#### SAINT LIAM EUTHANIZED

The 2005 Horse of the Year **Saint Liam** (Saint Ballado--Quiet Dance, by Quiet American) was euthanized yesterday after suffering a fractured hind leg

while being led to his paddock at Lane's End Farm near Versailles, Kentucky. The six-year-old stallion was immediately examined and treated by Dr. Peter Pryor at Lane's End before being transported to Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington where he was examined by Dr. Larry Bramlage. Due to the extent of the left tibial fracture, no surgical repair was possible and the stal-

lion was euthanized late in the afternoon. Bred by Edward Evans, Saint Liam was sold by Lane's End, agent, at the 2001 Saratoga Sale for \$130,000 to bloodstock agent Mike Ryan. Racing in the colors of Mr. and Mrs. William Warren, Saint Liam delivered a sparkling 2005 campaign, with four Grade I triumphs. He began the year with a victory in the GI Donn H. and added wins in the GI Stephen Foster H. and GI Woodward S. before ending his racing career with a triumph in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and went on to be named Horse of the Year and champion older horse. He retired with nine wins in 20 starts and earnings of \$4,456,995. Saint Liam, standing as the property of a syndicate, began his stud career this season and has 115 mares in foal.

Confined to handicap company last term, Notnowcato (GB) (Inchinor {GB}) emerged this season with group races on the agenda and quickly established his credentials for that company when winning the G3 Earl of Sefton S. at Newmarket Apr. 19. Following up in the May 30 G3 Brigadier Gerard S. at Sandown, he was far from disgraced when fifth to Ouija Board (GB) in the G1 Prince of Wales's at Royal Ascot June 21. He was struck into when baulked at a crucial stage in the Eclipse at Sandown last time July 8, but gained recompense to provide Ryan Moore with his first Group 1 success. Settled in behind Cherry Mix (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) throughout the early stages, the chestnut seized the advantage approaching the quarter pole. Headed by Maraahel and Richard Hills in the dying strides, he battled gamely to win the bobber. "I thought all the way up the straight I was going to win, but Richard [Hills] thought he'd won," Moore commented. "I've been very close before and it's nice to finally win one. I got a lovely lead into the race and I just had to go a bit sooner than I wanted, but once he was rolling I didn't want to stop him. He's very tough and well-made and travels really well. He does have a turn of foot and is very honest." Notnowcato will be rested now for some major fall and winter targets. "He had a puncture wound and was lame after the Eclipse, but he was sound the next day and that didn't hold him up," Stoute said. "This was always the aim after that race and I would have thought he'll be freshened up now for the G1 Champion S. at Newmarket Oct. 14, before hopefully finishing his season abroad in something like the G1 Hong Kong Cup [at Sha Tin Dec. 10]." Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's Dylan Thomas (Ire) (Danehill) was sent off the 5-6 crowd's choice, but raced freely throughout the early stages for Mick Kinane and was soon struggling in the straight before staying on for fourth. "It was a very slow pace and he was very fresh early on," Aidan O'Brien told PA Sport. She finally hit the heights with victory in the June 18 G1 Gran Premio di Milano at the San Siro before failing to overcome a subsequent penalty when fourth in the G2 Prix Maurice de Nieuil at her favored Longchamp last time July 14. "She's extremely well, we are delighted with her but with the way the forecast is in York, the ground may go against her," the Aga Khan's Racing Manager Pat Downes told PA Sport. "She's a good-ground filly and although it doesn't seem to be too bad today, they are due to get some more showers tonight and if it gets much worse, it will not suit her."

Yesterday's work was Bernardini's third since the Jim Dandy and followed a more earnest five-furlong move in 1:00 3/5 at the Spa Aug. 17. Also expected for the Midsummer Derby is GI Haskell Invitational S. winner Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat), High Cotton (Dixie Union), and Hesandoldsalt (Broad Brush).

ENFORCER MISSES OUT Enforcer (GB) (Efisio {GB}) was forced to sidestep yesterday's G1 Juddmonte International S. after being found to be lame on the eve of the race. Trainer Willie Muir revealed that the four-year-old, who was fourth in the July 29 G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot, had puss in a foot and was scratched from the extended 10-furlong contest. "I felt this was my race--we had a mile-and-a-quarter and soft ground--but it won't keep him out for long and he'll probably end up going somewhere in the next few days," he told PA Sport.

**DEAUVILLE WRAP-UP** Argana's Deauville August Yearling Sale recorded the third-highest total gross in the past 20 years with the figure of €30,416,000 bettered only in 2000 and 2001. Leading buyer at the sale was Shadwell, with €2,190,000 spent on six lots, including the €750,000 sale topper, followed by Peter Doyle Bloodstock, who secured 15 yearlings for a total of €2,069,000. The leading vendor was again Haras d'Etreham, who sent 55 into the ring and sold 43, for a total of €4,224,000. Next best was Haras du Mezeray, who consigned the sale topper and sold 17 of their 22 yearlings for a total of €2,702,000. In terms of average among the consignors, Watership Down Stud came out on top at €291,000, with Haras du Bouquetot achieving a figure of €263,333. With 10 yearlings sold, Montjeu (Ire) was the most successful sire of the sale with a gross of €1,355,000, followed by Anabaa, whose 14 yearlings grossed €1,214,000. In terms of average, Elusive Quality had a sole offering which sold for €500,000, Monsun (Ger) emerges on top with €460,000, including the sale topper. Green Desert's average stood at €336,667, while among the firstseason sires, Dalakhani (Ire) was responsible for four yearlings sold for an average price of €166,250. Hawk Wing was second on this list, with his five yearlings averaging €133,400 and Oasis Dream (GB) selling four from four at an average of €123,000.



# **Barbaro Update**

BARBARO REMAINS A HAPPY, COMFORTABLE HORSE

August 22, 2006 KENNETT SQUARE, PA -Kentucky Derby winner Barbaro remains comfortable according to veterinarians at Penn's George D. Widener Hospital. "Barbaro is doing well on both hind limbs," said Dr. Dean Richardson, Chief of Surgery. "Because of this, we do not plan to change his right hind cast in the next two weeks." The colt's left hind foot has laminitis, but Barbaro seems comfortable with that foot as well. "He needs to continue to improve over the next few months before we will have a better idea about his long term comfort." said Dr. Richardson. "Barbaro's appetite and his attitude right now are phenomenal; he attacks his feed and when he goes out to graze, he acts like he thinks he could train." Doctors remain cautious about Barbaro's prognosis because, according to Dr. Richardson, there is no assurance that he will surmount all of his medical problems. "Right now, he is a surprisingly happy horse," he said. "He is gaining weight and has had his pain medications reduced without any effect on his well being. His strength and overall appearance have been improving since he became well enough to be walked outside each day."

#### SUMMER REVIVAL

Going into last year's Keeneland September sale, the market looked shaky. Following \$84-million in turnover in 2004, Fasig-Tipton saw receipts fall to \$70-million at its two flagship summer yearling sales, Fasig Kentucky July and Saratoga. They were for different reasons: Fasig overloaded the catalogue in July, while Saratoga was sure to see a drop in aggregate, since it had been reduced from three days to two. But whatever the reasons, its two sales dropped \$14-million, down 16 percent in gross and 13 percent in average.

Next came Deauville, which had already been in a three-year decline which, by 2004, had seen its gross and average drop by 20 percent from its peak in 2001 ( $\in$ 35-million and  $\in$ 95,043, converted from the old French Franc) to  $\in$ 28-million and an  $\in$ 76,383 average in 2004. The 2005 edition of Deauville was a disaster. The gross dropped another 20 percent, to  $\in$ 22,842,000 (35 percent below its 2001 peak), while the average dipped to  $\in$ 70,067.

The significance of this year's recovery isn't, therefore, that the gross was up 30 percent and the average 16 percent in relation to 2005, but that, in fact, the gross was four percent higher than in 2004, the average six percent higher, and both figures are the best achieved, in their respective categories, since 2001. Officials from the newly constituted sales company, now called Arqana, were right to play down their own role too much. The market was going to recover anyway, regardless of who owned the company this year. But all reports were that The Buzz Is Back at Deauville, and that definitely—following the positive results at the two Fasig sales in America—augurs well for upcoming sales.

Next up is the Doncaster St. Leger sale, which has been brought forward to next week due to the redevelopment at Doncaster Race Course, where they are based--last year, for example, this sale was the week directly before Keeneland. This year, for the first time, European agents who normally have to be in the trenches in Kentucky will be able to go to Doncaster, and this can't fail to help their results.



Doncaster has been a popular and growing sale for years, and in that heady year, 2004, its gross and average jumped by a third from 2003 totals, grossing 11,319,200gns and averaging 24,238gns (well over \$40,000). The sale fell back slightly in 2005, by five percent, though the average inched up another two percent. Essentially, it didn't go forward, but held its big gains from the previous year. It is likely to make another leap forward next week and, if that happens, look for pressure on Henry Beeby & Co. to keep the sale in this week, rather than move it back to their old dates next year.

In 2004, we calculated that 12 'barometer' sales in the Thoroughbred market (nine yearling, three mixed) reached the \$1-billion mark for only the second time-the first had been in 2000. Going into Keeneland last year, all four yearling sales which had taken place so far had either suffered losses, or, at best, broken even.

Then Keeneland racked up a \$384-million sale, an all-time horse sale record, and a \$60-million improvement on 2004's near-record sale. Goffs reversed its long-term decline (the sale had not grossed as much as  $\in$ 42-million this century) with a 77-percent jump in revenues, to  $\in$ 54,990,900. Tattersalls followed with a near-20-percent increase in aggregate (to over \$200-million), and by the end of the 12-sale 'majors' season, we reckoned revenues had topped \$1.175-billion--easily a record.

We can't be certain what will happen in September--sales which show huge advances one year do have a tendency to consolidate in the next--but what is certain is that the U.S. summer sales went much better, the buzz is back at Deauville, and Doncaster looks poised to top its previous best.

Demand looks high.

#### **PERSPECTIVES**

In our Aug. 8 column, we looked at the world's leading sires, assessed by various APEX (Annual Progeny Earnings indeX) stallion ratings, mainly covering racing from 1/1/2000 through 7/31/06. I say 'mainly' because there is one statistic we are now publishing, 'career percentage of A Runners/Foals,' which includes A Runners and racing all the way back to 1983. But for all the other statistics published here, it covers racing in North America, the U.K., Ireland, France, Germany, and Japan, from the beginning of 2000.

A look at the Leading Sires lists (p. 11-12) from that issue shows why I have been contending that, essentially, today's leading sires are not as far out in front of their contemporaries as the great sires of yesteryear. Maybe they wouldn't be anyway. I'm pretty sure a Northern Dancer comes along only about once every 50 years, but there's no doubt anymore this is another one of the 'side effects' of the doubling of stallions' books over the last 10 years. *Cont. p9*

It's a pretty good illustration of the practical difference between the relative and the absolute. The table on page 12 on 8/08, 'Leading Sires, Career Percentage of A Runners/Foals,' was downright frightening. Only Smart Strike (first foals 1998) and Distorted Humor (first foals 2000) figured among the top 25 sires by this percentage.

Since the younger sires comprise about half the population of sires assigned APEX ratings each year, it doesn't really make sense that 23 of the top 25 (92 percent) are older sires; there must be more to it than that. If you take the 'absolutist' view--the same one that claims 10 percent stakes winners to foals is still a practical and correct standard--there aren't going to be very many horses you can breed to. So we have to be adaptable in our analysis, at least to some extent. Like it or not, things just ain't like they used to be.

Accordingly, we thought it would be useful to go

back and 'deconstruct' the table of leading sires, and look at the various 'sire crops'--stallions whose first foals all arrived the same year, so in some way can be compared to each other in a way they can't really be compared to other groups of sires. In one fundamental way, they all had the same opportunity. Historically there have been about 100 sires, on the average, in each 'sire crop.' After the World Top Five--A.P. Indy, Storm Cat, Danzig, Danehill, and Sadler's Wells (all with A Runner indices of 4.25 or higher)--the good news is that most of the sires with A Runner indices in the 3's (3.00 -3.99) are relatively younger. Nine of the next 10 places on the list of top sires by A Runner Index are filled by sires whose first foals were born between 1997-2003.

In my column last week, we had a look at the two youngest sire crops covered, those with first foals 2002 (four-year-olds of 2006) and 2003 (three-year-olds).

Today we run the statistics on what I think is the most powerful of all the recent sire groups, those with 'first foals 2000.' This group is headed, in four out of the five categories, by Distorted Humor, the only young sire on this side of the planet with an APEX rating above 4.00 (Redoute's Choice has a 5.00 rating in Australia, according to figures compiled for the Australian website 'stallions.com.au,' but he's on the other side of the planet). Not only does Distorted Humor have the highest A Runner Index from this sire group (and all other groups of relatively younger sires), he also has the highest number of A Runners (42), the highest ABC Index (2.71), and the highest career percentage of A Runners to foals (8.31 percent). The only other 'Top 20' category we've covered in these groups is 'number of ABC Runners,' in which Grand Slam leads Distorted Humor 115-110.



With A Runner Indexes above 3.00, two other sires from this group figure among the world's current top 15, Awesome Again (3.35) and Wild Rush (3.08), both, of course, originally Stronach stallions. But it's this group's depth of successful mid-range sires which is also so impressive. The group's top 12, ranked by ABC Runner Index (this is basically horses who make \$50,000 + in a season), also includes the likes of Arch, Indian Charlie, Grand Slam, Tale of the Cat, Elusive Quality--and Ghostly Moves, an obscure, New Mexico-based (slots) son of Silver Ghost with small crops, and three A Runners this year. These days a commercial stallion prospect has a very small window of opportunity to prove himself. A quiet season or two will generally mean he will be on the van to a regional program, or on the plane to a foreign country. Of course, it has become a virtual "rule" that once either dead or export a stallion will start to get good runners, and there have been more than a few examples of "export in haste, repent at leisure."

We suspect that there may have been a time early in the career of Arch that Claiborne Farm may have considered that his future might not lie in the Bluegrass. Arch actually went through his first two years with runners without being represented by a U.S. stakes winner, something which would often be the kiss of death for a Kentucky sire. However, Claiborne kept the faith, and Arch began a rally which culminated this weekend with the Grade I victories of his daughters Pine Island and Arravale.

Ironically, Arch was initially regarded by many breeders as a shrewd commercial play when he retired to stud at \$20,000. An extremely good-looking individual-he was a \$710,000 yearling--Arch had also displayed considerable talent as a racehorse. A maiden winner on his only start at two, he took a seven-furlong allowance race at Keeneland on his three-year-old debut. Unfortunately, after that bright start, Arch suffered a setback which kept him away from the races from early April until early August, four months later. Second in a Saratoga allowance race on his return, Arch then hit a rich vein of form. In succession, he took a nine-furlong Saratoga allowance race, scored a three-lengths win in the GI Super Derby, and outfought the year-older Touch Gold to take the GIII Fayette S. by a neck in track-record time. Arch ended his career with a tilt at the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. In what may have been the deepest ever renewal of that race, he pressed the pace in the early stages before fading to finish ninth, as Awesome Again accounted for Silver Charm, Swain, Victory Gallop and Skip Away.

As far has his pedigree was concerned, Arch was by Kris S., an excellent sire, but a horse whose stallion sons had a somewhat spotty record at stud. This was offset, however, by an excellent distaff pedigree: Arch's dam, Aurora, was a stakes-winning and graded-stakes-placed daughter of Danzig and champion two-year-old filly Althea, and was three-parts sister to several times leading English sire Green Desert.

Actually, even though they didn't get their sire off to a quick start, Arch's first crop was not at all bad, as it turned out all they needed was some time. From 40 foals, the first crop produced four stakes winners, the first to really make an impact being Overarching, who was exported to South Africa, where she won the G1 South African Fillies Sprint and GI Horse Chestnut S. The second Group 1 winner from Arch's first crop is the remarkable Les Arcs. Trained in England, Les Arcs initially campaigned in middle-distance events, and even ran over hurdles. This year, at the age of six, and dropped back to six furlongs, Les Arcs has shown himself to be one of Europe's best sprinters with wins in the G1 Golden Jubilee S. and G1 July Cup. The other stakes winners from Arch's first crop were Chilly Rooster, who took the GIII Fort Marcy H. at four, and Jake Skate, winner of the Lafayette H., and runner-up in the GIII Seabiscuit Breeders' Cup H. last year at five. Arch's second crop produced six stakes winners, headed by another Grade I winner Prince Arch, successful in the GI Gulfstream Park H.; the GII Hong Kong Chairman's Trophy victor Art Trader; and South African graded scorer Arch Mistress. The third crop was headlined by Montgomery's Arch, winner of the G2 Richmond S. in England at two, and Pine Island and Arravale are from Arch's fourth crop.

One of the attractions of Arch's pedigree for Claiborne was that he appeared an ideal cross for the resident broodmare band, which featured a high concentration of Mr. Prospector-line mares. Pine Island is a fulfillment of that expectation, as her dam, Matlacha Pass, is a daughter of fellow Claiborne sire Seeking the Gold. Matlacha Pass was a winner at two and three, but did earn black-type at the track. However, she's a sister to G1 Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine Pleasant Home, and to the four-time graded winner Country Hideaway. Pine Island's granddam, Our Country Place, is a half-sister to nine-time Grade I winner Sky Beauty, while her third dam, Maplejinsky, won the G1 Alabama S. and GI Monmouth Oaks, and was by Nijinsky II out of champion sprinter Gold Beauty. Incidentally, since Gold Beauty is also by Mr. Prospector, Matlacha Pass has that horse 2x4 in her pedigree, and that might be expected to suit Arch, whose grandsire, Roberto, is out of a mare who is bred on very similar lines to the dam of Mr. Prospector, and whose second dam is by Mr. Prospector's genetic relative, Alydar. We can also note that Arch's dam, Aurora, and Maplejinsky, are both Northern Dancer/Raise a Native crosses, with Alydar and Mr. Prospector supplying the Raise a Native strains.

Arravale has a European pedigree which is far more of an outcross. Her dam, the French-bred Kalosca, is by Kaldoun, a son of Caro. Stakes-placed in France, Kalosca also took third in the GII Lady's Secret Breeders' Cup in the U.S. She is a half-sister to French Listed winner Crillon, and out Shagrila, a Riverman half-sister to the dam of English Group 1-winning sprinter Piccolo. The fifth dam, Lady Kells, would be better recognized in the U.S. as ancestress of such as Broad Brush, Capote, Exceller, and more recently, Bob and John. The Roberto/Caro cross which produced Arravale hasn't been a prolific one, but two other sons of Kris S. have stakes winners out of Caro line mares.

Arravale's second dam is by Riverman, and he is a Nasrullah/Princequillo cross, something which has frequently played into the pedigree of Kris S., who is by a great-grandson of Royal Charger (three-parts brother to Nasrullah) out of a mare by Princequillo. #### CHET TAYLOR, FATHER OF MICKEY TAYLOR,

**DIES AT 92** Chet Taylor, the father of Mickey Taylor and former night watchman to Triple Crown winner Seattle Slew, died Monday at his home in Ellensburg, Washington. He was 92. Taylor came into the public eye in the spring of 1977 when he assumed the role of night watchman for Seattle Slew, parking his Winnebago camper outside his stall with his wife, Leola, to keep a nightly vigil. Taylor remained Seattle Slew's night watchman until the colt's retirement in November, 1978. Seattle Slew seemed to love Mr. Taylor and the feeling was mutual. On the NBC Evening News of May 6, 1977, the day before Seattle Slew won the Kentucky Derby, Mr. Taylor told reporter Dick Schaap that he "feels better with this horse than with people." Seattle Slew's former groom, John Polston, called Mr. Taylor "the finest man I have ever met." He was predeceased by his wife, Leola. The family will hold a graveside service on Saturday, Aug. 26, in Ellensburg, Washington. In lieu of flowers, the family has requested that friends honor Chet Taylor through the Seattle Slew Spinal Cord Research Fund. 'GEORGE' SET FOR COMEBACK Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's G1 2000 Guineas winner George Washington (Ire) (Danehill) looks likely to reappear in Sunday's £100,000 G2 Celebration Mile at Goodwood. Off the track due to a muscle injury sustained after finishing runner-up in the May 28 G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh, the colt was giving trainer Aidan O'Brien the right signs in his build-up. "As of now, it looks as if he will be ready, but he has a couple of bits of work to do this week," O'Brien told the Racing Post. Godolphin's impressive G2 Lennox S. winner Iffraaj (GB) (Zafonic) may be in opposition, but connections revealed that the five-year-old's participation rests on the weather. "A lot hinges on what happens with the weather over the next two weeks--not just for Goodwood," Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford commented. "The plan was for Iffraaj to go to Haydock [for the Sept. 2 Sprint Cup], but it depends on what the forecast predicts there in two weeks' time, and what the ground is like at Goodwood. He wouldn't want it too soft."

#### **JULY COURSE RENOVATION DUE**

Newmarket's £9-million redevelopment program will get underway after Saturday's final meeting of the summer season. Officials at the Suffolk venue revealed that the historic Newmarket Town Plate, which was the first race ever run under written rules in Britain in 1666, will close out the action before the track's revamp begins. "The July Course hasn't changed much over the last 60 years," commented Lisa Hancock, managing director of Newmarket Racecourses. "I would be the first to admit the redevelopment behind the stands is long overdue and I hope that in the not too distant future we will have the funding for the other stages within our July Course master plan which will see the stands themselves modernized. It is somehow rather appropriate that the very last race to be run here before the redevelopment begins will be oldest race of them all--the Town Plate. The fabric has to be modernized, but the history continues."


