### THE RETURN OF GORGEOUS GEORGE

George Washington (Ire) (Danehill) is back at center stage in today's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot. Injury has so far denied Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's celebrity the opportunity of building

on his brilliant dismissal of subsequent G1 Epsom Derby hero Sir Percy (GB) in the G1 2000 Guineas May 6, but the spark was evident for his comeback third in the Aug. 27 G2 Celebration Mile. "We think he's gone the right way since his run at Goodwood," trainer Aidan O'Brien said. "He's in good shape and seems to be fine mentally, but George is George." Impressive when winning the G1 Phoenix S. and G1 National S. at two, George Washington started 2006 with a huge reputation and proved he

had talent to match his self-belief on his return in the Newmarket Classic. The ego was landed when he ran second to Araafa (Ire) (Mull of Kintyre) in desperate conditions at The Curragh for the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas May 27, but he exited that effort with torn muscles in his hindquarters, and was emerging from convalescence when third at Goodwood. Araafa following his Irish Classic success with a victory over Stormy River (Fr) and Ivan Denisovich (Ire) (Danehill) in the G1 St James's Palace S. June 20, but was only fifth in the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood Aug. 2 and needs to rebound. "I have been happy with Araafa's preparations," trainer Jeremy Noseda commented. "Now we are just looking for some luck on the day." Cont. p3

I'll take a look at the program book now." G1 Prix Ganay winner Corre Caminos' cause was not aided as his pacemaker raced alone in the center of the track, and he made labored headway from rear to take third in the closing stages. "I don't understand what happened to my pacemaker, as he didn't follow the plan, but he needed the run and he will still go to Newmarket for the [Oct. 14] G1 Champion S," explained trainer Mikel Delzangles. Longgchamp in October and finishing third in the May 20 G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury on his European return. He was baulked close to home when second to Ad Valorem in the G1 Queen Anne S. at the Royal meeting here June 20 before his emphatic rout in the G1 Sussex S. Aug. 2, where he proved that Court Masterpiece a mile is within his scope. "He always works pretty good, but to me he just seemed to look better--he has a lot of

zest in his work at the moment," the owner's Racing Manager Bruce Raymond told PA Sport. "I felt a mile could be a problem for him before last year, although he had won at a mile before. I just felt in the top grade, going up to Group 1 company, that he might struggle. Certainly going into Ascot, where he got practically knocked over, I was still having reservations about it, but the Sussex put all those ideas to sleep."

Godolphin, chasing a fourth renewal, have loaded both barrels with Librettist and Proclamation. At the start of the year, last year's G1 Sussex S. victor Proclamation appeared to have the miling scene at his mercy, but connections have managed to get him to the track only once and he failed to fire when third in the Queen Anne. But Librettist has romped through the summer on a five-win streak which has encompassed the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois Aug. 13 and G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp last time Sept. 3. "I am looking forward to good runs from both the Godolphin horses," trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented. "This is [Librettist's] big test in England and I am pleased with him. [Proclamation] is in good form and has been working pleasingly for Kerrin McEvoy, who rides on Saturday and knows him well."

She suffered a troubled trip when seventh, upped a panel the Aug. 27 G1 Moyglare Stud S. at The Curragh, but continued the upward trend over a mile of York's circuit last time. "I was very happy with her performance at York and feel that she will be suited by the stiffer mile at Ascot," her trainer commented. "She is a genuine and honest filly and I'm sure she will again put up another good show." Barry Hills saddled Silk Slippers to success for the late Robert Sangster in 1989 and bids to roll back the years for that connection with English Ballet. Any rainfall may help in the cause of reversing May Hill placings, as she appeared to appreciate cut in the ground when capturing the G3 Sweet Solera S. at Newmarket Aug. 12, where Fitri Hay's Satulagi was back in third. Sir Michael Stoute took this in Untold (GB) in 1985 and Red Bloom (GB) three years ago and pitches The Queen's Lost in Wonder into the deep end off a Beverley maiden success last time Aug. 27.

King of the Roxy was purchased privately by Team Valor following a July 2 maiden win at Hollywood Park. "He ran well for us first time and if he improves a little bit, he might have a chance," trainer Todd Pletcher commented. "He seemed to settle right into our program. He's pretty laid back, so we didn't have any trouble with the transition." C P West and Kong's Revenge both step up in company after taking their Saratoga debuts. The former scored by 2 3/4 lengths Aug. 12, while Kong's Revenge rolled by 6 1/2 lengths Sept. 2.

Lawyer Ron returns to the site where he kicked off what would become a six-racing winning streak. After taking an off-the-turf optional claimer by 10 3/4 lengths Dec. 9 over this surface, the chestnut rattled off his next five outings, capped by the GII Arkansas Derby Apr. 15. He wasn't much of a factor in the GI Kentucky Derby May 6, but exited that 12th-place finish with a chip in his right hind ankle. The chip was removed, and the popular colt resumed his winning ways in the \$250,000 St. Louis Derby Aug. 26 at Fairmount Park. If he keeps it up here, he could find himself heading back to Churchill Downs for another 10-furlong start, this time in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. "We won't make any kind of decision until after the Super Derby," trainer Bob Holthus told Daily Racing Form. "Naturally, he'd have to come off a good race going into the Breeders' Cup. It's going to be an awful tough race this year." Strong Contender, a rousing winner of the GII Dwyer S. July 4 at Belmont, had a bit of a rough trip when third in the GI Haskell Invitational H. Aug. 6 last out. The big chestnut has been training smartly in recent weeks and could be ready to take the next step. Point Determined represents trainer Bob Baffert's first Super Derby starter. A game winner of the GIII Affirmed H. June 17 before settling for second in the GII Swaps Breeders' Cup S. July 8, the Maryland-bred tried the turf in the GII Del Mar Derby Sept. 3, but that experiment was a disaster. The bay struggled over the ground and wound up last of nine. The lightly raced local Louisborg could do himself proud. A debut winner June 10 over this strip, the grey ran fourth in Lone Star's Alysheba Breeders' Cup S. July 1, but rebounded with a pair of wins in Louisiana, an allowance at Evangeline Aug. 11 and the Prelude S. at Louisiana Downs Sept. 1.

# FROM THE DESK OF...

#### **MILESTONES**

Keeneland September 2006 surpassed last year's record by close of business (Book 5) Thursday, by which time 2,601 yearlings had sold for a new-record \$385,707,000--with four days and over 1,500 horses left to go. Last year's last four days grossed \$13,062,000, but there are 124 more horses catalogued in the last two books this year, of which 107 more are in the final day. It's ironic, really, in a very small way: there were 48 fewer listed sales in Book 1 this year, and there are 124 more horses catalogued in Book 7 than there were in 2005. On a minute scale, it illustrates the continuing shift in numbers from the top to the bottom; you see the same thing on the racetracks when there are five-horse fields in stakes races.

Though I may be in a small minority who care about such things, those extra 107 yearlings on the final day could actually make the difference that will push the 2006 Keeneland September Sale over the top, and make it the world's first \$400-million horse sale. The last two books need to gross just under \$14.3-million to accomplish that, which would be a 10-percent increase over the corresponding 2005 gross. My projections say it could be within \$25,000 either way, so if you're within the sound of my voice and you still have any excuse to buy a yearling this weekend, get yourself back over to Keeneland and do what you can to ensure the sale doesn't end up with a gross of something like \$399,900,000--it's just so much easier to say \$400 million.

That particular drama probably won't be resolved until the final day, which also happens to be the day before Europe's next major yearling sale, Goffs' reconstituted Million sale, gets underway. By all accounts, last Tuesday's big racing day with the two 'Million' races (both won by fillies) was very well attended and a big success.

Goffs faces a huge task in trying to improve on a 50-percent jump in 2005 from 2004, but Irish property prices and a corollary enthusiasm for buying racehorses seem to be continuing unabated at record levels. Their first three days last year grossed over  $\in$ 51-million, and averaged tantalizingly close ( $\in$ 99,455) to  $\in$ 100,000, so, notwithstanding last year's accomplishments, expectations are still high.

But let's return to Keeneland's prospective \$399.9-million, or \$400-million sale, just to review for a moment this year's first-crop yearling sires. The three 'Book 1' sires (formerly known as 'summer sale' sires) all averaged between \$290,000-\$390,000 through yesterday. Through yesterday, Mineshaft had 33 sell of 41 offered (80 percent), and ranked number three 'first foals 2005' sire in average, at \$292,415. Since this (including all *Insta*-tistics yearlings, not just Keeneland September) is more than double the average of number four Sky Mesa, the fact is that whether Mineshaft finished slightly over or under \$300,000 in average is immaterial: this year's commercial big three are miles ahead of their contemporaries.


Empire Maker is the 'first foals 2005' crop leader on average, with 31 sold of 41 offered (76 percent), for an average of \$386,516. Interestingly, he and Mineshaft had very similar numbers offered and sold: 31/41 for Empire Maker, 33/41 for Mineshaft. The other 'Book 1' sire is Vindication, who had exactly double the number offered (82) and sold (62) as Empire Maker, so he has the same 76-percent clearance rate. The 62 sold through Book 5 had averaged \$348,645, though he also has one more catalogued, the fourth horse in the book for today's session, a filly out of millionaire earner J J's Dream (hip 4061). But what a commercial performance: Empire Maker and Mineshaft are impressive enough, but for Vindication to basically equal their clearance rates and averages with 82 offered and 62 sold--it's a stellar commercial performance. (Editor's Note: Hill 'n' Dale announced yesterday that Vindication's stud fee would remain \$60,000 for 2007).

Sky Mesa, like Vindication, is a Seattle Slew-line stallion who successfully sustained a massive number selling: 65 offered, 54 sold (83 percent), for an average of \$133,574. He's finished for the sale, as his one Book 6 yearling has been scratched. Vindication is by Seattle Slew himself, and there are many who are hoping he will become Seattle Slew's second top sire son, after A.P. Indy, who is, of course, the sire of group number three, Mineshaft. Sky Mesa, the second highest-rated two-year-old of his year, behind Vindication, is by A.P. Indy's son Pulpit, so the Seattle Slew line occupies three of the top five places, commercially, among this group.

Empire Maker is Unbridled's last top son at stud, and Aldebaran, who I think will finish as the group's number five sire on average, as projected, will be about the last top son of the great Mr. Prospector to have runners, next year. He also finished the sale with 76-percent sold (34 of 45), and did, as expected, top the six-figure average mark, his 34 sold averaging \$106,076. At the end of Book 5 there were still two other first-year sires ahead of him, but they both have significant representation in the last two books, and are sure to fall below the \$100,000 mark in average. Nonetheless, Whywhywhy (\$119,138) and Harlan's Holiday (\$109,208), as well as Posse (\$98,524), all registered commercial performances which were beyond expectations; even if they got the huge 'first-crop sire' boost, their numbers indicate they must also be siring good individuals. Harlan's Holiday, a triple Grade I winner of over \$3.6 million, figures in the Vindication-Sky Mesa group in terms of quantity, with 48 sold of 64 offered (75 percent), through the end of Book 5. But with another seven catalogued in the last two books, he is more likely to finish up with an average just under \$100,000 than just over.

Two others who clearly impressed the 'judges' were Whywhywhy, who had 16 sold of 18 offered (88 percent), and Posse, with 21 sold of 28 offered (75 percent); Whywhywhy has nine catalogued in the last two books, Posse 12, so it is extremely unlikely that either could finish up averaging six figures. But their commercial performances through Book 5 were both impressive, considering they stood last year for \$7,500 and \$10,000, respectively. Whywhywhy, who won the GI Futurity in 2002, represents the burgeoning Gone West branch of Mr. Prospector through his sire, Mr. Greeley, already sire of last year's number two freshman sire, El Corredor; Posse was a triple graded-winning sprinter at two and three from the same crop (also Vindication and Sky Mesa's crop), and is by Silver Deputy out of a Rahy mare. Actually, another from that crop of 2002 twoyear-olds, Kafwain, was averaging almost \$100,000 through Book 4, so they obviously looked the part as well.

SMUGGLER RETIRED Champion Smuggler (Unbridled--Inside Information, by Private Account), recipient of the 2005 Eclipse Award as the nation's top three-year-old filly, has been retired with a cannon bone problem, according to Daily Racing Form. She will be bred in 2007 to Awesome Again. A daughter of champions and Breeders' Cup winners Unbridled and Inside Information, the Phipps Stable homebred captured the GI Mother Goose S. and GI Coaching Club American Oaks in 2005, but was sidelined thereafter with a persistent fever. Smuggler made three starts this year, finishing third in what would be her career finale, the GII Shuvee H. at Belmont May 21. Trainer Shug McGaughey told DRF that the four-year-old sustained a bruising in a hind cannon bone and would not be able to heal in time for the big autumn races. "I wish we could've done a little more this year," McGaughey told DRF. "I'm disappointed to see she's gone. We never got see the best of her."

# DEADLINE TO OFFER CHOICE FOR NEW YORK TRACK OPERATOR WILL NOT BE MET



Next week's deadline by a New York state panel to offer its non-binding choice for a new operator of the state's three major Thoroughbred racetracks will not be met, the chairman of the committee said. "After spending several weeks evaluating the materials from the four bidders who submitted proposals for the state's racing franchise, the Ad Hoc Committee on the Future of Racing has unanimously agreed that a thorough and reasoned deliberation can not occur within its initial, self-imposed deadline and must be adjusted,"' J. Patrick Barrett, the committee's chairman said in a written statement after the panel met in Manhattan Sept. 22. A new deadline was not selected to replace the Sept. 29 deadline the committee hard earlier said it could meet. The Blood-Horse recently reported the panel was eyeing the delay because, in part, permission had not yet been approved for the committee to hire an outside auditing firm to go through the complicated financial offerings by four bidders vying for the lucrative franchise. The delay came one day after New York Attorney General Eliot Spitzer raised concerns about the bidding package for the state's Thoroughbred franchise, while saying a decision to reward the rights to run Aqueduct, Belmont, and Saratoga racetracks could still be properly made this year before Gov. George Pataki leaves office Dec. 31.


