Seventh to Dhanyata on debut over six furlongs at Newbury June 10, Indian Ink rebounded to win over that course and distance 17 days later. She was fourth in the July 29 G3 Princess Margaret S. at Ascot next time, then was caught close to home in the G2 Lowther S. at York Aug. 24, but came here off an impressive success in the Watership Down Sud Sales S. a week ago. The chestnut broke smartly to race in a close third before jockey Richard Hughes gave her the cue inside the final quarter mile. Emerging out of the dip with only Dhanyata in front of her, Indian Ink knuckled down to a scrap with that old foe and prevailed in a bobbing climax, as G1 Moyglare Stud S. runner up Silca Chiave fared best of the remainder. "She is very tough, but I felt I gave the Lowther away by kicking too early and she died on me inside the last 50 yards," reflected the winning rider. "They kicked about two furlongs out going into the dip [here] and I let them lead me down there. She only has a dash of about 100 yards, so I was worried she wouldn't get home, but once she met the rising ground she was good." "Something got to him at York last time, whether it was a bee sting or not I don't know, but he got worried, sweated up and needed a blindfold to go in the stalls," explained Richard Hughes, who secured a group race double aboard Indian Ink (Ire) 30 minutes later. He added, "Today was totally different. He jumped fine, got cover and he was so much easier to ride. He must be 17 hands and is still a little weak so all he can do is improve." The Arindel Farm filly was 4 1/2 lengths the best that afternoon, and added a 4 3/4-length tally in the GII Lake Placid H. at Saratoga Aug. 18. She takes on her elders for the first time, including fellow speedsters Live Life, third in the GI Beverly D. S. last out; and Dancing Edie, who bested Moscow Burning by a nose after setting a leisurely pace in her latest, the July 22 GI John C. Mabee H. at Del Mar. "I was impressed that she gutted out that win," trainer Craig Dollase told Daily Racing Form. "We'd like to be on a lazy lead again, but I don't think that will happen."

Since the Sun Chariot was opened up to older distaffers in 1974, sophomores have enjoyed the majority of success, and Peeress was only the fourth older filly to emerge victorious when she scored last year. She takes on Terry Neill's three-year-old Red Evie, who has a perfect seasonal record to defend after holding off her older rival when stretched to seven furlongs in the G1 Matron S. That was a steep rise in class for the filly, who won the Listed Sandringham S. at Royal Ascot and G3 Oak Tree S. at Goodwood Aug. 4. "I think there is still more room for improvement--you'd like to think there is," jockey Jamie Spencer told PA Sport. "She gave me a fabulous feel in Ireland; she is a really nice filly." The Elite Racing Club's multiple Group 1 heroine Soviet Song looked in for another profitable year when taking the G2 Windsor Forest S. at Royal Ascot and was beaten as much by the slow pace as the opposition when sixth in the July 12 G1 Falmouth S. Runner-up in the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood Aug. 2, she put in a rare flat effort when fifth in the G2 Celebration Mile Aug. 27. "She's working well enough to run and see how we get on," Elite's Racing Manager Matthew Budden told PA Sport. "We'll take it a race at a time. If she [doesn't] run well, I suppose we'd have to think about retiring her." Noel and Miriam O'Callaghan's Alexander Goldrun looks for her sixth Group 1 victory, but her first at this trip. She has lost nothing of her old sparkle judged on her short-head second to Ouija Board (GB) in Goodwood's Aug. 2 G1 Nassau S. and her third behind Dylan Thomas (Ire) and that rival in the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown Sept. 9.

Marchand d'Or chases his second straight win at the highest level, having made a mockery of a competitive line-up assembled for Deauville's G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest Aug. 6. He has come a long way since finishing runner-up to Stormy River in the Listed Prix Djebel at Maisons-Laffitte Apr. 4, demonstrating raw speed over course and distance when taking the May 18 Listed Prix du Pont-Neuf and June 26 G3 Prix de la Porte Maillot. After a sixth in the G3 Prix de Ris-Orangis at Maisons-Laffitte July 15, hold-up tactics were adopted to maximum effect at Deauville, and he has the vital weapon of natural speed to employ. Stormy River followed his listed tally with a win in the G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly July 9, and finished runner-up in both the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot and G1 Prix du Moulin here Sept. 3. Godolphin's Caradak, who was second in this last year when trained by John Oxx, returns after defeating Killybegs (Ire) and George Washington (Ire) in the G2 Celebration Mile Aug. 27. That run came only eight days after a third behind Welsh Emperor in the G2 Hungerford S. at a rain-soaked Newbury, and he needs dry weather here. "Caradak came back very well after his last race and is working well," trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented. John Gosden puts forward Sleeping Indian. He carved out a niche as a specialist at this trip in 2005 when winning the G3 Hungerford S. and finishing a short-head second to Iffraaj (GB) in the G2 Park S. at Doncaster. He was having his first outing since a second in the G2 Challenge S. at Newmarket in October when taking the Sept. 15 Listed Dubai Duty Free Cup at Newbury.





Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe

After his Arc success on that rain-soaked day 12 months ago, Michael Tabor watched Hurricane Run (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) bask in Ascot's sunshine when winning the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. July 29, and he is hoping that tomorrow's spectacle proves the colt's crowning glory. "I'd be very hopeful, because I think he is a very special horse and, knowing Andre [Fabre] and the trainer he is, he will have him prepared on the day," Tabor commented. "It's a real race, very exciting, and it's a special time of the year." Fabre has a record which is second to none here, having saddled six Arc winners to date. He also has Baron Georg von Ullmann's Shirocco (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) and Khalid Abdullah's sophomore Rail Link (GB) (Dansili {GB}) to call upon Sunday. Fourth last year, Shirocco has been unbeatable since, taking Belmont's GI Breeders' Cup Turf, Epsom's G1 Coronation Cup and the Sept. 10 G2 Prix Foy over course and distance, where he had Hurricane Run back in second. For his connections, the securing of jockey Christophe Soumillon is key to the five-year-old's prospects. "Christophe has become such an important part of this horse's life, and we are very happy that he is free to ride Shirocco," the owner's Racing Manager Paul Harley told PA Sport. "He knows the horse extremely well and will now what to expect on the day." Makoto Kaneko's champion Deep Impact (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), beaten just once in 11 starts, makes in first start outside his native country. N P Bloodstock's six-year-old **Pride (Fr)** (Peintre Celebre) bids to become the first of her sex to win this since Urban Sea in 1993. The chestnut bested Hurricane Run in the June 25 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud before taking the eye when tenderly ridden to be third in the Prix Foy. "The ground was possibly too firm for her in the Foy and, when it's like that, she doesn't give her maximum," trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre commented. "From the beginning of the season, it was the plan to go for the Arc, and she's fresh, ready and is in good condition."



Hearing on ClassicStar Sale Horses Set:

A hearing on motions that may halt the sale of certain horses affiliated with the controversial ClassicStar mare lease program at the Fasig-Tipton November select mixed sale Nov. 5 will be heard Oct. 3 in a Lexington courtroom. Lawyers for a trio of plaintiffs who this past July filed a civil action against ClassicStar have asked for temporary restraining orders in the U.S. District Court's Eastern District. One motion asks for an expedited discovery period and protective order based, in part, on ClassicStar's intention "to liquidate its remaining equine assets at the upcoming Fasig-Tipton sales on Nov. 5, 2006." The plaintiffs claim they were bilked out of at least \$20 million in ClassicStar programs that touted valuable foals produced from leased mares bred to prominent stallions. The motions also request that ClassicStar "shall not transfer or encumber any foals that resulted from pairings purchased by plaintiffs," and seeks assurance that "defendants do not inadvertently or purposely destroy electronic or paper records relevant to this litigation..."



RICHEBOURG, PENCARROW FOUNDATION

MARE, DIES Richebourg (NZ) (Vice Regal {NZ}--Mary Mead {NZ}, by Wilkes {Fr}), a Group 3 winner who became a foundation mare for Pencarrow Stud, died last Monday at the Hamilton, New Zealand nursery. She was 26. Acquired for NZ\$65,000 at the 1982 National Yearling Sales by the Vela family, the dark bay won five races, including Australia's G3 Tranquil Star S. Her first foal, the winning *Sir Tristram colt Sir Rhine (NZ), finished fourth in the 1989 G1 WATC Australian Derby. Two years later she produced that colt's full sister Romanee Conti (NZ), a two-time New Zealand highweight who captured group events in that country as well as Australia and Hong Kong. Romanee Conti achieved fame as the dam of champion Ethereal (NZ) (Rhythm), whose four Group 1 wins came in the Melbourne and Caulfield Cups, the BMW S. and Queensland Oaks. Richebourg's 1996 filly Grand Echezeaux (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) captured the G1 Australasian Oaks and became the dam of Darci Brahma (NZ) (Danehill), the NZ\$1.1-million topper at the 2004 Karaka sale. He later became New Zealand's champion two-year-old and a multiple Group 1 winner. Grand Echezeaux's Stravinsky colt topped the 2006 Karaka sale at NZ\$2.2 million; she remains part of Pencarrow's broodmare band, along with her relations Romanee Conti and Ethereal. "[Richebourg] did so much for Pencarrow Stud," said the stud's general manager, Leon Casey. "She will be buried in a special area on the stud." For more information, go to www.pencarrowstud.co.nz.

2005 KARAKA TOPPER TAKES DEBUT

Enchanteress (NZ) (Danehill), the Pencarrow graduate who topped the 2005 Karaka sale at NZ\$1.3 million, captured her debut at South Australia's Balaklava racecourse Wednesday.
