#### TAYLOR MADE FOR SUCCESS

After a solid, if unspectacular, session Wednesday, the seven-figure fireworks returned at Keeneland September yesterday, with a pair of Taylor Made consign-

ees each eclipsing the milliondollar mark. Leading the way was hip 970, a son of Pulpit that Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Stable purchased for \$1.3 million. Jackson, stationed in a doorway in the front of the sales pavilion. locked horns with Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum representative Dan Pride, who was standing in the left lead-in chute, at about the \$400,000 point. The two traded salvos through an extended duel, but a Horsephotos smiling Pride walked away after Jackson's \$1.3 million bid. "He

was probably the best colt in the sale [Thursday] and maybe in the last two days," said Jackson. "And, obviously [Sheikh Mohammed] liked him as well. I'm pleased we prevailed." Jackson added with a laugh, "They were very persistent, but once in a while America has to win. [Sheikh Mohammed] took most of my good horses the first day or two. I'm surprised they were still here. I thought they left on that big jet." A handsome bay colt, the topper is out of the Storm Cat mare Razzi Cat, making him a half to Rocking Trick (Arg) (Phone Trick) and Randy Cat (Arg) (Roy), both multiple Group 1 winners in Argentina. Jackson and his bloodstock advisor John Moynihan agreed that the combination of the colt's page and physical made him a top prospect. "John feels this one is a true winner," said Jackson. "He's got a great pedigree on both sides, looks racy and, if he can run, he's got the blood to stand [as a stallion]. He's got some residual." Stonestreet also bought the Thursday session topper at the 2005 sale, a Distorted Humor colt that brought \$900,000. Named American Classic, he has not raced. Thursday marked another successful day for Taylor Made, who also consigned hip 942, a colt by Distorted Humor purchased by agent Tim Kegel for \$1.2 million. Cont. p2

#### Seven is the New Six...

Last year's Book 2 contained a single seven-figure horse, a Mr. Greeley colt that sold during the Wednesday session for \$1 million. Asked if he was disappointed the sale didn't reach that plateau during the corresponding 2006 session, Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell said Wednesday evening, "No, those horses should be in Book 1. That's where they belong." Despite the comment, it's safe to say that Russell wasn't too chagrined to find a pair of millionaires in his sale yesterday. So did consignor Taylor Made expect hip 970 to achieve such a lofty price? "Not really," admitted Mark Taylor. "I had him appraised at \$600,000, but I knew that anything could happen. He was the kind that all the top people really liked. The only people we didn't have were the Coolmore team, and I just don't think they really like buying Seattle Slew-line horses." Explaining the colt's appeal, Taylor said, "He had a beautiful head, the kind of head that captured everybody when they came in. He has a nice, clean, thin neck, with a Storm Cat shoulder--real chiseled--and a great hip and a great hind leg. He's very correct up front, and he was just the perfect package." Taylor added that it was no accident that hip 970 wound up in Book 2 rather than in the first book, where the competition is stiff and getting lost in the shuffle is easier. "With our Book 2 horses, we try to focus on conformation," said Taylor. "We also like to think of our stallion representation. We had a really nice Pulpit colt in Book 1, and we didn't really want the two right next to each other, and everything worked out." Hip 970 was bred by BAN Partnership and Haras Vacacion in Kentucky, but had been sold privately to a Floridabased outfit, according to Taylor. "I saw him a few months ago in Florida, and he was just a really nice horse," he said. Of note, BAN Partners was listed as the buyer when Razzi Cat sold for \$130,000, in foal to Distorted Humor, at the 2006 Keeneland January sale.

### Jackson Wearing Two Hats...

By his own admission, it's been tough sledding over the first few days of the September sale for Jess Jackson, who was either consistently outbid or was forced to watch Monday and Tuesday's battles from a distance. Jackson did have some success in Book 1, acquiring four horses, and another three yesterday, including the session topper by Pulpit. "It's been an interesting sale," the Kendall-Jackson Winery owner commented. "The first book was wild. The second book has calmed down a bit, but a good horse still sells well. I think the market is still strong in the lower to middle ranges and it's very strong at the high end." Jackson also finds himself in the role of a seller at the September sale, as he has begun to return to auction some of the foals produced by mares he acquired over the past few years. He was especially pleased with the performance yesterday of hip 936, a colt by Fusaichi Pegasus--Nickel Classic (Regal Classic), which brought a final bid of \$500,000 from Tim Kegel on behalf of Palmer and Partners Racing. "We've got a lot of quality," said Jackson. "All of our mares have black-type for the most part and when you get an outstanding body, like that Fusaichi Pegasus, there's a strong-enough market for him. Too bad he wasn't in the first book." Nickel Classic has an Unbridled's Song colt for 2006 and is in foal to Afleet Alex. Among Jackson's other good sales were a \$300,000 son of Rock of Gibraltar (Ire)--Tosca's Impulse (Ire); a \$360,000 filly by Galileo (Ire)--Beat It; and a \$400,000 daughter of Seeking the Gold--Catbaby.

Since then, the undefeated Todd Pletcher trainee has made two starts, posting an allowance score at Delaware followed by a 7 1/4-length victory in the GIII Monmouth Breeders' Cup Oaks at Monmouth Park. In a business where timing is everything, Aaron and Marie Jones, who Horsephotos bred the colt, were the beneficiaries yesterday when a Dis-


torted Humor half-brother to that talented sophomore was knocked down for \$1.2 million. Tim Kegel, who signed the \$900,000 ticket on the son of Unbridled's Song that was the co-topper Wednesday, was the successful bidder. Kegel was acting on behalf of an unnamed partnership, but one different from the group that purchased the Unbridled's Song colt. What caught the Louisville-based bloodstock agent's eye? "I love Distorted Humor and this is a real good-looking one," he said. "They come in all shapes and sizes, but they all can run. He's a very racy-looking horse." The Joneses purchased the colt's dam, Officiate (Deputy Minister) for \$575,000 at the 1999 Keeneland July Sale and sold Mo Cuishle for \$325,000 at this sale in 2004. Officiate is the dam of a two-year-old colt of this year by Forestry as well as a weanling colt by the Taylor Made stallion. The yearling was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency. "We always try to have a nice horse in Book 2," said Taylor Made's Mark Taylor. "We try to have at least one seven-figure horse. He also had a huge update from the catalog. We knew he was a nice horse for Book 2, but then it was good timing with the update. We're pleasantly surprised, but not overly so."

### America America Filly to Europe Europe...

It's not every day that a filly breaks her maiden in a three-furlong race in the United States, is sent to Europe and runs seven times in eight weeks, returns the North America to place in a trio of graded stakes on dirt and turf and defeats males for her first black-type victory. And that was just the first season at the races for the durable America (Mister Baileys {GB}). Purchased for just \$5,000 at the 2002 Fasig-Tipton October sale, the chestnut would go on to win the Lone Star Oaks at three while in foal to El Prado (Ire). Retired with earnings of \$403,093, she was sent through that year's Fasig-Tipton November sale, but failed to meet her reserve at \$325,000. The mare produced a filly by the Adena stallion Mar.13 of last year, and the attractive gray was knocked down to representatives of Sheikh Mohammed for \$280,000 yesterday afternoon. "She was a very, very nice filly," said Jeffrey Morris of Highclere, who consigned the filly to the sale. "She is very well balanced and athletic and a great first foal for the mare. She's a little more fine and polished than a lot of El Prados. She's a lovely filly." Morris added that the filly is going to go to John Gosden, who will train her for Sheikh Mohammed's wife Princess Haya. America America is boarded at Highclere and has a "gorgeous Dynaformer foal on the ground," according to Morris. She is currently in foal to Rock Hard Ten.

#### For Oxley, Patience Leads to Vindication...

John Oxley had been priced out of the September market for much of the first four days of the sale, but finally was able to strike a blow yesterday, landing a colt from the first crop of Vindication for \$600,000. Consigned by Eaton Sales on behalf of the colt's breeder, Overbrook Farm, the bay is a son of MSP Catcher (Storm Cat), a full sister to 1999 GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Cat Thief. Like many others, Oxley is bullish on Vindication. "I'm very impressed," he said. "They've done a great job getting an excellent book of mares to him. His foals look great." Of his purchase, he added, "He's a classic-looking horse. He's got good size, he's a January foal and he was really hard to fault. He's out of a nice family. There's a lot of good ones in the pedigree and he looks the part." Despite biding his time through the first two books, Oxley found a way to stay on task. "With 5,100 horses in here, the best one of the sale may still be yet to come, you never can tell," he remarked. "You have to be patient and you have to stay within your budget--at least I do. I have to look at it from a business standpoint and buy horses that can make back most, if not all, what I pay for them."

### Hermitage Mares Producing Popular Babies...

Carl Pollard's Hermitage Farm has had a nice first four days at Keeneland, selling six of their seven offerings, all but one for six-figure price tags. The consignment included yearlings produced by some of Pollard's best racemares, including a filly by Storm Cat out of 2000 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Caressing (Honour and Glory), which was purchased by Mike Ryan, as agent, for \$475,000. The Irishman has a long-standing relationship with the farm and bought Caressing for \$180,000 out of the 1999 September sale. At that same auction, Ryan went to \$150,000 on behalf of Pollard for the filly Kiss the Devil (Kris S.). The dark bay would go on to a very successful career at the races, bankrolling \$381,629, with an upset victory in the GIII Mint Julep H. in 2003. Pollard struck a foal-sharing deal with Darley, and Kiss the Devil was scheduled to be sent to Europe to be bred to Machiavellian, but fate intervened. "The stallion got sick, so we had a choice between Fantastic Light and Singspiel (Ire), and we chose Singspiel," said Hermitage Farm Manager Bill Landes. The resulting foal was consigned to vesterday's session and elicited a final bid of \$300,000 from John Ferguson. Landes says the cross is actually an interesting one, as it provides close in-breeding to the outstanding mare Ballade. He added that Darley is considering sending their purchase to race in Japan.

#### Ain't So Hard...

When the last of her children flew the coop about six years ago, Amy Tarrant decided to do something different. A product of the show horse world, she wanted to shift gears and try her hand at Thoroughbred racing. She jumped in feet first, purchasing a handful of horses for good money, and turned them over to trainer Ronald Taylor. The pair enjoyed some success, most notably with the Fortunate Prospect filly Bold World, who won the GIII Azalea Breeders' Cup S. in 2002 and earned \$376,710. After three years, Tarrant split with Taylor and, in a bold if unconventional decision, put herself in charge of conditioning her horses. She had no prior experience training Thoroughbreds. It was a risky move, she admitted, but it turned out to be a rewarding one. "I'm loving it," said Tarrant, who maintains a stable of about 15 horses at Monmouth in the summer and in Florida over the winter. "I learned a lot from [Taylor], and kept one of his assistants when I went out on my own, and he was very knowledgeable and helped me a lot. I'm with my horses all the time, day in and day out, and I'm still learning a lot every day." Despite being relatively new to the business, Tarrant hasn't been shy about spending at the sales. She has been buying horses at Keeneland September for the past four years for her Hardacre Farm. Since 2002, she's spent \$5,005,500 on 24 horses at the September sale. Her best runners include Indy Wind (A.P. Indy), a \$150,000 yearling in 2003 who was second to Park Avenue Ball in the Skip Away S. this past July; and Habiboo (Unbridled's Song), a \$210,000 buy in 2002. Habiboo didn't quite earn back her purchase price on the track, winning four of 17 races for \$190,190, but added considerable value to her future as a broodmare by hitting the board in three graded events, including last year's GII First Flight H. Habiboo was subsequently retired and has joined Tarrant's broodmare band. She was bred to Forest Wildcat in the spring. In 2006, Tarrant signed the ticket on four September yearlings. During the select sessions, she purchased hip 23, a Tale of the Cat colt, for \$310,000; and hip 406, a Kingmambo filly for \$250,000. On day three she added two more, a Songandaprayer colt (hip 534) for \$480,000 and an Empire Maker filly (hip 559) for \$150,000. "I'm really pleased with what I got," said Tarrant, who was back at Monmouth yesterday. Going against some of the best in the business could be nerve-wracking for some, but Tarrant says she's not intimidated at Keeneland. "I just go in with a list of horses and make the rounds," she said. "I think you've got to find your own niche, and I feel pretty lucky that I have. I love what I do."

#### Can't Fence This One In...

In November 1993, some 24 races into her career, five-year-old Ivor's Love was claimed by Texas businessmen David Hulkewicz and Michael Rainier for \$25,000. But she failed to win in three subsequent starts, and the daughter of Sir Ivor was bred the following spring to Dynaformer. The resulting foal was named Formal Tango, a filly of considerable talent who scored her most important victory for the duo in the GIII Eatontown H. in 1999. She was retired with six wins and nine minor placings from her 20 career starts and earnings of \$404,702. Sadly, that was the only foal of Ivor's Love, but Formal Tango has proved as proficient at stud as she was at the races. She began her second career by producing a Wild Again colt which made \$340,000 as a Keeneland September yearling in 2004. Her Thunder Gulch filly did not meet her reserve last year, but the mare got back on track yesterday at Keeneland, when her Forestry colt, consigned by the Elm Tree Farm agency of Mr. and Mrs. Jody Huckabay, realized a final bid of \$530,000 from California owner B. Wayne Hughes. That the colt, who was cataloged as hip 1230, made it to the sale at all was an accomplishment in itself for Elm Tree. About two months ago, he crashed through a fence on the Paris, Kentucky farm and sustained a severe laceration to his shoulder that required 100 sutures. "We didn't know until the last week whether we were going to bring him or not," said Jody Huckabay, who operates Elm Tree with his wife Michelle. "He was an absolutely beautiful horse, but the good ones always try to hurt themselves. Nothing ever happens to the bad ones, so we knew he was good when he got hurt. We just kept working with him. He looks great, and I think he'll only improve. The injury prevented us from really having him looking exactly the way we wanted." While Hulkewicz and Rainier weren't able to make it up to watch the colt sell, "they were on the phone hootin' and hollerin'," laughed Huckabay.

#### Steady As She Goes...

Sparked by steady trade, the final session of Book 2 posted a 17.2-percent increase in the average, while the middle market continued to prosper, advancing by 20 percent. "It was a spectacular sale from start to finish," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "The difference between Wednesday and Thursday is the consignors. Obviously, the Thursday group of consignors had a stronger group of horses than the Wednesday consignors. The feel of the whole sale from start to finish was very, very strong." Russell added that the two million-dollar horses contributed to the positive vibe. In the history of the sale, there had been a total of two seven-figure horses sold during the fourth session. The sale takes its now-traditional day off to allow buyers and sellers to collect their breath, while also allowing them the chance to show and see Book 3 offerings. Russell is expecting more of the same when the sale resumes tomorrow. "I hope Saturday and Sunday continue the momentum that's been built," he said. "We've tried to make it a conformation class and not worry about pedigrees as much. We encouraged that. We're hoping that will come good."



Campaigned by Timer Bay Farm and Mrs. Thomas Walsh and trained by Jimmy Jerkens, the five-yearold captured seven stakes in four seasons at the track, including the GII Jamaica H., GII National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame S. and GIII Hill Prince S. in 2004 and the GII Maker's Mark Mile and GII Bernard Baruch H. last season. Looking a picture in the

Belmont Park paddock before the Breeders' Cup, the bay was a 5-1 shot in the Mile, but threaded his way through traffic to catch champion Leroidesanimaux (Brz) in the final yards and win it by 3/4 of a length, with top grass filly Gorella (Fr) another nose back in third. Artie Schiller added a second in the Maker's Mark and a third in the GII Dixie S. this season, and retires with a record of 22-10-5-3. His bankroll stands at \$2,088,853. "Artie Schiller is an outstanding physical specimen and, at a \$15,000 fee, will give breeders a real chance," Hurricane Hall President Ben Walden Jr. said. The Kentucky-bred will stand as the property of a syndicate.

Officials in New York are considering pushing back the Sept. 29 deadline for the recommendation by a state panel on which entity should be awarded the franchise now held by the New York Racing Association. The possible delay by the Ad Hoc Committee on the Future of Racing could be approved as early as Sept. 15, when the nine-member panel is scheduled to meet in Saratoga Springs, N.Y. Besides having more than 11,000 pages of bidding documents to pore through, the panel's request to hire an outside accounting firm has not yet been approved by the state comptroller's office. Officials said the firm's expertise in going over the financial details of the bids is necessary. One individual close to the process said one idea being discussed is not to have a firm deadline placed on the decision in case other unexpected delays arise. "That is completely and solely up to the committee," Robert Williams, the committee's executive director, said when asked about the possibility of moving back the looming deadline. Jockey Club Releases 2005 Breeding Statistics:

The Jockey Club reported that 3,992 stallions covered 64,123 mares in North America in 2005, according to statistics compiled through Sept. 6, 2006. The matings have resulted in 36,630 reported live foals in 2006. The Jockey Club estimates that the number of live foals reported, at this point in time, is approximately 90 percent complete. The reporting of live foals of 2006 is 1.1 percent behind last year's pace when The Jockey Club received reports for 37,025 live foals of 2005. "History indicates that we'll receive another 3,500 to 4,000 Live Foal Reports in the coming months, which will put us on track to register the 37,300 foals we previously projected for North America for 2006," said Matt Iuliano, The Jockey Club's vice president of registration services. "We encourage breeders who haven't submitted their Live Foal Reports to do so as soon as possible so they can complete the registration of their foals within the one-year deadline and avoid late registration fees." In addition, The Jockey Club had also received 7,652 No Foal Reports for the 2006 foaling season. The number of stallions declined 3.7 percent from 4,145 reported in 2004, while the number of mares bred increased 0.1 percent from the 64,052 reported for 2004. As in past years, Kentucky led all states and provinces in terms of Thoroughbred breeding activity, with Kentucky-based stallions accounting for 33.2 percent of the mares reported bred in North America in 2005 and 40.3 percent of the North American live foals reported for 2006. The 21,310 mares reported bred to 370 Kentucky stallions in 2005 have produced 14,748 live foals, a 4.3 percent increase over 14,141 Kentucky-sired live foals of 2005. The number of mares bred to Kentucky stallions in 2005 increased 4.2 percent against the 20,443 reported for 2004. Among 13 states and provinces in which stallions covered at least 1,000 mares in 2005, six produced more state/province-sired live foals in 2006 than in 2005 and six produced fewer. Florida produced the same amount. Among individual stallions, Lion Heart sired the most live foals of 2006, with 187 reported as of Sept. 6.
