BATTLE OF UNBEATENS IN HALL OF FAME

Today's GII National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame Breeders' Cup S. at Saratoga is shaping up to be a battle between two colts who have yet to taste defeat on the lawn, with After Market (Storm Cat) pitched against Brilliant (War Chant). The former won on debut at Aqueduct last November, returned to take a Belmont allowance June 15 and most recently rallied to beat a small five-horse field in the GIII Lexington S. July 9. Brilliant had five dirt starts under him before moving to the green stuff. He collected a pair of Churchill allowance races in April and May and improved his turf record to three-for-three with a tally in the GII Jefferson Cup S. June 17. "He was never a bad horse on the dirt, but the turf has certainly moved him up," said trainer Neil Howard, who added of After Market, "He'll be tough. In this business, I fear anything and everything."

A Group 3 winner and multiple Group 1 placed at two overseas, Three Valleys came to this country in late 2004, finishing a troubled third to Leroidesanimaux (Brz) in the GI Citation H. The homebred, out of a halfsister to blue-hen mare Hasili (Ire) and to the dam of the aforementioned Brazilian-bred, made just three appearances last season, taking a Del Mar allowance July 24, the GII Del Mar Breeders' Cup H. Sept. 4 and finishing fifth in the GI Shadwell Turf Mile at Keeneland Oct. 8. Making his 2006 debut, Three Valleys was allowed to save ground after an awkward dispatch. The chestnut was taken off the rail down the backstretch, rallied four wide into the stretch and outgamed Hotstufanthensome for the victory. "My horse had a great trip," winning jockey Ramon Dominguez said. "I wasn't really worried about the pace up front because I was focused on my horse. 



180 head have been cataloged, a nearly 18-percent increase from last year. The boutique sale has, as usual, drawn a choice offering of yearlings by top sires, including A.P. Indy, Deputy Minister, Distorted Humor, Giant's Causeway and Unbridled's Song. There are youngsters by freshmen sires Include, Johannesburg and Orientate, as well as representatives from the first crops of Aldebaran, Empire Maker, Harlan's Holiday, Hold That Tiger, Mineshaft,

Sky Mesa, Vindication and Zavata. "This is an unusually strong group of first-year stallions," said Boyd Browning, Jr., Fasig's executive vice president & CEO. "There's the big three, Vindication, Empire Maker and Mineshaft, but there are some others who were extraordinary racehorses that absolutely have the creden-

tials to be stallions--Sky Mesa, Aldebaran, horses like Harlan's Holiday, whose yearlings were so well-received in July." There are a larger number of yearlings by first-crop sires at this sale compared with last term--27 to 18-which Browning credits to the quality of both the stallions and the dams they were bred to. "It's a reflection of the quality of this group, for sure," he said. "At the showcase in the July sale, we target first- and second-crop sires, and we can be a little forgiving on those

pedigrees. Generally at Saratoga we don't try to expand the pedigree boundaries too far, but with the quality of mares bred to these types of stallions, and with the quality of their race records and pedigrees themselves, it's just an unusually strong group of horses." Browning added that the overall size of the catalog, boosted from last year but smaller than the 2004 renewal, was not by design. "It's really more just a matter of the quality of horses we attract," he said. "Fortunately we've got more than we did last year, but there's no artificial number we have in mind." *L.M.*

Storm's a Brewin'...

Last year's sale was highlighted by the \$3.1 million Storm Cat/Rings a Chime colt that consignor Taylor Made Sales brought to the market on behalf of breeder Stonerside Farm. Dr. Demi O'Byrne, representing Team Coolmore, was the winning bidder for the strapping colt, later named Black Cat Crossing, who has since joined trainer Aidan O'Brien's string at Ballydoyle in

Ireland but has not yet started. In total, 103 of the 136 horses through the ring sold for a gross of \$33.4 million. The average of \$324,417 was the sale's second-best ever; the median was \$225,000. The 2001 edition of the sale, which saw 237 horses cataloged over three sessions, holds the record for gross (\$62,412,000) and average (\$385,259). The Saratoga sale was pared

down to two sessions last year. With 57 fewer horses cataloged this year than in 2001, it's unlikely that the record gross will be threatened, but buyers and consignors alike are optimistic for an exceptional two days of trade. "Hopefully, we've done a very good job in the selection process, and the consignors that support us, well, they're pros," said Browning. "We think it's an outstanding group of yearlings that we're presenting to the marketplace. We worked really hard to get a good group of horses on the ground-last year it was 150, this year we thought 180 fit. We limit that by the quality of horses we put in our select sales. We think it's a damn good group of horses." Michael Hernon from Gainesway Farm agrees. "We are bringing what we feel to be just a top-flight group of horses-they're highquality, athletic horses and we are very confident of a good sale," said Hernon. L.M.

Even by the lofty standards he's held to, 2005 was a banner year for Storm Cat. The world's most expensive sire was responsible for the \$9.7 million topper, out of Tranquility Lake, at Keeneland September, and the \$3.1 million topper, out of Rings a Chime, at this event. In all, 13 of his yearlings eclipsed the seven-figure plateau and his 28 sold averaged a remarkable \$1.7 million. He kept the momentum going into early 2006, when a two-year-old son sold for \$2.2 million at Fasig's Calder sale in February. This sale marks the first opportunity of the year for buyers to land a youngster from Storm Cat's latest crop of yearlings. He has two here: hip 8, from the Eaton Sales consignment; and Paramount Sales' hip 66. Both sell tomorrow. Hip 66 is the third foal out of the unraced Gone West mare Gone to the Moon and the third by Storm Cat. Her first, a foal of 2003 named King Shooting Star, sold to Roger King for \$1.1 million at the 2004 Keeneland September sale, while her second, an unraced two-year-old colt named Chief Broken Arrow, was never offered at public sale. A Mar. 16 foal, hip 8 is out of MGSP Beckys Shirt (Cure the Blues), making him a half-brother to 2003 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint hero Cajun Beat (Grand Slam), who earned \$1,159,100 in four years at the track. "He drew a bad post--hip 8," said Eaton Sales' Tom Van Meter about the colt's early showing. "But we're going to get off to a good start with this guy. He's got a little more leg than a lot of the Storm Cats and is just a really nice colt." L.M.

Hancock Homebreds = Stone Squared...

When Chamrousse retired from the racetrack, she had more than earned her keep. As a three-year-old of 2002, the daughter of Peaks and Valleys won the GII Black-Eyed Susan S., ran second in the GI Mother Goose S. and finished third in three more graded events while racking up a \$359,585 bankroll. A nice resume for any horse, but especially so for a horse that her breeder, Arthur Hancock III, had bought back for \$15,000 as a Keeneland November weanling. "She was a really nice filly, and we weren't going to give her away," said Hancock. "I think the reserve on her was \$23,000, or something like that." After the sale, Hancock sold a half-interest in the filly to James H. Stone, a partner who also owned an interest in Hancock's homebred Menifee. When Chamrousse was sent to the breeding shed at the completion of her career, Hancock had only to look at the window of his office at Stone Farm to see a good choice for a mate: Menifee. "Jimmy Stone and I own Menifee, so of course that had a lot to do with it, but it's a really good cross," Hancock said. The resulting foal was a bay filly born on Apr. 22, 2005. She's cataloged here as hip 17. "She is also a very nice filly," Hancock said. "She traces back to La Troienne, and she's got a great disposition." L.M.

Three Cheers for Three Chims?...

When opportunity knocks, a lot of times it's appropriate to knock right back. That was the mindset of Three Chimneys' owner Robert Clay when he went to \$300,000 for Bois d'Amour (Woodman), carrying a foal by Hennessy, at the 2004 Keeneland November sale. A



ten-year-old mare, Bois d'Amour is a daughter of Lovlier Linda, most prominently the dam of the late Old Trieste. "It's a terrific family and we try to concentrate on getting into those good families and this was an opportunity we felt that we had to jump on," explained Case Clay, son of Robert and the farm's codirector of sales. "We were kind of look-

ing for a mare that year and it was so threechimneys.com hard to buy that year--we were under-

bidders on a bunch of mares. But our pedigree advisor, Anne Peters, really recommended that we get into this family. We went and looked at her and she's beautiful and we were really fortunate to get her. So hopefully it'll work out." In addition to being the dam of the aforementioned Old Trieste, Lovlier Linda has also clicked with Storm Cat, as she produced Irish Group 3 winner Perigee Moon to the cover of Hennessy; as well as the stakes-winning full sisters Penny's Fortune and Stormica to Storm Cat himself. Case Clay is confident that tonight's offering, hip <u>14</u>, can earn back a large part of his father's investment. "We're very excited about the whole consignment," he said. "[The Hennessy] is an outstanding physical and a great mover and he should do well." Bois d'Amour is the dam of a weanling filly of this year by Three Chimneys' young, promising sire Sky Mesa. A.C.

arrived on the scene with an upset victory in the GII Lexington S. and backed up that effort with a runner-up finish in the 2002 GI Kentucky Derby and a third in the GI Preakness S. Mill Ridge Sales is looking for a similar results tonight, as the agency consigns a yearling full sister to the Saratoga sale as hip <u>43</u>. "She's a

really nice filly," commented Bayne Welker, Jr., Mill Ridge director of sales. "She follows very much what that mare's thrown in the past. There've been some other full siblings and they've all been very attractive, very athletic looking horses and she certainly follows suit." In addition to Proud Citizen, Mill Ridge also con-

signed his full brother Blazing Freedom, who fetched \$460,000 at the Keeneland September sale in 2001.

Welker says there are some similarities between tonight's offering and the dual Classic-placed runner. "This filly is a little more of a Gone West type," he offered. "Proud Citizen probably had a little more leg at that time than this filly does, but she's a very attractive, very

well-balanced individual. We hope she goes on and can perform like Proud Citizen and better, but even if she never sets foot on the racetrack, she's got plenty of residual value." This is the first live foal produced by Drums of Freedom since giving birth to the Gone West filly Dundrummin' in 2001. *A.C.*

Oxley Supporting Stallions With Best Mares...

Oklahoman John Oxley along with his wife Debby, are selling a trio of horses out of some of the top racemares that carried his blue and yellow blocks or the pink silks of Mrs. Oxley. The first of the three could be



the best of the bunch. Hip <u>32</u> is the third foal produced by Darling My Darling (Deputy Minister), a two-time stakes winner and twice runner-up in Grade I company at two. A daughter of GISW Roamin Rachel, Darling My Darling is in turn a half-sister to Japanese

Horse of the Year and G1 Japan Cup winner Zenno Rob Roy. The chestnut filly is from the first crop of Sky Mesa, one of the outstanding two-year-olds of his generation and winner of the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity for Oxley. Hip <u>53</u> is a son of Kentucky Derby hero Monarchos, also raced by Oxley, and the first foal out of Forest Secrets (Forest Wildcat), a \$425,000 purchase by Oxley out of this sale in 1999. The highlight of Forest Secret's career came in 2002, when she posted a 50-1 upset in the GI Acorn S. at Belmont Park, but she also posted a victory in the GII Rampart H. the following season. Selling during Wednesday's second session is hip <u>147</u>. A filly by Grand Slam, the dark bay is the first foal out of Snow Dance (Forest Wildcat), a five-time graded-stakes winner on the turf. Oxley purchased the gray out of this sale for \$220,000, also in 1999. Each of the three offerings is consigned by Gainesway as agent. *AC*

Keene On Success...

By all accounts, Ann McBrayer's Keene Ridge Farm has had a sensational year in 2006 and that trend looks set to continue during the early part of Wednesday night's bidding at Saratoga. Consigned by Gainesway, hip <u>98</u> is a filly from the first crop of 2003 champion sprinter Aldebaran out of Megulity (Court Trial), a halfsister to the stakes winning full siblings Valid Expectations, Little Sister, Little Expectations and Miss Valid Pache. Keene Ridge went to \$125,000 to acquire the chestnut at last year's Keeneland November sale. "I thought she had a lot of upside to her, but it was just a gamble," commented Charlie McKinlay, for the past 3 1/2 years the farm manager at Keene Ridge. "We were hoping that she'd grow up the right way and she did. She's fantastic. She's really filled out, she's grown into herself and she has a very good walk. She always presents herself well and she looks like she's going to be pretty quick." While the operation hopes to play the pinhooking game successfully this week, it's already been a season full of success. In 2001, Charlie Boden, a long-time advisor to Ms. McBrayer, purchased the Theatrical (Ire) mare Belva in a private transaction. Carrying a foal by Smart Strike, the mare gave birth to a colt in early 2002. Sold by Keene Ridge for \$50,000 as a Keeneland September yearling in 2003, English Channel has stamped himself as one of the leading turf horses in this country this season, with victories in the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic and the GI United Nations S. McKinlay and team are naturally full of pride. "It's kind of nice to have that happen, because seemingly it never does," he stated. "It makes you feel like you're really doing the right thing and that you're heading in the right direction. To have a horse like that on the farm and raise him and sell him and have him run like he is, that's quite an honor." Belva is the dam of a yearling filly by Street Cry (Ire), who is set to go under the hammer at this year's September sale, and a weanling filly by Aldebaran. McKinlay reports that Belva is going to sell at this year's Fasig-Tipton November mixed sale carrying a foal by Ghostzapper. Keene Ridge is also the owner of Cuando Quiere, the dam of leading turf distaffer Honey Ryder. A.C.

Eldon Hopes for Spa Redux...

At last year's Saratoga sale, Ken Luke's Eldon Farm Equine sold a son of Mr. Greeley for \$950,000. The Virginia-based farm had bought the chestnut colt as a weanling only months before for \$440,000 at the 2004 Keeneland November Sale. Eldon advisor Debbie Easter is hoping for similar results with a pair of November acquisitions at Saratoga this year. "I would love to have that success again," Easter admitted while discussing hip 99 and hip 124. "I think we have two very nice horses and I think they'll do well," she added. "I guess I should say, I hope they do well." Hip 99, a son of Elusive Quality, was purchased by Eldon for \$620,000, and the attractive weanling has blossomed into an even more attractive yearling, according to Easter. "He looks like a two-year-old," she said. "He's a nice big, leggy horse and he looks like the type of horse that could end up being there in the big races, if he goes ahead and runs. He's just very attractive, he's got a real nice walk and I'm just tickled with him." Easter is also impressed with hip 124, a son of Tale of the Cat purchased in November for \$390,000. "I think he's filled out," Easter said. "He filled out in his hind end even nicer than when he was a weanling and, for a Tale of the Cat, he's pretty leggy. He's got just a great swing in his walk. I like looking at him also." Buying pricey weanlings to pinhook might seem risky, but Eldon has a back-up plan. "The plan is that we bought nice horses," Easter explained. "And if the marketplace wants to reward us for that, great. If not, we're happy running them, too. We have a nice out." Eldon currently has about nine horses in different stages of training and, according to Easter, the two selling next week could be a nice fit if they fail to attract quality bids. "Obviously, when you bring a horse to the market, you'd be disappointed if you bring him home. But, as with those two colts, I couldn't be unhappy owning them. I think either one of those two would make great racehorses. That was the whole plan to buy horses, so that if the market changed, you'd be happy with them." And does she think the market will support Eldon's weanling investments? "There is nothing to indicate to us that things have changed," Easter said. "Certainly, the July sale was strong and I don't think there is anything that has changed between now and July. Who knows, though. It's a horse sale. But that's the nice thing about having our out. We try to buy nice horses, but at the end of the day if something should go wrong with the market, we'd be happy with the horses we have. Hopefully the market keeps on going. It's good for all of us." J.M.

I like to see that brilliance at some point in their lives, even if it wasn't in races." Stuart has already had success picking out stallions for Country Life Farm. "I've always bought stallions for Country Life--I bought them Allen's Prospect," he commented. "I bought a half-



interest from Mr. [B. Wayne] Hughes. As a stallion, he's gone from strength to strength." Stuart is also excited about another filly from his Saratoga consignment. <u>Hip</u> <u>145</u> is a daughter of Grand Slam. Out of Slew City Slicker (Slew City Slew), the yearling is a half sister

Lane's End Returns With a Family Fav...

After a two-year hiatus, Lane's End returns to the Selected sale with a compact three-horse consignment. "We wanted, first of all, to showcase what we think is an exceptional Mineshaft filly, and we wanted to bring a small, boutique consignment," said Lane's End's Bill Farish when asked why the operation decided to again make the trip north to the Spa. Though small in numbers, their draft lacks little when it comes to pedigree. The Mineshaft filly in question is hip 171, a youngster with an impressive page, as well as deep ties to the Versailles nursery. Her sire, by A.P. Indy, raced in green and gold colors of Lane's End chief Will Farish and was named 2003 Horse of the Year off a stellar season that included victories in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, GI Woodward S., GI Suburban H. and GI Pimlico Special H. Her dam is the now-eight-year-old mare Unbridled Lassie (Unbridled), the third-place finisher in the 2002 GI CCA Oaks for Mrs. W.S. Kilroy. The Kilroy family are longtime friends and associates of the Lane's End. Unbridled Lassie is a granddaughter of Lane's End's bluehen mare Lassie Dear, the matriarch of a family that includes, among others, Classic winners Summer Squall and A.P. Keeping a Tight--and Cool--Ship...

August can be a pretty uncomfortable time of the year in the Northeast. Just ask anyone who was around last week. With temperatures hovering around the 100degree mark and high humidity that made moving around a draining effort, several tracks called off racing, including Saratoga, which cancelled Wednesday's card. Even though the heat has taken a welcome downturn since then, many of the horses in the Saratoga sale traveled up from Kentucky--a 15-hour van ride--in the midst of the heat wave late last week, prompting consignors to alter their plans slightly. "We were going to ship at one [p.m.] on Thursday, but we moved the shipping time back to four," explained Eaton Sales' Tom Van Meter. "It's still plenty hot at four, but it gets cooler a lot quicker." In hot weather, VanMeter, like many consignors, stresses the importance of electrolytes, which help maintain an animal's hydration. "We have our vets give them electrolytes before they leave," said Van Meter. "We make sure they're good and hydrated, and we have our vets right there, just in case any of them do get dehydrated. Electrolytes are important. You've got keep the Gatorade in 'em." Denali Stud's Craig Bandoroff and Taylor Made's Mark Taylor echoed those sentiment. "We're real big on electrolytes -- electrolytes in the water, in their food ... the whole deal," said Bandoroff, who added, "Our horses left around four, so a lot of their travel was at night, so it wasn't too hot at all. But when you're shipping a horse or showing a horse, you have to pay attention to that stuff." Said Mark Taylor, "We have our vet tube all of our horses with electrolytes. There are all kinds of ways to get [electrolytes] into a horse: food additives, stuff you can put in their water. Sometimes a horse will go off his feed with the products you put in their food, so we prefer to tube them, but the tube can always present its own problems, too. You just have to watch them." L.M.
