(Lemon Drop Kid) from first to fifth in last Sunday's Prince of Wales S. Jockey Todd Kabel, who was given a three-day suspension for his ride on the three-vear-old colt, has also filed an appeal. In the 1 3/16-mile event at Fort Erie, a rallying Malakoff came in slightly on Shillelagh Slew (Chief Seattle) in deep stretch, causing a chain reaction that forced Pipers Thunder (Thunder Gulch) into the rail-skimming Edenwold (Southern Halo), who was

pinched back. After stewards ruled interference, Shillelagh Slew was placed first, Pipers Thunder second, Royal Challenger (Touch Gold) third and Edenwold, the Queen's Plate winner, fourth. The C\$500,000 purse of the race will not be distributed until there is a ruling on the appeal. Malakoff is the first horse in the 71-year history of the race, the second leg of the Canadian Triple Crown, to be disgualified from the win position.

FLYING STARTERS STRUT THEIR STUFF By Alan Carasso

The 2005 trainees for Darley's innovative Flying Start program gave presentations Wednesday afternoon at



Keeneland Race Course, discussing current issues in the Thoroughbred industry. The 11 students, hailing from a half-dozen countries from all over the world, were asked to conduct research and speak anywhere from 15 to 20 minutes on topics ranging from changes at the Breed-

The Darley Flying Start Class of 2005 darleyflyingstart.com

ers' Cup to a discussion of Polytrack to how to attract a new audience to horse racing.

Duncan Hinkle, USA

From nearby Shelbyville, Kentucky, Duncan tackled the changes made at the Breeders' Cup this year, including the management shuffle, the restructuring of the Board of Directors and the new television contract with ESPN. In Duncan's opinion, the changes are mostly positive, especially the eight-year agreement with ESPN to televise the Breeders' Cup. He feels ESPN will attract a newer, younger audience and will provide more focus and attention on racing's championship day.

Benoit Jeffroy, France

Benoit provided a statistical analysis of which races make successful stallions in this country. Benoit's research showed that horses which go on to become prominent sires are those which win a major stakes race during their three-year-old season. He also examined other factors, including winning distances and tracks at which the top performances were turned in.



Celene McEniry, Ireland

Celene took an in-depth look at the North American Riding Academy (NARA), a new curriculum being put together by Hall of Fame rider Chris McCarron to be administered at the Bluegrass Community and Technical College in Lexington. A total of 16 spaces are available for the two-year program--18 months of classroom study followed by a six-month apprenticeship--which seeks to provide aspiring jockeys a chance to learn techniques and other life skills.

Craig Rounsefell, Australia

Craig tackled the sometimes prickly issue of betting exchanges and rebate shops. Betting exchanges, such as Betfair, are popular in England and are just taking foot in Australia, but may have limited appeal in this country, since up to 75 percent of wagering is on multihorse or multi-race bets and those bets are not compatible with exchanges. Rebate shops have gained in popularity, but a double-edged sword exists, according to Craig. Left untouched, they contribute little to the game, but if outlawed, racing faces the loss of the \$1.2 billion wagered annually via that means.

Conor Foley, USA

On the surface, the development of Racinos has led to increased purses in those jurisdictions and the states of Florida, Pennsylvania and New York are set to sign on, Conor says. However, U.S. purses declined overall last year and even in those states where the installation of Video Lottery Terminals is pending, those states are warned that the financial health of the sport should be sustainable without being subsidized by video gaming.

Isabel Mathew, Ireland

Isabel took on the topic of synthetic racing surfaces and the long-term affects on Thoroughbred racing. At Turfway Park, where the first meeting on Polytrack took place last winter, there were no catastrophic breakdowns, a reduction in condylar fractures and no increase in soft-tissue injuries. Potential problems include the cost of installation, slower times that will be recorded during under-tack shows and the fact that not every horse will take to the surface.

Mayra Frederico, Brazil

The Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC), founded in 2001, has taken steps to provide a uniform medication policy and has recommended, for the first time, penalties for the horse and its licensed owner in the case of a drug positive. Can a national medication policy be adopted? It requires cooperation on all fronts, Mayra states, but it can be done, create trust and attract new people to the business.

Dan Blacker, England

Dan interviewed four trainers and one jockey in examining the various ways horses are prepared for the Kentucky Derby. He discussed some alternative training methods, drawing on the example of Michael Matz, who plotted a unique set of races to get Barbaro to the first leg of this year's Triple Crown. Also consulted were Bob Baffert, three-time Kentucky Derby winning trainer; as well as Jack Van Berg, trainer of 1987 Kentucky Derby hero Alysheba.

Gerry Duffy, Ireland

Gerry took a look at past performance information, owned by Equibase and sold to Daily Racing Form and Bloodstock Research. Past performances and other handicapping tools are increasingly used not only for betting purposes, but also for those people interested in purchasing horses privately. Gerry also points out that new technology is being developed to further enhance the game. Trakus, which uses small radio transmitters located in the horses' saddle cloths to analyze and track its performance, is already in use at Woodbine. Gerry says "the more information the better."

Carolyn Costigan, Canada

Carolyn contends that the current fan base of Thoroughbred racing is older, citing that the average age of fans leaving get well messages for Barbaro was 47.6 years; fewer than seven percent was younger than 20. She advocates the use of the Internet and all other media platforms (mobile phones, PDAs, video games) in an attempt to grow the fan base for racing.

Tom Morley, England

Two-year-old sales, decades-old in this country, are relatively new in Europe, having been around for about 30 years. Of the 765 stakes run in this country between January and June, nearly 18 percent have been won by graduates of a two-year-old sale. Of the 178 graded stakes run in that period, 21 percent were won by a two-year-old graduate, including four Grade I winners. While European two-year-old sales were represented by its first Group 1 winner (Speciosa--English 1000 Guineas), there lacks a promoting body on that continent, something Tom believes could serve the two-year-old market well.

Having just completed a six-month stint in the Bluegrass, the Flying Start class of 2005 is now on holiday through Aug. 14, when the program will resume at Darley's Australian base at Hunter Valley in New South Wales. For more information on the program, please visit www.darleyflyingstart.com.




