BALLYDOYLE DUO OUT OF BREEDERS' CUP

Ballydoyle Classic winners **Dylan Thomas (Ire)** (Danehill) and Alexandrova (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) will sidestep the Breeders' Cup extravaganza at Churchill Downs Nov. 4 and instead await next season, according to Racing Post. Dylan Thomas, who improved on a G1 Epsom Derby third to win the Irish equivalent July 2, was a non-factoring fourth in last weekend's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup in his main track debut at Belmont. That start followed defeat of Ouija Board (GB) in the Sept. 9 G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown. "Dylan Thomas didn't run his race in America last weekend on the dirt and may be feeling the effects of a long season, so we've decided to leave him at home," trainer Aidan O'Brien told the Racing Post. Offering similar reasoning with regard to Epsom, Irish and Yorkshire Oaks winner Alexandrova, who met with a last-out defeat in the Oct. 1 G1 Prix de l'Opera at Longchamp, he added, "Alexandrova never travelled in the Prix de l'Opera at any stage, and it just wasn't her for some reason. For a filly with a lot of speed that shouldn't have been the case, and she came back sore after France. She might have been feeling the effects of a long season, so we're going to leave her alone, and she won't be travelling to America. We're hopefully going to look forward to next year with her."



Sweet Stream, second behind Satwa Queen at Deauville in the G2 Prix Jean Romanet in August in her only seasonal outing, will be sent to Haras de Capucines after the Italian race to prepare for the 2007 breeding season. This year, the mare was booked to Monsun (Ger), but was never covered as she came into season too late. She will be rebooked to that German-based stallion for 2007.

How long have you been in racing and how did you get started? I've been in racing, I suppose, 35 or 40 years. When I was a little kid I had a love for horses. Orink of choice? I love Macallan Scotch in small amounts and I love a little glass of wine with either lunch and or dinner. But never to excess because I don't believe in a lot of drinking.

Childhood Ambition? I had no ambition, except to flirt with the girls and make a little money selling watermelons or Christmas trees or whatever to get my girlfriend a present.

PROTEST FILED OVER FINISH OF INDIANA

The connections of Star Dabbler (Saint Ballado--Meadow Silk, by Meadowlake) have filed a protest with the Indiana Horse Racing Commission centering around the three-year-old colt's dead-heat victory in the \$513,200 GII Indiana Derby Oct. 7. Owner Barry Schwartz and trainer Michael Hushion, who feel their entry hit the wire first, faxed the protest to the IHRC Oct. 9. "I saw the photo picture on the 15-foot screen and I couldn't believe it," Hushion said. "I got in touch with Mig [jockey Richard Migliore] and he thought he had won. He said the fans were screaming at him coming back that he got robbed. He tried to get a hard copy of the photo from the stewards and they would not give him one. Even if you go to Racereplays.com, you can clearly see daylight between his nose and other horse's nose; a good 2-3 inches." Hushion sent assistant trainer Graham Wolfram to Hoosier Park in his stead, instead watching the 1 1/16-mile contest via simulcast. Star Dabbler established the pace before briefly giving up the lead to Cielo Gold in the stretch. Migliore rallied his mount back along the inside to create the photo finish. After a lengthy deliberation, stewards determined there was a dead heat for win. Hal Wiggins, trainer of Cielo Gold, had conceded victory to Star Dabbler. "I felt we had our nose in front every jump except the last one. I honestly thought we got beat," Wiggins said after the race. "I watched the slow motion [replay] and it looked like we had our nose in front and right when they hit the wire it looked like I could see the shadow roll of that inside horse. I thought we probably lost by an inch or so." Schwartz and Hushion wasted little time filing their protest following the Indiana Derby. Now, they must wait for IHRC Executive Director Joe Gorajec to review the submission. According to IHRC Assistant Executive Director Deena Pitman, both Gorajec and the commission's legal counsel are on vacation. Gorajec is not scheduled to return until Oct. 24. "Really, this is kind of a first; we haven't set a protocol yet. That won't be determined until he [Gorajec] gets back," Pitnam explained. "They [connections] did what they thought was right, and they did it in a timely manner." Star Dabbler has since been retired after suffering an injury to his left front sesamoid. The three-year-old retires with three wins in seven career starts and earnings of \$319,936, all accomplished this season. He was bred in Florida by Four Horseman's Ranch and The Saint Ballado Syndicate. "He was slightly off when he came back, and it got worse. We took X-rays and he has a fracture of the front left sesamoid," Hushion said. "He was a brilliant horse with a nice family, and we're hoping someone contacts us about stud plans."
