KING'S RANSOM

For the first time since 1985, the eight-digit barrier for a yearling was breeched when a colt by Kingmambo out of Crown of Crimson was knocked down to John Ferguson, bidding on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed, for \$11.7 million during yesterday's second session of the Keeneland September Sale. The final price establishes a new record for this sale, easily surpassing the \$9.7-

million bid made last year for the unraced Liwa Oasis (Storm Cat--Tranquility Lake). It is the second highest price ever paid for a yearling, second only to the \$13.1 million paid for Seattle Dancer in 1985 at Keeneland July. "It was spectacular," said Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "We thought going in that we may not have as many million-dollar horses, but we anticipated that the top end would be stronger. The 30 horses outgrossed last year's 38 horses. The competitive spirit of Darley and Coolmore was very much at the front today." Indeed, it was that way throughout Book 1. With gross receipts approaching \$57 million--already some \$15 million more than he spent last year--Sheikh Mohammed is responsible for just over 31 percent of the cumulative turnover. Together, the Maktoums have spent nearly \$72 million, or 39.4 percent of the gross. A.C. Cont. p2-3

Clash of the Titans...

With the exception of a colt by Danzig that Coolmore landed for \$5.2 million, bidding on any yearlings that sold in excess of \$5 million featured riveting battles between that faction and Sheikh Mohammed's entourage. Neither did the scrimmage between the two for hip 425 did not disappoint. John Magnier, handling the bidding for Coolmore, maintained the same aggressive approach he had adopted earlier in the session when just missing out on the \$9.2-million colt by Danzig, also purchased by Sheikh Mohammed. Still going strong and determinedly past that mark, Magnier stayed in the protracted duel at \$9.7 million and, shortly after Sheikh Mohammed pressed the bidding past \$10 million, tried to land a decisive blow by tacking on a \$500,000 bid. Magnier answered Ferguson's next bid by going to \$11 million, and made one final bid at \$11.5 before bowing to the Sheikh's winning offer.

It's Good to Be the King...

With sons such as King's Best and Dubai Destination already on the Darley roster, Kingmambo is a sire who has been good to Sheikh Mohammed. Soon after their arrival at Blue Grass Field, it was clear to the team where their priorities lay. "The one thing about [hip 425] is that Sheikh Mohammed has great experience, and the moment he saw him, he thought he was the number one horse in the sale," Ferguson explained. "I certainly agreed with him. We're absolutely delighted to have him. When we bought the Mr. Greeley [Monday for \$5.7 million], the night before Sheikh Mohammed made it clear that we're going to spend a lot of money here over the next few days, and therefore it's important to buy the ones he really likes, rather than missing the really special ones. That's why it made sense to buy the Mr. Greeley, the Danzig and the Storm Cat [\$8.2 million on Monday], and this horse falls into that bracket." While fully extended, and then some, over the course of the first two days of the sale, Ferguson knows well that you have to pay for quality. "It's very hard to breed a horse that looks like that Kingmambo or any of the other top horses here," he commented.

Ferguson added, "They are beautifully conformed, athletic horses. Breeding horses is an expensive game, and when you get one, you deserve to win the lottery. He's bred by a very good breeder in Richard Santulli; he was raised the right way and was produced beautifully for the sale."

Super Sale for Santulli...

In the name of Jayeff B Stables, Richard Santulli and partner George Prussin purchased Crown of Crimson (Seattle Slew) from John and Betty Mabee following her victory in the 1999 Pocahontas S. at Churchill Downs. A 3/4-sister to MGISW Excellent Meeting (General Meeting), the filly failed to live up to expectations, winning just one of six starts, and was retired to stud in 2002. Bred that year to Kingmambo, her first foal, a colt, was hammered down to Shadwell Estate Co. Ltd. for \$2.85 million at the 2004 September sale. She produced a filly (who subsequently died) by the Lane's End stallion in 2004. Crown of Crimson died while foaling a Storm Cat colt this year; the colt was placed on a nurse mare. Yesterday's results helped at least a little to ease the sting. Santulli found himself pleasantly surprised. "I thought he'd make \$4 million, but then I hoped Coolmore and Sheikh Mohammed would get together," he said, adding that he reserved the colt at \$1,999,999. "Nearing the \$5-million mark, I leaned over to George and I said, 'We're going to top the sale. He said, 'You're crazy.' I said, 'Watch.' It's wonderful. It helps you to pay for a lot of mistakes. I'm glad the colt is in good hands." The NetJets CEO also had conversation with the successful bidders following the sale. "I walked over to Sheikh Mohammed and he looked at me and said, 'Have a drink of water. It looks like you need it." Yesterday's sale does not mark the first time that John Ferguson and Santulli have transacted successfully. A Gone West filly from Touch of Greatness, a full sister to Elusive Quality, was purchased by Ferguson for \$3.8 million at the 2003 Keeneland September sale, while a year-older full brother brought \$1.8 million, also from Ferguson, at the 2002 Keeneland July sale.

Burleson Makes an Impact...

Lyn Burleson cut his teeth working for Becky Thomas and Lewis Lakin at Lakland Farm. On his own since



February, the horseman was represented by a successful first consignment at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Sale in mid-July, but is likely to be on everyone's radar following yesterday's sale. "I give a lot of credit to Lyn and his team," said Richard Santulli. "They did a great job getting him ready for this sale and he works Burleson B Straus photo very hard." Burleson says he has

about 75 mares on his nearby farm. "I got some mares from [Mr. Santulli] about seven or eight years ago," he explained. "I started with Safely Kept and another mare. This was a mare that they had

bought in training, and he sent her to me. We bred her to Kingmambo, and that was her first foal that sold for \$2.85 million [to Shadwell Estate Co. at the 2004 Keeneland September sale]." So, how does it feel to be a part of history? "You can never guess that," Burleson said when asked if he expected he was coming to the sale with a \$10-million animal. "But he was always a nice horse, and he vetted well."

Score One for the Little Guy...

The names read Indian Creek, Burleson Farms and Monticule. Not exactly household names where it comes to selling horses, but they're well on their way, given the positive results from yesterday's session. Indian Creek struck first with its \$5.2-million son of Danzig, followed by Monticule's \$9.2-million colt by that same sire. Burleson provided the icing on the cake by consigning the salestopper and Geoff Russell was quick to pay homage. "I'm happy for Lyn Burleson, who's a good friend," he commented. "It's his first year on his own name--smaller farm. Same for Dr. Knapp. They're two smaller farms, and to have this exposure on a global market is wonderful exposure for both." He added, "Both have invested heavily in the industry; they just tend to do it on a lower profile. Lyn Burleson has been around for a long time and works very, very hard. Dr. Knapp's farm is a relatively new farm and he's invested heavily in the game and he's getting returns. We're happy for them to be in the forefront."

Peak Performance for Monticule...

The outside cover of the brochure published by Dr. Gary Knapp's Monticule agency bears the slogan 'Making Our Mark.' Hip 312, a beautiful dark bay colt from the final crop of Danzig, contributed mightily to that goal yesterday, realizing a final bid of \$9.2 million at the second session of Keeneland September. Once

again, John Ferguson-bidding on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed--outlasted John Magnier on behalf of Coolmore for the yearling out of Sharp Minister (Deputy Minister). The mare is a full sister to MGSW Flag Down. It was another tooth-and-nail battle between the titans, but it had a somewhat different feeling to Monday's bid-

ding wars. Magnier, clad in his panama hat and wearing dark sunglasses on a dreary and rainy afternoon, seemed more resolute in his bidding, answering Ferguson's bids of \$200,000 in increments of \$300,000 of his own. Magnier took the bidding to \$8.5 million and Ferguson offered \$8.7 million. After talking it over with his associates, Magnier lobbed across one final bid at \$9 million, but Ferguson responded in kind, and the colt was his. "He was one of the nicest Danzigs we've ever seen, and we've seen a lot of them," Ferguson commented. "He's just a supremely athletic horse. That's really what you're looking for. He was outstanding and as I said, Sheikh Mohammed is of the belief that you're paying a lot for these horses, so you need to buy the ones that really are important, and he was. If he does fire, we've got a huge opportunity from a stallion point of view." A.C.

High Praise for Danzig...

Sire of an astonishing 182 stakes winners, the deceased Danzig is represented by 18 last-crop yearlings in the September catalogue, and if his progeny were moderately disappointing in their performance during Monday's opening session, those that sold yesterday more than made up for it. Among the sire's biggest admirers are Sheikh Mohammed and team, who have had much success with his offspring. Those horses include GI Breeders' Cup Mile possibility Librettist, arguably Europe's top miler off wins in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois and the G1 Prix du Moulin. "We have a natural affection for him," Ferguson explained. "If you look at statistics on Danzig, bearing in mind that the book sizes he covers were relatively small in comparison to this day and age, what he's done is amazing. Sheikh Mohammed is delighted to have this colt." Ferguson also knows a little about the family. At the 2005 edition of the September sale, he signed the ticket at \$500,000 for this colt's full brother, Dijeerr. The bay, who races in the colors of Sheikh Ahmed Al Maktoum, was second in a July 29 maiden during Ascot's King George meeting and returned to graduate by 1 1/4 lengths at Leicester Sept. 5. A.C.

Looking Sharp...

Having founded Monticule in 1999, Dr. Gary Knapp made a positive initial entrance into the breeding game, selling a filly by Mr. Prospector--Lady Madonna for \$2.1 million at the 2001 Keeneland September sale. A year earlier at the November Breeding Stock sale, Knapp went to \$220,000 for Sharp Minister. What attracted Knapp to the mare? "Her age when I bought her and her broodmare sire," he offered. "When I was buying mares, I was using EQUIX. They will measure a broodmare and run those measurements in their database of stallions in Central Kentucky, and they'll tell you how well that mare fits with the stallions. You know you have the right physical match, then you just have to get the right genes. She's turned out to be a wonderful mare." In 2003, Knapp bred Sharp Minister to Danzig for the first time, and the result was the aforementioned Dijeerr. Cont. p5

That colt has already begun to exhibit his talent and Knapp carried high hopes for his full brother coming in. "We thought he was a very nice horse. I thought he would definitely be in seven figures," he said. "But to be in *those* seven figures was entirely unanticipated. It's my impression that when you get to that level, what you have is at least two parties who recognize what a fine animal is being sold and what you're seeing is a reflection of their aspiration to own the finest racehorses." *For more information on Monticule and yesterday's sale, please read tomorrow's Ringside in the TDN.*

Coolmore Lands Its Danzig...

Shut out on hip 312, a \$9.2-million son of Danzig, Coolmore principal John Magnier dusted himself off and got right back to business, dueling for and securing another son of the late, great stallion. Bidding just under the rear bid spotter while leaning against the left lead-in chute, where Sheikh Mohammed's team is typically stationed, Magnier saw off a challenge from the front of the pavilion to land hip 373, a Danzig colt out of the Roberto mare Al Theraab, for \$5.2 million. "He's a nice Danzig, isn't he?" asked Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne afterwards. O'Byrne had previously signed the ticket on a 3/4-brother to hip 373, the Danehill colt Albert Hall (GB), for 510,000gns at the 2002 Tattersalls December sale. Albert Hall went on to win the G2 Beresford S. as a maiden at The Curragh in 2004. He also finished second to Motivator (GB) in that year's G1 Racing Post Trophy S. "[Albert Hall] wasn't as nice looking as he is," said O'Byrne when asked to compare the two. He added, "I thought he was a quality horse and had a lot of Danzig in him." Hip 373 will race for Michael Tabor, John Magnier and Derrick Smith. Yesterday's result for hip 373 was another in a string of successes for consignors that had only a few horses in Book 1. 

Indian Creek/consignor of hip 373 cont.

Shack Parrish, who consigned hip 373 through his Indian Creek outfit, had just three cataloged in Book 1, and took pride in that accomplishment. "This was a strike for the small guys," said Parrish. "It shows that we can do a job that the big agencies claim that they're the only ones that can do. Now with this and a few others, like the Monticule horse [the \$9.2-million Danzig], it shows people we know what we're doing." Parrish was also quick to acknowledge his staff and the colt's breeder, Bjorn Nielsen of Greenwich, Connecticut. "It's a credit to our guys at the farm, and to [the late] Joss Collins, who sent us the mare for the owner," said Parrish. Parrish went on to explain how the mare arrived in Central Kentucky. "The mare had been in England and she had been barren for two years," he said. "Joss came to our farm manager, Mike Evans, and said, 'I've got a mare to send you and there are two little items I want to mention. She's been barren for two years and the man [Bjorn Nielsen] just bought a noguarantee season to Danzig.' So that showed faith in Mike, and she got in foal on one cover. Mr. Nielsen had his own theories and that's what he wanted to do, and he knew the cross worked." L.M.

V is for Vindication...

Perhaps no other freshman sire in Keeneland September history has had the two days that Vindication has had. The winner of the 2002 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and that year's two-year-old champion, Vindication was represented on Monday by a \$2.8-million yearling out of Serena's Tune who was purchased by John Ferguson. The Seattle Slew stallion wasn't done yet, though. Yesterday, a striking dark bay half-brother to Grade I winners Roman Ruler and El Corredor by Vindication was knocked down to Zayat Stables for \$4.6 million. It was the highest price ever paid for a yearling by a freshman sire in the sale's history. John Ferguson, who purchased the Danzig/Sharp Minister colt for \$9.2 million as hip 312, stayed around to vie for hip 318, a son of the Silver Deputy mare Silvery Swan. Ferguson was handed the rare defeat, however, as Ahmed Zayat, with conditioner Bob Baffert sitting to his left inside the sales pavilion, outlasted Team Darley with steady series of \$100,000 bids. Baffert, who trains several Zayat runners, knows something about the colt's pedigree. The silver-haired conditioner trained both El Corredor and Roman Ruler, and was also at the helm during Vindication's championship season. Vindication was retired to John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Farm to stand stud, and the sale of hip 318 represented a double-barreled score for Sikura. He not only stands Vindication, but also owns Silvery Swan in partnership with Liberation Farm and Needham/Betz Thoroughbreds. Coming into the sale, Sikura knew he had a star. The only question was, how much would he bring? "I knew that he was the kind of horse where anything could happen," said Sikura.



Sikura continued, "But you really just don't know what's going to happen. It's wealthy, strong-willed people buying what they want. It's nice to have more than one group think that much of your horse." Asked if hip 318 looked like his famous siblings, Sikura said, "Well, he's got similar attributes, but he's his own individual. Every foal out of the mare is spectacular." As for Vindication, there's no doubt that his strong showing at the sale will help keep him popular during next year's breeding season. "It's a credit to the horse and a credit to the people who supported him with their mares," said Sikura when asked what two multi-million dollar yearlings said about Vindication. "We're optimistic about his future. We're glad they've sold well and hope they race well." Silvery Swan, who also produced graded-stakes winner Silver Tornado (Maria's Mon) and a \$2.7-million Mr. Greeley filly at last year's September sale, has a Grand Slam weanling filly on the ground, but is not currently in foal. L.M.

North Meets South for Storm Cat Filly...

What do you get when you mix a Canadian horseman, a Louisiana trainer and a Southern businessman? A blue-blooded daughter of Storm Cat, if you are John Sikura, conditioner Eric Guillot and Mike Moreno, who is in oil field construction. Sikura has teamed up with Southern Equine--the Louisiana-based racing and breeding operation of Guillot and Moreno's--to go after wellbred mares with a goal of building a broodmare band in Kentucky. Sikura said he expected the partnership to be active at the Keeneland November sale, but said the men saw a golden opportunity vesterday with hip 363. By Storm Cat, the dark bay filly is out of the gradedstakes winner Welcome Surprise (Seeking the Gold), a half-sister to, among others, Horse of the Year A.P. Indy and Classic winner Summer Squall. A full-brother to hip 363, later named Mr. Sekiguchi, topped the 2004 September sale on Fusao Sekiguchi's \$8-million bid. "It's a great pedigree," said Sikura. "I thought that it was unique in the book, just for its depth." Hip 363 was consigned by Lane's End, agent. The farm's head, William S. Farish, bred the filly in Kentucky with the Kilroy Thoroughbred Partnership. Sikura, with a cell phone pressed to his ear, did his bidding from the front of the pavilion, with Guillot sitting directly behind him. Sikura signed the ticket under Southern Equine. Commenting on hip 363, Guillot said, "Physically, she's rangy. She's got a nice, deep shoulder, a lot of leg. But we bought her mostly for her pedigree--the long-haul value. She'll always be a Storm Cat filly. If she makes a race record for herself, the sky's the limit for a filly of this caliber. Would I have bought a colt like that for \$3 million? No. But there are probably three horses in the whole catalog with a pedigree like that." Guillot splits his time training at Louisiana Downs and at Hollywood Park and Del Mar in California. Southern Equine has a training center in Lafavette, Louisiana, and also has a broodmare band in the state. "We should be the dominant force in Louisiana breeding," said Guillot. "We've got a \$6-million broodmare band there, with Vindications, El Corredors--[weanlings and yearlings] by stallions like that. We expect to have a \$15- to \$20-million band in Kentucky in about six months or so." Guillot has been together with Moreno, 38, for about eight years. One of their best horses is the four-year-old Hello Lucky (Lucky Lionel), third in the GI Del Mar Debutante at two and most recently third in the Sept. 6 CERF H. at that track. L.M.

Conclusive Evidence...

In what might be the understatement of the year, Geoff Russell said that the market seems to be "alive and well." He said, "Compared to last year, the upper echelon is obviously stronger. When John Magnier and Sheikh Mohammed team up, they go to a higher level than anybody else. The next level down is a little lighter, I'd have to say. The spreading around of the million-dollar horses is not as deep as it was last year. For the rest of the sale, I think there are buyers from all corners of the world and from all 50 states in the union." Despite cataloging 12 percent fewer Book 1 horses as compared to last year, gross receipts were off fractionally while the average jumped by 12.1 percent. The session average of \$589,814 was a record for the September sale. And although the upper end of the market was dominated by two buying entities, the median of \$300,000 represented a 5.3-percent improvement on last year. The sale continues this morning at 10 a.m.

FROM THE DESK OF... Bill Oppenheim

SHEIKH THE PLACE

He and his family own Bernardini, Henny Hughes, and Dubai Escapade stateside this year, and Godolphin is winning at a 30-percent clip since coming back to life in Europe: Sheikh Mohammed came with serious intent. John Ferguson must have cramp in his hand, not just from signing 25 tickets in the last two days, but from writing all those zeroes. The total was \$56,885,000, which is an average of \$2,275,400, and included an \$11.7-million Kingmambo, a \$9.2-million Danzig, an \$8.2-million Storm Cat and a \$5.7-million Mr. Greeley. The only colt over \$5-million not bought by Sheikh Mohammed was a \$5.2-million Danzig colt bought by Demi O'Byrne, so, in \$5-million-plus colts, the Sheikh out-bought Coolmore four to one.

With 13-percent fewer horses sold than last year (324 vs. 372), the Book 1 gross dropped 3 percent, or a little under \$4.4-million, from \$187.2-million last year to \$182.8-million this year. The average rose by 12 percent from \$503,263 last year to \$564,383 this year, but, as I said, yesterday, it looks like the comparative medians might be the most significant figure this year. The median rose 5 percent, from \$285,000 last year to \$300,000 this year.

It remains to be seen, of course, but I wouldn't be surprised if we look back at the end of the sale and say, yeah, the 5-percent rise in the Book 1 median was the most accurate forecast of the sale's final figures. It would be really interesting if that were the case, because that could mean this year's sale would actually break the \$400-million barrier. Last year's gross was \$385-million.

That's all guesswork, though; here's what we do know from the last two days. Throughout the whole of Book 1, a total of 324 horses averaged \$564,383. But the 25 bought by Sheikh Mohammed averaged \$2,275,400, which means the 299 yearlings not bought by Sheikh Mohammed averaged \$421,321. The entire Book 1 average (\$564,383) is 34-percent more than the non-Sheikh Mohammed average (\$421,321). The way I read statistics, it means there is a measurable effect, that Sheikh Mohammed was personally responsible for adding more than a third (34 percent) to the average.

There were eight sires which averaged over \$500,000 with 10 or more yearlings sold, and, perhaps interestingly, only one of them is a Coolmore sire--Giant's Causeway (15, averaged \$522,000). After a slow start on Monday, the incomparable Danzig had colts bring \$9.2-million and \$5.2-million yesterday to head the sale-average leaderboard for the final time; his 11 sold averaging \$1,590,000. Storm Cat, with probably his best pedigrees ever, had 21 average \$1,413,095; and Kingmambo, with the \$11.7-million saletopper, had 13 average \$1,295,384. These were the three runaway leaders on average. Vindication, with colts bringing \$4.6-million and \$2.8-million, headed first-year sires, with 15 averaging \$777,667. Mineshaft (14, averaged \$450,000) just edged Empire Maker (19, averaged \$440,790) for second spot--but all three had very strong sales. Seeking the Gold had 13 average an impressive \$749,230, while A.P. Indy (13, averaged \$578,846) and Unbridled's Song (18, averaged \$550,000) were other sires who averaged over a half-million. Distorted Humor averaged \$433,611 with 18 sold. The really impressive statistic for him, though, is that the median for those 18 was \$412,500, an almost unheard-of 95 percent of the average (usually 75 percent is good). It means he is throwing a really consistent type.




