SPA GOING OUT WITH A BANG

The 2006 Saratoga meet is winding down, but the Spa isn't going down without a fight. This weekend's holiday racing features four Grade I races, beginning

Saturday with the GI Woodward S. and GI Forego S. The Woodward, traditionally run at Belmont Park, attracted a field of 11 for its Spa debut, including last year's GI Travers S. winner Flower Alley (Distorted Humor). The Eugene Melnyk colorbearer began the year with a win in the GIII Salvator Mile at Monmouth,

but was a distant seventh as the favorite in the Aug. 5 GI Whitney H. "I was a little concerned in the Whitney that we might be a race away from being at the same level as some of those other horses from a seasoning standpoint," trainer Todd Pletcher admitted. "We've got that race under our belt and he's had some good works since then. It's all in order now and it's up to him to step up and do it." Tracy Farmer's Sun King (Charismatic) has suffered close defeats in this year's GI Metropolitan H. and GI Whitney and trainer Nick Zito is hoping the four-year-old can earn his first Grade I Saturday. "Those noses were inches," Zito recalled. "It would be great for him to win one of these." Also in the Woodward field is 2003 Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner Funny Cide (Distorted Humor), coming off a win in the July 1 GIII Dominion Day S. at Woodbine. Farmer and Zito will team up again with Commentator (Distorted Humor) in Saturday's GI Forego H. The five-yearold won last year's GI Whitney H. and was third in the GI Woodward S., but has made only one start this term, winning the July 12 Mugatea S. at Belmont. "He's really been burning up the track in his works and that's always a positive with a horse like that," Zito said. Full Fields p2

IFFRAAJ OUT OF SPRINT

Godolphin yesterday decided to scratch Iffraaj (GB) (Zafonic) from tomorrow's G1 Haydock Sprint Cup due to the prospect of testing conditions. The G2 Lennox S. winner may be re-routed to Longchamp Sunday for the G1 Prix du Moulin. Haydock's Clerk of the Course Kirkland Tellwright reported the going to be soft, with heavy places. "We had a very wet night, with 20 millimetres of rain since yesterday evening, and the forecast is for further scattered showers," he said vesterday. "There is a possibility that the ground will turn heavy for Saturday." Also missing from the six-furlong sprint will be Budget Stables' Soldier's Tale (Stravinsky), off the track since finishing fourth in last year's G1 July Cup. Trainer Jeremy Noseda revealed that the five-year-old has suffered a setback. "I would hope that we can look towards running him in either the G2 Diadem S. [at Ascot Sept. 24] or G1 Prix de la Foret [Sept. 30]," Noseda said.



Stablemate and GIII Bashford Manor S. winner Circular Quay (Thunder Gulch), breezing in company, went five furlongs in 1:03 3/5. "We were just trying to stretch their legs a little bit four days out," Pletcher said. "We're excited about these horses not only for the Hopeful, but for bigger races down the road. They both seem like the kind of colts that will improve with added distance." Outlining plans for other stable stars, Pletcher said Pool Land (Silver Deputy) will likely go to the GI Ruffian S. at Belmont Sept. 10. DANEHILL DANCER FILLY TOPS FINAL DAY

After the high-octane middle day of Doncaster Bloodstock Sales Company's St Leger Yearling Sale, it was a relatively steady end to proceedings yesterday, with a stand-out yearling by Danehill Dancer (Ire) leading the way. After 13 lots had passed the 100,000 guineas barrier over the past two sessions, there was just one that managed the breakthrough yesterday. Consigned by John Deer's Oakgrove Stud, hip 485 is a daughter of Palacegate Episode (Ire), champion older mare in Germany in 1994 and dam of Halland Park Lass (Ire), responsible for this year's G2 Norfolk S. and G1 Prix Morny-winning St. Leger Sale graduate Dutch Art (GB). BBA Ireland was the name on the docket after a final bid of 200,000 guineas. Earlier, trainer Stuart Kittow had paid 95,000 guineas for hip 438, a colt by Xaar (GB) consigned by Martin Francis' Ballydrehid House. He is the latest product of the mare Iktidar (GB), the dam of Qadar (Ire), who topped this sale at 250,000 guineas three years ago. She also produced the fillies Hazelhurst (Ire), who sold here for 110,000 guineas in 2004; and Follow the Flag (Ire), who reached 75,000 guineas during this session 12 months ago. Invincible Spirit (Ire), who sired the overall sale topper Wednesday, was the sire yesterday of a colt from Liam Cashman's Rathbarry Stud who was much in demand. Hip 478, whose second dam is the smart stakes winner Limerick Belle (Ire), was knocked down to Anthony Stroud Bloodstock for 70,000 guineas.

For DBS, the latest renewal of their premier auction was a resounding success, with new records recorded for aggregate, average, median and individual price. Managing Director Henry Beeby reflected on the sale's growing poularity. "The St. Leger Sales is unique in Europe, as it has grown year on year since 1998, but that growth has been more than matched by better and better results on the track each season which has driven more and more people to the Doncaster," he commented.
