

Blood-Horse

GUENTHER SHOOTS, SCORES PULPIT COLT

Like a hockey player who puts a one-timer into the corner of the goal, Scott Guenther made a single bid to secure hip 353 at \$760,000, the highest price on the

second and final day of trade at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July Yearlings Sale in Lexington. Guenther signed the ticket in the name of his Desperado Stables. Widely expected to top the session, the handsome bay colt by Pulpit--Mayhavebeentheone (Arch) was consigned to the sale by John Mayer's Nursery Place agency. Observing the action from the north side of the rear walking ring, Guenther watched intently before nodding his head when the tote read

\$750,000. "I just thought he was the best colt in the sale. It was between him and the Forestry [hip 217] and this was my pick between the two of them," said Guenther, who is based in Newport Beach, California, but also maintains racing operations in the Midwest and New York. "The Forestry may have been more refined than this one, but this horse just had more bone and looks like my kind of horse." The Mar. 14 foal is from an outstanding female family and was produced by a half-sister to MGSW and first-crop yearling sire Wiseman's Ferry. The cross has already clicked in the family, as Pulpit's son Sky Mesa was produced by Caress, a half-sister to the dam of Wiseman's Ferry. As was the case for many other shoppers, Guenther found that a good horse was tough to halter at Fasig-Tipton July. "This was the third horse that I bid on, but the first one that I've been able to get," he said, adding that hip 353 was his focus all along. Desperado Stables has campaigned such runners as GI Santa Anita Derby hero Buddy Gil, the good sprinter Freespool, GISP Easy Grades and the solid multiple-stakes winner Aviate.

JAZIL SIDELINED

Diagnosed with a bruised cannon bone in his right rear leg, Shadwell Stable's Jazil (Seeking the Gold) will

not start in the Aug. 26 GI Travers S. at Saratoga. According to trainer Kiaran McLaughlin, the GI Belmont S. winner has been shipped to his owner's farm in Lexington, where he will be given 30 days off. McLaughlin hopes that the colt will be back in time to make the Oct. 7 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont. He said another possibility is that Jazil could make his next start in the Nov. 4 GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill, training up to that race. It is expected that he will run next year as a

four-year-old. "It's not a big deal," McLaughlin said of the injury. "If he wasn't who he is, we wouldn't even have been looking at him so carefully. But it's a good thing we found it when we did and found that a little something was going on. But it won't require surgery. Nothing is happening other than bruising of the right rear cannon bone. He is a very lightly framed horse who doesn't require a lot of training and he won't lose a lot of fitness with 30 days off. Obviously, we will miss the Travers. The first race we have hopes of making is the Jockey Club Gold Cup." The Travers was expected to feature a showdown between GI Preakness S. winner Bernardini and Jazil.

Barbaro **Update**

BARBARO'S CASTS CHANGED

KENNETT SQUARE, PA...Kentucky Derby winner Barbaro remains in stable condition with good vital signs after a restful night, according to Chief of Surgery Dean Richardson. "Yesterday afternoon we changed his right hind leg cast to take new radiographs and to examine the incision," said Dr. Richardson. "The radiographs looked good; the plates we placed on July 8 to fuse the pastern are intact and the fetlock fusion is unchanged. The leg and the incision looked as good as we could have hoped."

The right hind leg cast supports the repair of the injury suffered at the Preakness on May 20, and it extends from the colt's foot to just below his hock.

The modified foot cast, which acts like a bandage on Barbaro's left hind foot, was also changed yesterday. The foot cast is rigid and provides stability and support, but will be changed often so that the hoof can be treated. Both cast changes were performed with Barbaro lightly sedated in a sling. He has adapted very well to being managed as needed in the sling. "He is a very intelligent horse," said Dr. Richardson.

Barbaro continues to be monitored closely in the Intensive Care Unit of the George D. Widener Hospital at the University of Pennsylvania's New Bolton Center.

FUTURE UNCERTAIN FOR 'FOG' The connections of Lost in the Fog (Lost Soldier) are contemplating his retirement after a lackluster performance in the GII Smile Sprint H. at Calder July 15, according to Daily

Racing Form. After returning to his Golden Gate base yesterday, the four-year-old will get a freshener before returning to training; a decision on his future will then be made. "We're not leaning one way or the other," Gilchrist told DRF. "We'll give him time to get his feet underneath him and see

how he is. We want to determine if he can be competitive at the level he should be. If it were going to take two or three months to bring him back, and there was only one race left for him this year, we'd probably retire him." Recipient of an Eclipse Award as the nation's top sprinter in 2005, Lost in the Fog was the even-money favorite and 125-pound highweight in the Smile, but never factored and wound up ninth. "You can't put a positive spin on it," Gilchrist added. "It's the first time I've seen him not try. He carried a lot of weight, but that had nothing to do with running that poorly. He's got a lot of problems, things like quarter cracks and bumps and bruises. It's nothing life-threatening or career-ending, but they catch up with him." The Floridabred rattled off 10 straight wins to begin his career, but sustained his first loss when seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint Oct. 29. He finished second in his 2006 opener before taking Churchill's GIII Aristides BC H. June 3. Gilchrist also said that the three-year-old filly Victorina (Delaware Township), whom he saddled to victory in the GIII Azalea Breeders' Cup S. on the Smile undercard, would not return East for the GI Darley Test S. at Saratoga Aug. 5. "That's only 2 1/2 weeks away," Gilchrist continued. "That ain't going to work."

A Smart Purchase...

Bloodstock agent Joe Brocklebank bid \$410,000 for a filly by Smart Strike, the top price paid yesterday for a member of the fairer sex. Brocklebank signed the ticket on behalf of a client that's new to the game whom Brocklebank declined to identify. "I liked everything about her," he said of the filly, purchased earlier this year and prepared for the sale by John and Martha Jane Mulholland. "She's beautiful and a big, elegant filly, one of the few in the sale." He added, "The stallion is very reliable; he keeps coming up with good horses, I'm surprised more people weren't on her." Even if she doesn't work out at the racetrack, she has plenty of residual value as a broodmare. The bay was produced by a half-sister to Sweetest Chant, the granddam of Distorted Humor, and also hails from the family of Seaside Retreat, winner since the catalogue of the Charley Barley S. on the Woodbine turf and runner-up in last Saturday's GII Virginia Derby after an tough trip.

Kafwain Colt a Most Profitable Pinhook...

A colt from the first crop of three-time graded-stakes winner Kafwain (Cherokee Run), purchased for just \$40,000 as a weanling last November, was hammered down to Zayat Stables for \$485,000 yesterday afternoon. The dark bay is the first foal produced by Peyvon (Slewacide), a regional stakes winner at Fair Meadows Tulsa who represents nearly all of the black type on the colt's page. So, what was it about him that made him such a coveted offering? "He had balance and athleticism and he's by a very good young sire," explained Taylor Made's Mark Taylor. "I thought going in that he was going to bring a lot of money. I thought \$250,000 or \$300,000. He was so good physically, and those types just rise above their pedigrees. The horse was very well prepped and well raised, and everything worked out." Kafwain, second to former stablemate Vindication in the 2002 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, stands for a fee of \$10,000 alongside his sire at Darley at Jonabell.

Wolfs More Than Ready for Fasig-Tipton...

Bloodstock advisor Barry Berkelhammer, bidding on behalf of his clients Jack and Laurie Wolf and partners, was extended to \$375,000 for hip 320, a lovely dark bay filly by More Than Ready, who has already sired several graded-stakes winning fillies. Consigned by the Eaton Sales agency of Tom Van Meter and Reiley Mc-Donald, the Apr. 10 foal is a granddaughter of GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Twilight Ridge; she was produced by Itsmylife, an unraced Storm Cat half-sister to GII Demoiselle S. winner La Rosa. "I thought she was the best More Than Ready in the sale," said Berkelhammer. "She was a real athlete and she had a lot of Storm Cat coming out in her. We love her pedigree and she looks like a racehorse." The sale came as little surprise to her consignor. "According to Fasig-Tipton, she had a record number of repository hits," Van Meter explained. "Twenty-six individual buying entities decided to work her up. She was awesome. She's completely balanced, she had a big walk and showed herself extremely well and continued to do so

throughout the week. We hope she turns into Ashado." Maurice Miller was the immediate underbidder on the filly and Van Meter, who often partners with Miller in pinhooking ventures, admitted that would have been the case had Miller succeeded. Wolf added that this, in addition to his other purchases at the sale,

would be divided up among himself, Donald Luccarelli, Paul Saylor and Jonathan Kurtin. It's been tough sledding for the team. "We have the exact same program that we had when we started this, the problem is that we were buying nice horses back then for \$100,000 to \$125,000 and it seems you just can't buy those horses like that anymore," Wolf commented. "That's why it's nice to have partners--it lessens the pain a little bit." He also reflected on the performance thus far of youngsters by his former stable star Harlan's Holiday. "He's got some super-looking yearlings and, hopefully, it carries into August and September," he said.

Oscar Benavides' Montesacro Farm consigned a pair of horses to yesterday's session, with somewhat mixed results. Hip 315, the full brother to GII Illinois Derby winner Sweetnorthernsaint, was well received in the ring, but bidding stalled at \$210,000, a bit shy of the horse's reserve. Things took a turn for the better later on, when hip 374, a filly by Quiet American--Our Seattle Star (Seattle Song), was purchased for \$340,000 by Dennis Yokum, acting as agent for Ernie Moody's Mercedes Stable. "I'm very happy. We can fix a lot of fences with that," said a teary-eyed Benavides shortly after exchanging hugs with his help and other wellwishers. "There were a lot of people involved. My son helped my prepare her. Someone told me she was the best filly today. We had almost 200 people come and look at her. She's just a beautiful filly."

Quarter-Million Dollar Grey Colts in First Hour...

A pair of colts were knocked down for \$250,000 within the first hour of bidding yesterday morning. The first of those was hip 249, a colt by Yes It's True--Cocktail (Relaunch). The grey, consigned to the sale by Taylor Made, is a full brother to True Tails, a three-time stakes winner of \$209,630. Pinhookers Hoby and Layna Kight will prepare the colt for next year's juvenile sales. "He had a very racy look to him and he looks like he's forward and could be early and fits what I'm trying to do," Hoby Kight commented. "He's a strong-looking colt." The veteran horseman admits to having to work overtime this week. "It's been tough, but you have to be willing to spend that kind of money if you want to be successful down the line," he says. "I find that I'm having to pay more money that I wanted to, but that's what you have to do." Three hips later, Barry Berkelhammer signed the ticket on an eye-catching grey colt by successful young sire Forest Camp. Bidding on behalf of Starlight Stables' Jack Wolf and Donald Luccarelli, the bloodstock advisor went to the quartermillion dollar mark for a son of Comfort Zone (Rubiano) from the consignment of Clarkland Farm. Starlight and Luccarelli also own a two-year-old half-sister, Come Together (Dixie Union), a \$360,000 Keeneland September yearling who broke her maiden at Churchill Downs May 20.

If Not Less, Than Better Is More...

Officials at Fasig-Tipton made a concerted effort to improve the quality of this year's catalogue by tightening their standards and reducing the size of the book. By all accounts, the strategy has proved successful. The average posted a 15-percent gain over last year, while the median strengthened by a very encouraging 20 percent. "The numbers couldn't be much stronger and we had good horses and people wanted them, thank goodness," said Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson. "I think this year we had less horses that didn't fit. Better is more. One of our goals when we sat down after last year was to get a higher percentage of horses that fit this market." The question now becomes what to do a year from now. It has been borne out statistically that when a "successful" sale in one year leads to a growth in the catalogue for the next, there is a fall-off in the numbers. While Robertson was not yet willing to commit to a course of action for 2007, his general inclination is to say that if it ain't broke, don't fix it. "This is an awfully good sale, so our meetings coming up on what to do next year shouldn't vary too much from the way we approached this year," he stated. Robertson thinks the foundation has been set for an excellent yearling sales season. "I think it was a real strong market for horses, and people do want horses," he commented. "I think that bodes well for our next sale."

BACK IN FLIGHT

Last Friday, a dozen students representing a variety of backgrounds became the second class to graduate from the Darley Flying Start program.

A ceremony at Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket, England, culminated two years' worth of hard work that saw trainees visit, and study at, some of the best breeding farms and premier racetracks in Thoroughbred racing.

The graduation was also, in a way, a celebration of an idea first hatched by Darley's Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum. Welcoming its first students 2003, Darley Flying Start was Sheikh Mohammed's way of giving something back to racing: a wide-ranging course --the cost of which is covered entirely by Darley--that teaches a diverse group everything from bloodlines and veterinary care to farriery and finance.

The class of 2006, which began the program in August of 2004, includes the citizens of six countries. They are: Ajay Anne (India), Matthew Coleman (England), Andrew Fuller (England), Gary Hadden (Ireland), Ben Haslam (England), Eoin Kelly (Northern Ireland), Katherine McMahon (USA), Gillian Martin-Smith (Ireland), Kevin Sommerville (South Africa), Brianne Stanley (USA), Brent Wilson (USA), and Victoria Tremlett (England). And They're Off...

The question of 'What now?' can burden the mind of a graduate like an unrelenting months-long hangover. Remarkably, the 2006 Flying Start members barely had time to ponder the question before being snapped up by various operations. A day after receiving their Flying Start certificates, all had jobs lined up, though a few had yet to finalize the details.

Brent Wilson returns to one of the places where he

got his start: Pin Oak Stud in Versailles, Kentucky. Wilson, who grew up on a small farm in Batesville, Indiana, worked for Pin Oak as a barn foreman prior to joining Flying Start. He rejoins Pin Oak with a wealth of experience--and a promotion. Wilson is now part of Pin Oak's management team.

Though he cherishes the time he spent at Flying Start, Wilson is eager to begin his new job.

"There are a ton of emotions these days," he said. "I'm definitely ready to move forward. But it's been a great two years--the best two years of my life. It's sad to leave Flying Start, but I think everybody is excited to be moving forward, to embark upon the next step of our careers."

One aim of Flying Start is to expose its trainees to different ways of doing things. As a result, Wilson comes back to the U.S. with an enhanced perspective on how horses are cared for, thanks largely to the time he spent working at breeding farms in Australia.

"Everything on the stud farms there are done completely different than in the States and in England and Ireland--the Northern Hemisphere," Wilson said. "It was great to learn how to do things that you've been doing your whole life, but in a completely different way."

An example of this, says Wilson, is the way in which horses are foaled and raised.

"The horses are kept out year round; the only barns on the farm would be a hospital barn for sick horses and the stallion barns," he said. "The mares foal outside, the horses are raised outside their entire lives, and they're treated more like herd animals. You would actually herd them around on four-wheelers, mares and foals and everything. That was a bit of fun. There were laneways and corrals by your different pastures and paddocks, and you would actually herd the animals through rather than walking them one by one. There is a lot lower staff-to-horse ratio in Australia."

Wilson also puts Dubai on the list of places that made an indelible impression on him.

"Dubai is really neat. It's a great place to visit," said Wilson. "Sheikh Mohammed's dreams become realities there. It's amazing to see what they've done in the middle of the desert."

The Flying Start students even had a chance to meet and lunch with Sheikh Mohammed on an especially memorable afternoon.

Asked if meeting the Ruler of Dubai was an intimidating experience, Wilson said, "Far from it. He was very normal--he drove himself, was very easy to talk to. He told many stories about his passion for horses and how he came about his different ideas for the business. He was very laid back and we spent two or three hours with him. It was one of the most special experiences of the course."



Change of Direction...

A serendipitous day of internet surfing a few years

ago landed Anne on the Darley website. China Visit, who won the 2000 UAE Derby and ran sixth in Fusaichi Pegasus's Kentucky Derby wearing the blue silks of Sheikh Mohammed's Godolphin, was coming to India to stand stud, and Anne was looking up information on the son of Red Ransom.

"I was trying to see when

he raced, who did he race for, what his career was like, and ended up on the Darley site," explained Anne. "I looked at the program, which is kind of something which you can't believe. But I went ahead and applied for it."

Anne was accepted. Two years later, he credits the Flying Start program with providing him an invaluable education.

"Going to the races, going to all these big events, was obviously a highlight," he said. "But as far as learning is concerned, we had lectures from some really renowned people in the industry, and we've done a lot of work on pedigrees, which I really liked."

Anne's experience altered the course he originally planned to take in the industry. After learning from the likes of Headley Bell of Nicoma Bloodstock in Kentucky and Vin Cox of Vin Cox Bloodstock in Australia, Anne now plans to focus his attention on the breeding industry.

"When I joined the course, I imagined that I would go back into racing administration, but now my area of interest is more in bloodstock," explained Anne. "Things do change."

Anne hopes to someday make an impact on the Indian breeding scene, which has taken strides over the past decade as the Indian economy continues to grow.

"I would like to get some nice horses to India-broodmares and stallions," he said. "They've started to export horses from India to Korea and some Asian countries, and I'd like to work on that."

For now, those plans will be put on the back burner as Anne prepares to return to Dubai later this summer, not as a student, but as an industry professional. The specifics of Anne's new job have not been announced.

Summing up his Flying Start experience, Anne said, "I can't believe the amount of things I've learned in two years."

Breaking From the Starting Gate...

Having learned from the inaugural Flying Start class, Darley officials say they were able to tweak the program for the second go-round. The timing of certain courses were shuffled, and New Zealand was added as a Flying Start locale.

"We managed them slightly differently," explained Clodagh Kavanagh, general manager of Flying Start. "The management of the program has been a little bit tighter and a little more structured. As regard to placement, in this particular group, two of them [Andrew Fuller and Kate McMahon] went to New Zealand, which is the first time we sent anyone over there."

The announcement of where Flying Start graduates will begin their new jobs reflects the far-ranging scope of the program, both in terms of geography and its syllabus.

"After the course, there will be some based in Ireland, England, America, Dubai and Australia," said Kavanagh. "The jobs will go from bloodstock agent and assistant nominations manager through to assistant farm manager, and one of them is setting up as a self-employed bloodstock consultant."

For her part, Kavanagh says there's a certain amount of pride sending out the Darley Dozen entrusted to her care for two years.

"It's a bit like being a trainer," she said. "I feel like I've led them up to the track for the races, and now they have to show what they can do on their own."




