures and high humidity--is a welcome sight, according to Browning. "You're always optimistic when you get to kick off the yearling season," he submitted. "Everyone is enthusiastic about buying yearlings again, and we've been very busy out here [since consignors began showing on Friday]. It's a good group of horses on the grounds and we have a really strong group of new freshman sires this year, which always helps with the New Sire Showcase, so, yeah, we're optimistic here." **Cont. p7**

DOUBLE THE PLEASURE

Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's **Alexandrova (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) completed the English and Irish Oaks double in emphatic fashion at The Curragh yesterday to provide trainer Aidan O'Brien with a long-awaited first renewal. Sent off the 8-15 favorite on the basis of her six-length rout of the opposition in the June 2 Epsom Classic, she flaunted her superiority with a last-to-first flourish under Kieren Fallon to overwhelm **Scottish Stage (Ire)** (Selkirk) and win by four lengths. For the jockey, who also completed the double on Ramruma in 1999 and Ouija Board (GB) two years ago, it was a welcome relief. "She was very impressive at Epsom and there's always the worry that things can go wrong, but everything went great," he commented. "She's just gone from strength to strength, and the world is her's at the moment." **Cont. p2**

A REAL FOOL FOR BELMONT

Silver Train (Old Trieste) was sporting new silks for yesterday's GI Tom Fool S. at Belmont, but the result was still the same. Last year's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint hero made it five wins from seven starts over Big Sandy, posting a neck victory over a very game **War Front** (Danzig). "We have him ready at the right time," trainer Rick Dutrow said. "We're lucky with him. He came out of his last race, and I didn't think he was going to make it back over here. It's all hind-end; nothing up front. But we did some things and it happened to work out. I'm going to give him the summer off and get him ready for the [GI] Vosburgh S. [Oct. 7]. That's the only thing we've got left to do with him. I'm not going to take him to another track. I know it won't work. The Vosburgh is a Grade I, it's here at this track and we've got to do it. He'll be fresh and ready." **Cont. p3**

Since Alexandrova opened her account by 10 lengths at Tralee in August, she has been upwardly mobile and made Nannina (GB) dig deep when runner-up in the G1 Fillies' Mile at Newmarket in September. She may have needed her return when second to Short Skirt (GB) on York's testing ground in the May 17 G3 Musidora S. at York, but looked a different proposition next time at Epsom. Held up in last early here as the outsider **Flyingit** (Lear Fan) set fast fractions, she was cruising as Scottish Stage was committed early in the straight by Mick Kinane. Taken to the inside as her rivals fanned out across the track, the bay rolled to the front approaching the furlong marker and was clear in a matter of strides. "I didn't know where the pace was going to come from, but I didn't care as my filly has an electric turn of foot and I knew most of the others didn't," her rider added. "It was a small field, but it was real quality and a proper Oaks today, and she made them look ordinary."

Fallon added, "Aidan says she'll be better with a bit of cut, but I like the way she moves on top of the ground." O'Brien revealed that Alexandrova would be aimed at the G1 Yorkshire Oaks at York Aug. 23. "This is a great filly and her 0-60 is so rapid it's unbelievable," he commented. "Her pick-up makes her so special and we've tried to win this a few times, so it's a great pleasure to win. The Yorkshire Oaks is a possible and some fillies' races in France, so we'll have a meeting and decide. She has a lot of speed, and the G1 Irish Champion S. [at Leopardstown Sept. 9] is an option." Silver Train was third in the Lite the Fuse S. at Belmont last May, but hasn't tasted defeat over the Elmton oval since. He was a visually impressive six-furlong allowance winner in 1:07 3/5 at Belmont two months later, but disappointed upstate at the Graveyard of Favorites, finishing third in the GII Amsterdam S. The dark bay shrugged off that loss with impressive victories in the GII Jerome H. Sept. 11 and the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint Oct. 29, then kicked off his four-year-old campaign with an uninspiring seventh in the GII Richter Scale Breeders' Cup H. Mar. 4. Sent off at 1-2 at the Big A in a \$100,000 optional tagger Apr. 20, he rallied to finish second behind the ageless Spooky Mulder. Back to his favorite track May 29, he added the GI Metropolitan H. to his resume, and was favored to make it two straight here. With Edgar Prado aboard, he sat a stalking third on the rail behind War Front and Anew (Awesome Again), was guided to the outside for the turn for home and gamely fought his way to the front.

Fleet Indian was purchased privately at Keeneland January and hasn't lost since. She reported home a one-length victress in her first start for Todd Pletcher in the GIII Next Move H. at the Big A Mar. 26, then rolled by 12 1/2 lengths in Hawthorne's GIII Sixty Sails H. Apr. 22. Freshened after that sparkling effort, the five-year-old was equally impressive in her next start, winning Delaware's June 17 Obeah H. by 7 3/4 lengths. Heavily favored to keep her winning streak alive, the Paul Saylor colorbearer found herself on the lead through :23.94 and :48.21 fractions and won for fun beneath Jose Santos. "She had a pretty good race record before we got her," said winning trainer Todd Pletcher. "Jose has come along with his mare very well. He knows her well."

Awfully Smart earned his diploma at Delaware last August, then was placed on the shelf. The gray resurfaced with a sixth-place finish in a Gulfstream allowance Apr. 1 and followed with an impressive 7 1/4-length allowance tally over this strip Apr. 24. Sent off at 6-1 in Monmouth Park's Spend a Buck S. May 29, he finished sixth, beaten 3 1/4 lengths. Making his first start since, the Jayeff B Stables colorbearer trailed the field of six in the early stages, began to rally on the far turn and ran away and hid from 'em in the stretch. "I angled him out and kept him clear, making the lead was highly unlikely, but I was hoping to be close to the lead," said winning rider Ramon Dominguez. "I really did not want to be three wide, but the horse proved to be good enough to do so. He is a pretty nice horse."

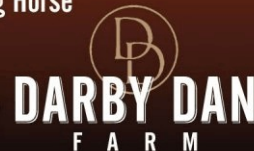

Shillelagh Slew broke his maiden over the Woodbine main Oct. 2, then was eighth as the 5-2 favorite in that track's grassy Cup and Saucer S. Oct. 16. The dark bay got back on track with a third-place finish when switched back to the dirt in the Coronation Futurity Nov. 10 and was given the rest of the year off. His sophomore season began on the right foot, notching an Apr. 29 allowance, and was most recently fifth in the June 25 Queen's Plate behind Edenwold (Southern Halo), Sterwins (Runaway Groom) and Malakoff. Sent off as the third choice here, he raced in fifth through :22.37 and :45.43 fractions and gained ground while racing four wide on the turn for home. He was forced to steady slightly in deep stretch as Malakoff took the lead and had to settle for second. Malakoff was disqualified for the infraction and placed fourth.

Egerton bounced back to his best to reward the patience of connections, who persevered despite injury to restore his career. Fourth in the G3 Preis des Winterfavoriten at Cologne in 2003, he returned the following year to finish runner-up in the G3 Bavarian Classic at Munich in May. Down the field in the G1 Deutsches Derby at Hamburg in July and G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis back at Munich the next month, he ripped up the form book when splitting Warrsan (Ire) and Shirocco (Ger) when second in the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden in September. He suffered a hairline fracture to his off-fore when fourth in the G1 Preis von Europa at Cologne later that month and returned from his lengthy spell on the sidelines this term to break his maiden at Cologne May 14. Only 11th in a conditions event at Compiègne last time June 9, he enjoyed the summer ground here, tracking the leading group before passing Nordtanzerin with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining and holding the late challenge of Song Writer.

With just three lining up and Tiger Dance running a lifeless race, this renewal was weakened significantly and it was the tough handicapper Jedburgh who emerged with the rosette. Seven furlongs is his trip and the specialist came to the fore when winning the Buckingham Palace S. at Royal Ascot at York last June. The pick of his latter efforts came when fourth in the Listed City of York S. back at that track in August and he got his picture taken again in 2006 after a conditions event at Leicester June 5. He wasn't disgraced when sixth as the highweight in the latest renewal of the Buckingham Palace back at the Royal meeting at Ascot June 22. In this one, he stalked Noelani throughout before getting the better of the game filly in the final 200 yards.

High Expectations for Market...

One need only look as far as the cover of this year's catalogue to realize that Fasig-Tipton is a solid source for talented horseflesh. In addition to GI Breeders' Cup Sprint champ Silver Train, the company also boasts among its recent graduates GI Whitney H. hero Commentator; the impressive G2 Cherry Hinton S. winner Sander Camillo; and, on Saturday, was represented by 2004 graduate Praying For Cash, victorious in the GIII Long Branch Breeders' Cup S. and bound for the GI Haskell Invitational H. Those success stories combined with a market that continues to thrive results in added optimism. "There's always a few things that give you a little anxiety, whether it be rising interest rates or the market losing 400 points last week, but there seems to be strong demand for horses, whether you're talking about yearlings or broodmare prospects or stallions prospects or racehorses," Browning says. "The game seems to be very live, so I expect the market to be very good again." Browning also anticipates strong participation from pinhookers, who by and large had a terrific two-year-old season. "I would think [the resellers] have as much or more money this year than last year," Browning suggests. "We have had some comment that the level of activity at the upper echelon--above \$150,000 to \$200,000--might be a little bit lower, but at the end of the day they're going to find horses they want. You may say you're going to stop at \$150,000, but if you really want one, you end up bidding \$225,000. Overall, the two-year-old sales were successful, people made money and that always helps."

Sixteen Million Other Reasons for Hope...

The Green Monkey was sold at last year's July sale for \$425,000 before going on to top the Calder sale at a world record \$16 million. Does that have any effect on this sale? "I think it demonstrated a couple of things. One, that you can buy an absolutely top-quality horse at this horse sale," Browning commented. "It's nice to say the most expensive horse ever sold in the world was sold here as a yearling. It's nice to see the buoyancy in the marketplace for everyone involved. The long balls is what fuels our entire industry. People play the Pick Six trying to hit the long ball, they buy yearlings trying to hit the long ball, people buy racehorses dreaming of winning the Kentucky Derby."

Browning continued, "To be in the horse business, you have to be optimistic and wake up every morning thinking what can go right and not what can go wrong. It's nice to have a tangible example so people say, 'That guy did it, maybe I can do it too.'"

New Sire Showcase Kicks Things Off...

The traditional New Sire Showcase, comprising the first 213 horses to go under the hammer, figures to be popular again among Fasig-Tipton shoppers, and Browning thinks there's much to look forward to. "As a group, it's very top-end," he commented. "There were some very high-priced stallions entering the marketplace in 2004--it was one of the better crops we've seen in a long, long time. As a result, there's some additional pedigree in this group of first-crop stallions. You go to the farms and take a look at them and it's no surprise that they were top performers at the races--they really do look the part and their babies are also looking the part." Sires represented by their first crop of yearlings include Aldebaran, Flatter, Harlan's Holiday, Hold That Tiger, Kafwain, Macho Uno, Milwaukee Brew, Posse, Proud Citizen, Repent, Sky Mesa, Sunday Break (Jpn), Trust N Luck, Van Nistelrooy, Vindication, Whywhywhy and Wiseman's Ferry. The balance of the catalogue includes offerings by Aptitude, Belong to Me, Buddha, Distorted Humor, Dixieland Band, El Corredor, Forest Camp, Forestry, Hennessy, Honour and Glory, Malibu Moon, Maria's Mon, More Than Ready, Mr. Greeley, Officer, Point Given, Smoke Glacken, Songandaprayer, Successful Appeal, Tale of the Cat, Thunder Gulch, Tiznow, Unbridled's Song, Victory Gallop and Wild Again.

Another Formidable Forestry...

While the son of Forestry--Magical Masquerade did not top last year's sale, the Taylor Made Sales Agency will lead one over this afternoon which likely appears on every short list. Consigned on behalf of Aaron and Marie Jones, [hip 217](#) is the second foal to be produced by Alizea's Song (Unbridled's Song), herself an \$850,000 yearling purchase and full sister to top second-crop sire Songandaprayer. "He's not only one of the best horses in our consignment, but he's one of the best horses that we've seen all year anywhere," commented Taylor Made's Mark Taylor. "We've got him in this sale to try to accomplish two things. To showcase a really good Forestry and to get him in a place where we think he's the centerpiece of the activity. He's got a tremendous amount of class and he's got a stallion's pedigree. He's got unlimited upside if he runs the way he looks like he should run."

Mazzonis Hoping for the White Stuff...

At 4:30 on the morning of February 17, 2006, Deebrand gave birth to a foal, but this was not your ordinary foal. About two hours into the filly's life, the veterinarian paid a visit to Nancy and Mike Mazzoni's Lost Creek Farm off Russell Cave Road near Lexington. "He said, 'That's a really nice-looking foal. What is she? An appaloosa?'" Mike Mazzoni related. A nearly perfectly white filly with some chestnut flecking and a similarly colored "medicine cap," the Mazzonis were immediately concerned that their and their vet's suspicions were true. "We called Domino Stud where she was bred and they told me they have did have an Appaloosa teaser," Mazzoni continued. "Fasig-Tipton and the Jockey Club worked with us to do some DNA testing. The vet took hair and blood samples and sent them to the University of California at Davis." A short time later, the Mazzonis got the confirmation they were looking for, that their foal was in fact a daughter of the chestnut-colored Trust N Luck, to whom the dark bay Deebrand was pronounced in foal when she went under the hammer February 13, 2005. "As luck--or maybe Trust N Luck would have it--it all worked out," Mazzoni quipped. Mazzoni admits that the very fact they ended up purchasing the mare was nearly by accident. "We were looking to provide a companion foal for our only mare that was due to foal early," Mazzoni explained. "My wife thought that particular foal would be better off if we had another foal with it--we weren't foaling anything for at least another two months. We were looking for a mare that had to foal within several weeks and we looked at several, some we liked and some we didn't. All of them exceeded the limits we had on price and we were just about to give up and leave and I turned around and I saw this mare whose belly was dragging on the ground. We hadn't looked at her seriously before, though I don't know why. She was a Gone West mare and we always liked that particular pedigree. I was surprised when I saw her that she hadn't foaled three days before, we looked at her and five minutes later we ended up with her for \$24,000."

Mazzoni can't help but gush about the filly, even if he admits he's a bit biased. "She's spectacular," he says of hip 41, consigned on behalf of Lost Creek by Darby Dan Sales. "I'm not a conformation guy; my wife's a horseperson. I'm what they call a "shovel and check" guy--I clean stalls and write the checks," he jokes, adding, "But she's huge, she's correct and is a very pretty filly with a great personality. A lot of people have come out to see her. When she's running around in the field and her tail's up, it's really something to see." The filly is one of just over 40 that the Jockey Club has registered as white dating back to the late 1890s. In recent years, the white mare Patchen Beauty won two of 23 career starts for earnings of \$54,268. Now 11 years old, she has produced a pair of registered white colts and one white filly in her five years as a broodmare.

Burleson No New Kid on the Block...

Len Burleson, the owner and operator of Burleson Farm, makes his first appearance as a consignor, but he is certainly no newcomer to the business. After Becky Thomas and Lewis Lakin announced in February that they would be commencing a reduction of their partnership ventures, the two parties swapped real estate, with Thomas assuming a portion of the former Silverleaf Farm in Florida and Lakin taking Lakland Farm in Kentucky. The former general manager for Thomas and Lakin for 10 years, Burleson now leases the farm from Lakin, where he keeps about 90 broodmares, 70 foals and 15 to 18 yearlings. "I'm not sure what size I want to be yet," Burleson says. "I'm basically doing the same thing I've always done just with a name change. I'm just paying the bills now." A majority of the Burleson consignment are New York-breds, but he has decided to bring those horses to this sale as opposed to the Saratoga Preferred sale next month. "These were horses that we thought were on a little different level than what we're sending up to New York, so we thought this sale was a good fit and we've had good success here in the past." **cont. p10**

A daughter of Guilty Pleasure (Pine Bluff), the bay is a half-sister to Ready to Please, the GII Fantasy S. winner, who has since finished second in the GIII Dogwood Breeders' Cup S. and third in the GI Mother Goose S. The Feb. 18 foal is also a half to Chief Officer, a 10-length maiden winner at first asking at Belmont Park June 30.

JLT Gets First Graded Winner...

The 2004 Fasig-Tipton July sale marked the debut of JLT Bloodstock, an outcrop of the Taylor Made Sales Agency and operated by a driven group of young horsepeople. Among the four horses in that initial consignment was a Florida-bred son of then first-crop sire Songandaprayer out of Cash No Credit (West By West), purchased by Becky Thomas for \$100,000. That colt, now known as Praying For Cash, became the operation's first graded-stakes winner when he posted a game victory in Saturday's GIII Long Branch Breeders' Cup S. at Monmouth Park. "It feels great, it's awesome," said Marshall Taylor, the son of Taylor Made's Duncan Taylor. "He was big, good-looking horse and looked like he would be able to go a distance. I knew he'd go on and do good things." Proudly displayed outside barn three is a poster with the four graduates from 2004, each now a winner. In addition to Praying For Cash, JLT also sold a son of More Than Ready--No Mud on Me (Great Above) for \$60,000. Named Frisco Star, the dark bay colt, campaigned by the Lost in the Fog connections, set a track record in his debut last August, covering 5 1/2 furlongs in an incredible 1:01 at Santa Rosa. He went on to add a Bay Meadows allowance in January and made it three-for-three with a victory in the Novato S. at Golden Gate in February. "The whole experience has been pretty neat," the junior Taylor comments. "Especially when you're making money." JLT consigns five horses to this year's sale.
