STEADY SESSION AT TATTS

There were no seven-figure fireworks, but a solid second day of Tattersalls' October Yearling Sale saw an 18-percent rise in average to 135,097gns from a year ago. The 90,000gns median represented a 20-percent jump from last year, with a clearance rate of 82.5 percent. The 15,266,000gns gross was up one percent from 2005 figures. A Dubai Destination colt out of Maskunah (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) topped the day when bought for 625,000gns by John Ferguson for Sheikh Mohammed. Tom Goff of Blandford Bloodstock was the underbidder. "Sheikh Mohammed saw him in the paddocks and thought he

No 'Cause' for Concern...

Charlie Gordon-Watson, acting for new clients, landed the highest-priced filly on the day, a Giant's Causeway youngster, for 480,000gns. The filly, a daughter of French Listed winner Mer De Corail (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), had been bought 'in utero' for \$1.05 million at Keeneland November in 2004 by Andreas Putsch's 6C Stallions. An Indian Ridge (Ire) filly out of a sister to Group 1 winners Ballingarry (Ire) and Aristotle, offered by her breeder Cathal Ryan's Swordlestown Stud, had earlier been bough for 425,000gns by Gordon-Watson for the same clients. "They are both for people who have had jumpers before but not Flat horses," said Gordon-Watson. "The Indian Ridge will go to James Fanshawe and the Giant's Causeway to Luca Cumani. They are both hopefully long-term breeding prospects." The sale continues today with the session starting at noon.

DAVID JUNIOR TO STAND IN JAPAN Roldvale Ltd's **David Junior** (Pleasant Tap--Paradise River, by Irish River {Fr}) has been sold to the Japan Racing Association in a deal brokered by John Tyrrell of BBA Ireland and will stand at the JBBA Shizunai Stallion Station in 2007. David Sullivan's four-year-old, who annexed the G1 Champion S., the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic and the G1 Eclipse S., is being prepared for his dirt debut in

the Nov. 4 GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs. "We concluded the deal to sell David Junior to Japan this morning," Roldvale's Racing Manager Eamon Connolly told the *Racing Post* yesterday. "We are delighted to have found him a very good home, and we shall all be sorry to see him go." Tyrrell added, "What interests them is that he's an outcross to Northern Dancer and Mr. Prospector, he was a two-year-old winner and his optimum trip was 10 furlongs. They, like the rest of the world, feel that is the optimum winning distance for stud purposes."

LAVA MAN NOMINATED TO BREEDERS' CUP

Officials at Breeders' Cup Limited confirmed yesterday that the five-year-old gelding **Lava Man** (Slew City

Slew) has been nominated by his owners, STD Racing Stable and Jason Wood, at a cost of \$150,000 to the Breeders' Cup program. A leading contender for the \$5 million GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs Nov. 4, Lava Man was not nominated to the program as a foal. Had he not been nominated as a horse of racing age, his supplemental fee to start in the Classic would have been \$450,000.

The late nomination also means that Lava Man will be eligible for the full \$500,000 purse in Saturday's GI Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. at Santa Anita, his final prep before the Classic. The Goodwood includes \$100,000 in Breeders' Cup funds. "We're very glad to be in this position to nominate Lava Man to the Breeders' Cup before the Goodwood," said Wood. "Now we can also win the money in the Breeders' Cup Program races for the rest of his career."

JAZIL OUT OF BC PICTURE Trainer Kieran McLaughlin has confirmed that GI Belmont S. hero **Jazil** (Seeking the Gold), who recently returned to training after being sidelined in July with a bruised cannon bone, would not be ready in time for a tilt in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs Nov. 4. "He's galloping every day and doing great," said McLaughlin. "It's just too close to try the Breeders' Cup. We'll get to working him. I was in Lexington, Kentucky during the September sale with Sheikh Hamdan, the owner, and he told me, 'Don't get in a hurry. Don't push him. Let's let him tell you when he's ready.'" McLaughlin added the 2007 G1 Dubai World Cup was a probable long-term target for the three-year-old.

NOTE: Over the next few weeks, the TDN will take a look at contenders for the Breeders' Cup World Championships, which will be held Saturday, Nov. 4 at Churchill Downs in Louisville, Kentucky. This week, we examine Team Valor's King of the Roxy.

CREDENTIALS FOR THE CUP by Lucas Marquardt

Breeders' Cup champions can come from anywhere. And from any price range. A.P. Indy was a regally bred \$2.9-million animal, while Da Hoss cost just \$6,000 as a yearling before winning two renewals of the Mile, in 1996 and 1998. Buck's Boy, an Illinois-bred, was an \$8,000 yearling that went on to take the Turf in 1999. The speedy Reraise was another who cost \$8,000 as a yearling. He debuted for a \$62,500 tag, but later reached Breeders' Cup glory in the 1998 Sprint. Could King of the Roxy become the third Breed-

ers' Cup champion who sold at auction for \$8,000? Purchased for that amount by trainer Richard Matlow out of the 2005 Keeneland September sale, the two-year-old colt put himself squarely in the Juvenile mix with a victory in the Sept. 23 GII Futurity S. at Belmont Park.

From the first crop of Valid Expectation's full-brother Littleexpectations, King of the Roxy began his career in California for Matlow, who also owned the colt. King of the Roxy ran an unspectacular sixth in his career debut sprinting 4 1/2 panels at Hollywood in mid-May, but caught the gist of things in his second trip to the post, winning a 5 1/2-furlong dash in 1:03 3/5 at the track July 2. **King of the Roxy cont. p7**

The victory caught the attention of the folks at Team Valor, who purchased him privately. In his first start for Barry Irwin's operation and for new trainer Todd Pletcher, King of the Roxy, now on the East Coast, ran Chace City hard to the wire and finished 3/4 lengths second in the GII Saratoga Special BC S. Aug. 17. He proved that was no fluke in the Futurity. Sent postward as the chalk, he rallied hard in upper stretch and held off CP West to take his first stakes by 3/4 lengths. The time for the seven-furlong race was 1:24 flat on a day when the track wasn't playing particularly fast.

Though he now represents two-time Eclipse Award winner Todd Pletcher and a major owner in the game in Team Valor, King of the Roxy had much more humble beginnings.

A King-Sized Story for a Small Operation...

Start small, do your research, work hard, reinvest your profits, hope for the best. Like many other breeders, this is the approach that Deborah Kopatz has taken in her 25 years in the business. The result of Kopatz's efforts could be seen in the Futurity. The dark bay colt that streaked down Belmont's stretch a game winner was the same one that used to streak around her 5 1/2-acre farm in Lake Township, Ohio, where Kopatz bred King of the Roxy.

Kopatz remembers King of the Roxy as an assertive but friendly colt who liked nothing better than tearing across the paddock with his pals.

"He would go and bite the other horses on the butt to make them run with him," chuckled Kopatz. "I think that's why he hangs a little when he's racing. He wants to run *with* them, not beat them."

Even in those early days, Kopatz and her husband Richard knew they had a runner on their hands.

"My husband, who's an excellent horseman but who knows nothing about pedigrees and can't remember who foaled who, comes into the house one day and says, 'That dark one out there. Who's he by?'" said Kopatz, who explained the colt was a son of Littleexpectations, out of their mare Marrakesh.

"Man," responded Richard Kopatz, "can he *run!*"

As a horse-loving young girl growing up in Ohio, Deborah Kopatz saved her babysitting money for a subscription to *The Blood-Horse*. Later, when she married in 1982, her step-father gave her \$1,000 for the wedding. She asked if she could keep whatever she didn't spend on the ceremony.

"Yeah, sure, I guess," he responded.

Needless to say, Kopatz soon had her first horse, an inexpensive, in-foal mare named Ohio Mary. She added a handful of other broodmares over the years, who were stabled in a barn that her husband had built himself. Kopatz usually sold the Ohio-breds she raised, and if a horse brought a good price, she put the money back into a better mare or a higher stud fee.

Such was the case when a Fit to Fight yearling colt she'd taken to Keeneland September in 1999 sold, on the last day of trading, to trainer Richard Matlow for \$50,000.

"I decided to take half of that and buy two mares," said Kopatz. "I bought one for \$7,500, and another, [the 10-year-old] Marrakesh, for \$17,500 [at the 1999 Keeneland November sale]."

Things hardly went smoothly with Marrakesh, a mare by Bold Forbes. After dropping the Alydeed filly she was carrying at the time of the sale, she was affected by the same Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome that hit Kentucky. She delivered dead foals in both 2001 and 2002, then was left open in 2002 so she could be bred early the following year.

As it turns out, it was a little earlier than expected.

"I dropped Marrakesh off at the farm in Kentucky, and usually it's a few weeks before they can be covered," explained Kopatz. "But the farm called the next day and said, 'We had the vet out, and this mare needs to be bred *tomorrow*.' I said, 'Tomorrow?!' I still didn't have a stallion picked out--nothing! So I went and looked it up: Bold Forbes crosses A+ with Valid Appeal and his sons. And I really liked the sire line a lot."

Kopatz decided to go with Littleexpectations, a son of Valid Appeal who was standing his first season at stud at Millennium Farms for a fee of \$3,500. The price was right, he was a full-sibling to the nice up-and-coming stallion Valid Expectations and, added Kopatz with a laugh, "He was available to cover the mare the next day."

The mating of Littleexpectations and Marrakesh produced King of the Roxy, who would go on to bring a little irony into Deborah Kopatz's life. **Cont. p8**

The story goes like this: Kopatz took the then-unnamed King of the Roxy to the 2005 Keeneland September sale, where he was consigned by Equus Farm and scheduled to be sold on the sale's final day ("Always the last day!"). The bidding for King of the Roxy stalled out at \$8,000--low but still above his reserve--and at the fall of the hammer he had a new owner. When Kopatz looked at the docket to see who had purchased the colt, she had to shake her head: Richard Matlow.

"What were the chances?," Kopatz asked. "I had a different consignor and everything. He must have looked at the papers afterwards and said, 'Hmm, that breeder looks familiar...'"

Matlow raced King of the Roxy under his own name for the colt's first two starts before selling him to Team Valor in July. After hearing of the sale, a friend of the Kopatzes who worked at the farm in Kentucky where they boarded their mares during the breeding season had a thought. The friend called Barry Irwin and told him about a year-younger half-sister to King of the Roxy. Soon after, Team Valor had

added the yearling sister, by Bright Launch, to its roster for a cost of \$40,000.

While the purchase seems like a bargain for Team Valor at this point, Kopatz is confident in her decision to sell.

She explained, "I thought it was a good price for a Bright Launch, and I was excited because I didn't have to vet the horse out, didn't have to sales prep her, didn't have to haul her down to the auction ring and didn't have to pay an auction company for an \$8,000 bid. Plus she's got the best possible home she could want. She'll have every chance to make it as a racehorse."

Marrakesh is back in foal to Bright Launch on a Mar. 4 cover, and Kopatz hopes the mare has another star or two up her sleeve.

In the meantime, Kopatz is content rooting on King of the Roxy from the sidelines. After all, she can take a great deal of pride in breeding a Breeders' Cup contender from what Kopatz herself describes as "the original ma and pop operation."

"All my life, I thought race horses were just the coolest things in the whole world," Kopatz said. "I'm just an example to every little girl who dreams about breeding a Kentucky Derby contender or a top horse, it's possible. I just hope he goes on to win the Breeders' Cup."

And who knows? \$8,000 seems to be a lucky number on racing's biggest day.

NORSE DANCER RETIRED Jeff Smith has announced the retirement of MGSW **Norse Dancer (Ire)** (Halling--River Patrol {GB}, by Rousillon). Having earned the tag of "nearly horse" at the highest level over the past three seasons, the David Elsworth-trained six-year-old won four of his 35 starts, including the G3 Sovereign S. in 2004 and last year's G3 Earl of Sefton S. and accumulated £729,552 in prizemoney. However, it was his placed efforts at the highest level that characterised his career. Having finishing third in the G1 2000 Guineas, fourth in the G1 Epsom Derby and third in the G1 Sussex S. in 2003, he returned the following season to finish third in the G1 Lockinge S. and runner-up in both the G1 Juddmonte International S. and G1 Irish Champion S. Runner-up again in the 2005 G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S., he failed to recapture his form and beat only one home on his last start in Newmarket's G3 Joel S. on Saturday. "He was a much maligned horse with a lot of class and when he was good he was very, very good, but it is true he has shown signs of losing his spark, so we have called it a day," Smith told *the Sportsman*.
