Blood-Horse

PRIDE AT STAKE

N P Bloodstock's **Pride (Fr)** (Peintre Celebre) steps onto hallowed ground today. She bids to follow in the steps of such famed distaffers as Time Charter (GB), Pebbles (GB), Triptych, Indian Skimmer, Bosra Sham and Alborada (GB) and capture today's G1 Emirates Airline Champion S. at Newmarket. Her development into one of France's leading middle-distance performers has been stealthy, but at the ripe age of six she is at her peak, running Rail Link (GB) to a neck when second in the G1 Prix de

'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp 13 days ago. "She ran very well

in the Arc, but I think the ground was a bit too firm for her there," trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre said. "She lost five kilos, but three days later was the same weight as before the race and she is that weight again now. It is always a risk running with only two weeks between races, but she looks good and we'll try." Pride's record against the boys stands up to the closest inspection, as she bested Michael Tabor's accomplished **Hurricane Run (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) in the June 25 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. Winner of the 2005 Arc, that rival re-opposes here after running fourth in the Longchamp feature. "He was unlucky...he couldn't move early enough," trainer Andre Fabre told *Racing Post*. "It was unlucky or there was a lack of acceleration at a crucial moment--he couldn't extend himself." **Cont. p6**

BIG APPLE BUBBLY

A field of 10 two-year-old males is set for today's \$400,000 G1 Champagne S. at Belmont, which will feature the stakes debut of **Nobiz Like Shobiz** (Albert the Great). Elizabeth Valando's homebred colt posted one of the most eye-catching debuts in New York this year when drawing off by 10 3/4 lengths over track and trip Sept. 9 ([video](#)). Trainer Barclay Tagg is quietly confident about his charge's chances. "I know you don't go from one maiden race to a Grade I and all that stuff, but what else is there?" Tagg said. "The first time I saw him, I thought he was something special. Of course you wish you had more experience, but he's got a pretty good mind." **Cont. p3**

CLASH OF THE TITANS

Jim Bolger's **Teofilo (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) bested Susan Magnier's **Holy Roman Emperor (Ire)** (Danehill) by just 1 1/4 lengths when they met in the Sept. 17 G1 National S. at The Curragh. They square up again in today's G1 Darley Dewhurst S. at Newmarket, but Bolger is not predicting an instant replay of that event. "We are running and competing tomorrow, so we will have to wait and see how [Teofilo] gets on," Bolger told *PA Sport*. "It is a very good race, but you would expect that of a Group 1."

A FIRST FOR GORELLA?

Her connections still aren't sure which Breeders' Cup race **Gorella (Fr)** (Grape Tree Road {GB}) will go in, but she'll tune up today for the Churchill extravaganza in the one-mile \$400,000 GII First Lady S. at Keeneland. "We will see what happens Saturday, then see how she comes out before we make any decisions about the Breeders' Cup," trainer Patrick Biancone told *Daily Racing Form*. Perfect against fillies this season, the chestnut hasn't been out since a sparkling triumph in the GI Beverly D. S. nine weeks ago, and faces a sharp contingent that includes **Mea Domina** (Dance Brightly), **Karen's Cap** (War Chant) and **My Typhoon (Ire)** (Giant's Causeway). **Cont. p6**

The lightly raced Midnight Lute relished the Polytrack, racing home with his ears pricked to capture his first stakes victory. Winner of his lone two-year-old outing at Del Mar last July, the dark bay didn't face the starter again until July 28, when he raced six wide before coming up a half-length short in an allowance. He put that behind him with a three-length tally in another Del Mar allowance Aug. 20 and was the fifth choice in this competitive heat. Last of all early, Midnight Lute threaded his way through rivals, hit the front at the eighth pole and opened up to win by daylight. "We've always thought he was a monster," said winning trainer Bob Baffert. "He had some throat problems early on, but we healed those, and now he really is starting to show his stuff." Bygone Days, a smart handicapper when trained by William Haggas, was purchased by Godolphin following his success at Haydock last September. Placed in handicaps on Nad Al Sheba's turf during the winter, he signed off on his Spring Carnival stint with a second to Candidato Roy Mar. 9. He returned to best the Ayr Gold Cup scorer Fonthill Road (Ire) in a conditions event at Hamilton last time Sept. 25 and made another stride forward here to open his stakes account. Settled in behind the early leaders by Frankie Dettori, he was presented with perfect fractions by stable rabbit Great Britain (GB) (Green Desert) and swooped late to inhale Borderlescott in the final strides. "He won very well and we'll look forward to seeing how he gets on in better races," trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented. Nobiz Like Shobiz may have garnered acclaim in his lone start, but he does give up valuable experience here. **Got the Last Laugh** overcame a stumble at the start to take his debut going away at Saratoga Aug. 19. The Zayat colorbearer then dug in bravely to dead-heat with Officer Rocket (GB) in the GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity Sept. 10, a race run at a similar one-turn mile. "It was a very, very game effort--you can't imagine that he won," trainer Bill Mott told *Daily Racing Form*. "That horse came by him with a head of steam and looked like he was going to beat us a length. He's been one of those [that] when you really ask him for it, he gives you a little more." Another who has shown

grit is **Scat Daddy**, in whom a 50-percent interest was recently sold to Michael Tabor. A 5 1/4-length debut winner June 3, the dark bay rallied to capture the GII Sanford S. July 27 at the Spa. He lost his unbeaten record when runner-up after a rough trip to his stable-mate Circular Quay in the GI Hopeful S. Sept. 4 at the upstate track. According to Tristan Barry, assistant to trainer Todd Pletcher, "He always shows a lot of heart to win in whatever situation he's in." The Champagne also features Scottish invader **Big Timer**. Gelded to alleviate his ridgling status, the chestnut has gone unbeaten in three starts in the U.K. He ships in following a victory in York's G3 Acomb S. Aug. 22. "He's definitely proven to be one of England's best two-year-olds," said trainer Ian Semple. "There's a bit of hype around him back home." Big Timer has raced solely on grass, but Semple is hopeful his charge can handle dirt. "He's got an American pedigree [Street Cry--Moonflute, by The Minstrel] and he's a well-balanced athlete," Semple commented.

Meadow Breeze is the most well-travelled member of this field, with her six starts coming over four different racetracks. In her most recent outing, the chestnut pulled off a 34-1 upset in the GI Matron S. Sept. 23, and stretches out to a mile from that seven-furlong contest. Making the jump from maiden wins to Grade I company are **Allude** and **Awesome Ashley**. Allude,

produced by a half-sister to Holy Bull, missed by a half-length when third to Debbie Got Even in a seven-furlong maiden at Saratoga Aug. 20 in her career bow. She cut back to six panels Sept. 17 at Belmont and rolled home a 5 3/4-length winner. "When she ran the first time, she got

there and then got a little tired," trainer Tom Albertrani commented. "The six-furlong race was there, so we backed her up, but the way she won, it really looked like she'd get a mile. Off that race, we felt like she deserved a chance in here." Awesome Ashley, a daughter of GISW Queens Court Queen, rebounded from a second in her debut to post a determined victory over track and trip Sept. 10. "Although she didn't win by a long way, she got to the front and just hung around there," said Tristan Barry, assistant to trainer Todd Pletcher. "The second horse was never going by her. Hopefully, she's learned enough in her first two races to set her up well for [today]."

Germance comes in from France with a glittering record. The bay reeled off four straight victories to begin her career, culminating in the G1 Prix Saint-Alary May 21 at Longchamp. Her unbeaten record came to an end when she ran second in the G1 Prix de Diane June 11, but, after a summer break, she rebounded to take the G3 Prix de la Nonette Aug. 20. After careful consideration, her connections opted for this race over the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe or the G1 Prix de l'Opera, both of which were run two weeks ago at Longchamp. An unbeaten filly based at Arlington Park looms an intriguing dark horse. **Vacare** ran past her rivals to land her June 9 debut at the Chicagoland oval. She resurfaced with a 5 3/4-length allowance tally July 26, then

showed a bit more early foot before drawing off by four lengths in the GIII Pucker Up S. Sept. 9. Can the bay continue her upward progression? "She's never been looked in the eye down the lane, but I'm sure it'll happen Saturday," trainer Chris Block told *Daily Racing Form*. "It's hard to say what to expect because there are so many nice horses in there, but if she raises her game, I'd say we're going to be competitive." Trainer Todd Pletcher will saddle **Magnificent Song**, who has posted wins in her last two starts, the July 28 GIII Lake George S. and the Sept. 9 GI Garden City Breeders' Cup S. **Citronnade**, a half-sister to a pair of Canadian champions, tried the turf for the first time in her latest. The bay ran her lifetime record to 5-3-2-0 with her victory in Belmont's Graceful Darby S. Sept. 21 and merits consideration while stretching out from that seven-furlong race.

The attention will focus on **Teofilo** and **Holy Roman Emperor** this afternoon, but there are other would-be champions waiting in the wings. Looking to dethrone the top two are Saleh Al Homaizi and Imad Al Sagar's unbeaten **Hamoodly** and Sultan Ahmad Shah's **Strategic Prince**. A debut winner in a conditions race on the July Course here July 13, Hamoodly ran free without cover before adding the G2 Richmond S. to his tally over Goodwood's six furlongs last time Aug. 4. "I think he is a serious horse, but the Dewhurst is a pretty serious race," trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam commented. "We have not seen the best of him yet. He has been a little bit immature and that is why we have waited this long to bring him out again." Strategic Prince followed an impressive success in the G2 July S. on the July Course here July 13 with a neck defeat of Duke of Marmalade (Ire) under a three-pound penalty in Goodwood's G2 Vintage S. Aug. 2. His rider Eddie Ahern is expecting a bold show. "His last two wins have been impressive and he's done nothing wrong," he said. "Our only doubt was the ground not drying out, as he has a really good turn of foot, but we walked it and it's okay for him. He travels well and brings you to the front easily before accelerating and idling. Jim Bolger's horse was very impressive last time and Holy Roman Emperor is a danger, but he has strengthened up and matured and won't let us down." Stan Moore saddles a dark horse in Uplands Acquisitions Ltd's **Traffic Guard**, who steps up off a six-furlong conditions score at this track last time Sept. 19. "Traffic Guard could be anything," he said. "Everything we've asked of him, he's done easily and he could be the one that shocks them all."

Anthony Pakenham's G1 Epsom Derby winner **Sir Percy** makes his first appearance since his dramatic short-head success in that June 3 Classic. Jockey Martin Dwyer is confident the sophomore has the credentials to compete against his elders here. "[Trainer Marcus Tregoning] has given him time and he's bounced back raring to go," Dwyer said. "He was working well and getting ready to run in the Arc and then just pulled a muscle, so it was just one of those things. I think they've all got me to beat and I think he's got a great chance." Sir Michael Stoute, who has won this twice, saddles a trio headed by Anthony and David de Rothschild's Aug. 22 G1 Juddmonte International S. winner **Notnowcato**. 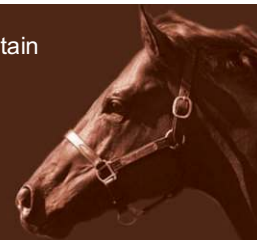

Showing Up switched to the turf after a respectable sixth-place showing in the May 6 GI Kentucky Derby and came home a 3 1/4-length winner in the June 24 Colonial Turf Cup. He added a front-running victory in the Aug. 12 GI Secretariat S., then took on older horses and held well for third after pressing the pace in the Sept. 9 GI Man o'War S. It was solid effort, but trainer Barclay Tagg has opted to pass on another tilt at the older generation in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, instead taking on fellow three-year-olds here. He was outfinished by Brilliant in the Sept. 9 GIII Kent BC S., but was easily second best over soft turf that afternoon.

BREEDERS' CUP BULLETIN

SUPER FROLIC CLASSIC BOUND Super Frolic (Pine Bluff), fourth at 69-1 in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic, has been given the go-ahead for another attempt at the \$5-million contest Nov. 4 at Churchill Downs. The chestnut ran fifth to Lava Man in the GI Goodwood BC H. Oct. 7. "We're planning to run," trainer Vladimir Cerin said. "He might be a big longshot again, but we found out something after the Goodwood that we're going to keep to ourselves. If you look at this red flame coming at you, bouncing all over the place and feeling like \$5 million, I can show you the No. 1 reason we're going to the Breeders' Cup. We'll ship as close to the race as possible. He's run at more tracks than most horses [10] and he's a good shipper."

BORDONARO LIKELIER FOR SPRINT Trainer Bill Spawr still isn't sure whether the swift **Bordonaro** (Memo {Chi}) will take his place in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, but is getting closer to a decision. "As of right now, we're putting things in motion on the premise that we're running," Spawr said. The GI Ancient Title BC S. hero would have to be supplemented to the \$2-million Sprint. "We're not sure, but we're making arrangements, tentatively," he added. "I did get him a spot on a plane on the [Oct.] 24th in case we decide to go."

ARAFA MILE-BOUND Saleh Al Homaizi and Imad Al Sagar's **Arafa (Ire)** (Mull of Kintyre) will be aimed at the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Churchill Nov. 4 after connections opted not to step the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 St James's Palace S. winner up in trip for today's 10-furlong G1 Emirates Airline Champion S. at Newmarket. "The Breeders' Cup is the only target we are thinking about now," the owners' Racing Manager Tony Nerses told *Racing Post*. "The horse is fine and the ground at Newmarket wouldn't have been a problem for him. It was just that the Breeders' Cup Mile would be a better possible option."

GEORGE DIRT SPIN POSTPONED Aidan O'Brien's proposed fact-finding gallop of Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's **George Washington (Ire)** (Danehill) on Southwell's all-weather track had been called off yesterday due to adverse weather. O'Brien had intended to take the G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. winner to the British track to work, but he was forced to cancel the trip due to extensive fog at the local airport. Still, the plan is the clearest indication yet that the sophomore will be asked to run on dirt in the Nov. 4 GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs. Mick Kinane had been booked for the exercise, which is similar to the spin given to Galileo (Ire) prior to his attempt at the Classic in 2001. Starcraft (NZ) also used the surface, which is the closest Britain has to American dirt, for his warm-up gallop 12 months ago.

GODOLPHIN FIRM UP CUP TEAM Saeed bin Suroor yesterday shed light on Team Godolphin's plans for the Breeders' Cup at Churchill Downs Nov. 4. While effectively ruling the meet out for the unbeaten **Discreet Cat** (Storm Cat) in favor of the GI Cigar Mile at Aqueduct Nov. 25, he confirmed that **Librettist** (Danzig) and **Echo of Light (GB)** (Dubai Millennium {GB}) may fly the flag in the Mile. The G1 Prix Jacques le Marois and G1 Prix du Moulin winner Librettist had been reported to be lame in front after his disappointing sixth in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot Sept. 23, but has made a full recovery and may be joined in Louisville by the G2 Prix Daniel Wildenstein scorer Echo of Light. "So far, we think we'll take Discreet Cat to the Cigar Mile, as he has plenty of speed and it's the best thing for him this year," bin Suroor said, adding, "Librettist worked very well over five furlongs [yesterday] and he came back from his last run very well."
