Class 3 medication in the U.S., but, according to *Associated Press*, is not listed by the Japan Racing Association as a banned substance. A press release from France-Galop stated that after the first sample came up with a positive result, a second sample was tested by the Hong Kong Jockey Club Laboratory and confirmed the presence of ipratropium.

As a result, French stewards are conducting an inquiry both in France and Japan. Upon the conclusion of the inquiry, the decision will be made whether to disqualify the four-year-old, who earned \in 228,600 in running third in the Arc. Louis Romanet, director general of France-Galop, told *PA Sport* that, although correct protocol had been followed for treating Deep Impact with the substance in question, the withdrawal time guidelines were not followed properly. **cont. p2**

European juvenile champion George Washington, the top-priced yearling at the 2004 Tattersalls October sale at 1.15-million guineas, is the winner of five group races over two seasons, including four Group 1s-the Phoenix S., the National S., the 2000 Guineas, and the Queen Elizabeth II S. "We've been lucky to stand a lot of champion stallions over the years, but I don't think any of them could match George Washington's range of qualifications," said Grassick. Another son of Danehill, Aussie Rules, victorious in the G3 Somerville S. at two, won this year's French G1 2000 Guineas and recently added the GI Shadwell Turf Mile at Keeneland Oct. 7. Representing the Northern Dancer line, European Horse of the Year Hurricane Run took the G1 Irish Derby and G1 Prix de L'Arc De Triomphe in 2005 and added the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup S. and G1 King George and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. to his resume this term. Ad Valorem collected a victory in the G1 Middle Park S. in 2004 and added his second Group 1 victory this season with a score in the Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot. On Breeders' Cup day, George Washington is expected to start in the Classic; Hurricane Run in the Turf: and Aussie Rules and Ad Valorem will take on the Mile.

Aragorn set a course record in the Eddie Read, completing the nine furlongs in 1:44.79 at Del Mar. "What's appealing about him is really the same thing that appealed to me with Kingmambo," Farish said. "He's an outstanding miler. The interesting thing is that when he first got here from Ireland, he won two races at a mile and an eighth. As we all know though, so many great sires were outstanding milers and that's what we've been looking for and are very excited to have." Farish has been impressed by what he has seen of Aragorn on and off the track. "Conformation-wise, he's very correct," Farish said. "He's about 16.1, has a good hip, deep shoulder, lovely neck, head and eye. He's just an outstanding individual." And, on the racetrack, Aragorn has a "terrific kick," according to Farish. "I've been impressed with his ability to accelerate at any distance," he added. The Irish-bred stallion is out of Onaga, who fetched \$1.7 million at the 1999 Keeneland November Sale. He is from the family of stakes winners One Cool Cat, Valoris II, Savannah Dancer, State Shinto and Sha Tha. To date, Aragorn has hit the board in 11 of 13 starts, with six wins and earnings of \$1,095,480.

"It is clear the horse was given some medication containing the substance when he was in France," Louis Romanet told PA Sport. "The prescription was given by a French vet, as the Japanese vet was not allowed to give medication to their horse. The prescription very clearly gave a clearance time for the medication, but it appears they have not followed this instruction. The vet did not administer the drug; that was left up to the assistant trainer or a stable lad. They have clearly made a mistake regarding the clearance time. We have all the evidence, the vet's prescription and everything; we are just waiting for a detailed report which has been done in Japanese and will be translated. The JRA have been very helpful. The next step will be an official inquiry by France-Galop, who will have a hearing where they ask the owner and the trainer to give evidence if they wish to and after that, when we have a full record of all the details, the stewards will make a decision on the disqualification of Deep Impact." Romanet added, "The rules are very clear; the horse shall be disqualified, and then we will review the situation and decide on the level of the fine depending on the evidence of the case," Romanet added. "We will gather all the relevant information together and a decision is likely to be announced in around four weeks' time. The rules are very clear though and a banned substance has been used after a time it had been allowed and that will lead to the disgualification of the horse. It has been a very transparent inquiry, and the only problem has been that the drug has been administered too close to the race. We have a system in France where, when vets administer substances they have to clearly state a clearance time and this has been breached. All we have to determine now is to decide who breached it before we come to a final decision." A statement issued yesterday by JRA President Takahashi said, "Firstly, I would like to say to all the racing fans who came from many different places to give their support to this horse in this event, how immensely saddened I am that this news will effect the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, which is revered as the pinnacle in world horse racing. While this incident has occurred in France, I would like to say on behalf of the JRA that I intend to be meticulous and take a strong lead in raising the awareness among all connections in Japan about prohibited substances and those running abroad." Deep Impact is scheduled to enter stud at Shadai Stallion Station in 2007.

We'll aim for the [Feb. 3 GI] Donn H., and possibly give him a prep in the [Jan. 6 GIII] Hal's Hope H." In addition to the Super Derby, Strong Contender captured the GII Dwyer S. and was runner up in the GII Peter Pan S.







The Jockey Club Releases 2006 RMBs Statistics:

A total of 3,053 stallions covered 59,434 mares in North America during 2006, according to the Reports of Mares Bred received by The Jockey Club through Oct. 12. The number of stallions declined 1.4 percent from the 3,097 reported at this time last year, while the number of mares bred increased 1.2 percent from the 58,739 reported at this time last year. The number of stallions bred to 100 mares or more this season was unchanged at 126. These 126 stallions, four percent of the total number of stallions, covered 16,222 mares, or 27.3 percent of all mares bred. While in 2005, four stallions covered more than 200 mares each, Roman Ruler led all stallions in 2006 with 197 mares bred, two more than El Corredor. Giant's Causeway and Stormy Atlantic each covered 191 mares. "The continued growth in stallion book size and the increase in mares reported bred compared with last year at this time support our previous forecast for a slight increase in the 2007 North American registered Thoroughbred foal crop to 37,500," commented Matt Iuliano, The Jockey Club's vice president of registration services. RMB statistics for all reported stallions in 2006 are available through the Publications and Resources section of The Jockey Club's website at www.jockeyclub.com.

The top selection and overall sale topper arrived late when Robin O'Ryan went to 42,000gns for hip 878. Consigned by Norton Grange Stud, the Diktat (GB) filly's page received a significant update when Dutch Art (GB)--under her second dam--added the G1 Middle Park S. to his earlier win in the G1 Prix Morny. She was bought with a long-term breeding plan in mind and goes into training with Richard Fahey in the meantime. Her price surpassed the 40,000gns paid by Dale Wilsdon for hip 813, a Medicean (GB) filly, earlier in the day. Sent up from Paul Mason's Ash Tree Farm, the Mar. 13 foal was another to benefit from a recent success when Molly Max (Ger), closely related to stakes-placed dam Molly Mello (Ger), garnered the prestigious G3 Preis der Winterfavoriten at Cologne last Sunday. She is destined for trainer Bryan Smart's yard. "It is generally accepted that our St. Leger Yearling Sales benefited from moving away from racing, and it is probably true that the opposite has been the case this week," conceded DBS managing Director Henry Beeby. Looking to the future, he added, "The sale should receive a boost next year when the Racing Post Trophy meeting returns to Doncaster. That said, there has been strong competition for those yearlings that stand out from the crowd, whilst we have again fulfilled our responsibility of providing a marketplace for every type of yearling. This year's figures are roughly on a par with the first two days of last year's sale--the average is actually 14 percent higher--which enjoyed a rise of 22 percent over 2004. What we have lacked is the sparkle of the Friday evening session after racing which accounts for the 70 less lots in the catalogue but, as illustrated by the 42,000 guineas top price, there has been plenty of money for the right horse." Trainer George Margarson announced yesterday that the four-year-old, who has risen through the handicap ranks to win the G3 Cumberland Lodge S. at Ascot on his latest start Sept. 24, will take in the Tokyo feature. "He has improved rapidly, is in really good form and I'm happy to take him out there," Margarson said yesterday. "He has spent a bit of time in the paddock, but he is a creature of habit who likes a routine, and he doesn't like to be taken out of it. I don't know how far this horse can go and, in an ideal situation, I would like to wait until next season and try and step him up. I would have liked to have freshened him up and bring him back for the start of next season and then go through the gears with him in that way, but when you give them a break they find it hard to come back at the same level and sometimes lose their form completely. I just felt that now is the time to have a crack at these races."

ERSKINE-CRUM TO LEAVE ASCOT

Douglas Erskine-Crum yesterday announced to the Board of Ascot that he will end his near 13-year spell as Chief Executive of the Berkshire venue. Following the completion of the redevelopment program, Erskine-Crum is set to "find a new challenge." It is expected that the current Commercial and Finance Director Janet Walker will assume his role until a successor has been appointed. "After nearly 13 years and with the redevelopment largely completed, the time has come for me to find a new challenge in the next phase of my career," Erskine-Crum said yesterday. "I thank everyone at Ascot and in racing, for their support and help over the years. I will look back on my time at Ascot with great pride and wish the Board and team every success in the future." The Duke of Devonshire paid tribute to Erskine-Crum, saying, "We are indebted to Douglas for all he has achieved at Ascot. He has taken Ascot into the 21st century and realised its potential as one of the great racecourses in the world. We will miss him greatly; we thank him for everything and wish him well for the future. In the meantime, we have a strong team in place to manage a time of transition. The search for his successor has already commenced."



Dennis Narlinger has been involved in the Thoroughbred industry for more than a decade as an owner. Now, aided by his son Michael, he is making a name for



himself in the breeding side of the business. Working in partnership with Becky Thomas and Bill Heiligbrodt, the Narlingers stand Ten Most Wanted and Read the Footnotes in New York and Closing Argument in Florida, and they

recently joined forces with Taylor Made, relocating not only top freshman sire Officer, but also their broodmare band, to the Lexington farm. They will soon make an announcement regarding their fifth stallion, Sunday Break (Jpn).

The Thoroughbred Daily News talked to Michael Narlinger about the past, the present and the future of the operation.

Q: How did you get involved in the Thoroughbred industry?

A: My father grew up around the Meadowlands racetrack. We moved out to California, and he started buying a few racehorses 10 or 15 years ago. When he retired, he decided to make a larger investment in the industry. That investment started with Officer at the end of 2002, and it has grown into what it is today.

Q: Have you always worked in the industry?

A: While I was in college at Villanova, I learned about the breeding side of the industry. I studied the mares, and what is needed to be done to commercially support stallions, and I was fortunate enough to learn how to look at a horse from such astute horsemen as Michael Hernon, Mike Ryan, John Fulton and Rudy Delguidice. I have now taken over that part of our business. But I also have my own company, which repairs cell phones. I split my time between that and the horses.

Q: Can you apply the business model from your company to racing?

A: They are very, very different, but there is one similarity. In either business, you have to have a great management team. Since we are not based in Kentucky or Florida or New York, we rely heavily on our team, as we do in our other business. That's why our partnerships with Taylor Made, and with Becky Thomas and Bill Heiligbrodt, are so important. cont. p12



Inside Scoop cont.

Q: What is your role in the operation, and what role does your father play?

A: We work together hand in hand to manage the entire business. We talk for hours upon hours every day. I spend a little more time looking for mares, placing them with the right stallions. I do all of our matings and the placement of our sales horses. Dennis handles the general business plan, he forms the partnerships and has driven those relationships.

Q: Why did you get into racing?

A: We do this because we love the animal, we love the game itself. It is so exciting. But we treat it like a business and want to be a significant player in the industry. It is important to be a major player, not only in Kentucky, but also in New York and Florida, in the regional markets. We feel that having a significant presence in New York and Florida is as important as having a significant presence in Kentucky.

Q: Why did you choose to branch out to Florida and New York?

A: Florida is a great place to make a stallion. There are so many pinhookers there, and it is where Becky is based. She has a great mare base if you are making a stallion that can produce two-year-old speed. You can produce a stallion that will eventually end up in Kentucky, a la Songandaprayer. Florida was a natural fit for us. New York has an exciting state-bred program. They have a wonderful state-bred purse structure in New York, as well as lucrative breeder awards for both stallion owners and mare owners. And the biggest thing is the slot machines. The state is so forward-thinking, and we want to be a part of that.

Q: Are you looking to expand to other areas? **A**: We do drop foals in New Jersey, because we race out of there and we like the New Jersey program as well. But we are obviously curious about Pennsylvania. The state is a significant interest because, with the renovation of Philadelphia Park, it is so close to having slot machines in operation. We think the area has a great future. We are in the process right now of evaluating Pennsylvania, along with Canada, for business opportunities. We are looking at those areas in greater detail every day.

Q: Do you concentrate exclusively on the breeding end

of the business?

A: We have racing interests as well. That is part of supporting your stallions. You have to breed to your stallions, you have to place some of the weanlings and yearlings and two-year-olds in the right commercial spots, and the final piece of the puzzle is supporting them at sales, buying and racing some by your stallions. We currently have 15 head in training, and almost all of them are by our stallions. Some are homebreds. We have them with Kelly Breen; he is going to be a superstar in the training game. He trains at Monmouth, and he commands a lot of respect wherever he ships.

Q: What was behind the partnership with Taylor Made? **A**: We really wanted, at this point, a strong internal supply of mares for Officer. That's what Taylor Made was able to bring to the table. They have a strong internal mare base, and such a wonderful client list--we felt Officer would get a strong book of mares and be able to fully realize his potential as a sire. We have also moved our mares to Taylor Made, and they are doing our consigning. It was just a change of business strategy in that regard in Kentucky. From a business perspective, we were drawn to the family mentality, the entrepreneurial mentality at Taylor Made. We like the way the Taylor brothers are out there working with the team--they are in the trenches with them. We can really relate to that.

Q: What other moves has the operation made as it has evolved?

A: We relocated Ten Most Wanted to New York and we're thrilled about that. We feel he did so well in New York, running second in the Belmont and winning the Travers, that he will be received very well there. We had already moved Read The Footnotes to New York, and we are very happy with his first foals. We have Closing Argument in Florida, and he covered a tremendous book of mares this year. He is the only son of Successful Appeal at stud in Florida, and is his leading money earner. Sunday Break will be moving soon, too-we are feverishly closing a deal to relocate him as well. We are constantly trying to reinvent ourselves and think about where this industry is heading. We are always looking for potential opportunities.

Q: What is the future of your operation?

A: Although we participate in every facet of the business, from pinhooking to racing to commercial breeding, our business is really about making stallions, and making them in different geographic areas. We will continue to focus on that end of the business, and we feel strongly that you have to support your stallions, because if you don't have faith in your horses, why should anybody else?
