

PRIDE GOES ONE BETTER IN CHAMPION

A narrow runner-up to David Junior in last year's running of the G1 Champion S., N P Bloodstock Ltd.'s hard-knocking **Pride (Fr)** (Peintre Celebre) earned a measure of revenge yesterday, posting a comfortable three-length victory over **Rob Roy** (Lear Fan). "She is a champion; the trainer did a really good job to keep her in excellent condition and this is his reward today," said winning rider Christophe-Patrice Lemaire. **Hurricane Run** (**Ire**) (Montjeu {Ire}), sent off the 9-4 favorite, inherited the role of pacesetter, but weakened late to be third.

Summer Doldrums draw clear in a Belmont MSW to become the third new winner for his sire in three days.

Jim Bolger's unbeaten homebred Teofilo had put daylight between himself and Susan Magnier's Holy Roman Emperor in the G1 National S. at The Curragh Sept. 17, but had to dig deeper to withstand that foe this time. Teofilo's iron resolution was evident first time when winning an above-average maiden at The Curragh July 16 and again 13 days later in Leopardstown's Listed Tyros S. He had to call on those qualities again to deny Eagle Mountain (GB) by a head in the G2 Futurity S. back at The Curragh Aug. 26 before his convincing dismissal of Holy Roman Emperor. Missing the kick vesterday, the imposing bay made up ground to track the early leaders and needed all of his considerable muscle to edge through the gaps and lead with $1 \frac{1}{2}$ furlongs remaining. He looked held as Mick Kinane rolled by on his arch rival inside the final eighth, but his ground-swallowing stride carried him back to the front in the final uphill climb. "I could see he wasn't that happy on that ground, but was happy with the amount of energy he had when passing the post," Bolger, the colt's owner, breeder and trainer commented. "He doesn't know he's two--he's four really in his mind. That's the sort of mentality he has--he's been strutting around like that since he was a foal." Trainer Aidan O'Brien was looking ahead to next May with Holy Roman Emperor. "He's run a great race, but it was all a bit rough," O'Brien told PA Sport. "They are two good horses and the winner looks very good. The ground today was borderline. The horse loves fast ground so this surface was a worry, but the boss said to let him run. I hope we'll be here next year for the Guineas and that's it for the season."

The irrepressible Gorella remained unbeaten against her own sex in 2006, scoring a narrow victory over a game Karen's Caper. Winner of a local turf allowance Apr. 19, she was a troubled fifth to English Channel in the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic at Churchill May 6. She bounced back with a neck victory in the GII Just A Game H. on the Belmont S. undercard June 10 and was last seen displaying her wicked turn of foot in a 1 3/4-length score in the GI Beverly D. S. at Arlington Aug. 12. Posted at the back of the field behind a solid pace, Gorella advanced along the inside on the turn and was in need of room in upper stretch. The agile chestnut, beneath Julien Leparoux summoned up another flying finish, knifing through between My Typhoon and Karen's Caper inside the final eighth before holding the latter safe. Given her ability to stay at least 9 1/2 furlongs, the temptation might be to start Gorella in the GI Filly and Mare Turf in three weeks. But trainer Patrick Biancone sees a clear choice. "When a horse can run a mile in 1:34 and change, I think the answer [Mile] is easy to find," he commented. This is a game of confidence and he was successful. I was anticipating having some speed to stalk. But he broke sharp and put himself in his usual bowed neck position. "We gave him a break since his last race, which he needs to perform well," trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented. "He prefers soft ground so hopefully he will get that and run another big race." Laverock looks to add to his win in the G1 Prix d'Ispahan at Longchamp May 21. Subsequently third behind Pride (Fr) and Hurricane Run in the June 25 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud and runner-up in the G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis at Munich July 30, he has also enjoyed a freshener since finishing a place ahead of Cherry Mix in the International. Sweet Stream usually bags a big prize each season and has the 2004 G1 Prix Vermeille and last year's G2 Park Hill S. on her resume. GEORGE'S HOME SPIN POINTS TO CLASSIC

The saga surrounding the possible participation of George Washington (Ire) (Danehill) in the Nov. 4 GI Breeders' Cup Classic took another twist yesterday when Aidan O'Brien gave out positive vibes about the colt's Ballydoyle workout. Following the forced abandonment of a gallop on Southwell's fibresand track on Friday, Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. winner worked on the Polytrack at home. After the surface was loosened up, George Washington was sent through his paces by Mick Kinane. O'Brien told the Racing Post, "We ended up having to use our own gallop and while we did loosen the surface, the kick-back was not the same as it would be in the U.S. or as loose as it would have been at Southwell.
