"She ran real big at River Downs and they called the race a nocontest," winning trainer Tom Proctor said. "I thought it was a very big risk of Mrs. Alexander to run this filly here, giving up \$60,000 [the winner's share of an Ohiobred stakes race] to run here and try to get this filly some graded black type. We ended up making \$30,000 more, so we did good."

Market Remains Strong at Deauville...

A total of 78 horses went through the ring Saturday evening, and there was no slowing the trend nor the demand from buyers. The gross on the evening totalled €6,225,000, for an average €92,910 and a median of €70,000. The clearance rate was a shade under 86 percent on the day. Over the first two days of the sale, the overall clearance rate reached an all-time high of just over 80 percent. It is a bit too early to compare this sale with last year's figures, but the market remained strong and pleased Argana's management. "We have kept the same diversity of buyers from yesterday and, to reach such a high percentage of horses sold on such a market, is a great feat, outlining the quality of the catalogue," said Managing Director Eric Hoyeau. "Certainly we benefited from the fact that several buyers tried without success to bid yesterday and parlayed their money on the second day. Last year's sale grossed almost €23 million and we stand at more than €20 million after two days [this year]. At this stage it looks like we are on a trend of a 25-percent increase, but all that has to be confirmed in the days to come. So far, so good."

Tears and Emotion...

Trainer Jean-Yves Artu and his wife, Carole, sold the top colt yesterday, getting €290,000 for a son of Montjeu (Ire). The first foal of Listed winner Prudence Royale, who Artu trained for his wife, the bay was consigned by Haras du Mezeray and knocked down to trainer Robert Collet. "Thank you so much," a tearful Carole Artu said to Collet after the sale. But it was not the success of the transaction that brought out the emotion. Sadly, the Artu's 21-year-old daughter Nathanaelle, a professional jockey, was killed in a terrible spill at Le Lion d'Angers just a month ago. Jean-Yves Artu explained, "When I trained Prudence Royale, I received huge offers to sell her, but always turned them down. My daughter was getting more and more involved in running the stable and riding the horses and I thought that one day she would be able to assist me full time. My idea was to keep the filly to breed from and try to have nice babies, and that my daughter would take care of and also have the possibility to ride real good horses. Everything was for her, and she is not with us anymore. We miss her so much."



PP HORSE SIRE ODDS

1 Top This and That Old Topper 20-1

Is a very sound horse that has done lots of developing, but isn't fast enough to threaten here.

2 Lava Man <u>Slew City Slew</u> 8-5

Ran an enormous race to take last year's Gold Cup, tailed off thereafter, then came around again to run big in this year's Big Cap. Since, he's been solid, but not spectacular. On the plus side, he won't be spotting weight this time, he's fastest on his best, and his early speed helps. The negatives are that he only has the two really big ones, and O'Neill has not been getting as good figures from his runners recently. Strong contender, but tough to take at a short price.

3 Preachinatthebar Silver Charm 12-1

Is a solid horse that has taken advantage of a weak older male division out west. But he's never run fast enough to make a serious impact at level weights, and his short-term pattern is a little shaky.

4 Giacomo Holy Bull 3-1

Got good at the right time last year, but soon thereafter disappeared. Since his return he has shown no development, and in fact took three starts to get back to last year's top, not a good sign. Note that he backed up second off a layoff this past winter, and Shirreffs in general is better off layoffs than the next time. Since Giacomo would probably need a new top to seriously contend here, he's an underlay.

5 Magnum (Arg) El Compinche (Arg) 5-1

Came to this country last fall, and gave no indication of being anything special for quite awhile. This year he's a new horse, though he only got close to Lava Man in the Big Cap because he saved ground and got weight. His Lone Star effort was huge, and a repeat of that effort would give him a very big shot here. But it came in the mud, and may have taken a lot out of him. He bounced last time to his worst effort this year. This horse has good tactical speed, which helps, but it's tough to tell how long he'll be feeling the effects of the big effort two back. Contender, tough call.

6 Perfect Drift Dynaformer 6-1

Is not what he was at four and five, but he's still pretty solid, and gets better as the campaign goes on every year. He's also shown he can run his race shipping east to west, which many can't.

All of which makes him one of many around the same level on overall ability, and a strong contender if he picks this time to return to his best.

7 Super Frolic Pine Bluff

Was a decent two-year-old that got better every year, and by the age of five was running major league figures at minor league tracks. Last summer we recommended his purchase to client Ro Parra, and he did very well in his final two starts last year before tailing off badly over the winter. Now he's coming around again, and there are a couple of things to note. First that half of his starts last year resulted in negative figures, and second that he raced on a dead rail in the Gold Cup. Horses that run on a dead rail almost always go forward next time, and this guy's got some big figures to run back to.

8 Good Reward Storm Cat 10-1

Has developed with age, improving his top with every campaign. Interestingly, his best race in each of the last two years has come on dirt, though he wasn't rewarded for either effort. This horse, like Giacomo, is coming off a top effort and is only a borderline contender on ability. They also both have the wrong running style for this race. There is little early speed in the race, and with the short Del Mar stretch, closers face the prospect of traffic and ground loss. Still, this one is similar in ability to Giacomo, and will be much longer.

BOTTOM LINE- Giacomo will be over bet. Lava Man is the horse to beat, but no sure thing. Super Frolic looks like the value.


