BERNARDINI BACK TO BUSINESS

Today's \$500,000 GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga has attracted only six three-year-olds to the starting gate, but it features none other than **Bernardini** (A.P. Indy), who makes his first appearance since drawing off in the GI Preakness S. at Pimlico May 20. Though that after-

noon will always be remembered for Barbaro's horrific injury, it should be noted that Bernardini made an eye-catching rally, won by 5 3/4 lengths and earned big speed figures. His connections announced shortly thereafter that he would skip the GI Belmont S. and target Saratoga instead, and the Darley homebred has been training smartly ahead of the second half of this season. "He's

worked within himself," trainer Tom Albertrani said. "He looks every ounce as good as he did going into the Preakness, and he's run well off layoffs before. The Preakness was a long time ago. Actually, it feels like forever. I'm really looking forward to having him back on the track. Naturally, you want to have him good going into the Jim Dandy and then peaking in the Travers [Aug. 26], the same way we did it in the Preakness. Right now, he's showing me he's on ready. I'm hoping the Jim Dandy will catapult him to the next level." He faces some intriguiging faces here. Trainer John Ward will saddle a coupled entry for owner John Oxley, the unbeaten Minister's Bid (Deputy Minister), who makes his stakes debut; and Dr. Pleasure (Thunder Gulch), the son of champion Beautiful Pleasure who is looking for his first win since taking his career opener over this surface last summer. Minister's Bid, an impressive maiden winner at Keeneland, overcame greenness to take a one-mile Belmont allowance June 22 (video). "He was a horse that had a knee problem last year," Ward said about Minister's Bid. "I wanted to run him in Florida; he was entered, but he came down with a quarter crack and we had to scratch. After that, he was ready to run, but I couldn't get a race for him until Keeneland. He got his endurance trip at Belmont Park. That race is going to set him up nicely for the Jim Dandy." GRADE I HUNT

Seven turf distaffers have been entered for the \$500,000 GI Diana S. this afternoon at Saratoga, and only two of them--Sweet Talker (Stormin Fever) and Angara (GB) (Alzao) have previously won at this level, though the latter will reportedly only run if the ground

comes up soft. It's a good opportunity for trainer Patrick Biancone, who will saddle the three-year-old Lady of Venice (Fr) (Loup Solitaire). Biancone knows what a Grade I win/placing means for a filly's future worth. "I have owners who spend a lot of money getting quality horses, and it is my job to

not only put those horses in races where they can win, but to get value as well," Biancone said. "Lady of Venice already won a Grade III race [Regret, June 17]...It is much better for her and for her career as a broodmare to run third in a race like the Diana than to win the [GIII] Lake George." Patrice Lemaire repeated the dose to maximum effect in the Mar. 25 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Nad al Sheba and is looking forward to taking the fight to the best Europe can offer. "I think Heart's Cry has a very good chance," he commented. "He has a lot of experience, has proven in Japan and Dubai that he is a world-class horse and the ground will suit him very well. It will be hard race, with two of the best horses in the world in Hurricane Run and Electrocutionist, but Heart's Cry has the potential to win. He's a fighter--he has a big heart, he loves to gallop and he's very strong and tough--and in the King George, you have to be powerful and stay the trip very well."

Sir Michael Stoute knows how to win this race, having captured it with Shergar (GB), Opera House (GB) and Golan (Ire). He saddles Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Maraahel (Ire) (Alzao) this year. He was breathing down the neck of Electrocutionist (Red Ransom) when third in last year's G1 Juddmonte International S. at York and showed when winning the G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot last time June 24 that he is best served by late-running tactics. "He's in great form and if he reproduces the form of the Hardwicke, he should be there with a shout," jockey Richard Hills said. "He's got character and doesn't want to be in front too long, but there should be a good, honest pace and is a good horse in his own right. He's an outsider and has to improve, but Sir Michael is happy with him, which is important, and he does come right at this time of year." Godolphin, chasing King George number six, are buzzing over G1 Dubai World Cup hero Electrocutionist, who warmed up with a game second in the June 21 G1 Prince of Wales's S. at the Royal meeting here. "Electrocutionist has really come to himself after his last run at Royal Ascot," conditioner Saeed bin Suroor said.



The big grey filly, a maiden winner on the main track at Belmont in October, closed out 2005 with a sixth in the GII Golden Rod S. Nov. 26. Fourth on the turf at Gulfstream Feb. 13, she was given some time to regroup and captured a Keeneland allowance with blinkers on, then annexed Churchill's Edgewood S. May 5. She settled for second behind Lady of Venice (Fr) in the GIII Regret S. over the Louisville lawn June 17, but was the third choice here. Allowed to settle at the back of the pack by jockey Garrett Gomez through the opening three-quarters, Magnificent Song drew closer on the far turn and came sweeping up late, despite taking a gander at the crowd, to make it a Pletcher exacta. Beaten just a half length when runner-up in the GI Pacific Classic last August, he filled the show spot in both the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and GII Clark H. to end the season. The bay opened the year with a second in an allowance on the Keeneland turf in April and a 10th in the May 6 GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic, then just missed last time out, running second by a nose in the June 17 GI Stephen Foster H. Second of June has endured a losing streak that has lasted since the GIII Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream in January of 2004. 

Of the older horses, Crocodile Dundee may fare best if sharp enough off an absence since winning the G3 Scandinavian Open Championship at Copenhagen last August.






Barbaro Update

BARBARO REMAINS STABLE, RADIOGRAPHS LOOK GOOD

His right hind leg cast was changed late Wednesday. "We took new radiographs, and they look good," said Dr. Richardson. "No problems were evident." In addition, the modified foot cast on Barbaro's left hind foot, which has laminitis, is changed daily so the foot can be treated and watched for signs of infection. "Barbaro has a strong appetite, and he has been enjoying hand-picked grass and 'healthy snacks' daily," said Dr. Richardson. Barbaro remains in the Intensive Care Unit of the University of Pennsylvania's George D. Widener Hospital. FALLON LOSES CASE Kieren Fallon faces a lengthy ban from riding in the UK after his High Court challenge to the Horseracing Regulatory Authority's decision ended in failure yesterday. Having been charged with conspiracy to defraud customers of betfair by the City of London Police, the six-time British champion jockey has been suspended by the HRA, and that will hold until the trial is concluded. Despite arguments that the HRA appeal board had acted unfairly and disproportionately in refusing to lift the ban, the High Court judge refused to grant Fallon an injunction. Mr. Justice Davis said the charges against Fallon were "grave" and it had rightly been said that, if proved, the case would "strike at the heart of racing." He concluded that the appeal board had been right in their refusal to examine the evidence which, he said, had been "cherry-picked" by Fallon's legal advisers from a wider range of material. He added that some of Fallon's arguments that the ban was disproportionate had been overstated and that his claim that it would effectively end his career as a leading jockey was not supported by any evidence. lan Burton, speaking for Fallon's solicitors BCL Burton Copeland, said, "My client is understandably disappointed with the outcome of his efforts to have his suspension from riding in the UK lifted pending a trial in 18 months' time. We are not seeking leave to appeal and our focus will be on defending the ill-founded charges against Mr. Fallon."




