NO TIME TO RELAX IN SWORD DANCER

With horses like English Channel and Cacique (Ire) in the GI Arlington Million this weekend, there's little argument that the most contentious turf event for males in the country will be held in Chicago. But that



doesn't mean Saturday's GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. at Saratoga will be a cakewalk for likely favorite Relaxed Gesture (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), according to his trainer. "There are no easy Grade I's," Christophe Clemente asserted yesterday. Still, there are no monsters in a race that includes MGSW Silverfoot (With Approval) and last year's Queen's Plate winner

Wild Desert (Wild Rush), and Relaxed Gesture should have every opportunity to notch his first victory of 2006. He was well-beaten in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic in March, but ran admirably in two U.S. starts since, finishing second by a head in the June 10 GI Manhattan H. and third, to English Channel and Cacique, in the July 8 GI United Nations H. In addition to having that pair halfway across the country Saturday, Relaxed Gesture doesn't have to ship for the Sword Dancer, which played in Clement's decision to keep him in New York. "My horse is training here and it's nice to run them where they're training," Clement said. The chestnut gave a good account of himself in the 2005 renewal of the Sword Dancer, finishing second to King's Drama (Ire). "He ran very well last year," Clement said. "He just got beat by a better horse."



Back in the year 2000, there were 603 yearlings sold in three Summer sales, and they grossed over \$148 million. The Keeneland September Sale that year grossed another \$290 million. So, totaling the then-four most important yearling sales in North America, 3,912 yearlings sold for \$439,691,600, and averaged \$112,396.

A lot happened in the ensuing five years; the dot-com crash hit the business hard in 2001, when the corresponding gross dropped to \$402 million. Then MRLS struck, and the gross for the four key North American yearling sales dropped to just over \$320 million in 2002, and \$350 million in 2003 (now three sales, with the demise of Keeneland July). There was a big recovery, to \$409 million, in 2004, and further sustained gains in 2005, when 4,016 yearlings in the three sales combined sold for \$454,870,900 and averaged \$113,265. Having suffered the double whammy of the dot-com crash and MRLS since 2000, there were three percent more sold in 2005 than in 2000, for three percent more money, and the average had gained a fraction of one percent. Given the adversities, that is probably testimony to just how strong this market really is--especially when you consider last September's yearling sale grossed \$384,349,900, shattering the previous record by some \$60 million.

But it was not even as straightforward as that. In the last five years, the summer yearling market, through the loss of Keeneland July and the reduction of Saratoga from three nights to two, has lost almost half its value-down over \$70 million from the \$148 million total in 2000, to \$77,683,000 this year. By the same token, Keeneland September was up over \$93 million in the same period.

All horses in the *TDN* are bred in North America, unless otherwise indicated

Since Keeneland July ended in 2002, Fasig-Tipton has had the major North American summer yearling market all to itself, first at Fasig-Tipton July, then at Saratoga. In 2002, the final year of Keeneland July, Fasig July and Saratoga combined grossed \$67 million. It was up to \$76.5 million in 2003 and \$84.3 million in 2004, but last year Fasig got clobbered on both fronts-they overbooked Fasig July while cutting Saratoga from three nights to two--and the combined two-sale gross was back down to \$70 million. A month later Keeneland was breaking all known records.

For 2006, some tweaking took place for both Fasig sales, and the results were very positive: the July sale did drop another \$1.5 million in gross, but they got the number catalogued back into line (470 this year, 679 in 2005), and their average (\$115,954) bested even the 2004 average (\$114,260). For Saratoga, they catalogued around 90 per session, and sold 26 percent more horses than last year for 26 percent more money (thus maintaining the average). The gross went up almost \$9 million from last year, to more than \$42 million, and this year's \$323,731 average was within a fraction of a point of the 2005 average of \$324,417. Sires represented by their

\$1,600,000 respectively. It's interesting that there are five top prospects standing for \$30,000 or more with their first yearlings this year, and none of the five is Northern Dancer-line. Three are Seattle Slew (Vindication, Mineshaft, and Sky Mesa), while the other two (Aldebaran and Empire Maker) are Mr. Prospector-line; Aldebaran by Mr. Prospector himself (and his last top son to go to stud, actually) and Empire Maker by Unbridled. While all of the top five have sold at least fine, it's noteworthy that, among them, they have had 30 yearlings sell; the same five sires have 261 yearlings catalogued for Keeneland September. Galileo in unassailable lead, but Medicean position in jeopardy



HILE the lower end of the second-crop European sires' table continues to be a battle ground for places - in some cases meaning the difference between a fee change and export - the top end looks a cut-and-dried affair, with Galileo having secured an unassailable lead over his nearest competitor.

Earlier this season, Galileo was sitting at the head of the table mainly thanks to Nightime's Classic victory. Now the son of Sadler's Wells has yet another Classic contender in the Gordon Stakes winner Sixties Icon, a leading fancy for the St Leger, while Allegretto, Red Rocks and

Heliostatic, as well as exciting juvenile Teofilio, are further evidence of the stallion's versatility.

In Australia, Galileo just missed out on the first-season sires' championship, despite siring 11 winners. With three stakes scorers among his first southern hemisphere crop and with the promise of further to come, it would not be a surprise to see him dominate in Australia next season as well.

His nearest pursuer in Europe, Medicean, is in a vulnerable position. If Nannina is stripped of her Coronation Stakes win, which is worth approximately £152,000, Medicean will lose his second spot in the table, thus leaving the door open for a Coolmore sweep of the top three spots.

well await some of this year's first-crop yearling sires. Herewith, to remind ourselves, we publish the top 20's, both here and in Europe. Of the American sires, Johannesburg and Officer (12 winners each, both with a stakes winner in Europe) have surged clear among their sire group. Johannesburg had the GII Sanford S. 1-2 Scat Daddy and

Teuflesberg at Saratoga, plus GII Richmond S. winner Hamoody, at Goodwood last week; Officer has had three stakes-placed horses in America, plus the stakes-winning filly Satulagi in Europe.

The Europeans are a bit more advanced at this stage; 10 of their top 11 have already had stakes horses. Elhamri, winner of the Listed Windsor Castle S. at Royal Ascot, added a valuable sales race at Newbury, taking his sire, Noverre, into a close second behind Invincible Spirit, who is now up to 21 winners. Kyllachy and Redback are still third and fourth; the Danzig horse Ishiguru only stayed five furlongs himself, but his son, Hellvelyn, won the GII Coventry S. over six at Royal Ascot, and is due to run in a Grade 1, possibly this weekend. Iron Mask, another sprinter by Danzig, has a French stakes winner, while two of the cheaper Darley horses, Tobougg and Best of the Bests, are both acting like they could be better than £5,000 stallions. This sire crop's hottest prospect, Rock of Gibraltar, is only just ahead of his American stablemate, Johannesburg (in Europe), at this juncture, but one does just get the feeling there could be big news emanating from that corner before much longer. Sellers of yearlings by him will be hoping it happens before the Deauville sale gets underway at the end of next week; some of the best pedigrees in the catalogue are by Rock of Gibraltar.



Third Inspection Finds Arlington Surface Safe:

"Our primary concern has always been for the safety of the horses and jockeys who ride them. We have and will continue to fully cooperate with the Illinois Racing Board. We have on our own taken numerous pro-active measures to insure the safety of our track."



Magna, Horsemen Reach Slot Revenue Agreement:

Magna Entertainment Corp., owner of Gulfstream Park, announced yesterday that it has reached a definitive agreement with the Florida Horsemen Benevolent and Protective Association (FHBPA) on the purse contributions from slot machine revenues at Gulfstream Park. Under the terms of the agreement, the FHBPA will receive 7.5 percent of slot machine revenues at Gulfstream Park once the first 500 slot machines are installed and operational. MEC's initial plans are to have 500 slot machines installed and operational at Gulfstream Park before the end of October 2006. In the event MEC installs and operates 1,500 slot machines, which is the maximum permitted under law, the agreement calls for the FHBPA to receive 6.75 percent of the first \$200 million in annual slot machine revenues and 12.6 percent of annual slot machine revenues in excess of \$200 million. WINSTON CHARGED BY HRA

Britain's rolling race-fixing scandal took another turn on Wednesday when the Horseracing Regulatory Authority notified jockey Robert Winston that he is to be charged after an investigation into alleged corruption in racing. The prominent rider was named by the HRA; reportedly, fellow jockeys Luke Fletcher, Robbie Fitzpatrick and Fran Ferris and five unlicensed individuals, one being a former bookmaker, have also been informed of charges. It is believed that the investigation does not relate to the high-profile City of London Operation Crypton, which has seen charges brought against 11 people, including Kieren Fallon. Winston, who enjoys a connection with the Sir Michael Stoute stable, had been released from bail without charge by the City of London Police last month. Paul Struthers, public relations manager for the HRA, issued a statement yesterday which read, "We can confirm that four jockeys and five unlicensed individuals, one a former bookmaker, have been charged in connection with corrupt practices.

"When licensed individuals are charged with offences of a serious nature we always give them notice of when we intend to release the charges to the press and public. In doing this, we give them time to digest the charges and seek legal advice. On occasion, representations are made to delay releasing such charges which need to be considered. Clearly, this does not take account of statements made prior to the release of charges by those that are charged. Our position is, therefore, that as things stand, we will announce further details of these charges, and the individuals involved, after the weekend." Winston is currently sidelined after a fall at Pontefract on Wednesday, but is expected to be back in action at Newmarket today before taking part in Ascot's Shergar Cup tomorrow.
