"It's a sad day as El Gran Senor has been with us from the very beginning," said Dermot Ryan, Ashford's manager. "I'd like to make special mention of Richard Barry, who has taken great care of the horse for almost 20 years." Bred by E.P. Taylor, El Gran Senor carried Robert Sangster's colors with great distinction on the racecourse while trained by Vincent O'Brien. He was named champion at two in a season capped by victory in the G1 Dewhurst S. At three, the bay won the G1 2000 Guineas and the G1 Irish Derby, with his only loss coming by a head in the G1 Epsom Derby. He entered stud at Windfields in Maryland in 1985 before heading to Ashford. Though plagued with fertility problems, El Gran Senor did sire 53 stakes winners from 16 crops (13 percent). Among his best runners were champions/highweights Lit de Justice, Rodrigo de Triano, George Augustus, Winter Quarters, Flowing, Kundalini and Helmsman. He also sired an additional eight Grade/Group 1 winners topped by Toussaud, whose race record has been surpassed by her accomplishments in the paddocks. Named Kentucky's Broodmare of the Year in 2002, she is the dam of four Grade I winners to date, including Classic winner Empire Maker.



FOG'S CANCER EXTENSIVE, NECROPSY RE-VEALS By Debbie Arrington

The deceased champion sprinter Lost in the Fog's cancer was much more extensive than originally believed and most likely had been growing for many months. Results of the necropsy, released Oct. 18, showed a gigantic tumor that compromised several of his internal organs. Located directly below his spine, one inoperable lymphoma ran almost the length of the colt's back. Doctors at University of California at Davis, where the necropsy also was performed, originally thought that tumor to be about one foot long. "It went all the way from his pelvis to invade and erode his diaphragm and chest cavity," said Dr. David Wilson, director of UCD's large animal clinic, who was part of a large team of veterinarians and specialists who worked with the horse. "It also involved his arteries, kidnevs and intestinal organs. It actually invaded one kidney and compressed both. It came right up against his aorta. He had experienced swelling in his hind legs and that was no doubt caused by the tumors pressing on blood vessels." In earlier tests, the large tumor had been partially hidden from view by other organs. In addition to the gigantic growth, Lost in the Fog also carried a tumor the size of a football in his spleen. Congressional Races Tighten

To gain control of the Senate, Democrats need to win a net of six seats for a 51-seat majority.
