History will be rewritten today if Makoto Kaneko's Deep Impact (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) can conquer the G1



Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Lucien Barriere at Longchamp, Had El Condor Pasa not encountered Montjeu (Ire) seven years ago, Japan would already be counting a landmark success in Europe's premier test. Now it is up to that country's most revered equine Deep Impact Japan Racing photo deity to feed a nation's desire, and his trainer Yasuo Ikee is

building the expectation, "I compare my feelings about him now to that of Miyamoto Musashi, one of the greatest Japanese swordsmen, who lived in the 17th century," he said. "We don't need to sharpen this great sword any more. I just put it back in the sheath and wait for the raceday, so that he will be able to run the race of his life. I want to go home with the best possible result." Deep Impact's reign was built on completing last year's Triple Crown, and he's been unstoppable this season as well, with sensational wins at Kyoto in the Apr. 30 G1 Tenno Sho Spring and G1 Takarazuka Kinen on his last start June 25. Most came on a firm surface, so the question remains of how he will handle yielding ground in Paris. Ikee is unconcerned. "Since arriving here, he's been training for almost two hours everyday on the sand course, which is deeper than that of Japan," he added. "We are ready for the race." Cont. p2

GENERATION CLASH With fellow elders Hurricane Run, Shirocco and Pride stacking up against the sophomore challenge, the odds appear against that category. However, three-year-olds have dominated recently, accounting for their elders on 12 occasions since 1990. Of those, nine had either won or placed in the courseand-distance G2 Prix Niel; this year's winner Rail Link (GB) (Dansili {GB}) fits the bill. Successful in the July 14 G1 Grand Prix de Paris, the Khalid Abdullah homebred enjoyed the typical mid-summer break before returning to take that prep Sept. 10. "It's a very highclass Arc, but Rail Link is in very good form," the owner-breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe said yesterday. "This is going to be a huge test for him, not least because of his two stable mates, but we're hopeful the ground is going to be nice for him as he's a good-striding horse. I think there will be an honest gallop, as most of them want a mile and a half."

Of the remaining three-year-olds, Paul and Susan Roy's Sixties Icon has been supplemented as a result of his highly impressive success in the G1 St Leger at York Sept. 9. Despite the ease of that win, history is against him as no winner of that Classic has triumphed here in the same year, even though Nijinsky, Sun Princess (GB) and User Friendly (GB) found only one better when attempting the double. "It's a fantastic race and I'm as excited as anyone else," commented jockey Frankie Dettori, looking for his fourth Arc. "I wouldn't be surprised if Shirocco goes to the front, but my horse is very straightforward and I'll have a chat with Paul [Roy] and [trainer] Jeremy [Noseda] on the day and we'll work something out." Paul Vidal's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club runner-up **Best Name** warmed up for his tilt at this contest with a win in the G3 Prix du Prince d'Orange here Sept. 17 and bids to emulate Saumarez (GB), who in 1990 was the last to win that en route to Arc success.



Unbeaten on turf, Wait a While continued her domination of the U.S. scene by winning the Yellow Ribbon and will now head to Churchill as a leading contender for the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf Nov. 4. The Tin Man lulled his rivals to sleep in the Aug. 12 GI Arlington Million before kicking on for home. That victory was his third in four starts this year at age eight, and the popular gelding was bet down to 1-2 for his return to Santa Anita. The bay set out in front with T.H. Approval on his tail, setting a modest pace of :25.06, :49.87 and 1:13.76. As The Tin Man quickened turning for home, his rival took a bit longer to hit his best stride, but the favorite dug in gamely to record his ninth victory in 14 starts over this course. It may be time for him to hit the road again, though. The Tin Man has participated twice in the Breeders' Cup, finishing fourth in the GI Turf twice, in 2002 at Arlington and the following year at Santa Anita. Will he be there at Churchill Nov. 4? "That would be the plan," answered winning trainer Richard Mandella, "as long as he comes out good and continues as well as he's been, we'll just keep going." 

Denied a short head by Court Masterpiece (GB) last year, Caradak returned to go one better for team Godolphin and justify his purchase from His Highness the Aga Khan's ranks. Since it was renamed and moved to this day, he has collected four of the last five renewals courtesy of Rock of Gibraltar (Ire), Hold That Tiger, Oratorio (Ire) and Horatio Nelson (Ire). He saddles the impressive Aug. 13 G1 Phoenix S. winner Holy Roman Emperor, who was runner-up to Teofilo (Ire) in the G1 National S. at The Curragh last time Sept. 17; and Trinity College. After a winning debut at Cork Aug. 7, that colt was fourth behind Teofilo in the G2 Futurity S. at The Curragh 19 days later. Jean-Claude Rouget has yet to win this prize and puts forward the unbeaten Battle Paint, who could not have been more impressive when winning on debut at Deauville Aug. 8 and over course and distance Sept. 7. Vital Equine is also unbeaten, having taken the G2 Champagne S. at York on his latest start Sept. 9.

Despite the withdrawal of Ouija Board (GB) and Alexander Goldrun (Ire), this race is almost as keenly anticipated as the Arc itself, with Alexandrova and Mandesha squaring up alsongide the G1 Oaks d'Italia heroine Dionisia, G1 Coronation S. scorer Nannina and South African champion Irridescence. Alexandrova has been a sensation this season, completing the notable treble of June 2 G1 Epsom Oaks, July 16 G1 Irish Oaks and Aug. 23 G1 Yorkshire Oaks. With each run, she appears to have become stronger and the ease with which she won at York last time is rarely seen at this level. Mandesha would not have been out of place in today's main event, which connections sidestepped due to the prospect of easy ground. She handled those conditions when dropped to a mile for the July 30 G1 Prix d'Astarte at Deauville, but looked more at home on a livelier surface when annexing the G1 Prix Vermeille over a mile and a half Sept. 10. Dionisia proved a revelation for her trainer Riccardo Menichetti, winning five stakes races as a juvenile, including the G1 Gran Criterium in Milan in October and two more prior to her Oaks romp at the San Siro June 18. Now with Luca Cumani, she will make certain it is not a two-horse war, as will the Apr. 23 G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup heroine Irridescence, who warmed up for this with a fifth in the G1 Prix du Moulin last time Sept. 3.



(Candy Stripes) had been slated to take on star sophomore Bernardini in the Oct. 7 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont, but that confrontation may be put off until the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Nov. 4 at Churchill. The four-year-old spiked a fever Thursday afternoon at Belmont and has missed two days of training. "He had a 103 temperature Thursday," trainer Kiaran McLaughlin explained. "We pulled blood and his white count was elevated. We treated him, walked him [Friday], took more blood and that blood came back perfect." The bay was supposed to have his final work for the Gold Cup vesterday, but stayed at the barn instead. "We were really looking forward to facing Bernardini and it would have been a great race," McLaughlin added. If the Argentine-bred indeed heads to Churchill for the \$5million Classic, he would have to be supplemented for \$750,000.

COMMENTATOR STRAIGHT TO SPRINT Grade I winner Commentator (Distorted Humor) will make his next start Nov. 4 in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, according to Daily Racing Form. A facile winner of the Mugatea S. for New York-breds in his belated seasonal bow July 12, the chestnut had a rough time of it as the 4-5 chalk in the GI Forego S. Sept. 2 at Saratoga and wound up 10th. "That was a rough race he ran in," trainer Nick Zito told DRF. Zito added, "He jammed a shoulder a few days after the race. He's been training like a bear now." Zito said that the Tracy Farmer colorbearer has been shipped to Kentucky to prepare for the Sprint.

SHOWING UP IN THE MILE Lael Stables' Showing Up (Strategic Mission) will likely have the \$2-million GI Mile as his Breeders' Cup objective, according to Daily Racing Form. The three-year-old, winner of the 10-furlong GI Secretariat S., lost his unbeaten turf record when a close third to Cacique (Ire) in the 11-furlong GI Man o' War S. Sept. 10. Trainer Barclay Tagg indicated that the chestnut would be pre-entered in both the Mile and the \$3-million Turf. "The Turf is not going to be easy and it's a mile and a half," Tagg explained to DRF. "Although I think he can handle the distance, I don't know if he can handle it against the Caciques and the Europeans of the world. I think he'd run good in either one." Showing Up will not start again until the Breeders' Cup.

Among changes for 2007, the GII Swale S. has been shortened to 6 1/2 furlongs and the GIII Holy Bull S. and GII Davona Dale S. will both be cut back to a mile. Also, the Swale was moved up in the schedule to join the Holy Bull on the Feb. 3 card, which also features the GI Donn H. Taking the place of the Swale on the Florida Derby undercard is the seven-furlong Aventura S. for three-year-olds on the dirt. "After listening to the horsemen, Frank Stronach [chairman of Gulfstream] said some changes were in order," said Gulfstream Vice President of Racing Bill Murphy. "We believe adjustments to the timing and distances of these races will provide a smoother progression to the Florida Derby, and beyond to the Kentucky Derby." The Sunshine Millions series will also return in 2007, with purses totaling \$3.6 million.



Internet Gaming Legislation Passed:

Internet gaming legislation containing language favorable to the horse racing industrywas overwhelmingly approved by both the House and the Senate early Saturday morning. The bill is expected to be signed into law by the President in the near future. The legislation recognizes the ability of horse racing to offer account wagering under the Interstate Horseracing Act of 1978, as amended. "This is a very significant landmark recognition by the U.S. government of our industry's legal right to conduct wagering under the IHA and of our industry's important position as an agribusiness that supports 500,000 jobs," said Greg Avioli, chief executive officer of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association and Breeders' Cup Ltd. "The bill also includes language that will prevent the addition of harmful elements in any rulemaking required by the bill."


