Readying for his return to the races in Saturday's GII Jim Dandy S. during the opening weekend at Saratoga, **Bernardini** (A.P. Indy) breezed five furlongs yesterday. The Darley Stable colorbearer, off since his impressive

5 1/4-length romp in the May 20 GI Preakness S., covered five panels over a 'fast' Belmont track in 1:00 4/5. "He worked super," trainer Tom Albertrani told *The Blood-Horse*. "He couldn't look any better, and he's ready for a big race. He was just galloping out there and came back like it was an easy day. He was very impressive." Also on the Belmont worktab yesterday were

Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat) and Strong Contender (Maria's Mon), both of whom are being pointed toward the Aug. 6 GI Haskell Invitational H. at Monmouth Park. The GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont S. runner-up Bluegrass Cat also worked five furlongs, stopping the clock in :59 4/5. Strong Contender, who comes off a 7 3/4-length win in the July 4 GII Dwyer S., worked six furlongs in company in 1:12 4/5 with jockey Edgar Prado up.

BREEN FILLY TARGETS SCHUYLERVILLE

Trainer Kelly Breen's **Desire to Excel** (Mt. Livermore)

was a 24-1 shot when she won the July 2 Astoria S. at Belmont, but after that five-length romp will be at much shorter odds in Wednesday's GIII Schuylerville S., the opening day feature at Saratoga. For anyone who lived through them, it is virtually impossible to forget the mad years of the bloodstock

boom in the early 1980s. It's possible, though, that people have forgotten how much the boom was fueled by the Northern Dancer phenomenon. Have you forgotten, for example, that the bidding soared to \$1 million when Matchmaker offered a no-guarantee season to the 24-year-old Northern Dancer in January 1985?

While no-one is likely to have forgotten the moment when Northern Dancer's son out of My Bupers raised the record price for a yearling to \$10.2 million, memories have probably faded of Northern Dancer's overall impact on Keeneland's 1983 July Selected Yearling Sale. The average leapt past the \$500,000 mark for the first time, helped by a dozen Northern Dancer yearlings which averaged \$3,446,666. In addition to the \$10.2-million sale topper, he was represented by a \$4.25 million colt and two fillies which raised the record price for a yearling filly from \$2.1 million to \$2.5 million. One of those Northern Dancer fillies, Ballade's daughter Ma Petite Jolie, has made little impact on the breed, but the other, Valoris' daughter Savannah Dancer, proved a solid investment for the late Allen Paulson.

The Valoris filly offered breeders a rare chance to obtain a potentially top-class filly from an exceptional family. Valoris had achieved impressive victories in the 1000 Guineas at the Curragh and the Oaks at Epsom in 1966 to become the second Classic winner out of the famous Vali. Her predecessor, Val de Loir, had won the 1962 French Derby before becoming the dominant stallion in France. A further Classic success came the family's way when Valoris' half-sister Kalila produced Roi Lear, winner of the 1973 French Derby.

Valoris had already been represented by three notable performers by the time Savannah Dancer came on the market. Her daughters Val's Girl and Vincennes had respectively finished second in the Oaks and the Irish Oaks, while Valinsky had won at Group 2 level.

Savannah Dancer didn't let the side down. Her four stakes victories included the GII Del Mar Oaks over a mile and an eighth, and she also took second place in the Hollywood Derby. Her efforts made her the highest-rated turf performer on *The Blood-Horse* Free Handicap for three-year-old fillies.

Savannah Dancer also maintained the family tradition of broodmare success. Bred to Blushing Groom, she produced Brier Creek, a Group 3 winner whose success came from 1½ miles to two miles. Savannah Dancer also produced six foals to Mr. Prospector, including five daughters.

The partnership with Mr. Prospector got off to a fine start with Sha Tha. After finishing second in the French 1000 Guineas, Sha Tha transferred to the States to win the GII All Along S. Sha Tha in turn produced the very talented State Shinto, a Pleasant Colony colt whose achievements included a good fourth in the 2001 Dubai World Cup.


By one of those quirks which make Thoroughbred breeding so unpredictable, none of Savannah Dancer's next five foals by Mr. Prospector was good enough to earn black type. However, the strength of their bloodlines ensured that there was plenty of interest in three of the fillies when they came on the market. Oshima, a winner of two small races, made \$675,000 in 1995; Onaga, who failed to win during an eight-race career, attracted a bid of \$1.7 million from Alexandra Scrope in November 1999; and Tacha, who won only one of her nine starts, fetched \$2.2 million in January 2000.

The buyers of two of these mares have every reason to be delighted with their purchase, as Tacha and Onaga have produced Grade 1-winning sons to highly fashionable stallions.

It was Storm Cat who sired Tacha's son One Cool Cat, who justified his purchase price of \$3.1 million by recording Group 1 successes in the Phoenix S. and National S. in 2003. And it is Storm Cat's son Giant's Causeway who sired Onaga's son Aragorn, who was landing his second consecutive Grade I turf victory when he lowered Del Mar's nine-furlong record in the Eddie Read H. Andrew Caulfield cont. p3





Aragorn had won only two of his nine starts before his victory in the Shoemaker S. in May, but he had a legitimate excuse for taking time to reach his peak. He

was born as late as May 26 in 2002 and the chances are that it is only now that he has matured enough to be competing on level terms with his contemporaries. Aragorn must always have shown a lot of talent, though, as his original trainer, John Oxx, asked him to make his debut in

early June 2004, when just past his actual second birthday.

Although a late birth date certainly doesn't help in the sales ring, it doesn't automatically consign the youngster to failure. Among last year's American Grade I winners with May birthdates were Afleet Alex, Bandini, Borrego (May 17), Flower Alley, Megahertz, Pleasant Home, Prince Arch (May 24), Round Pond (May 21), Sand Springs, Smuggler (May 20), Splendid Blended and Sweet Symphony.

The other interesting aspect of Aragorn's emergence as a top-class turf horse is that he confirms Giant's Causeway's affinity for mares with Mr. Prospector blood. This year's British Group 3 winner Primary is another son out of a Mr. Prospector mare and Giant's Causeway has other graded winners out of daughters of Fappiano, Forty Niner, Gone West, Kingmambo, Machiavellian and Miswaki. There are also graded-placed performers with dams by Crafty Prospector, Lycius and Seeking the Gold.

Of course, Giant's Causeway's sire Storm Cat has also excelled with Mr. Prospector line mares, as he showed by siring One Cool Cat, Denebola and Finder's Fee from daughters of Mr. Prospector, and there are also Grade I winners bred on this cross by Storm Cat's sons Hennessy and Tabasco Cat.

Aragorn's dam Onaga has every chance of strengthening this link as she has a two-year-old and a yearling by Storm Cat, plus a 2006 filly foal by Giant's Causeway.

The winner of this race last year, Erimo Harrier came from the middle of the pack to successfully defend his title. The six-year-old gelding kicked off the year with a third in the May 27 Kinko Sho and was coming off a second in the July 9 Prix Tomoe. Settled off the pace early as the favorite here, he shot through a narrow opening in the stretch and secured the win on the soft turf. "My horse had trouble with the going and raised his head turning for home, but started to fight again in the stretch," jockey Katsumi Ando said. "It wasn't a smooth race--he won it on heart."

BARBARO'S CONDITION REMAINS STABLE

KENNETT SQUARE, PA...Kentucky Derby winner Barbaro had an uneventful weekend, and continues to be comfortable according to his doctors at the George D. Widener Hospital. "He's maintaining an excellent attitude," said Chief of Surgery Dean Richardson. "We change his left hind foot cast regularly, and we may change his right hind cast some time this week."

Barbaro spends several hours daily in a sling. "He is out of the sling overnight because he is very smart about lying down and sleeping," said Dr. Richardson. "He continues to eat a diet designed to maximize protein and caloric intake, and his body condition is good for a horse that has had (and is having) his problems. His diet includes a selection of the best quality hay."

The next update will be posted on Wednesday, July 26 unless there is a significant change in Barbaro's condition.

HURRICANE HEADS EIGHT FOR KING

GEORGE Michael Tabor's Hurricane Run (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) will face a maximum of seven rivals in Saturday's £750,000 G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot after yesterday's five-day stage. Last year's G1 Irish Derby and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe hero, who returned to win the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh May 28 before his defeat at the hands of Pride (Fr) in the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud June 25, was reported in great form by trainer Andre Fabre last week. Regular jockey Kieren Fallon faces a High Court hearing on Thursday in an attempt to overturn the Horseracing Regulatory Authority's ban on riding in the UK. Christophe Soumillon will be available to partner the four-year-old should that fail. Godolphin's G1 Dubai World Cup winner Electrocutionist (Red Ransom) is on course for the 12furlong midsummer highlight, as is Shadai Race Horse's G1 Arima Kinen and G1 Dubai Sheema Classic winner Heart's Cry (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), who is currently based at Luca Cumani's Bedford House Stables in Newmarket. He will be partnered by Christophe-Patrice Lemaire. "His connections tell me he's in very good condition," Lemaire told the Racing Post. "The King George will be a new experience for me and a great challenge for Heart's Cry. I have a lot of confidence in him, and he has proved he has the ability to run well in Europe. One of his main strengths is that he stays the King George trip very well, while he has a powerful finish in the final two furlongs. He's a very strong, very tall horse who covers a lot of ground with every stride." Speculation as to whether Lord Derby's Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) would be supplemented was ended yesterday when the five-year-old was confirmed on target for Glorious Goodwood's Aug. 5 G1 Nassau S. "It was a general decision, as the plan was always the Nassau and to just look at the King George on the way," the owner-breeder's Racing Manager Peter Stanley told PA Sport. "The King George looks a pretty tough field, and this way it gives her an extra week."

Purses Up, Handle Steady in Second Quarter:

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association and Equibase Company LLC yesterday released the "Thoroughbred Racing Economic Indicators" for United States and Canadian pari-mutuel wagering on U.S. Thoroughbred racing during the second quarter of 2006, as well as for U.S. purses and race days. During the second quarter, wagering on U.S. races hit \$4,013,729,721, an 0.56 percent increase over the comparative 2005 figure. U.S. purses were up 3.64 percent, to \$303,962,900, and race days were up 0.57 percent, from 1,766 to 1,776. "The second-quarter handle and purses statistics are solid--especially given the absence of the Derby and Preakness winners in this year's Belmont S. field," said Greg Avioli, interim CEO of NTRA/Breeders' Cup. "The record wagering on this past quarter's Kentucky Derby, along with the continuing upward trend in purse levels, provide cause for optimism as we head into the summer months."
