horns in a memorable battle from about the \$4-million level. Positioned on opposite sides of the bidspotters in the back walking ring, Sheikh Mohammed, acting with confidence and conviction, answered a \$7.5-million bid from Team Coolmore with one of his own at \$7.7 million before a brief break in the action. Unwilling to capitulate that soon, Magnier, flanked by Demi O'Byrne, Michael Tabor and Paul Shanahan, took it to \$8 million, but that raise was called and Sheikh Mohammed held the bid at \$8.2 million. Magnier turned to consult with the rest of the team, but reluctantly allowed the hammer to fall. "The colt is just really special," said WinStar President Doug Cauthen. "He's out of the first Grade I winner for Distorted Humor and I hope it's a cross we'll see for a long time. He's in great hands and we hope he goes on and does what we think he can do. I wish Darley all the success in the world." A.C.

WinStar In Good Humor...

When Bill Casner and Kenny Troutt purchased the old Prestonwood Farm, one of the stallions they inherited was Distorted Humor. So it seemed to make perfect sense that the farm, renamed WinStar, would take great interest in their young sire's first stakes performer. Awesome Humor, just a \$45,000 yearling purchase, broke her maiden at first asking for Tom Durant and trainer Ronny Werner and went on to post a 7-1 upset in the GIII Debutante S. at Churchill. That was enough for WinStar to approach Durant with a \$1-million offer for his filly, and the deal that was consummated was validated within two months when Awesome Humor rolled to wins in the GII Adirondack S. and GI Spinaway S. at Saratoga. A Grade III winner at three and runner-up in the GI Alabama S., she was retired with six wins from 11 starts and earnings just short of \$850,000. Was there any inclination to keep her first foal? "We had a very strong, but what we thought was a very fair reserve on the horse," said Cauthen. "He was selling for a long ways. He's probably as nice a horse as we've bred. We've been fortunate to breed One Cool Cat and Bluegrass Cat, and this is the next one in that line." A.C.

More Taylor Made Success...

The leading consignor by gross at September eight out of the last 12 years, Taylor Made took a big step toward adding to that achievement yesterday. But nothing is ever taken for granted. "Any time you sell a horse for over \$8 million, you'd better be surprised. It takes a magic horse to do it," Duncan Taylor said. "When you go to look at a horse, you expect him to look a certain way, and this horse looked exactly like I expected him to. He's a really well-balanced, fast-looking individual that I think will be able to make it as a two-year-old. We're just fortunate to be able to sell this horse for WinStar. They raised the horse, they raced Awesome Humor, so they did all the work. We just brought him over here." What stood out about the colt? "He looked as good as he could possibly look," Taylor added. "I like that kind of horse--a big hip, with a lot of muscle to his stifle; I'd rank him right near the top." A.C.

Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum also landed the second-highest priced yearling yesterday,

fighting off the Coolmore conglomerate for hip 91, a colt by Mr. Greeley out of G1 Preis der Diana (German Oaks) winner Silvester Lady (GB) (Pivotal {GB}). Sheikh Mohammed dominated most of the approximately seven minutes of action, with things heating up in earnest at around the \$4-million mark. At that point, Magnier, who had been at the controls, began consulting Michael Tabor and Paul Shanahan, among others. When the bidding reached \$4.8 million, Ferguson upped the ante to \$5 million, which was answered after

a minute's deliberation by Magnier, who took it to \$5.2 million. The teams exchanged \$100,000 salvos until, with Magnier's back turned to the lectern, the hammer finally dropped at \$5.7 million. Sheikh Mohammed's wife, HRH Princess Haya of Jordan, signed the ticket. A.C.

The Makings of a Star...

To John Ferguson's way of thinking, the result for hip 91 was never in doubt. "Sheikh Mohammed saw the horse [Sunday], and made it very clear to me that he thought he was a star," the bloodstock advisor commented. "He made the point to me, [that] there's no point spending a lot of money if you don't get what you believe is the best. He's an exceptional individual and obviously the sire is doing very well. The mare won a [Group 1] in Germany, so he's got a lot going for him. He ticked every box: conformation-wise, pedigree-wise. He's an outstanding individual. We're very fortunate." The chestnut is possessed of a pedigree which could excel on dirt or turf, and Ferguson indicated that a decision on where the colt heads from here lies squarely with his boss. "Sheikh Mohammed's been buying horses for a lot longer than I have and, as you know, he's a world-class horseman. He makes those decisions." A.C.

Fruits off the Vine...

Hip 91 was bred in Kentucky by Vinery, which acquired Silvester Lady following her German Oaks success in 2001. The mare was retired the next year and gave birth to a filly by Red Ransom in 2003, now named Chatila and campaigned overseas by Princess Haya. Silvester Lady is the dam of an unraced Gulch two-year-old named Lonigan. Her yearling was special from the start, said Vinery's Ben McElroy. "He's been an A-1 horse since the day he was born," he said. "We've never had any problems the whole way through to selling him today. He's going to a top-class organization and hopefully he wins a couple of Grade Is for them. It's a great result for everybody." McElroy explained the rationale behind the mating with Mr. Greeley. "When you've got a European type of mare, you have to go with something that can appeal to both the American and European market, and Mr. Greeley, being by Gone West, fits the bill," he said. "He's had a good year at the track and we think he can work in either market." A.C.

Ferguson Lands Pulpit Kin...

Standing alongside Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum and his wife Princess Haya, John Ferguson went to an even \$3 million to take home hip 60. Consigned and bred by Claiborne Farm, the striking chestnut colt is a son of Storm Cat out of the important Claiborne mare Preach (Mr. Prospector). Winner of the GI Frizette S. in 1991, she has become a successful producer as the dam of Pulpit (A.P. Indy), a leading three-year-old and winner of the GII Blue Grass S. in 1997. She also produced SP filly Tell It, to the cover of Storm Cat, and Ferguson sees only blue skies ahead. "Obviously, he was a very desirable horse," he commented. "Not only was he a great-bodied, good athlete, on top of that, he comes from a farm that has raised more top racehorses over the last 100 years than anybody. We saw him in the spring and we liked him and when we saw him again this time, he'd done so well physically. He's a relatively late foal, so it's nice to see that. On top of that, he's a [half-brother] to Pulpit, who's making a great career for himself at stud. You could understand the fact that you'd have to give a large sum of money for him." A decision on whether the colt would remain in this country or be sent overseas will be made at a later date. "Obviously, Pulpit's been successful over here, but then Johannesburg is in the family, so it's a family that could go either way," Ferguson explained. A.C.

More Crafty Bidding from Ferguson...

John Ferguson maintained a high level of activity on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed at the midway point of the session, going to \$2.8 million for a filly by Unbridled's Song from Win Crafty Lady (Crafty Prospector). Cataloged as hip 129 and consigned to the sale by the Taylor Made Sales Agency, the chestnut is a half-sister to GI Ballerina H. winner Harmony Lodge, MGSW and promising freshman sire Graeme Hall, MSW Win's Fair Lady and GSP Win McCool. The underbidder was Lincoln Collins, acting on behalf of an unnamed client. "At the end of the day, a filly like that has a superb pedigree and was a great individual, and Unbridled's Song is a proven sire, so it all makes sense," Ferguson said. "She made a lot of money, because she was one of the best fillies in the sale. When they're at the top, they're worth that kind of money. What people forget is how hard it is to breed a horse that looks like that and those people deserve to be rewarded when they do." Despite the recent run of success for Godolphin/Darley runners, including Bernardini, Dubai Escapade and Discreet Cat, Ferguson insists there's been no real deviation from Sheikh Mohammed's grander plan. "Sheikh Mohammed has been consistent at this sale for years," Ferguson explained, but added, "Success doesn't hurt." A.C.

Sheikh Mohammed Names That Tune...

Sheikh Mohammed warmed up the Keeneland sales pavilion yesterday with a determined drive for hip 83, a striking dark bay colt from the first crop of juvenile champ Vindication. Bidding in the back through bloodstock agent John Ferguson, Sheikh Mohammed purchased the colt for \$2.8 million from the draft of Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency, which had bred the colt in partnership with Edward McGhee. Hip 83 is the third foal out of Serena's Tune, herself the result of the regal pairing of Mr. Prospector and champion mare Serena's Song, and he looks to be an able torchbearer for his dynamic family, said Hill 'n' Dale's John Sikura. "This yearling, from the day he was born, we've always loved him," he said. "He's got great composure and he's a beautifully toned, muscled horse." *L.M.*

Vindicated...

The successful sale of hip 83 also represents an early feather in the cap of young sire Vindication, who

stands at Hill 'n' Dale. "We're really happy for the sire," commented Sikura. "We committed our best mares to the horse year after year and it's rewarding to see such a good representative and see him so well received in the market-place." Bred on the same cross as Horse of the Year

Mineshaft and successful sire Pulpit, hip 83 represents a proven nick, said Sikura. "There's an affinity for Seattle Slew--Mr. Prospector matings," he said. "She's a very typey, nice mare. We hoped the mating would impart the quality of both horses and it worked." Sikura added that Serena's Tune has a weanling full-brother to hip 83 on the ground, but was not bred in 2006. Just one hip earlier, an A.P. Indy colt out of Serena's Song. From the draft of Craig and Holly Bandoroff's Denali Stud, hip 82 was knocked down to Japan's Nobutaka Tada for \$1.5 million. Denali consigned the colt on behalf of Beverly Lewis, who bred the chestnut with her late husband Bob Lewis. L.M.

Beverly Lewis Buys Distorted Humor Colt...

While Bob Lewis will always be still sorely missed in racing and breeding circles, most everyone on the Keeneland sales grounds was happy to see his wife Beverly and son Jeff sitting front and center in the pavilion during yesterday's opening session. Beverly Lewis even got into the action, buying hip 46 for \$425,000. By Distorted Humor, the chestnut colt is out of the 16-year-old mare Northern Emerald (Green Dancer), a Grade-I winning grass specialist. Hip 46 was consigned by Eaton Sales, agent for Dr. Hiram C. Polk, Jr. and Dr. J. David Richardson. Last year, Bob and Beverly Lewis were a major force at this sale, buying 15 yearlings for a total of \$10,585,000, good for fifth on the leading buyers list by gross. *L.M.*



On a Smaller Scale...

While the scope of the Lewis operation has been toned down, Jeff Lewis said that he and his mother were likely to bid on a few more yearlings this year. "We don't have a number identified," he said. "It's just a matter of what our trainers and bloodstock agents recommend to us, and what some of the other bidders are doing. There have been a few nice ones that we liked that went for well beyond our limit. We've gone through a change, as you can imagine, with my dad's passing. We're re-learning, in a sense, our strategy." Jeff Lewis added that returning to Keeneland, where Bob Lewis had been a fierce competitor despite his friendly demeanor, was a special experience. "There have been so many people who have had nice things to say to Mom about how much they thought of dad," he said. The Lewises also said that they were pleased with the result of the sale of hip 82, an A.P. Indy colt out of their mare Serena's Song that made \$1.5 million. "We're also very happy for Hill 'n' Dale and John Sikura and Vindication, that hip 83 sold well--even better," Jeff Lewis said. Serena's Tune was sold by Bob and Beverly Lewis for \$1 million at the 1999 Keeneland July sale. L.M.

More Than Ready for Keeneland September...

New Jersey resident Jim Scatuorchio has had an outstanding year with the likes of GI United Nations S. winner English Channel and GII Sanford S. winner Scat Daddy, as well as the continued success of the stallion


he raced and still owns in partnership, More Than Ready. Scatuorchio yesterday reinvested some of that good fortune when he went to \$3.2 million for hip 110, a Seeking the Gold filly out of the first-rate distaffer Take Charge Lady (Dehere). The Lucas Marquardt chestnut was bred and consigned by Eaton Sales.

Scatuorchio stood alongside trainer Todd Pletcher in the rear of the sale pavilion as the latter did the bidding. When the dust settled, the reigning Eclipse winner commented on the filly's appeal. "It was very obvious-it was a tremendous pedigree and she's a magnificent individual," said Pletcher, who conditions English Channel and Scat Daddy and who also handled More Than Ready. "To me, she's the best horse I've seen since I've been here, and she's got the pedigree to match. It's kind of a no-brainer." But at \$3.2 million, Pletcher admitted, "We were stretching our budget." He added that part of the appeal of hip 110 was her value as a broodmare. "Jim's always looking to breed some of his mares to More Than Ready, and she matched up well with him down the road," said Pletcher. "But he bought her primarily as a race horse." Watching over the proceedings just a few feet away from the winning bidders was Ken McPeek, who conditioned Take Charge Lady during a stellar career that saw her win two renewals of the GI Spinster S., as well as the GI Ashland S. All of those race, fittingly, were contested at Keeneland. "I'm very proud," said McPeek. "You've got to take some satisfaction knowing that I had a big part in [Take Charge Lady's] racing career, and that she's continued on like this is great." L.M.

Golden Girls For Eaton Sales...

It was a good half hour for Eaton Sales. Just 15 hips after selling hip 110 for \$3.2 million, Eaton sent out hip 125, a Storm Cat half-sister to dual Grade II winner A.P. Warrior. Bidding for that filly quickly escalated past the million-dollar mark before slowing when the price neared and then passed \$2 million. A resolute Ira Gumberg of Skara Glen Stable bid \$2.2 million from the inside of the pavilion, prompting auctioneer Ryan Mahan to quip, "No pressure, no diamonds," in an effort to stoke the competition, but the hammer fell on Gumberg's offer. Hip 125 is the third foal out of the Quiet American mare Warrior Queen, a champion sprinter in Ireland and England. A.P. Warrior (A.P. Indy), her first foal, made \$1.3 million at Keeneland September 2004, while a full sister realized \$3.8 million last year. Australian businessman Jim Fleming, who purchased Warrior Queen for \$2 million as a broodmare prospect in 2002, was on hand to watch his filly sell. For Eaton's Reiley McDonald, who calmly watched the action in the pavilion while sipping on a cup of coffee, both fillies met his expectations. "We thought [the Warrior Queen filly] would bring \$2 million or more," he said. "In some ways, she was less flashy than her full sister...last year, but in a funny way I liked her more. She is a very solid-looking, sturdy-looking physical." As for hip 110, McDonald said, "I might say [she] was the best-looking filly I've ever brought to auction." L.M.

Kight on the 'Hook for a \$1 Million Storm Cat...

At Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga sale, Hartley/DeRenzo Thoroughbreds went to \$900,000 for a Storm Cat colt

bred by Eagle Holdings who will be resold as a two-year-old. It was almost twice what Randy Hartley and Dean De Renzo had ever spent on a pinhook. Yesterday, Ocala consignors Hoby and Layna Kight got in on the action, more than doubling their highest-ever yearling purchase when they bought a son of Storm Cat, also bred by Eagle Holdings, for a cool \$1 million. Hoby Kight, wearing a cowboy hat and leaning

against the press box , saw off all challengers to land hip 35, the first seven-figure yearling of the sale. The dark bay colt is the second foal out of the seven-year-old Moon Safari (Mr. Prospector) who was third in an Irish Group 3 and is a full sister to two-time Grade I winner Scan. Top sire Caerleon is found under the third dam. Lane's End, agent, consigned hip 35. Kight's previous high was a Tiznow/Thega colt that he acquired for \$500,000 and resold for \$1 million at the 2005 Fasig-Tipton February sale. "If it works, I look really smart. If it doesn't, I won't," said Kight about the prospects of pinhooking a seven-figure yearling. "But he's a really nice horse." *L.M.*



Quiet Day for Coolmore? Not Really...

A quick look at the numbers--four horses purchased for \$2,525,000, a \$631,250 average--doesn't quite tell the whole story of Coolmore's participation during the opening session of the Keeneland September sale. Principal John Magnier fought Sheikh Mohammed's team tooth and nail for the eventual \$8.2 million session topper by Storm Cat, and also was the underbidder on the \$5.7 million Mr. Greeley/Silvester Lady (GB) colt, the second-highest priced yearling of the session. Had its \$8 million and \$5.6 million bids on those respective horses gone unanswered, Coolmore, which ranked eighth on the leading buyers list by gross, might have spent \$16,125,000, rather than \$2,525,000. Last year, Coolmore spent \$5,800,000 on six horses on the sale's opening day, a \$966,667 average, but spent 56.6 percent less in 2006. The spending of Sheikh Mohammed's bloodstock agent John Ferguson, by way of comparison, was significantly up from 2005. The first day of 2005's Book 1 saw Ferguson buy 10 horses for \$15,265,000, some 94.3 percent less that his 2006 gross of \$29,660,000 for 18 horses--a \$1,853,750 average.

Anything But a Sheikh-y Start...

Despite selling 25 fewer horses than the comparable session a year ago, the gross receipts were off just marginally while the average of \$539,264--a singlesession record for the September sale--jumped by 14.3 percent. The median of \$310,000 ticked up by 3.3 percent, demonstrative of the depth of day-one buyers. "It was a very successful first day of the sale," commented Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "To be that close to the gross and have the median up, that was very successful. The number of million-dollar horses was down [to 16 from 21 last year], but the gross of million-dollar horses was up. We had two breakout horses and we like to see those two buying groups hook up--they sure put on a show when they hooked up today." He continued, "We had a good crosssection of buyers, international and national, and I thought it was a good start to the September sale." Russell was guick to acknowledge the importance to the sale of Sheikh Mohammed and the Maktoum family. With gross purchases totalling \$29,660,000, Sheikh Mohammed single-handedly accounted for 33.4 percent of the Monday gross. Add to that the \$4.7 million in purchases made by Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Estate Company Ltd., and the Maktoums accounted for 38.8 percent of all gross receipts. "There's no mistake, I think both Sheikh Mohammed and Sheikh Hamdan enjoy coming to Central Kentucky," Russell said. "Sheikh Mohammed is very visible and wanders through the barns on a regular basis and he seems to really enjoy himself." Book 1 concludes today, with the session beginning at 10 a.m.

SOLID TRADE

As we poor handicappers know, there is often a recoil, or 'bounce' after a particularly impressive performance. Considering last year's Monday session was up \$25-million, or 40 percent, in gross from the corresponding session in 2004 (\$63 million that year to \$88 million in 2005), it wouldn't have been a total shock if things had fallen back a little bit at yesterday's opening session of Keeneland's 2006 September Yearling Sale, especially with fewer horses (12 percent fewer) catalogued. A combination of Strom Cat and Sheikh Mohammed (John Ferguson signing) ensured that yesterday's gross dropped just 1 percent from last year and, with 25 fewer sold, the average gained 14 percent, to \$539,264.

Perhaps more tellingly, yesterday's median was up 3 percent, from \$300,000 to \$310,000; that's more what the market felt like yesterday.

Excluding sires with just one yearling sold yesterday (beginning with Mr. Greeley's only Book 1 yearling, a colt out of G1 German Oaks winner Silvester Lady, by Pivotal, bought by Sheikh Mohammed for \$5.7 million), Storm Cat dominated proceedings with eight yearlings averaging \$2.1-million, headed by yesterday's session-topper, the first foal of Grade I winner Awesome Humor, by Distorted Humor. We expected big things from him--Distorted Humor--and he sold very solidly yesterday, with 10 averaging \$470,500; we're expecting more of the same from him today.

Five of the six sires who averaged over \$500,000 yesterday (four or more sold) were among the 14 veteran sires we highlighted in our Aug. 30 column. Seeking the Gold had a great sale, headlined by the \$3.2-million session-topping filly out of Take Charge Lady: he had six in all average \$882,500.

Unbridled's Song had nine average \$774,444 yesterday, while A.P. Indy had eight average \$690,625. The venerable Dynaformer had just four sell yesterday, but they averaged a whopping \$583,750; and Kingmambo had six sell, which averaged \$511,667. By contrast, the incomparable Danzig did not have a great day: he had eight through the ring, of which four were bought back, and the other four averaged a barely respectable (considering this is North America's top sire of the last 20 years) \$412,500.

Among the debutants, Vindication was the star yesterday, with seven yearlings averaging \$613,571, but both Mineshaft (seven, averaged \$402,143) and Empire Maker (10, averaged \$354,000) were impressive as well.

The 'first foals 2005' crop's number four and five commercial prospects, in either order, are Aldebaran (one sold yesterday for \$500,000) and Sky Mesa (two, averaged \$300,000).

Tuesday's session is traditionally stronger even than Monday's, but that remains to be seen this year. Last year, Tuesday grossed \$95.5 million, and averaged over \$535,000.

Old age finally caught up with Diesis, Europe's champion two-year-old of 1982, earlier this year, when the 26-year-old started having difficulties mounting his mares. There are therefore only a few more foals to come by this son of Sharpen Up, but the message of last weekend is that any fillies among them should be treasured.

In the space of less than 10 minutes, Diesis' broodmare daughters pulled off a spectacular double in Saturday's major European events.

First, Sixties Icon was impressively smooth in landing the G1 St Leger (a race which simultaneously highlighted Galileo's considerable potential as a stallion, but more of that later). Then the Irish Derby winner Dylan Thomas struck a blow for the three-year-old generation when he rallied to defeat that great mare Ouija Board in the G1 Irish Champion S. Another outstanding three-year-old--this one with a Diesis mare as its second dam--took the following day's G1 Prix Vermeille, with the winner, Mandesha, passing the post first for the fifth consecutive time in six starts.

An interesting link between Dylan Thomas and Mandesha is that they are both by members of the Danzig male line--Danehill and Desert Style, respectively --and the weekend provided further evidence of the symbiotic relationship developing between the Danehill branch of the Danzig male line and mares by sons of Sharpen Up. Both of the Group 2 juvenile events at York on St Leger day went to youngsters out of daughters of Selkirk. The first, the Champagne S., went to Vital Equine, an unbeaten colt by Danehill's fast son Danetime, and then the May Hill S. was won by Simply Perfect, a daughter of Danehill himself.

Another of Danehill's sons, Dansili, has a leading contender for the G1 Dewhurst S. in Strategic Prince, who is yet another out of a Diesis mare. Incidentally, last week was a rewarding time for the Dansili clan, as he achieved the remarkable sequence of having a stakes winner on four consecutive days thanks to Price Tag, Silver Touch, Ripples Maid and Rail Link. At the same time Dansili's younger brother Cacique confirmed his place in the Banstead Manor stallion team with his stylish victory in the GI Man o'War S.


To get back to Diesis, arguably his finest achievement as a stallion was to sire three winners of the Oaks at Epsom, with Diminuendo scoring in 1988, Ramruma in 1999 and Love Divine in 2000. This put Diesis one ahead of his highly distinguished brother Kris, who was responsible for the Oaks winners Oh So Sharp and Unite.

While every breeder wants to own an Oaks winner, the truth is that recent Oaks winners have experienced mixed fortunes as producers. There have been a few hard-luck stories among the winners of the Oaks since 1970 and Love Divine became only the sixth member of this sizeable collection to produce a Group 1 winner when her son Sixties Icon took the St Leger. She is the third to produce a Classic winner, following Midway Lady (dam of the 2004 Oaks winner Eswarah) and Snow Bride (dam of the Derby-winning Lammtarra). Ramruma, who was bought by John Magnier for 2,100,000gns in 2003, hasn't had much chance yet to prove herself as a broodmare but it is encouraging that it is her sister Ausherra who is responsible for the very promising Strategic Prince.

Sixties Icon's emergence as one of the year's best three-year-olds has been timely for Lordship Stud, which is offering Love Divine's Red Ransom colt Oct. 4 at Tattersalls. Lordship is also selling a filly from the first crop by the champion sprinter Oasis Dream out of Love Divine's winning sister Easy To Love. Lordship sold Love Divine's once-raced half-sister Love Excelling for 220,000gns at the 2004 December Sales, in foal to Galileo, and the resultant filly is also on offer at Part 1 of the October Sale. Another of Love Divine's half-sisters, the Shirley Heights mare Lyrical, is represented by a Sadler's Wells colt, so it should be a rewarding week for the broodmare daughters of La Sky, a talented three-parts sister to the Champion S. winner Legal Case.

Sixties Icon came on the market in 2004, before Midway Lady and Imagine had boosted the reputation of Oaks winners as broodmares by producing the Group 1 winners Eswarah and Horatio Nelson. Perhaps this explains why his price of 230,000gns was only the ninth-best price achieved by yearlings from the first crop by Galileo, even though the colt's parents had won three mile-and-a-half Classics between them.

After Galileo had followed up his Derby victory with a four-length romp in the Irish Derby, his trainer Aidan O'Brien commented, "Galileo has so much class that it's hard to believe he's a natural mile-and-a-half horse."

However, his stallion career is confirming that Galileo is a powerful influence for stamina, with his broodmare sire, the sprinter Miswaki, appearing to exert very little influence. Galileo was responsible for no fewer than five of the 11 runners in the St Leger, and he was also represented in the G2 Park Hill S., the so-called Fillies' St Leger. He performed a feat worthy of his sire Sadler's Wells in filling first, second and third places in a classic, thanks to Sixties Icon, The Last Drop and Red Rocks, and his daughter Allegretto filled third place in the Park Hill.


However, there are encouraging signs that Galileo isn't going to be purely a source of stamina. Sixties Icon is his second Classic winner from his first crop and his predecessor, Nightime, was fast enough to win the Irish 1000 Guineas. The difference is that Nightime's first two dams were sired by winners of the five-furlong King's Stand S. Galileo has also sired the unbeaten juvenile Group 2 winner Teofilo from a stakes-winning miler by Danehill, so it is possible to inject some speed and precocity.

Sixties Icon's St Leger demonstrated how much the European industry has come to rely on the Sadler's Wells male line for its stayers. In addition to the five sons of Galileo, the 11 runners included two by Montjeu and two by Sadler's Wells (Ask and Tusculum, who were to finish fourth and fifth).

This is nothing new, as Sadler's Wells has sired two St Leger winners in Milan and Brian Boru, plus four runners-up, and his sons Saddlers' Hall and Montjeu were respectively responsible for the winners Silver Patriarch and Scorpion.

A good performance in the St Leger is also nothing new for Diesis. Two of his Oaks winners, Diminuendo and Ramruma, finished second in the Doncatser classic, so it is hardly surprising that his third Oaks winner, Love Divine, should produce a St Leger winner. Oh So Sharp, one of the Oaks winners by Diesis' brother Kris, also won the St Leger and her daughter Shaima produced the 1996 St Leger winner Shantou.

SUIT FILED INVOLVING CLASSICSTAR FILED

Individuals claiming they were bilked out of millions of dollars by ClassicStar's high-profile mare lease and breeding program are awaiting answers to a recent complaint filed on their behalf in the United States District Court's Lexington, Kentucky, division. The 29-page document levels against ClassicStar, along with affiliated individuals and entities, felony criminal allegations of racketeering, including mail and wire fraud, as well as a variety of civil charges for more than \$20 million in claimed losses suffered by the plaintiffs. The plaintiffs are investors heading up limited liability companies based in the states of Washington and Oregon. All told, the lawsuit says the defendants in a four-year period "converted a Thoroughbred horse breeding operation into a vehicle used to defraud unsuspecting purchasers of nearly \$500 million." Although government officials looking into possible criminal charges aren't talking, the legal action, filed in late July, potentially sheds some bright light on the stunning raid Feb. 23 by Internal Revenue Service agents on ClassicStar's Thoroughbred operation near Versailles, Kentucky. The lawsuit claims in part that ClassicStar, which formerly included Utah-based entrepreneur S. David Plummer, knowingly misrepresented its program as a legal loophole for saving millions of dollars in federal taxes, mostly in the realm of capital gains. It also charges that ClassicStar didn't own interests in all the broodmares marketed by the company, and grossly over-inflated the value of the advertised \$160 million mare inventory by four times the actual portfolio value of \$40 million.
