Beauty is Truth (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}) earned a welldeserved first group win in yesterday's G3 Prix d'Arenberg at Chantilly. After a successful debut in the July 6 Listed Prix Yacowlef at Deauville, the bay homebred had been stepped up in class. A commendable fourth in the July 23 G2 Prix Robert Papin at Maisons-Laffitte was followed by a pair of equally laudable sixths in the July 30 G3 Prix de Cabourg and Aug. 20 G1 Prix Morny, both at Deauville, but she turned things around with this dominant display. Recovering from jinking right at the break to take an early lead, Beauty is Truth quickly established daylight when kicked clear approaching the final furlong and coasted to the wire with the race comfortably in the bag. "The ground was just too desperate and we held her up for confidence in the Prix Morny, but we changed tactics today and it proved to be the correct decision," explained trainer Robert Collet. He added, "On good ground I think she will stay six furlongs, and we will now go to the G1 Cheveley Park S. [at Newmarket Sept. 29]."

Horse Greeley earned his diploma next time out, though, taking a 6 1/2-panel test by four lengths Aug. 12. Stepped right up into stakes company here, he brushed the gate at the break and was off a step slowly, but quickly rushed up to keep Stormello company up the backstretch. Pushed on to take command after a swift half in :44 4/5, he leveled out nicely in the final furlong and was never in danger as Great Hunter rallied for second, Jon Court, aboard second choice Prime Ruler (Orientate), lost his left iron during the run up the chute and the pair never got going, finishing last of seven.

BORREGO'S WINTERGREEN FEE SET AT \$20,000

Multiple Grade I winner **Borrego** (El Prado {Ire}--Sweet as Honey, by Strike the Gold) will stand his initial season at Wintergreen Stallion Station for a fee of \$20,000 live foal, due Nov. 1. Retired after undergoing surgery in early April to remove a chip from his right front ankle, Borrego notched runner-up efforts in the GII Louisiana Derby and GII Arkansas Derby at three before having a breakout season last year as a four-year-old. The chestnut, who was trained by Beau Greely, won the GI Pacific Classic and GI Jockey Club Gold Cup in 2005. First or second in 11 of his 20 starts, Borrego bankrolled \$2,052,090. Wintergreen is scheduling showings of Borrego during the Keeneland September sale.

DENMAN CONFIRMED AS BC ANNOUNCER

Race caller Trevor Denman has been confirmed as the replacement for Tom Durkin as the announcer for the 2006 Breeders' Cup World Championships. Denman has joined with ESPN, who will cover the Breeders' Cup for the first time in the event's 23-year history. Durkin had called all of the previous Breeders' Cups, but was precluded from duties this year because of contractual obligations with NBC. The South African Denman is a fixture on the Southern California circuit and has been calling racing since 1971.

HOUSE TO VOTE ON HORSE SLAUGHTER BILL

The U.S. House of Representatives is scheduled to vote Thursday on bill H.R. 503, the American Horse Slaughter Prevention Act, which would end horse slaughter for human consumption in the United States, as well as the domestic and international transport of live horses or horseflesh for the same purpose. Backers of the bill are encouraging supporters to call their representatives to urge a "yes" vote. If passed, the act would shut down the three foreign-owned horse slaughter plants in the country. The plants in Forth Worth and Kaufman, Texas, and DeKalb, Illinois, slaughtered more than 90,000 horses last year with the vast majority of the meat sold overseas for human consumption. "Since our nation was founded, we have shared a special relationship with the horse," New York Rep. John Sweeney, the author of the bill, said during a rally to gain support for the bill. "The practice of horse slaughter is a contradiction to our culture, history, and economy. The time has come to end it." The bill has more than 200 cosponsors. The House is scheduled to convene at 10 a.m. EDT. "The horses who get slaughtered are not brought by weeping families who have no money to feed their horses," said Diana Pikulski, Executive Director of the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation, a supporter of the bill. "They are brought there by middlemen who offer cash to people and often tell unsuspecting sellers they will give the horse a good home. A full 92 percent of the horses who arrive at slaughter are classified in "good" condition. Surely the American people can do better by them."

She seems well, and I just hope the Goodwood race hasn't taken too much out of her." With Coolmore's representation not confirmed yesterday, Dunlop was not intimidated by the possible presence of the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. winner Hurricane Run (Ire). "If he turns up, he'll be a worthy favorite as he's a worthy champion, but it's at the stage of her career when we're not going to run away from Hurricane Run," he added.

WEIGHT STUDY – FEEDING TO FAIL

Cecil Seaman & Co. LLC conducted a study concerning young horses that fail to reach their potential at the racetrack. According to the study, a significant problem is that overweight and obese horses make up a substantial percentage of the entries in yearling and two-year-old sales.

In the mid-1980s, Seaman discovered that many horses that had the same biomechanics (skeletal structure) experienced widely varied results at the track. Full brothers and sisters to millionaires, who had very similar height and structural measurements, performed quite differently. A Weighty Issue cont. p6

the latter at Arlington Park in track-record time of 1:53.53 for the mile and three-sixteenths. Trained by Paul McGee, Suave has won seven of his 26 starts for over \$1.3 million in earnings. "A son of A.P. Indy who could carry natural speed has been a goal of Darby Dan for some time," said John Phillips, co-managing partner of Darby Dan. "Suave caught our attention in a big way with his track record at Arlington. With Urbane and the strength of his female family, Suave has all the criteria to be a successful sire. We consider the acquisition of Suave to be a real coup. We anticipate a lot of excitement in the breeding community for this stallion." A stud fee has not been set.







A Weighty Issue cont.

Many people claimed it is just lack of desire, or the "heart," to perform. While that may contribute to the problem, other possibilities deserved examination.

Seaman collected data on the physical size and shape of over 44,000 yearlings and two-year-olds during a 30-year period from 1970 through 2001. After extensive analysis, the one consistent attribute that could be identified in most of the under-performing horses was excessive weight.

The problem with weight begins very early. Small weanlings and yearlings are often overfed in the hope that they will grow faster and larger. This overfeeding tends to increase weight more then size, and can put young horses into the overweight or obese category.

The results of overfeeding young horses, according to Seaman's study, are:

- 1) Overweight and obese horses make fewer lifetime starts, earning less than half that of underweight or ideal-weight horses. They tend to be ineffective at higher levels of racing, and thus are often relegated to races that offer low purse money.
- 2) The incidence of OCD lesions in overweight horses could be related to rapid growth brought on by overfeeding.
- 3) Weanlings and yearlings with offset knees have more problems when they are overweight, compounding conformation flaws.
- 4) Heavier horses place higher levels of stress on bones, muscles, ligaments, and tendons, which results in more unsoundness, and shorter racing careers.

Seaman believes that while extra flesh looks good in the sale ring, removing that extra weight is difficult even with intensive training and attentive feed-management techniques. He believes buyers should avoid overweight horses at yearling and two-year-old sales.

Trainers should closely monitor the weights of their horses. Trainers in Europe often weigh their horses weekly and on race day, and in some countries race-day programs publish the weights of entrants for each event.

According to Seaman, to identify a horse of ideal weight, "Height, length of barrel and girth must be in the correct proportions. Ribs may be felt with little pressure. [There should be no] ridge down the back, no bulge at the tail head and no cresty or thick necks."

His study, which correlates weight with career earnings, involved 52.2 percent colts and 47.8 percent fillies. The subjects were 91 percent yearlings and 9 percent two-year-olds. Measurements were run against a growth curve from Dr. Tyznik of Ohio State that projected what the individual might look like when full grown. Weights were calculated with a formula used by Texas A&M and other major universities in their weight studies.

A second study, measuring ideal weight of the race horse, was based off a study done by Seaman in 1993 that measured 51 horses within three weeks of winning a Grade I race. After evaluating these Grade I winners and their weights, a scale was established for ideal racing weight.

HOLD THAT TIGER COLT TOPS CTHS SALE

The Canadian Thoroughbred Horse Society's Canadianbred Selected Yearling Sale enjoyed a robust round of selling Tuesday at the Woodbine Sales Pavilion, with gross up significantly from last year. In all, 22 yearlings sold for over C\$100,000, compared with nine in 2005. Leading Tuesday's session was a colt from the first crop of Group 1 winner Hold That Tiger (Storm Cat) that brought a C\$250,000 bid from Winsong Farms. Selling as hip 34 from the consignment of Woodlands (Gail Wood), agent, the chestnut is out of the 13-yearold Forty Niner mare Brittan Lee, a half to GSW Capsized. A daughter of Broken Vow earned honors as the sale's highest-priced filly. Hip 175, consigned by Richard Moylan, agent, was sold for C\$160,000 to Hugh Graham, agent for Morgan Firestone. The chestnut is out of Regent's Fancy (Vice Regent) and is a half to MSW & MGSP Byzantine (Quiet American) and SW & GSP Pete's Fancy (Peteski). Gross for the sale was up over C\$1 million, a nearly 20-percent jump from last year. Average was up a solid 11.1 percent to \$43,390, while the RNA rate dropped from 25.2 percent to 22.7 percent. A preferred session of the sale will be held Saturday, with action getting underway at 2:00 p.m.

Duchossois didn't tell the newspaper how the situation would impact the NJC meet or racing dates. The NJC once held meets at Sportsman's Park, which was converted to a horse and auto racing complex. The facility closed, was sold to Cicero, the town in which it's located, and the NJC racing dates found a home at neighboring Hawthorne. NJC officials told the Sun-Times they had just heard about the note being called in and had no immediate comment. 

House to Vote on Horse Slaughter

H.R. 503, legislation to ban the slaughter of horses for human consumption, will be on the House floor for a vote on Thursday, Sept. 7. With some 200 co-sponsors, the bill is expected to pass.

In July, two House committees reached different conclusions about H.R. 503. The Energy and Commerce Committee simply discharged the legislation from its jurisdiction. The Agriculture Committee reported the bill "unfavorably with amendments," signaling its belief that the legislation should not be passed. One of the amendments accepted in the Agriculture Committee, which may be offered on the House floor, would grandfather in the existing operations of the three plants that currently slaughter horses.

The House convenes at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday. The debate will be telecast on C-SPAN.

2007 DUBAI INT'L CARNIVAL ANNOUNCED The

Dubai Racing Club has announced that the 2007 Dubai International Racing Carnival, which will be held Jan. 25-Mar. 24, will be worth \$31 million. Over 200 horses competed in the Carnival last year, but an amendment in quarantine protocols is expected to see more horses from Australia and New Zealand. Previously, horses from those countries could only remain in the United Arab Emirates for a total of 14 days if they wanted a direct return. However, that protocol has been extended, and Australasian horses can now be in the UAE for a total of 60 days. "The amendment to the protocol is great news for both us and Australia as it will give Australian trainers an opportunity to compete at the world's richest racing carnival and horses based in Dubai the opportunity for direct routing to Australia," said Martin Talty, DRC's manager. The Carnival will conclude with the Dubai World Cup meeting Saturday, Mar. 24. The marquee event is the \$6-million G1 Dubai World Cup, and there will also be the \$5-million G1 Dubai Sheema Classic and the \$5-million G1 Dubai Duty Free.
