



JOCKEY CLUB GOLD CUP-GI, \$750,000, 3yo/up, 10f Darley's GI Travers S. hero Bernardini (A.P. Indy), looking for his sixth straight victory in Saturday's Gold Cup, tuned up with a five-furlong breeze in 1:03.33. "He's ready to go and has given us every indication that he is ready as he was for the Travers," said trainer Tom Albertrani. The three-year-old was slated to take on top older horse Invasor (Arg), but that runner will skip the 10-furlong contest after spiking a fever late last week, forcing him to miss a breeze. "Naturally, by losing a horse that I thought was the one to beat and a horse I had a lot of respect for in Invasor means one less to worry about," Albertrani added. "If Bernardini were to beat him--and I won't say what the outcome would have been--it would have boosted Bernardini's status." Albertrani warned that the colt will take some beating. "If Bernardini just shows up with his game from the last three or four races, someone is going to have to be on his A-game to beat him," the conditioner continued. "He showed in the Preakness that he doesn't have to be on the lead. He is very versatile."

REALITY BITES

The North American yearling market is pretty straightforward: Fasig-Tipton July (\$35 million), Fasig@ Saratoga (\$42 million), Keeneland September (\$399.8 million)--total, about \$477 million in the three bellwether sales. It's more complicated in Europe (I was tempted to say everything is more complicated in Europe, but, after considering the fallout from the American anti-Internet gambling bill, I'm reconsidering my position on that): we're now counting eight yearling sales in five different countries--though, thankfully, there are only two different currencies (neither of them USD, of course) in play.

Going into yesterday's opening session of Tattersalls' four-day October 1 yearling sale, six of the eight European sales had taken place, and all six had seen rises in gross. The two new sales we're counting, BBAG Baden-Baden and the Italian sale in Milan, were up just marginally, with grosses remaining in the \in 7-million range. Tattersalls Ireland's Fairyhouse sale was up €2 million to €10.7 million. The new French sales company's debut Deauville sale was up almost €7 million itself; the Doncaster St. Leger sale was up over 5-million guineas (€7.5-million); and, last week, Goffs Million and Sportsman's sales (the first four days of the five days they sold) were up over €8 million. Since Goffs had been up \in 23 million the year before, having fallen to a relatively paltry €31 million in 2004, it meant Goffs' 2006 gross actually more than doubled the corresponding four days' gross of just two years before. I think we can say that the Return of the Sales Stakes and the domestic Irish property market account for that welcome resurgence.

In the first year of the wholly reconstituted October 1 sale (four days, alphabetical for all four days rather than grading each day), 499 yearlings (84 percent of the 592 offered) grossed 59,635,000gns, and averaged 119,509gns. That's well over \$200,000 at today's rates. Followed by an equally buoyant October 2 sale the following week (up over 50 percent in gross, almost 40 percent in average from 2004), the combined Tattersalls October 1 and 2 grossed over 76.6-million gns and averaged 67,609gns in 2005.

Business was distinctly patchy yesterday, as several key indicators showed. If you divide last year's gross by four, each day last year averaged 14.9-million guineas, whereas yesterday's gross was 13,129,000gns--a 12percent drop from last year's 'daily average gross.' There were 25-percent not-solds yesterday, compared to 16 percent (for the whole sale) last year; that's a hefty 9-percent increase. The good news on that front is that The Judges report today's horses are markedly better than yesterday's, so we can expect today's figures to look better against last year's daily averages of 84-percent sold and 14.9-million gross than yesterday's did.

Here is what is more worrying: the sire showdown. Seven colts bought yesterday by Demi O'Byrne, John Magnier, or Horse France sold for an average of 187,143 gns; six of the seven were by Sadler's Wells (2), Danehill Dancer (2), or High Chaparral (2). The other was by Cheveley Park's Kyllachy, son of Pivotal. Of the seven yearlings signed for yesterday by John Ferguson or Dick O'Gorman, three were by Cheveley Park's Pivotal and one was by Indian Ridge: the three by Darley stallions, colts by Singspiel, Cape Cross, and Dubai Destination, averaged 140,000gns. Considering the price of a good colt yesterday was plus-or-minus 200,000gns, breeders could be forgiven for wondering whether they should be breeding to either camp's stallions. If you had a nice colt by one of them, and the camp bought the colt, there was a distinct shortage of competition for it; for good colts by 'neutral' stallions, everybody was in. It's pretty wacky.

Oppenheim cont. THE POKER WARS

Strictly from the point of view of the domestic U.S. horse racing industry, the NTRA's Greg Avioli is adamant that the anti-internet gambling bill that passed Congress before adjournment last weekend is a good thing for horse racing. In response to a question, he argues: "NTRA's overriding concern is to protect our industry's on-line account wagering under the Interstate Horseracing Act, because that is our fastest-growing source of revenue, and in many ways the lifeblood of our industry. The legislation not only allows us to continue on-line account wagering, but also shuts off many illegal competitors (e.g. Internet bookmakers) who we believe are diverting revenue from the licensed and regulated domestic pari-mutuel industry." Emphasis on that term 'domestic,' I think: faced with the difficulties posed by collecting tax and/or commissions from internet betting, you can certainly see why the NTRA has taken the view they have. Narrow the focus, achieve the achievable: that's a whole lot better than having simulcasting wiped out, too.

On the other hand...what is this really about? This looks pretty wacky, too--to most Europeans, anyway. A Republican Congress's appeal to the anti-gambling moralists to try and help cling on to their slim majority? A recent estimate is that there are 30-million poker players in the U.S., and 25 million play for money. I'm not sure how many of them will be voting Republican. Nor will any investors in the on-line gambling companies whose stock prices plunged 50 percent on the London Stock Exchange following Congressional passage.

The oldest native American sire line is that of Himyar, a foal of 1875 and a grandson of Eclipse who was imported in 1859. This sire line has survived to the present day through two branches. One is that of Plaudit, who is now represented by Holy Bull. The other is that which comes down through the "Black Whirlwind," Domino. The Domino line has had a particularly tenuous existence over the last 100 years or so. Foaled in 1891, Domino was the fastest horse of his day. Unfortunately, he died after standing only two seasons at stud and left only 19 named foals, seven of which were stakes winners. Domino's most notable son, the once-beaten Belmont S. victor Commando, was a great success at stud, but also died young, siring only four crops. Commando's best son, the undefeated Colin, was very sub-fertile, getting only 83 foals (11 stakes winners) in 23 crops. Despite this, it is through Colin that the Domino line exists today. In the late 1930's Colin's grandson, Good Goods, was standing at "private treaty," which to all intents and purposes meant free. Bred to Winds Chant, a mare acquired for \$90, Good Goods sired Alsab.

A champion at two, Alsab took the Preakness S. and twice defeated the previous year's Triple Crown winner, Whirlaway, at three.

At this juncture, we have to note that consistent inbreeding plays a key part in the survival of the Domino line from the time of Good Goods to the present day. Alsab, the best horse to spring from Colin's line since his sire, had Colin and his 3/4-sister, Verdure (dam of Alsab's broodmare sire, Wildair) 3x3. Alsab's best son, Armageddon, added to this formula, as his third dam, Comixa, was also by Colin, giving the close relations Colin/Verdure 4x4x4. Winner of the Champagne S. at two and the Withers and Peter Pan S. at three, Armageddon's resume boasted wins over champions Tom Fool and One Count.

Armageddon was not a stellar sire, but did extend the line through the Saratoga Special and Lawrence Realization winner, Battle Joined. That horse owned two of our favorite patterns: both his sire, Armageddon, and his broodmare sire, Revoked, were out of mares by Sir Gallahad III (giving inbreeding to the broodmare sire of the sire), and both were by Domino-line stallions out of Sir Gallahad III mares (a "Parallel Pattern"). Incidentally, we can note that despite his tiny number of foals, by this time--the early 1960's--the influence of Domino had so proliferated that Battle Joined had no less than nine crosses of Domino.

It was Battle Joined who sired the first truly outstanding horse from this branch of the male line in recent years in the shape of Ack Ack. He was another horse with an intense pedigree pattern, having three crosses of the great mare, Plucky Liege (dam of Sir Gallahad III, the horse to whom Battle Joined was inbred), and having the 3/4-relatives Pharos and Sickle 5x5x5x4. Ack Ack won four stakes at three, including the Arlington Classic and Withers S. It was at the age of five, however that the Charlie Whittingham-trainee demonstrated his true class and versatility. Quick enough to set a track record at 51/2 furlongs that year, Ack Ack also stretched out to capture the American H. at nine furlongs, and the Hollywood Gold Cup at 11/4 miles.

Not surprisingly, his feats that year earned him titles as champion sprinter and Horse of the Year. Subsequently, Ack Ack turned out to be a more than useful sire, getting 55 stakes winners from 580 foals, including Youth, champion three-year-old colt in France and champion turf horse in the U.S.; and Broad Brush, who proved one of the best three-year-olds and handicap horses of his crop. He earned \$2,656,793 with wins in the GI Wood Memorial S., GI Suburban H., GI Santa Anita H. and GI Meadowlands Cup. Like the first four sires in his male line, Broad Brush also featured notable inbreeding and linebreeding, as he had Turn-to 3x3 (including in the broodmare sire of the sire position), and the top-class sisters, Cherokee Rose and How 3x5. At stud, Broad Brush brought the Domino line its first sires title for more than 65 years when heading the 1994 table. Broad Brush's first shot at extending the Domino line with a stallion son came in the shape of GI Breeder's Cup Classic winner, Concern. Unfortunately, Concern failed to get a graded winner in his first eight crops, and is now standing in Oklahoma at a fee of \$2,500.

Concern was an outcrossed horse, but Broad Brush's second-leading earner, Include, followed in the footsteps of the other extenders of the male line as he is inbred 4x4x4 to Turn-to. He has the Kentucky Oaks winner Hidden Talent (third dam of Broad Brush) 4x5. A later-developing horse, Include didn't win in two starts at three, but took four of five outings the following year, including the Vincent A. Moscarelli Memorial S. Include enjoyed his best season at four, capturing five of nine starts, including the GII Massachusetts H., GII New Orleans H. and GI Pimlico Special. Include wasn't the same force at five, but he did take the Jennings H. for a second consecutive year, tallying by nine lengths.

Retired to Airdrie Stud, Include is represented by his first crop of two-year-olds in 2006. His record would not have encouraged expectations of his runners being particularly early, but he's actually already had 26 starters and 11 individual winners. His first stakes winner came Aug. 20 when Sul Lago took the Northern Lights Futurity at Canderbury Park.

Distorted Humor

Sul Lago is out of a mare by American Standard, a grandson of Hidden Talent, so he has Hidden Talent 5x6x4 and her daughter Too Bald 5x3. An even better result came Sept. 4, when Include's daughter She's Included took third behind Point Ashley and Untouched Talent in the GI Del Mar Debutante S. Fast forward to the most recent weekend, when Include became the first of the freshman sires to get a Grade I winner. His daughter Cash Included steppped to the front of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Filly contenders with a decisive win over Point Ashley in the GI Oak Leaf S.

In keeping with the success of the inbreeding theme,

Cash Included is the third foal of the unraced Chimes Band mare, Henderson Band, a half-sister to Lord Flasheart, winner of the G3 Prix de Conde and G2 Prix Hocquart in France, and also graded placed in the U.S. The second dam, Miss Henderson Co. (Silver Hawk), was a sister to the Delaware Oaks winner Like a Hawk (dam of the stakes-winning and Grade-I placed Like a Hero), and half-sister to By Land By Sea, whose victories included the GI Apple Blossom H. and GI Milady H. Porter cont. p9



What's more, both Armageddon--four generations back in the male line of Include--and the dam of Hail to Reason are by Domino-line stallions out of Sir Gallahad III mares. Perhaps a colt with similar inbreeding will appear to allow Include to extend the Domino line another generation.

"He's in top form and I couldn't be happier with him," Chapple-Hyam said. "The step up to seven furlongs will certainly suit him and I wouldn't mind if there was any ease in the ground. 
