Topping the session and the sale overall at €2 million was hip 627, a sister to this year's G1 Epsom Derby runner-up Dragon Dancer (GB). Despite her obvious potential for the track, the May-foaled

daughter of Sadler's Wells consigned by Kirsten Rausing's Staffordstown Stud has significant residual value as a broodmare prospect. Her third dam is the outstanding Alruccaba (Ire), who has established a dynasty of topclass performers in a short space of time. Among her progeny is the 1996 G2 Nassau S. and G2 Sun Chariot

S. winner Last Second (Ire), who is the dam of this vear's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) winner Aussie Rules and the 2001 G3 Doncaster Cup scorer Alleluia (GB), who has produced the G2 Lancashire Oaks winner and G1 Yorkshire Oaks third Allegretto (Ire). 1 heroine Albanova (GB) and Jude (GB), whose progeny include Ballydoyle's top-class fillies Quarter Moon (Ire) and Yesterday (Ire). Earlier in the afternoon, the ongoing influence of Sadler's Wells was keenly felt when hip $\underline{591}$, a daughter of Pat O'Kelly's excellent producer Welsh Love (Ire) was sold for $\underline{\in} 1.3$ million. Kilcarn Stud is accustomed to realizing million-plus sums at the old-style Orby--this

revealed that the filly was heading back to Kilcarn. "She has been bought for Miss O'Kelly," he explained. "She was a foal-share with Coolmore and is a lovely filly, so she wanted to buy out her partners and keep the family." Kilcarn was also responsible for the same family's hip 518, the joint-highest priced colt of the session bought by Shadwell. By King's Best, the half to this year's dual group scorer Echo of Light (GB), who also topped the sale at €1.2-million three years ago, is out of a sibling of Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's past luminaries Salsabil (GB) and Marju (Ire). Derrinstown Stud's General Manager Stephen Collins paid €600,000 to ensure that the colt would race in the famed blue-and-white, as his close relatives Akarem (GB) and Multazem have done. "We know the family exceptionally well and this colt stood out," Collins said. "He has a lot of quality about him and we loved him."

A Relentless Pace...

During the frenetic period between the selling of the two toppers, Dermot Weld paid €600,000 for hip 634, a son of Medicean (GB), who is the sire of Nannina (GB) and today's G1 Middle Park S. hopeful Dutch Art (GB). From Denis Brosnan's Croom House Stud, the 105,000gns Tattersalls December weanling acquisition is out of a half to the group scorer Rum Charger (Ire) and Pakhoes (Ire), two runners sent out from Weld's Rosewell House base. That transaction came hot on heels of bloodstock agent Gill Richardson's €550,000 purchase of a filly by Galileo (Ire). As it was on the first two days, demand for the Coolmore stallion's progeny was strong. Hip 631 is from the immediate family of this year's G2 Hardwicke S. winner Maraahel (Ire). Consigned by Abbeville and Meadow Court Studs, she is also from the family of the talented Shadwell performers Muhbubh, Sayedah (Ire) and Istintaj.

Other Notables...

Early in the session, first-season trainer David Myerscough went to €380,000 to secure hip 457, a Green Desert close relative to the 1997 G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 Irish Derby winner and sire Desert King (Ire). The Irish National Stud's offering is also a halfsister to last year's G3 Mooresbridge S. winner Cairdeas (Ire) from the family of the 1994 G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. winner Maroof. "I've bought her for Frank O'Malley, who has a nice two-year-old with me called Isola Star," the trainer's son Philip Myerscough commented. "She has a great pedigree and is an individual to match. She looks a strong filly and a two-year-old type and hopefully she'll be one for the Million." Another to grab a slice of the Sadler's Wells action was Glenview House Stud, which paid €355,000 for a daughter of the 1998 G1 Irish 1000 Guineas winner Tarascon (Ire). From the draft of Thomastown Castle, hip 546 is from the immediate family of the ill-fated 2004 G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano winner Mister Monet (Ire) and Mala Mala (Ire), who was third in the G1 Cheveley Park S. six years ago. Danehill Dancer (Ire) has produced healthy returns again. His colt consigned as hip 497 by Paul Shanahan's Ashtown House Stud was knocked down to Charlie Gordon-Watson for €350,000. He is closely related to the 2000 G3 Queen Mary S. runner-up Al Ihsas (Ire) and the useful sophomore Anna Karenina (Ire). "I had an order to buy a Danehill Dancer and he looked the best of them," Shanahan explained. "He'll stay in Ireland." Michael Morrin's Pier House Stud provided another highlight in hip 525, a Mr. Greeley filly who was snapped up by Peter Doyle for €340,000 on behalf of Plantation Stud. Dermot O'Rourke's establishment will race the halfsister to the stakes winner Limelighting from the family of Sky Classic. "She's a gorgeous filly, with a broodmare's pedigree and has been bought for Plantation," Doyle said. "She is by one of the top sires of our time of both colts and fillies and will go into training with Mick Halford."

Success at the Top...

Goffs Managing Director Matt Mitchell heralded a highly successful sale, which returned a near 17-percent increase in average on 12 months ago and a rise in the median from €65,000 to €70,000. Despite these figures, Mitchell admitted that the market had been "selective" and that horses had to have all the ingredients to satisfy the criteria for buyers. "We are very happy with the sale and the increases on top of the huge increases last year," Mitchell said. "The real key is the median, which is also up by nearly eight percent and the races, which underpinned the sale and saw this year's winners reinvesting. A feature of the sale was a demand for fillies and the increase in quality has driven breeders to invest in pedigrees. The top end of the market is very healthy, but the market is selective and animals that don't have the conformation and pedigree are punished. There was a very good cross-section of buyers, with buyers from Japan, which was encouraging and we hope to build on that--there was also a Russian presence for the first time. The progression of the Million Sale should be seen in the context of three years and the trends shown this week, building on the success of the inaugural Million in 2005, are very positive." Showing his versatility when capturing the June 20 G2 Coventry S. on Royal Ascot's faster surface, he was subsequently runner-up to Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) in the Aug. 13 G1 Phoenix S. at The Curragh, with the subsequent G1 Moyglare Stud S. scorer Miss Beatrix (Ire) behind. "I couldn't be more pleased with him and he's going to Newmarket in good order," trainer Bryan Smart commented. "I'm hoping for a big run in what looks to be a very competitive race. I was obviously a bit disappointed he got beat last time but, if anything, I think my horse was a little bit free that day and the form is solid. The horse has done it on all sorts of ground, so I wouldn't be concerned on that score." Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's Conquest (Ire) represents the form of York's G2 Gimcrack S., which recent winners Balmont and Amadeus Wolf (GB) collected en route. His 3/4-of-a-length defeat of the subsequent G2 Flying Childers S. winner Wi Dud (GB) was an improvement on his previous form and the syndicate's Manager Harry Herbert is hoping the forward progression continues. "Physically, he has improved throughout the year," Herbert told PA Sport. "He's not a small two-year-old, he's a really imposing horse with plenty of size and scope. We are very hopeful, it is a hot race but this is the sort of race he should be running in." Sander Camillo burst onto the scene with a comfortable 1 1/2-length defeat of the subsequent G2 Lowther S. scorer Silk Blossom (Ire) and Nicholas Jones' Scarlet Runner (GB) in the June 23 Albany at Royal Ascot. She was even more impressive when registering a fivelength success in the Cherry Hinton on the July Course here when last seen July 12. Following her third at the Royal meeting, Scarlet Runner went on to beat Setsquare Recruitment's Vital Statistics (GB) and the eventual G1 Fillies' Mile winner Simply Perfect (GB) in the G3 Princess Margaret S. back at Ascot July 29. She disappointed on York's rain-softened ground when only fifth in the Lowther last time Aug. 24, but jockey Kerrin McEvoy is hoping she can bounce back. "We didn't get any luck in running at York and she didn't finish like she can," he explained. "She is a nice filly and I'm looking for a big run from her at the weekend, but we have Sander Camillo to beat. If we get some nice ground, I'll be disappointed if she doesn't run in the top three." Trainer Mick Channon has won two renewals courtesy of Seazun (Ire) in 1999 and Queen's Logic (Ire) five years ago and saddles Aldridge Racing Partnership's Silca Chiave (GB). She was denied by a short head by Miss Beatrix (Ire) when runner-up in the Aug. 27 G1 Moyglare Stud S. at The Curragh, having opened her account at Newbury nine days previously. The homebred bids to better the eighth placing of her halfsister Golden Silca (GB) in 1998. "We always thought Silca Chiave was a good filly--it was just a question of which route we went with her," her trainer said. "I thought it was worth having a cut at the Moyglare and she only got beat by a short-head. I'm not at all worried about the drop down in trip in the Cheveley Park S.--six or seven furlongs come the same to her. It won't be easy, but I'm very hopeful and I think she goes there with a good chance." Criquette Head-Maarek captured this race with Ma Biche in 1982, Ravinella in 1987 and Pas de Reponse in 1996 and lines up Tony Ryan's Magic America. She comes here off a second in the Aug. 20 G1 Prix Morny at Deauville, where she split Dutch Art (GB) and the subsequent G2 Mill Reef S. winner Excellent Art (GB). "She's not a bad filly and is very well," the trainer told the Racing Post. "She ran very well in the Morny, in which she was beaten by two good colts and the form looks good after the third won a Group race."

ICON ADDITION MAKES EIGHT FOR ARC

Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Lucien Barriere at Longchamp will witness the smallest field since 1941 after only eight were declared yesterday. As expected, Paul and Susan Roy's Sixties Icon (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) was supplemented at a cost of €60,000. Trainer Jeremy Noseda paid the fee to add the Sept. 9 G1 St Leger winner to the mix and is realistic about the colt's chances. "We know we face a tough task taking on Andre Fabre's pair, plus the Japanese raider Deep Impact--three great horses," Noseda told The Sportsman, "However, the owners are keen for Sixties Icon to run and as the horse has come out of York so well we have decided to roll the dice. The bookies probably have it right by making us 12-1 or 14-1, but we have nothing to lose and we will give it our best shot." Fabre accounts for three of the field: Michael Tabor's Hurricane Run (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), Baron Georg von Ullmann's Shirocco (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) and Khalid Abdullah's G1 Grand Prix de Paris winner Rail Link (GB) (Dansili {GB}). Makoto Kaneko's Deep Impact (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) represents Japan. Alain de Royer-Dupre will saddle N P Bloodstock's Pride (Fr) (Peintre Celebre), while Paul Vidal's Best Name (GB) (King's Best), from the Robert Collet yard, and Berend van Dalfsen's Irish Wells (Fr) (Poliglote {GB}), trained by Francois Rohaut, complete the runners. Geoff Wragg scratched John Pearce's Dragon Dancer (GB) (Sadler's Wells), while Aidan O'Brien withdrew Susan Magnier's duo of Dylan Thomas (Ire) (Danehill) and Alexandrova (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Jean-Claude Rouget took out Nelson Radwan's Germance (Silver Hawk), before revealing that the G1 Prix Saint-Alary winner would be aimed at the Oct. 14 GI Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Keeneland.

OUIJA WAITS Lord Derby's Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross (Ire) will sidestep Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Opera at Longchamp after connections decided against sending the five-year-old overseas. Trainer Ed Dunlop revealed that the multiple Group 1 winner will be aimed at the Oct. 14 G1 Emirates Airline Champion S. at Newmarket before another tilt at the Nov. 4 GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf at Churchill Downs. "Having assessed the ground at Longchamp, it is still on the slightly soft side of good, which is not totally ideal for her," Dunlop said yesterday. "It was one journey she didn't need to do, as she's going to go to America and then Hong Kong. We thought it would be better if she ran here in the Champion S., but if it was very soft I'm sure we'd miss it, with only three weeks to the Breeders' Cup. It's under very serious consideration and as long as we feel everything is right for her, we will most probably have a tilt at that. The main target is the Breeders' Cup as long as the ground is right and Louisville is very wet at the moment. It does drain quickly, but if it was very soft she may not go there and the G1 Japan Cup [in Tokyo Nov. 26] is an option for that reason."

YEATS SET FOR FLEMINGTON Connections of Yeats (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) have opted to aim the five-year-old at the Nov. 7 G1 Emirates Melbourne Cup, ending days of speculation in the process. Susan Magnier and Diane Nagle's G1 Ascot Gold Cup and G2 Goodwood Cup winner, who was reportedly stiff after his second in the G1 Irish St Leger at The Curragh Sept. 16, was given the go-ahead by trainer Aidan O'Brien on Wednesday for the Flemington spectacle. "Yeats will go into quarantine at Ballydoyle this Friday for two weeks and the plan is to travel to Australia as long as everything is okay with the horse," O'Brien told the Racing Post. "When he gets to Australia he will spend two weeks in quarantine, so hopefully it all will work out."

SILENT NAME TO ADENA SPRINGS Silent Name (Jpn) (Sunday Silence--Danzigaway, by Danehill), winner of this year's GII Arcadia H. at Santa Anita, will enter stud in 2007 at Frank Stronach's Adena Springs near Versailles, Kentucky. The four-year-old will remain under the care of trainer Gary Mandella for the duration of his racing career. "He's got a few racing options, so it is in the trainer's hands right now as far as which way we go," Jack Brothers, director of breeding operations for Adena Springs, told the Blood-Horse. "He's a great miler and he fits our program to a tee." Bred in Japan by the Wertheimer Brothers, who sold an interest in the colt to Stronach following his Arcadia success, the bay spent his first two years in France, winning a pair of Listed stakes and placing third in the G3 Prix du Pin. An allowance winner prior to taking the Arcadia Apr. 8, Silent Name has finished third to Aragorn (Ire) in the GI Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile May 29 and the GI Eddie Read H. July 23.

The renaissance of Churchill Downs, from a single track facing hard times, to a thriving company that owns five additional racetracks, may have been a team effort, but the team was captained by Churchill Downs Incorporated President and Chief Executive Officer Thomas H. Meeker. Meeker, who was named Churchill's president in 1984, has been the man behind one of racing's greatest success stories. Meeker is widely recognized as one of the most influential individuals in the history of Churchill Downs; second, perhaps behind only Col. Matt Winn. He served three tours of duty in Vietnam


and left the Marine Corps in 1977 as a lieutenant colo nel. A graduate of the University of Louisville School of Law, where he was No. 1 in his class, he worked for the Louisville law firm of Wyatt, Tarrant & Combs. There, he served as general counsel for Churchill Downs before replacing Lynn Stone as the track's president. In January, Meeker announced that he

would retire at the conclusion of his current contract, which expires in March, 2007. His successor, Robert Evans, has big shoes to fill. Meeker recently sat down with the Thoroughbred Daily News to discuss his reasons for retiring, his future plans and to look back at 22 years at the helm of Churchill Downs.





Q) You are only 63 and would appear to have many good years in front of you. Why did you pick this time in your life to retire?

A) You start off with the basic equation: I've been at this now for 22 years and before that I was associated with the company as outside counsel, so I've been working at this location for a number of years. You look at any company, any organization, and the longevity of the CEO is generally five to eight years or something like that. So I have overstayed my welcome. That is number one. Number two, while I would like to think I have all sorts of skills, there are some skills with which I am not blessed. As I look toward what's going on within our industry, I see some exciting things happening. Those things relate to a larger distribution base of our products and a more generous introduction of technology onto our product mix. These skills do not really resonate in me. We have some people who are good at those things, but we need someone such as a Bob Evans to come in and take a different view of life and to apply his skills in assisting the company as well as the industry at large to exploit new opportunities that are clearly out on the horizon today. His prism is very much different from mine. I looked at that and I looked at my family. I've had a number of jobs all my life,

ranging from the military and then practicing law and the 22 years out here. The way I work is to work 24-7...not literally...but I am devoted to my work and I just thought it was appropriate with two grandchildren sitting out there--who are the love of my life--that I spend more time with them. I don't know what I might do in the future. I'm going to take six months off and kind of think about life and enjoy life a little bit and see what happens.

Q) Is there any particular accomplishment of which you are most proud?

Yes, there is. It's our people. If you look at Churchill Downs the way it was in 1984, we had a loyal and energetic but somewhat demoralized team base at that point. Today, we have a sense of energy, a sense of commitment and an overwhelming acceptance of change that exists among our team that is something that has held us in good stead over the years. More

important, that will allow us to be very nimble and flexible as we move forward in the future. Then you look at what the team has been able to accomplish over the years, taking a monolithic, single track, which was not much, not withstanding the fact that we had the Derby, and taking Churchill Downs and moving it to the front of the racing world. And our team took the Derby and elevated it to a position that is untouched by any other racing event in the world. You see what they

have been able to accomplish over the years and it is pretty impressive. But it all centers on the culture and the team that really represents Churchill Downs today.

Q) What is the one thing you regret the most?

A) Our inability to convince various legislators of the needs of racing as it relates to slots. That's probably the single greatest disappointment.


Q) From so many standpoints, Churchill Downs was not in good shape when you took over. How bad was the situation and were you confident you could turn things around?

A) They had suffered through two years of summer racing that were an abysmal failure. They had lost money for three years in a row. It was financially strained. It was physically strained. All of that was reflected in the attitude of the employees. Did I think it

was going to be a hard job? Yes. Was it going to be easy to do something? The answer is ves because it was so far down that anything you did was going to produce a result. If my memory serves me correctly, after we started in 1984 here at Churchill, we had 14 meets in a row where we increased attendance and handle. That was reflection of a couple of things: one, an attitudinal change among our employees and team Churchill's 2001-2005 \$121 million renovation was one of many members and, two, the introduction of some

> \$35 million. That was the most difficult thing I had to do since I joined the company--to convince the board that they ought to spend \$35 million on an asset that was losing money. It was that commitment from the board that allowed us to add money and leverage the company up a little bit. From there, we started down the road that led us to where we are today.





