It accelerated up to and through the milliondollar threshold, and Ferguson saw off all would-be suitors, including B. Wayne Hughes, to secure the colt, who was produced by Alizea's Song (Unbridled's Song), a full sister to leading second-crop sire Songandaprayer. "He is a lovely horse, athletic," Ferguson said. "He's a horse we saw through the spring and the summer and we consistently liked him. We also have a high regard for Forestry, and obviously we have a great deal of

respect for Discreet Cat [also by Forestry]." Giving a nod to the yearling's stallion potential, he added, "His mother is a sister to Songandaprayer, so obviously he is not just an athlete. We're delighted to have him." Taylor Made consigned the colt on behalf of Aaron and Marie Jones, who purchased Alizea's

Song for \$850,000 from the Taylor Made consignment at the 2000 Keeneland July sale. For all their accomplishments, yesterday's events marked a first for the agency. "It's gratifying because we come over here every year and you never know when a horse is going to break loose," explained Mark Taylor. "We've topped [Fasig-Tipton] Saratoga five or six times in the last eight vears, but we had never sold a million-dollar horse here. Coming Full Circle...

The commercial appeal of Forestry continues to grow. He is the sire of the world-record, \$16-million The Green Monkey at Fasig-Tipton's Calder Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training, and yesterday's topper is yet another feather in the young stallion's cap. The relationship between the horse and Taylor Made dates back to 1995. "Forestry was bred by one of our very good clients, Shel Evans, and we sold him as a yearling as a sale-topper [\$1.5 million, 1997 KEEJUL]," Mark Taylor explained. "Then Mr. Jones bought him and went on and won a Grade I [1999 King's Bishop S.] with him and gave us the opportunity to stand him. So now to see him climbing the ladder of success and maybe turning into a breed-shaping stallion--to be a part of that is really what the business is all about. Then it was up to Forestry and he's really getting it done."

Recipe For Success...

What made the Forestry colt such a snug fit at the Newtown Paddocks? "For this sale you want a forward horse and he was a very forward horse from birth," Taylor offered. "He was always precocious, fast-developing. You don't want to bring a horse over here that you can pick apart [physically]. You want to bring a horse that can stand up to constant scrutiny. You want to bring a horse that has typically American appeal, but Fasig-Tipton has brought a lot more European guys in here. Forestry has shown he can be a horse that can have success everywhere."

Gainesway consigned the dark bay, a halfbrother to SW and Canadian Classic-placed Patriot Love and MSW Deputy Country. "He was a pleasant surprise, lovely colt that he was," said Gainesway's Michael Hernon. "We're very grateful to Zayat Stables and Jack Wolf and his advisor Barry Berkelhammer, who put on a tough battle for the horse and pushed the price high. Harlan's Holiday was an admirable racehorse, an attractive horse and I'm glad for Airdrie that he's getting off to a good start in the sale ring." Hernon also reflected on the day's proceedings. "I think Fasig has attracted a broad, deep market here and they are to be commended for that," he stated. "They've assembled the usual good group of athletic horses. We're glad to be back here, we've got a good group and we're going very well at the moment."

"Caramel" Finds a Home...

Hip 41, the rare white filly by Trust N Luck--Deebrand (Gone West), was purchased for \$40,000 yesterday afternoon by Naveed Chowhan, whose best runner to date is GII Alcibiades S. winner Runway Model. "I was satisfied with the price," said Darby Dan's Wayne

Sweezy, who consigned the filly. "[Trust N Luck's] average yearling price was \$28,000 coming out of January. The color was the most difficult thing to decipher. I know that she sold well because she's athletic and a very pretty filly. It was a lot of fun to have her in the consignment. The Mazzonis were also very happy

In addition to the on-track exploits of her two-year-old half-sister, hip 75 is also a half to Ready to Please, this year's GII Fantasy S. winner who was also second in the GIII Dogwood Breeders' Cup S. and third in the GI Mother Goose S.

Anything Is Posse-ble...

New Jersey-based bloodstock agent Buzz Chace went to \$300,000 for hip 65, a scopey bay filly from



the first crop of the outstanding multiple graded-stakes winning sprinter Posse (Silver Deputy). Consigned by Legacy Bloodstock as agent, the March foal was produced by the Silver Ghost mare Ghost Storm, a half-sister to Grade III winner Fast Decision and GSP City Sister. She also hails from the family of champion Dehere. "She was just a lovely filly," Chace explained. "I

Buzz Chace Jim Firios love the way she's bred--I love the Sil-

ver Ghost on the bottom. She looks like she's fast and that she might run long. She's a gorgeous filly. I thought that's what I'd have to give for her, maybe even a little bit more." Chace indicated that he did not yet know who would end up owning the filly, but said he had talked to such people as Lewis Lakin, seated to his right, and his newer client Al Gold.

Vindication Filly Gets Things Started...

An elegant filly from the first crop of 2002 Eclipse Award winning juvenile Vindication (Seattle Slew) realized a final bid of \$250,000 to lead the way early during yesterday's New Sire Showcase. Consigned by the Bluewater Sales agency of Meg Levy, the Jan. 20 foal is a daughter of Destined (Deputy Minister), a half-sister to MSW and track-record setter Day Job. The winning ticket was signed by pinhooker Jerry Bailey on behalf of Gulf Coast Farms LLC of Lance Robinson, and the new purchase is expected to resurface at a two-year-old sale early next year. "Everything we buy we'll put back on the market," Bailey explained. "We've been a Vindication fan and she comes from a nice family. It looks like she'll be early and she's a very well-balanced and athletic filly." Bluewater consigned the filly on behalf of Satish Sanan's Padua Stables, which went to \$1 million to acquire Destined out of the 1998 Keeneland July Sale. The mare was resold in foal to Yes It's True for \$150,000 at last year's Keeneland November sale. That Vindication would get off to fast start as a sire of yearlings is no surprise, based on the success of his firstcrop weanlings last fall. Eight of his nine horses were sold for an average of \$204,625.

Deja Vu All Over Again?...

It's been a meteoric rise to prominence for Sweetnorthernsaint (Sweetsouthernsaint), a ride which began late last year. After crossing the line some 16 lengths better than anything in a maiden claiming event at Laurel in December, he proceeded to win his next two and was a good third in the GIII Gotham S. in March. A 9 1/4-length victory in the GII Illinois Derby the following month saw the dark bay go off the 11-2 favorite in the GI Kentucky Derby, a race in which he made a premature move and finished seventh to Barbaro. Sweetnorthernsaint has been away since his runner-up effort in the GI Preakness S. May 20, but the buying public gets a chance to see if lightning can strike twice this afternoon. Montesacro Farm consigns hip 315, a full sibling to the talented runner. "He's a very good horse and he looks a lot like [Sweetnorthernsaint]," said Montesacro's Oscar Benavides. "He's a little bit taller than him and he's coming along pretty nicely. He's better behaved than his brother and we hope he turns out to be just as good."

I hadn't seen her since she was a yearling and we were so excited and we had a wonderful day in the stakes room. My husband was watching the competition and in the paddock he said, 'Honey, look at this other horse, she's awful

pretty,' but my eyes were right back to Ever Elusive." The object of John Mullholland's attention was Malibu Mint, winner of the 2005 Chaposa Springs H. "John went over and asked [trainer] Jim Chapman if he'd be interested in selling and he said yes. We went over and looked at her and she's a beautiful filly. We're always interested in buying another broodmare, but even though she was off form a little this spring, Jim thought she still had some run in her and it turns out he was right." And how. The Mulhollands agreed as part of the deal to leave the filly with Chapman through the end of the year and purchased her following a neck second to Ever Elusive that afternoon. The best was yet to come, however, as Malibu Mint rallied in the stretch to win last Saturday's GI Princess Rooney H. at Calder. "It was very exciting, very unexpected and very thrilling. Calder is a great place. We never thought we'd run in a Grade I race, let alone win it," Mrs. Mulholland added. The Mulhollands will try to parlay their luck this afternoon at Fasig-Tipton as the couple consigns hip 339, a filly by Smart Strike. A daughter of Liseux (Steady Growth), the bay has Distorted Humor close up in her pedigree and also counts GII Virginia Derby runner-up Seaside Retreat among her relatives. "She's got one of the best walks on a horse that I've ever seen," Martha Jane commented. "She's uncomplicated and a fluid-moving filly. She's nicely balanced and has a lovely shoulder and I think she's the entire package." The Mullhollands purchased the filly in a private transaction earlier this year.

FALLON OUT ON BAIL Kieren Fallon, charged with conspiracy to defraud Betfair customers, was released on unconditional bail alongside 10 others at the City of London Magistrates' Court yesterday. The six-time British champion jockey was told that the case will be sent to Southwark Crown Court, with the date to be set. Fallon, fellow jockeys Fergal Lynch and Darren Williams, and Shaun Lynch, Miles Rodgers and Philip Sherkle are alleged to have conspired with persons unknown between Dec. 1, 2002 and Sept.r 9, 2004 to defraud Betfair Ltd and those who placed bets with bookmakers, or through facilities provided by the Horserace Totalisator Board, by dishonestly "agreeing not to permit diverse horses ridden by Fergal Lynch, Kieren Fallon or Darren Williams to run on their merits in that riding practices would, if necessary, be used, which would interfere with the running of the horses and affect the result," and by laying both horses to lose on the exchange provided. Fallon, Lynch and Williams remain banned from riding in Britain by the Horseracing Regulatory Authority (HRA), with Fallon's appeal having been dismissed last week. He will seek an injunction in the High Court and his case could be heard in the next few days, while Lynch and Williams are yet to have their appeal hearings.



Barbaro Undate

BARBARO STABLE, COMFORTABLE WITH FOOT CAST

KENNETT SQUARE, PA...Chief of Surgery Dean Richardson reports [Monday] that Kentucky Derby winner Barbaro's vital signs are good and that he had another quiet, restful night. "He remains in stable condition, and he is eating well," said Dr. Richardson. "We continue to manage his pain successfully, and he is alert." Barbaro is tolerating his right hind leg cast well; this cast supports the repair of the injury suffered at the Preakness on May 20. To treat a severe case of laminitis in the colt's left rear hoof, last week Dr. Richardson and his surgical team performed a hoof wall resection that removed 80 percent of the hoof. Doctors then applied a modified fiberglass foot cast to protect the hoof; this foot cast will be changed as needed so that the hoof can be treated and watched for signs of infection. The foot cast is rigid and provides greater stability and support than a bandage. "It is important for people to understand that this is not a 'routine' laminitis. The care involved in treating a hoof with this degree of compromise is complex," said Dr. Richardson. Barbaro continues to be monitored closely in the Intensive Care Unit of the George D. Widener Hospital at the University of Pennsylvania's New Bolton Center. For more info on Barbaro, please see www.vet.upenn.edu.

No doubt there are plenty of breeders in Kentucky who would rather not think back to the comparatively dark days of 1988, when the bloodstock market continued to fall from the ridiculous heights it achieved four years earlier. Dispersal sales became all too common an occurrence and 1988 kicked off with the dispersal of Nelson Bunker Hunt's huge racing empire, which had earned him three Eclipse Awards for leading breeder. No fewer than 580 Hunt horses sold at Keeneland in January, including 281 mares which sold for a total of \$27,562,811.

Among those mares was the great Dahlia. Although she had just turned 18 and was barren, this brilliant daughter of Vaguely Noble and Charming Alibi drew a bid of \$1,100,000 from Allen Paulson, for whom she went on to produce the Grade I-winning Dahlia's Dreamer and the Grade II winner Llandaff.

Tough enough to race 48 times from two to six, Dahlia had been talented enough to win 10 Group 1 races during her dazzling career. Anyone who expected her exertions on the racecourse to compromise her broodmare career was in for a shock. Unlike her contemporary Allez France, who produced only five foals, Dahlia produced 13 live foals (the last at the age of 26) and as many as six of them became graded winners, including the Grade I scorers Dahar, Rivlia, Delegant and Dahlia's Dreamer.

Dahlia's yearling filly by Northern Dancer followed her into the ring, where she attracted a bid of \$1,300,000 from Sheikh Mohammed. Named Wajd, she became a Group 2 winner before producing the G1 St Leger hero Nedawi.

This family continues to come up with the goods and Golden Alibi, a three-parts sister to Dahlia by Vaguely Noble's Derby-winning son Empery, is the third dam of two fairly recent Group 1 winners in France. The first, Linda's Lad, took the 2005 Criterium de Saint-Cloud and then, four days ago, the Grand Prix de Paris was won in very encouraging style by Rail Link, a highly progressive son of Dansili.

It makes a very interesting exercise to re-read Kent Hollingsworth's foreword to the Nelson Bunker Hunt dispersal catalogue.

"This extraordinary succession of international triumphs resulted from deliberate implementation some 15 years earlier of a specific breeding theory," he wrote. "The theory, as articulated and advocated by Joe Estes, was that breeding race horses was a matter of probabilities and that the chance of breeding a good horse was more probable with a good race mare, irrespective of her pedigree, than from a mare with a good pedigree but poor race record."

In his notes on Dahlia, Hollingsworth explained, "In keeping with his practice of adding good race mares,



irrespective of their pedigrees, to his broodmare band, Hunt paid \$80,000 at the 1969 Keeneland January sale for Charming Alibi. She was a six-year-old empty mare by an ordinary stallion, Honeys Alibi, out of an unraced Hierocles mare. Charming Alibi The Blood Horse had run 71 times in four racing

seasons, had won four stakes in Detroit, and had earned \$110,483. Hunt bred her to Vaguely Noble, and Charming Alibi's first foal was

Dahlia, which was to earn a record \$1,535,443." When Charming Alibi was bred to Secretariat in his first season, she produced a colt--Canadian Bound--who raised the record price for a yearling to \$1,500,000 in 1976. Golden Alibi also sold well, making \$1,100,000 as a yearling in 1979, but she never raced.

I was reminded of this Estes theory by last week's stakes victories by two colts who now rank among the leading contenders for the St Leger. Both these colts--Soapy Danger and Linas Selection--were bred by the Jacobs' Newsells Park Stud. My impression of the stud's purchasing policy is that it is geared much more to acquiring stakes-winning mares, rather than ultra-fashionable bloodlines. Indeed, the Newsells website states, "We have invested in supreme performing mares on the racetrack and chosen the most suitable premier league stallions worldwide."

Although there are plenty of fashionably bred mares among the Newsells Park broodmare band, the quest for stakes-winning mares has also led to the acquisition of daughters of such as Bartok, Bates Motel, Distinctly North, Emperor Jones, Half A Year, Line in the Sand, Mi Cielo, Mountain Cat, Roanoke, Septieme Ciel, Sharp Victor, Stack, Take Risks, Travelling Victor and Yachtie.

The Mi Cielo mare, the CCA Oaks winner On A Soapbox, is doing very well with her Danzig colt Soapy Danger, who has added the G2 Princess of Wales's S. to his earlier success in the G3 Queen's Vase. The Line in the Sand mare, the Grade III-winning Lines of Beauty, also enjoyed stakes success for Mrs. Jacobs when Linas Selection scored for the fourth time in his last five starts.

I don't know whether it is just coincidence, but the Newsells Park broodmare band contains at least three descendants of Charming Alibi, including Dahlia's Krissy, a stakes-placed granddaughter of Dahlia, and Diamond White, an exceptionally tough winner of the G2 Prix de l'Opera whose second dam, Wedding, was a half-sister to Dahlia.

Of course, there are still plenty of breeders who would rather buy an ordinary racemare from a top family, in the hope of resurrecting the ability which made the family so fashionable.

As I said, Golden Alibi never raced, so wasn't able to show whether she possessed any of the talent which made Dahlia so special. Golden Alibi proved to be an irregular producer, but she did leave a sizeable legacy in the shape of her Riverman filly Dockage. A very useful Listed winner over 1 1/8 miles in France, Dockage was very closely related to Dahlia's Riverman colt Rivlia, a Grade I winner on turf from 1 1/4 miles to 1 3/4 miles in California.

Dockage started her broodmare career in fine style, her first three foals being Rail Link's dam Docklands, the G3 July S. winner Wharf and Linda's Lad's dam Colza.

Dockland's shared the same sire, Theatrical, as Dahlia's Grade I-winning daughter Dahlia's Dreamer and, like Dahlia's Dreamer, took time to flourish. However, Docklands made up for lost time by winning five of her 10 starts as a four-year-old.

Docklands was a natural choice to send to Dansili in his second season in 2002, as she had already done very well with another grandson of Danzig. A visit to Grand Lodge had resulted in her smart son Chelsea Manor, winner of the G3 La Coupe de Maisons-Laffitte over 1 1/4 miles at three and third twice at Group 1 level at four.

Rail Link's triumph at Longchamp was just one of numerous victories by Dansili's progeny last week. It was only a few weeks ago that I pointed out that Dansili's sire Danehill was capable of getting important winners over all sorts of distances, and Dansili is following his example. His two-year-old son Strategic Prince produced an impressive finishing burst to win the G2 July S. over six furlongs earlier in the week and Dansili is also sire of Price Tag, a filly who was unlucky to be demoted after winning the G1 French 1000 Guineas.

There are currently 19 runners by Dansili with Racing Post ratings of at least 92, with 10 of them rated 100 or more, and these 19 are likely to be joined before too long by several of Dansili's promising third-crop juveniles. His sons Thousand Words and Codeword both showed considerable potential in winning over six furlongs on their respective debuts, and his daughter Supposition earned a Group 1 entry with her close second to an Aidan O'Brien hotpot on her first appearance. Vasilia and Alexander Goldmine, two unraced two-year-old fillies by Dansili, also hold Group 1 engagements, so they too should be names to remember.



CHURCHILL TO SELL ELLIS PARK Churchill Downs Inc. has reached an agreement to sell Ellis Park to a company owned by Kentucky businessman and horse owner Ron Geary. The purchase price was not revealed. As the transaction will not be finalized until after July 19, the opening day of Ellis's 2006 meet, CDI has inked a deal wherein Geary will take over the management of the track until the sale is completed. The Kentucky Horse Racing Authority yesterday endorsed that agreement. The two companies also came to terms regarding racing dates over the next five years. Ellis Park used to open in early July, racing over the July 4 holiday, but in recent years, Churchill was open over Independence Day, and Ellis began its meet in mid-July. Under the new agreement, both tracks will apply for dates over the holiday weekend, and Churchill will close after the first week in July. "Churchill Downs Incorporated is pleased to have found for Ellis Park a new owner who is passionate about horse racing and ready to focus his full attention on the track and its prospects for the future," said Michael Miller, CDI's executive vice president and chief financial officer. "Ellis Park is an important link in our state's year-round racing circuit and provides a summer 'home' for Kentucky-based horsemen." He continued, "CDI acquired Ellis Park eight years ago to preserve that year-round circuit. Today, we believe Ellis Park will benefit from an independent operator such as Ron Geary, who as a successful businessman and racehorse owner approaches this new opportunity with enthusiasm and a vision for this historic property." Geary added, "I am excited to take the reins at Ellis Park at a pivotal time in the track's 85-year history. The track has faced its share of challenges to be sure, including a [2005] tornado that almost leveled the facility. But today, a rebuilt and rejuvenated Ellis Park is focused on the future and ready to welcome horsemen and race fans back for another season of live racing. I am focused on building a solid future for Ellis Park."

Illinois Racing Board Probe Finds Arlington Strip Safe:

The Illinois Racing Board, responding to the high number of horses euthanized after breaking down during the current meet at Arlington Park, hired an independent racetrack consultant to inspect the surface and issue a report. Gregory Coon of Charles E. Coon & Sons, which has designed, constructed and maintained tracks for 50 years, spent two days assessing the Arlington main track and found it "remarkably consistent and uniform," according to a press release from the IRB. He added that there was no aspect of the track that he would consider unsafe. "This report from Mr. Coon is the latest in the board's efforts to analyze every factor that might have caused or contributed to this cluster of breakdowns," said IRB Executive Director Marc Laino. "Mr. Coon's analysis, taken with all other information available at this time, has not identified any defect in the track surface as a cause or contributor to these breakdowns. Regrettably, neither the board nor Arlington Park has been able to identify a unifying cause for these events. Our ongoing efforts will include close examination of the affected horses' veterinarian records and discussions with those trainers involved. the racing secretary, and our own staff. In the meantime, we have stepped up our pre-race examinations of horses in order to make doubly sure every horse that goes to the post at Arlington is sound. This is a matter of profound importance to the entire racing community, and the public should be aware that the IRB is doing everything it can to protect our jockeys and horses from injury." Responding to the report, Arlington President Roy Arnold said, "This verifies what our expert Joe King concluded, and what we have believed all along. We are also very appreciative of the efforts of the IRB and their expert in addressing this critical issue as quickly as they have. Arlington Park will continue to cooperate fully with the racing board to address all issues concerning the safety of the horses and jockeys who race at our track."
