It's been a good summer for Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Stable. In June, colorbearer Jazil, a dead-heat fourth in the GI Kentucky Derby, captured the third leg of the Triple Crown, the GI Belmont S. Jazil was subsequently sidelined with a bruised canon bone, but another Shadwell horse, Invasor (Arg), did a pretty good of picking up the slack. The Argentine-bred followed his wins in the GI Pimlico Special H. and GI Suburban H. with a thrilling nose victory over Sun King in last Saturday's GI Whitney H. at Saratoga. Last night, Shadwell president Rick Nichols added what he hopes is another future star for the operation, paying an even \$1 million for hip 35, a chestnut son of top sire Distorted Humor. "He was a big, strong, correct colt with a good walk to him," said Nichols, who did his bidding from the center of the sales pavilion with Shadwell trainer Kiaran McLaughlin sitting to his left. Nichols said that the colt would likely stay in the States to race, but that Sheikh Hamdan would make that decision at a later date. Shadwell had been shopping for runners with pedigrees suitable for America's dirt racing for the past four years, Nichols said, who added that Sheikh Hamdan's commitment to U.S. racing was strengthened further by the success of Jazil. "Seeing Jazil run in the Kentucky Derby, which was the first race he saw in America live, then coming back and winning the Belmont, it's been...well, it was great," said Nichols. The sale of the hip 35, a half to GSW Fast Decision (Gulch) and GSP City Sister (Carson City) from the immediate family of champion juvenile Dehere, represented a successful return to Saratoga for consignor Lane's End. The Versailles farm had skipped the last two editions of the sale, but chose to return this year with a high-octane three-horse draft. Speaking about hip 35, Lane's End's Bill Farish said, "He's a very well-made, athletic colt. He looks like a racehorse, and he's by the right sire." Farish also said he was pleased that Sheikh Hamdan was the winning bidder. "He's bought some good horses from us over the years, and it was great to see him get the colt," he said. Lane's End consigned the Virginia-bred hip 35 on behalf of breeder Edward P. Evans.



## Jump On the Bandwagon! Barretts May Sale Graduate JUMP ON IN

The top-priced 2006 May Sale filly at \$410,000, **JUMP ON IN** went to post the 4-5 favorite in her August 6 debut and was in "total command," winning by just over 5 lengths in 1:03.65 and posting the fastest 2-year-old Beyer (98) of the meeting.

## Pricey Pinhook for Hartley/DeRenzo...

Asked last March, a month after they had sold a Forestry colt for a world-record \$16 million, if he and partner Dean DeRenzo planned to alter their buying strategy when shopping for pinhooking prospects, Randy Hartley said, "No, I don't think so." Well, maybe just a little bit, as it turns out. Yesterday, the two-yearold consignors more than doubled the amount of money they have ever spent on a yearling when they purchased a son of Storm Cat for \$900,000. Catalogued as hip 66, the handsome dark bay colt is out of the unraced Gone West mare Gone to the Moon and counts as his famous relations the champions Gold Beauty, Dayjur and Sky Beauty. "He's just a good horse--I thought he was the best horse in the sale," said Hartley. "Honestly, I'm kind of surprised we got him." Asked how far he was willing to go, Hartley laughed, "I was done at \$700,000." Previous to last night's sale, the most Hartley/DeRenzo Thoroughbreds had spent on a pinhooking prospect was \$425,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton July Sale. That horse, later named The Green Monkey, went on to become the most expensive horse ever to sell at public auction when Dr. Demi O'Byrne purchased him for Team Coolmore. While not necessarily expecting the same spectacular results with last night's Storm Cat colt, Hartley said he was excited about putting the colt into training down at their farm near Ocala, Florida. "Honestly, if he goes down there and does real good, he's a horse that could bring millions [at the two-year-old sales]," he commented. Hartley added that he hadn't vet been able to visit his most famous graduate, who resides just down the street at Todd Pletcher's barn at Saratoga, but that he was planning a trip to see The Green Monkey this morning. Hip 66, consigned to the sale by Paramount Sales, agent, was bred in Kentucky by Eagle Holdings.

## Purge Sis Brings \$600,000...

A full-sister to Grade I winner Purge became the first horse of the evening to clear the half-million mark last night when Live Oak Plantation's Charlotte Weber fought off a slew of challengers to land the filly at \$600,000. The daughter of Pulpit sold as hip 26 from the consignment of Taylor Made Sales Agency. "We thought she was a nice physical," said Weber. "She's got a nice page on her, and she'll fit nicely into our broodmare band if she can fulfill her potential as an athlete." Perhaps it was fitting that hip 26 sold at Humphrey S. Sales Pavilion in Saratoga, given the fact that her brother Purge scored one of his biggest successes across the road. In 2004, Purge romped by 4 1/2 lengths over The Cliff's Edge in the GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga Race Course. He went on to take the 2005 renewal of the GI Cigar Mile H. and now stands at Vinery Stud in Kentucky for \$20,000. Hip 26 is out of the stakes-winning Copelan's Bid Gal (Copelan), herself a half-sister to MGSW Valid Wager. Bred in Kentucky by Glory Days Breeding, hip 26 will now go to Live Oak in Ocala, Florida to be broken.




## Great Sale for Greathouses...

"I like the filly very much, she was very nice," Gerry commented. If Gerry has faith in Theatrical, it's understandable. One of Lazy F's best horses in recent memory was his daughter Auntie Mame, trained by Penna to a trio of gradedstakes victories, including the 1998 running of the GI Flower Bowl Invitational H. Gerry indicated that Auntie Mame's current two-year-old, Uncle Indy (A.P. Indy), could make an appearance at Saratoga. Less than five minutes later, Gerry signed the ticket on hip 22, a son of Awesome Again from GISW Classy Mirage (Storm Bird). ## Statistically Speaking...

Last night's opening session generally held its own versus last year. The average of \$313,167 was off by a little more than three percent, but the middle market grew by two percent. The buyback rate remained steady, with one of every four horses failing to find a home. "By and large, consignors brought good horses and sold them well," said Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson. "It was a good sale. Horse for horse, they sold well. It was a very similar sale to last year. The average is down a bit, but the median is up. It's a very similar marketplace as last year."

Led by the sale-topping Sky Mesa filly purchased by agent John Ferguson for \$1.15 million, yesterday's opening session of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale featured a number of fillies that were well-received in the ring. "His left hind hoof continues to show signs of regrowth and looks healthy." The colt's left hind foot, which had most of the hoof wall removed due to severe laminitis, has a daily bandage change for examination and treatment. Barbaro remains in the Intensive Care Unit of the University of Pennsylvania's George D. Widener Hospital, where he is recovering from injuries suffered at the Preakness on May 20.

The weekend showcased two Grade I events which promised to point up likely major "second-season" contenders from the ranks of three-year-old colts and older males. The two events, the GI Haskell Invitational S. and GI Whitney S., were won in two very different styles, by two horses with very different types of pedigrees.

Runner-up in the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S., Bluegrass Cat revealed a a new dimension in his abilities in the Haskell, producing a powerful finishing kick to draw off and score by seven lengths from the front-running Praying for Cash. A son of Storm Cat, Bluegrass Cat is out of the unraced A.P. Indy mare She's a Winner, previously dam of the two-time graded stakes winner Lord of the Game. The cross of Storm Cat over mares by A.P. Indy has always looked as if it might work well--Storm Cat and his sons work well with Seattle Slew in general, and both Storm Cat and A.P. Indy are out of Secretariat mares--and the day before the Haskell, the GIII Sorrento S. was won by Untouched Talent, a two-year-old filly who is also by Storm Cat out of an A.P. Indy mare.

As we mentioned, even though Bluegrass Cat took the GII Remsen S. and GIII Nashua S. at two, and was runner-up in two Classics this year, the Haskell marked a new performance high for him. We wonder if this is something in line with the A.P. Indy influence: as we mentioned a few weeks ago with regard to Bernardini, the tendency for horses by that sire is to reach their peak after the Classics have passed. We can certainly see something similar to Bluegrass Cat's pattern with Accelerator and Daydreaming, a talented brother and sister to the dam of Bluegrass Cat. Accelerator won an off the turf renewal of the GIII Pilgrim S. at two, but was better at three, when he took runner-up spot in the GII Wood Memorial, and at four, when he was three times graded placed, including a third in the GI Metropolitan H. Daydreaming was third in the GI Spinaway S. on her second start at two, but didn't get her first stakes win until taking the GIII Indiana Breeders' Cup Oaks in October of her three-year-old season. Also successful in the GII Top Flight H. that year, Daydreaming added the GII Next Move H. at four.

Bluegrass Cat's granddam, Get Lucky, won the GIII Affectionately H. at three, and was a sister to Rhythm, a champion at two, and winner of the GI Travers S.-the next likely target for Bluegrass Cat--at three. We should also note that Get Lucky is a sister to the very successful Maryland-based sire, Not For Love, and three-quarters related to Woodman, who is by Mr. Prospector out of a sister to Bluegrass Cat's fourth dam, champion two-year-old filly Numbered Account. Bluegrass Cat's third dam, Dance Number, won the GI Beldame S. and GII Shuvee H.

With his future stud career in mind, it's interesting to note that Bluegrass Cat has pedigree similarities to two hot young sires, Dixie Union and Johannesburg. Bluegrass Cat is a Storm Cat (grandson of Northern Dancer) horse out of a mare by a son of Seattle Slew, with a second dam by Mr. Prospector. Pedigree Perspectives cont. p9

Dixie Union is a Northern Dancer-line stallion out of a mare by a son of Seattle Slew, and with a second dam by Mr. Prospector, while Johannesburg is by a son of Storm Cat, and has a second dam by Mr. Prospector. Inbreeding to Mr. Prospector is already found in six of Dixie Union's first 12 stakes winners, including graded scorer High Cotton, who is out of a mare by A.P. Indy and therefore also inbred to Seattle Slew. Meanwhile, Johannesburg's first crop is headline by the GII Sanford S. first and second, Scat Daddy and Teuflesberg, and the G2 Richmond S. winner Hamoody, all three inbred to Mr. Prospector, with Scat Daddy being out of a mare by that horse. In the light of that it will be very interesting to see how Bluegrass Cat does with Mr. Prospector line mares, particularly those bred on a parallel Mr. Prospector/Northern Dancer cross to Bluegrass Cat's granddam, Get Lucky.

The day before the Haskell, the Whitney was captured by Invasor, who fought off an early challenge from last year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic runner-up Flower Alley, then dug in late to hold off a determined Sun King. In doing so, he took his U.S. record to threefor-three, having previously won the GI Pimlico Special and GI Suburban H. In fact, Invasor has been perfect on the American continent, and he also captured all five of his starts in Uruguay, where he was a Triple Crown winner and Horse of the Year. His sole defeat came early this year when fourth in the G2 UAE Derby.

Although he spent the formative part of his racing career in Uruguay, Invasor was bred in Argentina. He is a son of Candy Stripes, who, having been represented by champion turf horse Leroidesanimaux last year, may end up with a champion on dirt this term if Invasor continues in similar form. Candy Stripes, who did all his racing on turf, started only six times and never won a black-type event, but did finish third (promoted to second by the stewards), beaten two lengths, in the G1 French 2000 Guineas. Retired to stud in Argentina, Candy Stripes made a sensational start to his career, which led to him being imported to stand in the U.S., first in Kentucky and then in Florida. Unfortunately, Candy Stripes seemed less well-suited to the mares he covered in the U.S., and from four crops sired here, his only graded scorer was champion Canadian turf mare Sweetest Thing. However, from South American mares, which one suspects fit him better physically, Candy Stripes has several other runners that have made their names in the U.S., these including, in addition to Leroidesanimaux and Invasor, the Grade I-winning Different, and graded scorers Lundy's Liability, Victory Stripes and Criollito. Incidentally, Different, Lundy's Liability, Victory Stripes and Criollito all scored major victories on dirt, so in this respect Candy Stripes is emulating his sire, Blushing Groom, a turf horse who was able to get Blushing John, Arazi and Sky Beauty, who all earned Eclipse Awards for the achievements on dirt--as well as other major dirt performers such as You'd Be Surprised, Mt. Livermore and Rahy.

Invasor's dam, Quendom (by the Nashua line stallion, Interprete), never ran, but her immediate family had already made it's presence known in the U.S. prior to the arrival of Invasor. Quendom's dam, the Argentine Group 1 winner Reina Victoriosa, is dam of the More Than Ready brothers More Than Regal, winner this year of the Iowa Derby and Sportsman's Paradise S., and Ready Ruler, winner in 2004 of the El Joven S.

Invasor's pedigree is a complete outcross at five generations, but we can note that whereas Invasor is out of a mare by Interprete, Candy Stripes has also sired two Grade I winners out of mares by Interprete's sire, Farnesio. He is a horse whose pedigree has some important background similarities to that of Candy Stripes' broodmare sire, Lyphard.

At stud in Argentina, Candy Stripes made a great start to his stud career, his early crops including Seaborg, winner of South America's greatest race, the G1 Gran Premio Internacional Carlos Pellegrini, as well as horses like Different, a champion in Argentina and a multiple Grade I winner in the U.S., and Criollito, a Group 1 winner in his native country and successful in the GIII Churchill Downs H. in the U.S.

With his runners showing so much talent in North America, Candy Stripes, was acquired to stand at Taylor Made Farm in Kentucky. Pedigree Perspectives cont. p10

Unfortunately, he didn't hit it off anywhere near as well with North American mares, and from his time in the U.S. sired only four stakes winners. Returned to South America, however, Candy Stripes has continued to shine. Not only has he sired numerous additional high-class performers in Argentina and Brazil, but was also represented by Leroidesanimaux, winner in the U.S. of the GI Citation H., GIII Inglewood H. and GIII Morvich H., and Eventuail, captor in South Africa of the G1 South African Guineas and G1 Turffontein Summer Cup.

Two questions. One: what do Blushing John, Arazi, Sky Beauty, Eliza, Cherokee Run, Serena's Song, Chilukki, Peaks and Valleys and Mt. Sassafras have in common? Two: what is the point of that question?

The answer to the first question is that all the horses named above are by Blushing Groom or sons of Blushing Groom, and all earned champion status through their efforts on dirt. The answer to the second is another question, one posed to us by Stonewall Stallions with regard to Leroidesanimaux, a Blushing Groom grandson who was the champion turf horse of 2005 and who is now standing his first season at Stonewall.

That question, "what are Leroidesanimaux's chances of siring high-class runners on the dirt?"

Of course, Leroidesanimaux made his name on the turf, and that statement also applies to his sire, and to nearly all of Leroixdesanimaux's immediate family. However, that statement also fits the description of Leroixdesanimaux's male-line ancestor, Nasrullah. Imported from Europe in 1950, he subsequently took the Leading Sire title five times, an achievement then surpassed by his son, Bold Ruler, an eight-time Leading Sire.

Other Nasrullah line horses to head the Leading Sire table include champion turf horses T. V. Lark and Cozzene (by Caro, a turf runner who also sired champion three-year-old filly and Kentucky Derby heroine Winning Colors).

Leroidesanimaux's grandsire, Blushing Groom, is by Red God, a son of Nasrullah. A brilliant champion twoyear-old and Classic-winning miler in Europe, Blushing Groom also came to stand in the U.S. without ever having competed on the dirt. During his tremendously successful career, Blushing Groom sired 92 stakes winners--including his three Eclipse Award winners.

From the pedigree standpoint, there is another interesting angle here. Leroidesanimaux's third dam, champion Sookera, is very closely related to the dam of Mariah's Storm. Like Leroidesanimaux, Mariah's Storm was sired by a son of Blushing Groom. A multiple graded-stakes winner on the dirt, Mariah's Storm, is dam of Giant's Causeway, a European champion on the turf, who was beaten inches in the Breeders' Cup Classic on his only dirt outing. A sire sensation with his first two crops, Giant's Causeway is already represented by dirt graded-stakes winners First Samurai, Diamond Omi and Oonagh Maccool.
