

WOODBINE JOINS ERA BID FOR NEW YORK RACING FRANCHISE

Empire Racing Associates has added another potent partner, Woodbine Entertainment Group, to its team vying to take over the franchise to operate Aqueduct, Belmont and Saratoga racetracks.

Empire, which has prided itself on the New York roots of its horsemen members, turned to the Canadian racetrack giant as 16 groups in all are in the midst of rushing to submit their bids by the end of August for the franchise now held by the New York Racing Association. The franchise expires December 31, 2007.

"Empire Racing is New York's home-grown solution. Now we're excited to add world class talent, expertise, and a truly international perspective to our team to make New York the world capital of horse racing," said Jeff Perlee, Empire Racing's chief executive officer. The addition of Woodbine comes after Delaware North Cos. recently joined the Empire efforts.

Empire officials said Woodbine representatives will not sit on the group's board of directors, but will help develop a "state-of-the-art'' operational plan for Aqueduct and Belmont racetracks.

Woodbine will also have a financial position with the Empire group, though a spokesman for the New York organization, Glen Mathes, could not immediately provide details about the investment. He noted the board approved a provision that no outside company could hold more than an 8% share in Empire. "Their interest is substantially less," he said.

Perlee could not be immediately reached for details on the financial arrangement.

The registration deadline for the new Kentukcy Thoroughbred Breeders' Incentive Fund has been set for Aug. 1. Breeders can register online, for a fee of \$60, by visiting the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority website at www.khra.ky.gov. "The Aug. 1 deadline is only for mares covered in 2006," said KBIF Administrator Jamie Haydon. "It is important for Kentucky breeders to register the mares they breed this year, so then can be eligible for approximately \$12 million a year in incentives during the foal's racing careers." To qualify for the program, the mare must have been covered by a Kentucky stallion and remain in Kentucky from the time of cover until foaling. Foals born in 2006 and prior years are grandfathered into the KBIF program if the foal is eligible for the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund (KTDF). FALLON AWAITS RULING Kieren Fallon will discover if his UK riding ban can be lifted after the High Court resumes with its decision today. The six-time British champion jockey's case centers around the refusal of the Horseracing Regulatory Authority to grant another licence after the expiry of the original due to him being charged with conspiracy to defraud betfair.com customers. Fallon is also seeking a hearing at which his legal representatives can submit evidence, which was initially refused by the HRA's appeal board. Although he was absent from the High Court yesterday, Fallon's counsel, David Pannick QC, told the judge Mr. Justice Davis, "Mr. Fallon is entitled to put his case before he is suspended and before he suffers from the serious detriments that flow from that." Pannick added, "We say the panel was wrong in law to refuse to hear submissions and evidence from Fallon as to why he says the criminal case against him is very weak on the merits. We want to advance those arguments in private. We say that, before a decision is taken on suspension, the panel is obliged to hear what Fallon wants to say as an important factor in the weighing of the balance. In any event, the appeal board erred in law by concluding that to suspend Fallon was a proportionate sanction." If today's ruling is successful, Fallon faces a race against time to ride Hurricane Run (Ire) in tomorrow's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot, but could be in action at Glorious Goodwood next week.
