#### **EMPIRE IN THE MAKING**

Bidding started off slowly on hip 146, but interest on the daughter of Empire Maker picked up quickly as Egyptian businessman Ahmed Zayat and representa-

atives of Darley, sitting just across the aisle from each other in the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion, engaged in a spirited bidding duel. Zavat wound up the winner for the beautiful bay with a final bid of \$1.6 million at vesterday's final session of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Selected Yearlings. Zayat, a relative newcomer to the sport, never hesitated during

the bidding and, asked if he was surprised by the price, said, "I went for it, right?" Zayat said the yearling will be sent to Bill Mott, who already has plenty of experience with the family after training the yearling's stakeswinning dam Sluice (Seeking the Gold). Sluice is a daughter of multiple Grade I winner Lakeway (Seattle Slew). "I trained the mother--it's a great family; the second dam was a real tough race horse," Mott said. "Sometimes the daughters of those kind of mares are good producers." The yearling herself also impressed Mott. "I thought she was a lovely filly--obviously the best filly in the sale." Asked to compare the youngster to her mother, Mott said, "She's bigger and scopier at this point. I think she's actually an improvement, physically, on her mother--I think she probably got a little bit of scope from Empire Maker." Cont. p2

business, plans don't always work, so when it happens, it's special." The plan worked to perfection for the yearling's breeder Diane Snowden, who with her husband Guy, purchased Sluice for \$1.5 million as a yearling at the 1999 Keeneland July sale. "Mrs. Snowden and I did the mating and foaled her, and we're re-

ally excited to get a first foal to look like that," Bandoroff said. Explaining the choice of Empire Maker to cover Sluice, Bandoroff added, "My theory was that until a mare shows you what she's got, I didn't want to put a great big stud fee in her. I like Empire Maker, I love his pedigree. So we went to him. We went to Mineshaft [this year] on the same theory. Now I'll step her up and breed to a big stud fee." Sluice has a weanling colt by Fusaichi Pegasus and is currently in foal to Mineshaft. Diane Snowden was thrilled with the sale. "A beautiful, beautiful animal; it's hard to part with her," Snowden admitted. While the Snowdens do race many of the horses they breed, she explained, "We sell horses that we feel are important enough to make a statement." This one actually made 1.6 million statements.

#### Man on A Mission...

Ahmed Zayat walked into the pavilion yesterday at the Fasig-Tipton Yearling Sale in Saratoga under a veil of mystery given his low profile at earlier sales. Rarely at the forefront of much of the bidding action at previous sales, Zayat came out in grand style after securing two of the top four highest-priced yearlings at yester-

day's second session. And while the Egyptian-born businessman's foray into the game hit center stage with a fevered bidding battle with Darley's John Ferguson, Zayat admitted that his passion for horses is nothing new. Heavily interested in horses as a child, Zayat had to put that love largely on hold while developing his successful company Al-Ahram Beverages Company (ABC), but returned to his childhood passion after lightening his workload in recent years. Following the purchase of his first Thoroughbred two years ago, Zayat has

increased his stable to 170 head, while spreading his stock out to 12 trainers. No stranger to European racing with six trainers under his employ, Zayat has six trainers in the U.S.: Bill Mott, Bob Baffert, Patrick Biancone, Todd Pletcher, Mark Casse and Richard Dutrow. "My goal is to create the best-bred horses," said Zayat, explaining his game plan. "We will race them, and, hopefully, they'll become champions. Then we'll take it to the next step." While a full-fledged breeding farm may still be a few years away, Zayat indicated that every horse brought into the program is selected with an eye on breeding future champions. "We look at conformation, soundness, pedigree, Ragozin sheets and even heart measurements when we decide to buy a horse," he explained. "We want to build on a strong base." And while Zayat considers this game a chance, he acknowledges that it's something far deeper than luck that has brought him to where he is today. "My convictions have served me well," said Zayat. "I always follow my convictions."

Don Adam admitted this could be the only yearling he'll buy this year, but it was a memorable one. The owner of Courtlandt Farm paid \$1.45 million for hip 171, a filly from the first crop of 2003 Horse of the Year Mineshaft. "This is the first yearling I've bought in

a while," Adam said. "But the pedigree was one I just couldn't pass up. This was the only horse in the sale that I had any interest in. She's a collector's item." The much sought-after filly is out of Unbridled Lassie (Unbridled) and from the family of Broodmare of the Year Weekend Surprise. "She's just a beautiful filly,"

Adam added. The seven-figure sale was just what Lane's End's Bill Farish was hoping for as a coming out party for Mineshaft. "We put her in the sale hoping to get Mineshaft off to a good start and hopefully we've done that," Farish said. "We sell a lot of the family every year, so it's not such a rare occurrence, but she's just a very special filly. Physically, one of the best we've ever had."

#### Song of Songs...

A grey colt by Unbridled's Song set the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion alight yesterday, attracting a final bid of \$1.3 million from Sheikh Mohammed's bloodstock agent John Ferguson. "He has great conformation and is very athletic," Ferguson said. The attractive yearling is out of the unraced Queen's Lady (Storm Cat), a full sister to the dam of 2005 champion juvenile filly Folklore. Asked about the price tag, Ferguson said, "We expected he'd bring about what he brought. He's by a very good sire. He's a natural athlete; I'm looking forward to having him in training next year." Where the colt will be in training in the vast Godolphin empire is still undecided. "Sheikh Mohammed will have to decide where the horse will train, but he probably looks more like an American horse," Ferguson said. "But that is for Sheikh Mohammed to decide when he comes over in September." The Maktoum family has enjoyed a superb 2006, headlined by GI Preakness S. winner Bernardini and by GI Belmont S. winner Jazil. Asked if that success has further energized the racing dynasty of Dubai's ruling family, Ferguson said, "We've always been excited. We've had great success all over the world. Obviously to have an American Classic winner--for two brothers to win two legs of the Triple Crown--is fabulous." The seven-figure price tag was gratifying for the connections of the Unbridled's Song colt, according to Mark Taylor of Taylor Made Farm, which consigned the yearling and is listed as co-breeder along with Seven Island Ltd Partnership and the Unbridled's Song Syndicate in a foal-sharing arrangement. "He had the whole package," Taylor said. "He's by the right stallion, his mother is a full sister to the dam of Folklore. He had a great walk, he's a very good-looking colt, but you can't predict. On a horse like that you don't know if he's going to bring \$600,000 or \$1.2 million. It just depends on what two people line up on him. I thought personally that he was going to bring between \$800,000 and a million, so I was in the ballpark. But we were very happy with the sale." Bloodstock agent Buzz Chace, bidding on behalf of Ernie Paragallo, was an underbidder on the colt.

#### Quality Apparent...

Eldon Farm went to \$620,000 to buy a weanling colt by Elusive Quality last November at Keeneland. Selling early last night as hip 99, the bay attracted a nice return on that investment, selling to Ahmed Zayat for \$900,000 at the final session of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale. Asked what he liked about the yearling, Zayat said, "Everything. I thought he was the best colt in the sale." He is out of Mermaid's Tale (Boston Harbor), a half-sister to the Grade I-placed Ashboro. Gainesway consigned the yearling on behalf of Eldon Equine. "That was in the range we thought he'd bring," Gainesway's Brian Graves said of the \$900,000 price tag. "We were very pleased with the way the colt sold. We thought he could bring a million or more, but we thought he brought a good price." Eldon was back in pinhooking mode a few hips later when a colt by Tale of the Cat colt, purchased by the Virginia-based farm for \$390,000 in November, sold for \$400,000 to Maurice Miller III.

#### In The Thick of It...

Taylor Made's stallion Forestry, who blew everyone away with a spectacular score when a son brought a cool \$16-million at Fasig-Tipton's Calder Sale, received additional plaudits last night when a filly brought \$650,000. Consigned by Lane's End as hip 115, the chestnut was purchased by agent Mike Ryan for an undisclosed client. "He's an existing client that plans to establish a small but select broodmare band," said Ryan. "He'll race the filly in New York." The Feb. 7 foal is out of graded stakes winner People's Princess (Meadowlake). The 10-year-old mare--who sold for \$410,000 at this venue in 1997 before going on to be an \$800,000 FTFFEB juvenile--is a full sister to Meadow Flight, winner of the GII Pennsylvania Derby, GIII Flamingo S. and second in the GI Haskell Invitational H. This yearling looks to have all of the physical attributes to also make her name for herself on the track. "She's a very mature, well-made, strong filly-she's very athletic," Ryan commented. "She's a great Forestry--there is really nothing not to like about her."

#### Another Mr. Greeley for Coolmore...

Earlier in the year, Dr. Demi O'Byrne purchased a Mr. Greeley colt for \$2 million at Fasig-Tipton's Calder juvenile sale, and the Irish bloodstock agent went back to the same well last night. This time, it was a son of the Gainesway stallion out of the unraced A.P. Indy mare Tell Me Now that caught O'Byrne's attention. Selling out of Gainesway draft as hip 158, the striking Mar. 29 foal was knocked down for \$800,000. The bay hails from the family of Triple Crown hero Affirmed, as well as GSW White Crown and SW & GISP Dr. Caton. "This colt went over extremely well right from the getgo," Gaineway's Michael Hernon. "We hope he joins the very impressive list of Grade I winners that Mr. O'Byrne has amassed to date. We're delighted, as we stand the stallion and it's a terrific endorsement. It's a great endorsement of the horse that such a prominent figure on the world's stage is such a strong supporter of Mr. Greeley." Hernon added, "We'd like to express our thanks to Jess Jackson of Stonestreet, who was the immediate underbidder, as well as other parties that bid on the horse."

#### Just For Fun...

It didn't take long for Coolmore to jump into the fray when Demi O'Byrne went to \$650,000 for hip 111, a son of Distorted Humor yesterday. Out of GSP Our Tomboy (Bates Motel), the Feb. 19 foal was consigned by Eaton Sales, agent for Bona Terra Farms. "We thought he'd bring \$500-750,000," explained Eaton's Reiley MacDonald. "He's a big, good-looking son of Distorted Humor. He's very athletic, and that was a good price for a very good racehorse prospect." The colt marked O'Byrne's first purchase of an offspring of the 13-year-old stallion. "Demi wanted a Distorted Humor," said MacDonald. "He loved him when he saw him at the farm."

tional field of 11. Californiabased **The Tin Man** (Affirmed), now eight, will look to be the oldest horse to win the \$1-million contest since John Henry took his second renewal as a nine-year-old in 1984. The Tin Man last ran in this race in 2003, when he was sixth in the controversial contest won by Sulamani

(Ire). A 10-1 chance on the morning line, he will break from post with Victor Espinoza in the irons. Rising from the ashes once again is **Phoenix Reach (Ire)** (Alhaarth). The peripatetic six-year-old has not faced the starter

since finishing unplaced last year's GI King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. But, prior to that, he had raced in seven different countries, winning the 2003 GI Canadian International, the 2004 G1 Hong Kong Vase and the 2005 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic in between several setbacks. "Usually, you'd probably give up with a horse, but he keeps coming

back from every setback even better," trainer Andrew Balding told *Daily Racing Form*. "He's very durable and very tough." Trainer Todd Pletcher was torn between the Million and Saratoga's GI Sword Dancer for **English Channel** (Smart Strike), but has apparently gone for the Chicago option with an eye on Eclipse consideration. "Right now, I think he's the divisional leader, and if we get lucky enough to win that race it'll really strengthen his position," he told *DRF*. The 3-1 morning-line favorite drew the outside post 11, just outside of nemesis **Cacique (Ire)** (Danehill), the 4-1 second choice. If they both make it to the start, it will mark the fourth consecutive time that they meet in a Grade I race. English Channel leads 2-1 in their previous face-offs.

NO ARLINGTON FOR FALLON Illinois Racing Board officials yesterday denied beleaguered champion jockey Kieren Fallon a license to ride in Illinois, according to Daily Racing Form. Fallon had been slated to ride Ace (Ire) and Ivan Denisovich (Ire) in Saturday's GI Arlington Million and GI Secretariat S., respectively; both runners were entered without a rider named. He was also denied access to Arlington Park and any other Illinois racetracks. Fallon rode last year's Arlington Million winner Powerscourt (GB) for trainer Aidan O'Brien, who conditions the aforementioned runners. Along with several other members of the British racing industry, Fallon was charged with conspiring to defraud bettors and had his license revoked in Britain. Fallon, the first-call rider for O'Brien's Ballydoyle operation, has continued to ride in Ireland and France because both iurisdictions will await a final verdict in the matter.

## Barbaro Update

## ANOTHER SMOOTH CAST CHANGE FOR BARBARO



KENNETT SQUARE, PA...Kentucky Derby winner Barbaro is doing well this morning after the cast on his right hind limb was changed late yesterday afternoon under general anesthesia. "The leg looked good under the cast, especially considering the length of time that he has been in a cast," said Dr. Dean Richardson, Chief of Surgery. "The radiographs also were encouraging. There is no sign of active infection. This is further supported by his markedly improving blood values over the last two weeks. He had an excellent pool recovery; he is a very intelligent horse and has definitely figured out the whole process." The cast on the right hind leg encloses the foot and extends up to just below the hock. It will continue to be changed regularly until the fractures and joint fusions have healed completely enough to sustain full weight bearing. The bandage and protective boot on Barbaro's laminitic left hind foot continues to be changed daily. "The appearance of the foot is very good. It is dry and healthy looking with excellent early regrowth at the coronary band," said Dr. Richardson. Barbaro remains in the Intensive Care Unit of the University of Pennsylvania's George D. Widener Hospital, where he is recovering from injuries suffered at the Preakness May 20. The next update will be posted Tuesday, Aug. 15 unless there is a significant change in Barbaro's condition.

FLORIDA SLOTS DEALT SETBACK A Florida state appeals court ruled Tuesday that a lawsuit challenging the constitutional amendment which would allow for slot-machine gambling in two Florida counties should be reinstated, according to published reports. The lawsuit alleges that petitions gathered to put the measure on the ballot in 2004 contained forged signatures of dead people, as well as phantom voters. It was filed by the Humane Society of the United States and GREY2K USA, a greyhound protection organization. A lower court threw out the suit earlier this year, finding that the election that approved the amendment rectified any problems with the petitions. A panel of three judges from the 1st District Court of Appeal ruled 2-1 to overturn that decision, sending the case back to the lower court for trial. If it is determined that there was fraud involved with the gathering of signatures, the amendment will be ruled invalid.

John is very much a team player within our operation and wouldn't want to see us miss this because he wasn't there. We've consciously targeted these races and, although we don't want to rush him to get to Haydock, we could if we decide to change plans." #### Tax Legislation Benefits Horse Owners

Congress has extended the \$100,000 expensing allowance for assets placed into service — which may include horses, fencing and other farm equipment — for an additional two years. The allowance now runs through 2009. The benefit is reduced dollar for dollar when total purchases exceed \$400,000 per year.

The 15 percent tax rate on capital gains also has been extended two years and now runs through 2010.

Through legislative advocacy and its Political Action Committee, Horse PAC, NTRA works to educate Members of Congress about the horse racing and pari-mutuel industries.
