light with a fluent fifth stakes score under a three kilogram penalty in yesterday's G3 Grand Prix de Vichy. Having backed up that Stateside effort with a second victory in the G2 Prix Dollar at Longchamp Oct. 1, he finished off the board in both Oct. 15 G1 Champion S. at Newmarket and Dec. 11 G1 Hong Kong Cup at Sha Tin, but returned

this term to bag the Mar. 2 G2 Jebel Hatta S. at Nad al Sheba before a last out eighth in the G1 Dubai Duty Free at the same track Mar. 25. Settled in the wake of the leader's sedate early pace, the crowd's third choice was produced for his run approaching the final furlong and outsprinted Ruwi (GB) (Unfuwain) for an easy win. We've had a number of reasons over the last two or three years to remark on the emergence of A.P. Indy as

a sire of sires. We were reminded of this again over the weekend when Malibu Mint (Malibu Moon) upset the GI Princess Rooney H., while Silver Train (by Old Trieste) took the GII Tom Fool H. Malibu Moon and Old Trieste--who sadly is no longer with us--join Pulpit, Golden Missile and Stephen Got Even to form a quintet of A.P. Indy sons who have

sired Grade I winners in their first two crops.

Given that A.P. Indy is generally regarded as an influence for ability over Classic distances, it's interesting to note that both of this weekend's graded stakes wins for horses by his sons came in sprints. If that is not typical of the A.P. Indy line, the same could be said of the brief career of Malibu Moon. He was in action as early as the end of April in his two-year-old season, taking second in a four-furlong maiden at Hollywood Park. A month later Malibu Moon captured a five-furlong maiden race at the same track in the fast time of :57.41. Unfortunately, he came out of that race with a knee chip, and was retired to stand at Country Life Farm in Maryland at a fee of \$3,000. Porter cont. p3

EVANS NAMED CHURCHILL DOWNS PREZ, CEO

Churchill Downs Incorporated's board of directors yesterday named Robert L. Evans as its new president and chief executive officer. Evans succeeds Thomas H.

Despite his modest stud fee, Malibu Moon's merits as a sire were not long in being revealed. His first crop, two-year-olds of 2003, has so far produced seven stakes winners, headed by Perfect Moon, who took the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship and GII Best Pal S. Malibu Moon's second crop has been even better in terms of quality, the six stakes winners including not only Malibu Mint, but also Declan's Moon, who earned honors as champion two-year-old male after taking the GIII Hollywood Prevue S., GII Del Mar Futurity and GI Hollywood Park Futurity during an undefeated juvenile season. Sidelined since taking the GII Santa Catalina S. last February in his lone start at three, Declan's Moon returned last Sunday to finish a very close second in an allowance event, his first start in 16 months.

Malibu Moon's third crop, currently three-year-olds, has so far produced four stakes winners, headed by Ah Day, a two-time black-type winner who took second in this weekend's GIII Leonard Richards S. That comes to a total of 17 stakes winners from the 173 foals in Malibu Moon's first crop, a figure of very nearly 10 percent. Admittedly, this does include several stakes winners in restricted Maryland-bred company, but when one considers the stud fee at which these horses were conceived, it's hard to escape the conclusion that Malibu Moon is a very good sire indeed.

Of course, this bright start did not go unnoticed in Kentucky, and for the 2004 season, Malibu Moon moved to Castleton Lyons, where he covered at a fee of \$10,000. For the most recent season he was fully booked at the same farm at a fee of \$30,000.

In terms of pedigree and performance, one would think that Malibu Mint's dam, Ivory Mint, would have been one of the best mares to visit Malibu Moon in his

early seasons. A daughter of Key to the Mint, Ivory Mint won the B. Thoughtful Handicap at Hollywood Park and took second in the California Cup Distaff H. and third in the Survive S. A half-sister to the group-placed Lyphard horse Falstaff--a useful sire in the Cal-bred program--Ivory Mint was out of Sir Ivor's daughter, Ivorina, a Listed winner in Ireland and

herself a sister to the GII Breeder's Futurity winner Sir Bordeaux. The quality in the family continued into the third dam, Double Damask, who was unraced, but was by Damascus, out of My Sister Kate, a full to Raise a Native, who set a new track record for 6½ furlongs at Keeneland and took second in the Falls City H.

At the time she visited Malibu Moon, however, those credentials had done little for Ivory Mint's stud career. Of her three foals born prior to Malibu Mint, only one made it to the races, and none had won (in fact, Malibu Mint remains her only winner to date). This disappointing start to her mother's career was probably one of the reasons that Malibu Mint realized only \$15,000 at the 2003 Keeneland September Yearling Sales, a figure which made her only 16th of the 19 Malibu Moon yearlings sold that year.

It's likely that much of the speed and precocity which Malibu Moon both displayed--and seems to be passing on--comes from the distaff side of his pedigree. Malibu Moon's dam Macoumba, a daughter of Mr. Prospector, won the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac over a mile in France at two. Her dam, Maximova, took the seven-furlong G1 Prix Salamandre at two, and two more group sprints at three. Bred to Malibu Moon's grandsire Seattle Slew, Maximova produced Septieme Ciel, a two-time group winner at two, and successful in the seven-furlong G1 Prix de la Foret at three. Alan Porter cont. p4

The distaff side of Malibu Moon's pedigree could be the deciding factor in the background of Malibu Mint, too. Since Malibu Moon's broodmare sire, Mr. Prospector, is by Raise a Native, and since Malibu Mint's fourth dam is a sister to Raise a Native, Malibu Mint has the siblings 4x4 in her pedigree. The My Sister Kate/Raise a Native combination is found in several other good horses, too. They include the brilliantly speedy West Coast filly Go Go, who was by Falstaff (half-brother to Malibu Mint's dam) out of a mare by a son of Malibu Mint's broodmare sire, Key to the Mint, giving a very similar genetic background to Malibu Mint, and the multiple-graded-stakes-winning Molto Vita, by Mr. Prospector's son Carson City; and with a second dam who was three-parts sister to Ivorina, the second dam of Malibu Mint. BARBARO STABLE, COMFORTABLE WITH FOOT CAST

KENNETT SQUARE, PA...Chief of Surgery Dean Richardson reports that Kentucky Derby winner Barbaro remains in stable condition with good vital signs today. "Barbaro spends several hours a day in a sling, which he has adapted to very well," said Dr. Richardson.

Slings, which were originally designed for rescuing horses, are now common in the treatment of horses with conditions that include neurological problems or muscular skeletal injuries. They have been in use for many years for long-term management of a horse's movement. "We have a lot of experience in using slings for equine support," said Dr. Richardson. "In Barbaro's case, it is a part-time aid that we use to increase his comfort level."

BACK TO THE FUTURE

After adding 180 head to the catalogue in 2005 to get 30 more yearlings sold, Fasig-Tipton's July Sale went back to what has historically been the right size



catalogue this year, and the results were rewarding. With only 18 (4 percent) fewer catalogued this year (477) as in 2004 (495), there were significantly more outs--15 percent this year, versus nine percent in 2004. So 10 percent fewer horses went though the ring this year (407) than in 2004 (452), and the gross was \$35,598,000, some eight percent below the record 2004 gross of \$38,620,000. But the average of \$115,954 topped the 2004 average

of \$114,260 by about 1.5 percent, and 75 percent of those offered were listed sales this year, the same percentage as in 2004. The numbers show, definitively, that demand for 'the \$100,000 yearling' continues at record levels--and yes, the reason I'm comparing 2006 to 2004 is that last year was anomalous because, as Fasig has pointed out themselves, too many horses were catalogued.

Again and again this week, the value of a really good prospect was set at plus-or-minus \$300,000; that's the


price you had to be prepared to go to, in order to be in as a finalist for the star individuals. Fasig was rightfully proud to sell a seven-figure yearling: the \$1.2-million Forestry colt (hip 217, out of a full sister to Songandaprayer, from the family of Montbrook), to John Ferguson--for the first time in 23 years. Also, a Pulpit colt brought \$760,000, but these were the

only two to sell for more than \$500,000. There was a lot of very solid trade, and a median of \$90,000 (a high 78 percent of the average) also tells you that demand was consistent as well as strong.

It looked a strong group of first-yearling sires going into Monday's New Sire Showcase, and so it proved. Even though this sire crop's top two representatives, Mineshaft (none catalogued) and Empire Maker (one, bought back), are not yet on the scoreboard, the other three of this group's projected top five all sold well, as did a number of other first-yearling sires. No fewer than eight registered six-figure averages (over \$100,000) at Fasig.

Considering only those sires which had two or more sell at Fasig, Vindication, as expected, topped the charts: his two to sell brought \$250,000 and \$300,000, so he averaged \$275,000. Pulpit's son Sky Mesa, the second-best two-year-old of 2002 (behind

Vindication), proved very popular, his five to sell averaging \$182,400. Not far behind him was 2003 champion sprinter Aldebaran, whose four to sell all seemed well received and averaged \$173,750. The 2002 Breeders' Cup Juvenile form got another boost as Kafwain, second to Vindication that day, finished a close-up fourth

among this sire crop in yearling average, after a \$485,000 colt on Tuesday lifted the average for his seven sold to \$169,000. The good sprinter Hook and Ladder, now standing in New York, had two average \$161,000, one (a half-sister to a Grade II winner and 10-length two-year-old winner) bringing \$310,000, and the other bringing \$12,000. The speedy Silver Deputy horse Posse had only six sold of 12 catalogued, but the six that did sell averaged an impressive \$148,333. Whywhywhy, winner of three graded stakes as a two-year-old, had four average \$133,750 on Monday. Airdrie's triple Grade I winner Harlan's Holiday had 14 at Fasig average \$120,857, rounding out the top eight first-yearling sires there with six-figure averages and two or more sold. Yankee Gentleman, another Airdrie sire, just missed a six-figure average, as seven yearlings by him averaged \$96,571. Another eight first-yearling sires averaged over \$60,000, suggesting this crop of sires displays depth as well as class.

Frosh Sires Stay Fresh...

Sires with their first two-year-olds this year (first crop of racing age)--are eligible to be especially vulnerable, depending, obviously, on how they're doing up till now. Though the number offered by this group of sires was obviously significantly fewer than when their first yearlings were selling in 2005, their averages generally held up quite well.

Johannesburg, who has now jumped up to number two on the Freshman Sire list, led the group, his four averaging \$142,500. Jump Start (two, averaged \$125,000) and Officer, Leading Freshman Sire (six, averaged \$117,500) were the only other two from this sire group with two or more sold which beat the sale average of just under \$116,000, but another five-- E Dubai, Include, Buddha, Yonaguska, and Came Home-all averaged \$85,000 or more. Among second-crop sires (that's second crop of racing age, first three-year-olds), the leaders were Songandaprayer, whose 10 sold (from 10 offered) averaged \$160,000; Forest Camp, whose nine sold (of 11 offered) averaged \$128,556; and Tiznow, whose three sold averaged \$124,000. Of the sires with first four-year-olds, you couldn't help but be impressed with More Than Ready: he had nine catalogued, nine offered, and nine sold, averaging \$157,778.

Groups and individuals trying to influence the future direction of horse racing in New York have opened their wallets to statewide candidates and campaigns of legislators who will have a role in picking a new owner of the franchise to operate Aqueduct, Belmont, and Saratoga racetracks.

The biggest beneficiary--by far--from equine interests over the past six months was Democratic Attorney General Eliot Spitzer, who is far ahead in the polls in the governor's race, according to filings made public this week by the state Board of Elections.


A number of entities vying for the franchise now held by the New York Racing Association pumped money into Spitzer's campaign, including \$10,000 from TVG and its parent and at least \$5,000 from Delaware North and its subsidiaries.

Among his top donors was WinStar Farm co-owner Bill Casner, chairman of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association who also serves on the board of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association's political action committee. Casner gave \$50,000 and the NTRA donated \$4,000 to Spitzer.

Hollywood Park to Add Six-Furlong Turf Chute:

Hollywood Park, which just concluded its spring/summer meet, plans to build a new six-furlong chute for the Lakeside Turf Course. The chute will be constructed on the inside of the one-mile course and is scheduled to be completed in time for the opening of the 36-day Autumn Meet Nov. 1. "It will tuck up against the clubhouse turn," said Martin Panza, vice president of racing. "We took several riders out to have a look at the layout and they were all very happy with the idea." The new layout means that turf sprints will now be run at six furlongs rather than 5 1/2 furlongs. A starting gate will remain in the infield for races beginning in the existing 1 1/4-mile chute and the new six-furlong chute. "It will reduce traffic on the course, because the gate won't be rolling on the backstretch every time we schedule a sprint. The distance will be advantageous if horsemen have a route horse they are trying to get ready. This should help us with field size."

I-gaming, Horse Slaughter on Congressional Agenda

Senator Jon Kyl (R-AZ) has placed the Internet Gambling Prohibition and Enforcement Act (H.R. 4411) on the Senate calendar. The bill passed the full House on Tuesday, July 11. The Senate may consider the bill under the rules of unanimous consent, by which legislation is moved (or passed) if there are no objections from any Members.

Additionally, the Subcommittee on Commerce, Trade, and Consumer Protection has scheduled a legislative hearing for Tuesday, July 25, to focus on H.R. 503, a bill to amend the Horse Protection Act. H.R. 503 has been referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

Through legislative advocacy and its Political Action Committee, Horse PAC, NTRA works to educate Members of Congress about the horse racing and pari-mutuel industries.
