## SCAT DEFINITELY CAN DO

After a year's hiatus, the GII Sanford S. is back to kick off Saratoga's trio of graded stakes for two-year-old males. Owner James Scatuorchio and trainer Todd Pletcher, immortalized by today's bobblehead give-

away, are no strangers to this event, having won it with More Than Ready in 1999. The team return to the scene of many of their finest hours with **Scat Daddy** (Johannesburg), a colt in which Pletcher and his father J.J. reportedly each own a 25-percent stake. And ever since his much ballyhooed debut,

stakes are where the \$250,000 Keeneland September graduate has been heading. Entered in a Monmouth maiden June 2 after several similar spots failed to fill in New York, the dark bay was scratched instead and ran the following day at Belmont Park. That race marked the return to competition of jockey John Velazquez, injured in a horrific spill at Keeneland Apr. 20, but Scat Daddy did his part, winning off by 5 1/4 lengths in the mud, a performance which particularly impressed his trainer. "I don't think this horse wants to be rushed off his feet as much as he way," Pletcher commented. "The first time out going five and a half furlongs over a muddy track, you don't necessarily want to take back and get mud in your face. So I thought he ran very well by running a style he's not best suited to." On paper, there appears to be little competition, but War Wolf (Tale of the Cat) broke his maiden in 1:03 2/5 at Churchill July 2 and can complete a chalky exacta.

## FIRST SAMURAI RETIRED

Bruce Lansford and Lansdon Robbins III's **First Samurai** (Giant's Causeway--Freddie Frisson, by Dixieland Band), a dual Grade I winner at two, has been retired

from racing and has arrived at Claiborne Farm, where he will begin his stud career in 2007. The decision to call a halt to his racing days was made after connections determined they would be unsuccessful in preparing the colt for a fall campaign. "We had planned to retire First Samurai at the end of the season, but as it became

clear that we did not have enough time to achieve our major objectives, we made the decision to stop on him now," Lunsford explained. "He was a brilliant racehorse and we are very disappointed, but we're also looking forward to the next phase of his career." The best of his generation for most of 2005, First Samurai won his first four starts, including the GI Hopeful S. and the GI Champagne S., the first to sweep those events since Dehere in 1993. Third to eventual champion Stevie Wonderboy in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Oct. 29. the chestnut returned to run a bang-up second to Keyed Entry in the GII Hutcheson S. Feb. 4. He finished runner-up in the Mar. 4 GII Fountain of Youth S., but was promoted to the victory after being interfered with by Corinthian. He had been sidelined with broken ribs likely suffered at the start of the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. Apr. 15. Bred in Kentucky by John D. Gunther, First Samurai heads to the breeding shed with a record of 8-5-1-1 and earnings of \$915,075.

## PLETCHER OFF ON THE RIGHT FOOT

For the third time in the last four runnings, trainer Todd Pletcher has kicked off the Saratoga meet with a victory in the GIII Schuylerville S., sending out Dogwood Stable's **Cotton Blossom** (Broken Vow) to a 1 3/4-length success on a sunsplashed afternoon. SOUMILLON ON THE HURRICANE Trainer Andre Fabre has confirmed that Christophe Soumillon will parter Michael Tabor's Hurricane Run (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in Saturday's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot. Following regular rider Kieren Fallon's UK riding ban imposed by the Horseracing Regulatory Authority, Soumillon will partner last year's G1 Irish Derby and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner for the first time since finishing runner-up in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club at Chantilly last June. "It is not a worry that Kieren does not ride and Christophe does," Fabre told the Post. "Christophe knows the horse, he is one of the world's top jockeys and is perfectly able to ride Hurricane Run at Ascot."

## NTRA. BREEDERS' CUP STRIKE MODIFIED **OPERATING AGREEMENT**

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association and Breeders' Cup have struck a new joint operating agreement through at least 2008, ending speculation the two organizations could go their separate ways. In addition, they will have separate chief executive officers. The boards of directors of the NTRA and Breeders' Cup announced the decision July 26 after two days of meetings in Lexington. Under terms of the new agreement, the two organizations will continue to work jointly on television, marketing, public relations and sponsorship initiatives, and continue to share offices and administrative functions. The organizations, however, will have separate budgeting and accounting functions and separate CEOs, as was the case from 2001-04. "We'll be tracking the budgets separately, but the boards determined it would be best to continue with the financial apparatus that's in place through this year," NTRA Senior Vice President of Communications Keith Chamblin said in a follow-up interview. "It's still a joint budget; however, we are tracking organizational revenue and expenses separately as a way of making it easier to transition to separate budgets in 2007." As for the different CEOs, Chamblin said the two boards would decide on their search processes. "It was discussed, but no particular course of action was decided upon," Chamblin said. Before Tim Smith departed in 2004, he headed the NTRA, and D.G. Van Clief Jr. was president of Breeders' Cup. When Smith resigned, Van Clief became NTRA commissioner and continued as Breeders' Cup president.

Go Between (Point Given), victorious in the GII Virginia Derby last time out, is possible for the Secretariat S.

## Commentator Now Possible for Whitney:

After first suggesting that Commentator (Distorted Humor) could concentrate on one-turn races for the balance of this season, trainer Nick Zito and owner Tracy Farmer seem to have had a change of heart and may give the New York-bred the chance to defend his championship in the GI Whitney H. at Saratoga Aug. 5.
