The four-year-old filly, a Group 1 winner in Argentina, won a Belmont allowance June 14 and was far from disgraced when third, beaten 1 3/4 lengths by Behaving Badly, in the GII Genuine Risk BC H. July 3. Reunited, meanwhile, got caught up in a speed duel in her 2006 debut, blazing a half in :44 1/5 in the

May 27 Winning Colors S. at Churchill before tiring to fifth. She exited that race with a cut to the inside of her mouth, but is now healed and has been outstanding in the mornings since. "She's been training great," said conditioner Neil Howard. "I just wish she had one more race this year because the races come up so competitive at Saratoga." Todd Pletcher has been dominant in the Saratoga stakes thus far and saddles **Ever Elusive** (Forestry) here. The \$1 million KEESEP yearling captured her first black-type event in the Winning Colors, finishing a neck to the good of Malibu Mint and 4 1/4 lengths better than Reunited. She failed as the odds-on pick in a sloppy Lazer Show H. at Churchill July 4 and tries to rebound with the addition of blinkers.

Classic Lines...

Yeats had solid Derby credentials in 2004 after winning the G3 Ballysax S. and G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial at Leopardstown, but injury intervened and he was not in the headlines again until his all-the-way success in the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom last June. Subsequently off the board in the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud, he returned from a break to finish fourth in the G1 Irish St Leger at The Curragh in September before a below-par sixth in the GI Canadian International at Woodbine in October. Making his seasonal debut in the Group 1 marathon at Royal Ascot, he annihilated a deep field to record a four-length success and was in no mood to relinquish his new crown here. Settled in middivision off the frantic early pace, he made smooth progress on the outer to run down the leaders and strike the front at the quarter pole. Despite the challenge of **Geordieland**, he was always comfortably on top and was at the line under a hand ride with the track record in his possession. "He's probably the best stayer I've ridden," Mick Kinane commented. "We got a nice position and they were going very quick, so I let him get into a nice rhythm and he traveled lovely. He was always well within himself and when I gave him a flick the race was over." Aidan O'Brien revealed that the G1 Irish St Leger at The Curragh Sept. 16 was the next target for Yeats, with the G1 Melbourne Cup an option at Flemington Nov. 7. Kinane, who has won the Australian feature before, believes that fast conditions may be the biggest concern. "When it's firm, it's firm at Melbourne and that would be a shade worrying, but the weight wouldn't be as he's a big, strapping horse," he said. Jamie Osborne was sending out Mountgrange Stud's recent acquisition Geordieland for the first time and was delighted with the five-year-old's effort. "We finished second to one of the great staying performers, but take him out of the race and we've beaten the field easily," Osborne said. "The Ebor H. [at York Aug. 23] is under serious consideration now, but the ultimate plan is to go to Melbourne, which is what he was bought for. 

CANCER CLAIMS PENN OWNER, BREEDER

DIXON Prominent owner and breeder F. Eugene Dixon died of cancer Wednesday at a Pennsylvania hospital, according to *Daily Racing Form*. He was 84. A committed booster of Pennsylvania racing, Dixon was a two-time member of the Pennsylvania Horse Racing Commission, serving from 1986 to 1997 and from 2003 to June of this year before stepping down. Along with his wife Edith, Dixon owned historic Erdenheim Farm in Pennsylvania, and was a former owner of the Philadelphia 76ers and a shareholder in the Philadelphia Flyers. He also formerly served as chairman of the Board of Governors of Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education.



Barbaro Update

BARBARO CONTINUES TO IMPROVE

KENNETT SQUARE, PA...Kentucky Derby winner Barbaro's left hind hoof is slowly showing evidence of regrowth after surgery last month to treat laminitis. Laminitis occurs when laminae, the strong connecting tis sues that attach the pedal bone and the inner hoof wall, are inflamed. "The coronary band [the portion of the hoof that is responsible for continued downward growth of the hoof] is beginning to re-establish itself," said Dean Richardson, Chief of Surgery at the George D. Widener Hospital. Barbaro's right hind leg continues to be protected in a cast. "The original fractures have apparently healed well, but the cast is necessary to protect the pastern fusion," Dr. Richardson said. "This protection is required because he must bear most of his weight on the right hind limb due to the laminitis in the left hind leg." Barbaro remains in the Intensive Care Unit of the University of Pennsylvania's George D. Widener Hospital. 
Steppenwolfer Sidelined Indefinitely:



Road to Love was victim of whatever was stopping Mark Johnston's horses from displaying their usual enthusiasm in the spring, but came right when the stable did and won a Sandown handicap July 8. Down the field when harried on the front end in the Joss Collins S. at Newmarket July 13, he rebounded with a typically dominant performance to win a handicap at Ascot Sunday. Repeating the feat on this quick return, he followed the example of Yeats an hour earlier and cracked Goodwood's course record. Sent to the front gradually from his wide draw, he bowled along in isolation and was full of run approaching the quarter pole before delivering another surge to put the result beyond doubt. "The four-day break was never a worry, because he came out of Ascot really well and only lost six kilos," his trainer said. "We were very worried about the draw and we were concerned about him getting taken on and going too fast early like Newmarket. He's been given the perfect breather on the turn and, although they looked to be queuing up behind him, he was going incredibly well in the straight. It's down to what the handicapper does now as to whether he stays in handicaps or moves up to pattern races, particularly in France." He added, "He's a very good-bodied horse like his sire and let's hope he's somewhere near as good. I have to look back now and think that he was not well at the beginning of the season, when our other horses were below form. If that's the case, who knows how good he is."




