"She did what she had to do." Dogwood president Cot Campbell said of the \$210,000 FTKJUL yearling purchase. "You really can't say she was spectac-

ular in a three-horse field, but she did well." Team Valor Stables and Never Tell Racing's Audacious Chloe debuted with a second-place finish at Keeneland Apr. 26, then earned her diploma by 1 1/4 lengths after stumbling at the start at Belmont June 1. Desire to Excel (Mt. Livermore) figures to be the one to beat after notching Belmont's July 2 Astoria S. by five lengths. According to Daily Racing Form, trainer Bill Mott will scratch Chief Officer (Officer), a 10-length winner in her Belmont debut June 30 against state-breds.

Classic winner Araafa (Ire) (Mull of Kintyre--Resurgence {GB}, by Polar Falcon) has been purchased by Plantation Stud and will begin his breeding career at the

Newmarket farm in 2007, according to a press release. The deal was brokered by Peter Doyle Bloodstock on behalf of the purchaser and Tony Nerses for the sellers. The three-year-old, winner of the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 St. James's Palace S., is currently being pointed to the Aug. 2 G1 Sussex S. by trainer

Jeremy Noseda. He will continue to race in the colors of Saleh Al Homaizi and Imad Al Sagar. "We are leasing the horse back to outgoing owners Saleh Al Homaizi and Imad Al Sagar for the rest of the season, culminating in the Breeders' Cup in early November," said Kevin Buckley, Plantation's chief executive. Produced by a full sister to leading sire Pivotal (GB), Araafa will be the first stallion to stand at the revamped operation. Plantation will keep a majority of shares in the horse for themselves, although, Buckley added, "a limited number of shares may be available for major owner/breeders, and a decision will be made at a later date."

GEORGE GETTING CLOSER

Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's sidelined G1 2000 Guineas winner George Washington (Ire) (Danehill) is nearing a return to action, according to trainer Aidan O'Brien. The handsome bay, who injured muscles in his pelvic area following his runner-up effort to Araafa (Ire) in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh May 27, has pleased connections with his progress in recent weeks. "Nothing has been decided yet, but he's not that far off starting back," O'Brien told Racing Post. "He's coming along nicely, but we must get him away cantering to a track somewhere, and if he gets on okay with that, we'll then see where we go from there."

FABRE GROUND FEARS Trainer Andre Fabre has told Racing Post that he hopes there would be some moisture in the ground for Michael Tabor's Hurricane Run (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) ahead of Saturday's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot. Though he raised concerns about running the four-yearold in the height of summer, the Chantilly-based conditioner is satisfied with the champion's preparation for the £750,000 contest. "The horse is fine and I'm pleased with him," Fabre told the Post. "He's ready for the race and will just have a canter by himself tomorrow. My little worry is that this will be the first time he has run in the summer. It's quite unusual for me to run a horse like Hurricane Run at this time of the year, but I made his program this year around the King George, so if he is beaten I can only blame myself. The King George is one of the biggest races in the world and he has already won the Arc, so I wanted to run him at Ascot, but he is proven on soft and heavy, so I would prefer some rain before the race." Should regular rider Kieren Fallon lose his appeal in the High Court tomorrow against his UK riding ban, another rider will be named for the colt who ranked as the best runner in Europe in 2005 with victories in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and G1 Irish Derby.

In 1998, Real Quiet came within inches of capturing the Triple Crown, losing out in the last strides of the GI Belmont S., the longest race in the series. Eight years later--also at Belmont--Real Quiet's daughter, Wonder Lady Anne L, delivered a measure of redemption by taking the GI Coaching Club American Oaks, the longest race of the Filly Triple Crown. The race not only provided a degree of redemption for Real Quiet, but also for Wonder Lady Anne L herself. She had appeared likely to have a bright future when winning the GII Demoiselle S. last November, but had failed to score in four starts this year, although she had taken second in the GII Bonnie Miss S. and Susan's Girl Breeders' Cup S., and third in the GII Davona Dale S.

Wonder Lady Anne L realized just \$3,500 in 2004 as a weanling at Keeneland November, and \$8,000 as a yearling at the OBS August Sale the following year, a price which placed her as the 15th most expensive of the 29 yearlings offered by Real Quiet in 2005, or just around the median.

That statistic, combined with a 2005 yearling average of \$24,390, indicates that by the time Wonder

Lady Anne L--a member of this third crop-- reached the ring, Real Quiet's stock had fallen considerably from the point where he retired to begin his stud career standing at Vinery in Kentucky for \$25,000. This slide from favor was not a total surprise: despite his excellent race record, Real Quiet's much-publicized conformation defects--his front legs are a long way from perfection, even after

the corrective surgery which was performed prior to his sale as yearling--were always going to make breeders wary of him. It didn't help when his first crop, numbering 71 foals, couldn't come up with anything better than Quiet Cash, a multiple stakes winner and graded-stakes performer whose most notable efforts have come at Hastings Park; and the minor stakes winner No Place Like It.

Real Quiet's second crop of 55 foals yielded a much better horse in Pussycat Doll, heroine of the GI Humana

Distaff H. and GI La Brea S., and also included the stakes-winning and graded-stakes placed Bull Ranch. Wonder Lady Ann L is the only stakes winner so far from Real Quiet's third crop, but that group also includes the GI Santa Anita Oaks runner-up Quiet Kim. The efforts of Pussycat Doll and Wonder Lady Anne L came too late in the

day to save Real Quiet's Kentucky stud career, and in 2006 he stood at Reigle Heir Farm in Grantville, Pennsylvania, for \$6,500.

With Pussycat Doll, Real Quiet's first Grade I winner, there is an inclination to give a major share of the credit to her dam, the brilliantly speedy Grade I winner Hookedonthefeelin, but this isn't the case with Wonder Lady Anne L.

She is the second foal of her dam Ancho, an unraced daughter of Wild Zone. Ancho, a half-sister to three other winners, the best of which, Matter of Law, has been multiple stakes placed in restricted Canadian-bred company. The second dam Ruth Ann d'Or was a useful two-year-old who won two of four starts, and finished third in the Bassinet Stakes in her first campaign.

By Tour d'Or, Ruth Ann d'Or was a sister to Ohio stakes winner Tour Time and a half-sister to O'Rocky, winner of the What a Pleasure S. and Dr. Fager S. as a two-year-old. Incidentally, like Wonder Lady Anne L, Ancho and Ruth Ann d'Or failed to impress in the sales ring: Ancho changed hands twice as a yearling for \$5,700 and \$6,500, and Ruth Ann d'Or was a \$3,000 two-year-old.

The third dam, Loudmouth Time, an Illinois-bred daughter of Buckeye State stalwart Honey Jay, was more expensive. She sold twice at auction as a broodmare, realizing \$12,000 in foal to Alaskan Frost, and \$11,500 in foal to Birdonthewire. We can note, however, that she had ended career running for a \$3,000 claiming tag. Prior to that she had won three races and gained black-type with a third in the state-bred Tah Dah S. She is also a sister to the state-bred stakes winner Fair While, and half-sister to state-bred stakes winner Jabunny.

Loudmouth Time actually owns an interesting pedigree, as she had the top-class horse, Summer Tan (highweighted two-year-old of his crop) and his sister, Thoris, 3x4 (both by Heliopolis), and the pedigree of her sire, Honey Jay, was virually a mirror image of that of her dam. Ancho, the dam of Wonder Lady Anne L, also has some interesting pedigree features, with Northern Dancer appearing 4x5 through the similarly bred The Minstrel and Fanfreluche, and Northern Dancer's three-parts relation, Icecapade, in the third generation. Real Quiet himself is also an inbred horse, with Raise a Native being 4x3 in his pedigree.

Wonder Lady Anne L is more of an outcross, but the inbreeding in her sire and dam does link up. Real Quiet's Raise a Native strains, Mr. Prospector and Meadow Blue (his granddam) are both Native Dancer/Nearco crosses, and Icecapade and Northern Dancer (a total of three times in Ancho) are Nearco/Native Dancer crosses, and Real Quiet also brings in a daughter of Nearctic, the sire of Icecapade and Northern Dancer.

For good measure, Nearctic's dam is bred on very similar lines to Heliopolis, who we mentioned as closely doubled through siblings in the pedigree of Wonder Lady Anne's third dam. It may just be coincidence, but we can note that Real Quiet's other Grade I winner, Pussycat Doll, has three Nearco/Native Dancer crosses (all through Northern Dancer), and is by a son of Dixieland Band, a horse inbred to Hyperion through Heliopolis and Alibhai (another close relative to the dam of Nearctic).





FORTY NINER MAY BE PENSIONED Forty Niner

(Mr. Prospector--File, by Tom Rolfe), a champion during his racing career who became a leading sire, may be pensioned due to declining fertility, according to Racing Post. Standing at Shizunai Stallion Station in Japan, the 21-year-old stallion had covered approximately 45 mares this season, but fewer than six have been reported in foal. "It is something that comes with age," a spokeswoman for the Japan Bloodhorse Breeders' Association told Racing Post. "We haven't made it public to any party yet." Though he remains in good health, it is not yet known whether he will stand stud in 2007. The JBBA has stood Forty Niner since 1996. A Claiborne Farm homebred, the chestnut earned an Eclipse Award as the top two-year-old colt in the U.S. in 1987, when he landed the GI Champagne S., GI Futurity S., GII Breeders' Futurity and GII Sanford S. while under the guidance of Woody Stephens. At three, he added victories in the GI Travers S., GI Haskell Inv. H., GII Fountain of Youth S. and NYRA Mile and a second in the GI Kentucky Derby. He entered stud at four in 1989 with record of 19-11-5-0 and earnings of \$2,726,000. Ranked as the U.S. leading freshman sire of 1992, Forty Niner was sold to the JBBA in the fall of 1995. From those six U.S. crops came the likes of Grade I winners Editor's Note, Coronado's Quest, Nine Keys, Ecton Park, Gold Fever and Marley Vale. Among his graded-stakes winning sons were Distorted Humor, who has already been represented by GI Kentucky Derby winner Funny Cide; End Sweep, who ranked as the leading freshman sire in 1998 before heading to Japan; Ide; Jules; Roar; Tactical Advantage; and Twining. From his time in Japan, Forty Niner has sired standouts Daiwa Passion (Jpn), Koolinger (Jpn) and Utopia (Jpn).
