DEPTH OF QUALITY FOR BREEDERS' CUP XXIII

A total of 127 horses have been entered for the eight races which comprise the Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships, set for Saturday, Nov. 4 at Churchill Downs. It marks a record sixth time that the



historic track will play host to the world's best. Six of the events were oversubscribed, including the GI Juvenile Fillies, which received 24 entries, one short of a record. The GI Classic. raised to \$5 million this year, features a battle of blue-blooded, blue-silked and blue-collar horses. Darley Stable's Bernardini (A.P. Indy) will look to cap a championship season as he goes in search of a seventh consecutive victory. In racking up an average winning margins of over 6 1/2 lengths in that stretch, the son of Cara Rafaela has dismissed all that have tried him with utter disdain, but he figures to face his stiffest test a week from Sat-

urday. Still, trainer Tom Albertrani, who sent his charge out for a five-furlong breeze yesterday in 1:02 3/5, wouldn't trade places with anyone. "He looks like he's on top of his game and everything is going well," said the conditioner, who added that Bernardini galloped out six furlongs in 1:15 and seven-eighths in 1:28 3/5. "We've had a great season so far, and hopefully he'll run the same race he always has and it'll be a great year." Having already locked up champion three-yearold honors. Horse of the Year is his with a win in the Classic. Sheikh Hamdan will try to show no brotherly love, as he sends out Invasor (Arg) (Candy Stripes) in his Shadwell blue. Since finishing fourth to Discreet Cat (Forestry)--an unexpected Classic entry--in the G2 UAE Derby in March, the four-year-old has rattled off three straight Grade I victories, including a nose score over Sun King (Charismatic) in the GI Whitney H. at Saratoga Aug. 5. Despite missing a start in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Oct. 7, the Argentinian-bred is sitting on go for the Classic. "He's training unbelievably well," his trainer Kiaran McLaughlin said. "Hopefully fitness is not an issue. He's never trained or looked better than he does today." Cont. p2

GW Looks to Bridge the Gap...

Adding fuel to the Classic fire is Mrs. John Magnier's George Washington (Ire) (Danehill), a three-year-old who would be a strong favorite in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, but enters uncharted territory as he tries 10 fur-

longs and the dirt for the first time. Winner of his first six career outings, including the G1 English 2000 Guineas, he suffered an injury in heavy ground in the Irish equivalent, but proved all was behind him with a comprehensive success in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot Sept. 23. His Timeform of 132 + , if trans-

ferred to the main track, would put him right on the wire and the risk is worth the potential reward, says trainer Aidan O'Brien. "I suppose we felt that George proved all he could prove on the turf--he's run against all the best milers and has nothing to prove and that was part of the reason we decided to go for the Classic," he explained. "We've always said we never had a horse like him, so we want to take a chance." Coolmore's Giant's Causeway, who was admittedly blessed with a pedigree better suited to the main track than George Washington, nearly got the job done in 2000, just missing in the Classic to Tiznow.

Not to Be Outdone...

Lava Man (Slew City Slew) joined the Doug O'Neill barn in August 2004, having been claimed for \$50,000. Since then, the gelding has 11 wins, five in Grade I company. He goes for a perfect eight-for-eight record in the Classic and a win would mark his fourth in a million-dollar event in 2006 alone. Perfect Drift (Dynaformer) will make Breeders' Cup history win or lose, as he makes an unprecedented fifth start in the Classic. The seven-year-old will look to improve on his third-place effort from last season. Discreet Cat was entered for the Classic, but remains likely for the GI Cigar Mile Nov. 25. He worked five furlongs in 1:02.53 at Belmont yesterday morning. BC Bulletin cont. p4

In a decision likely to become moot between now and Championship Saturday, Melnyk Racing Inc's Flower Alley (Distorted Humor), runner-up to Saint Liam in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic, was not selected into

the body of this year's race and will need a defection to draw in. While that scenario is pending a decision on the status of Discreet Cat, trainer Todd Pletcher did not mince words expressing his dissatisfaction. "It's an absolute joke that a horse that finishes second in the race in 2005 doesn't get in--I'll

leave it at that," he said during a national media teleconference. The conditioner feels that despite a curtailed season and a lone victory in the GIII Salvator Mile in June, Flower Alley deserves his just due. "We know he's a good horse and he's proven that on the track time and time again," he offered. "He seems to have picked his head up since he's been training at Churchill Downs. We've been leaning on him in the morning and we hope he can reproduce some of his best efforts from last year and this year." The chestnut, who will enter stud in 2007 at Three Chimneys, breezed six furlongs in 1:13 2/5 Oct. 22.

Pletcher Empties Stable for the Cup...

On the same afternoon he tied D. Wayne Lukas for graded-stakes wins in a season (53), Pletcher made Breeders' Cup history yesterday, pre-entering no fewer than 18 horses. That number is four better than the previous record of 14 entered by none other than Lukas in 1987 and 1988. "It's the biggest day in racing and we have a lot of clients that want to be there and we feel all our horses that are there deserve a shot," Pletcher commented, adding that he is impervious to any sort of game-day pressures. "It's just going to be like a Wednesday at Aqueduct," he quipped.

So deep is the field for the \$2-million GI Breeders' Cup Distaff that **Summerly** (Summer Squall), winner of the GI Kentucky Oaks beneath the Twin Spires in 2005, was not selected into the field. Of the 15 fillies and mares pre-entered for the nine-furlong event, all but one are Grade I winners. The lone exception is **Baghdaria** (Royal Academy), who was thrashed in her lone try at the top level, but is a dual Grade III winner, having taken the GIII Silverbulletday S. over the winter before earning her way into the Distaff with a victory in the GIII Indiana Breeders' Cup Oaks Oct. 6.

George Plan a "Gamble"...

Aidan O'Brien yesterday described the decision to pitch George Washington (Ire) (Danehill) into the GI Breeders' Cup Classic as a "gamble" at a specially arranged press conference staged by Epsom racecourse. Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. hero will be attempting dirt for the first time and the Ballydoyle conditioner admitted to being in the dark as to whether he will handle the surface. "Everyone says Danehills won't go on the dirt and we won't know that until he runs," he said. "All we do know is we've never had a horse with this type of class and pace and he's a rare horse. Obviously it's a gamble, but we're hoping maybe he will be able to overcome all of this and he has natural pace, cruises and can quicken. We always thought he'd have a chance of getting a mile and a quarter, as he's not been stopping at the end of his races over a mile. We won't know until he turns into the straight, but we just have to hope he jumps and travels, and whatever happens after that happens. What we try to do is to expose the horses and see how far we can push them for everyone to see. We know what he can do over a mile on grass and he's done all that, so we'll try to go a little bit more and see what could be. We've accepted the challenge and we're going in there at a big disadvantage, but it is exciting for everyone to see what is going to happen."

Ouija Set for Challenge...

Lord Derby's six-time Group 1 winner **Ouija Board** (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) yesterday received an upbeat bulletin from her owner-breeder ahead of her tilt at the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf. At a press conference staged at Epsom, he confirmed the five-year-old to be in good form as she bids to repeat her success of two years ago at Lone Star Park and better her runner-up placing behind Intercontinental (GB) at Belmont 12 months ago. "She seems as good as ever and Frankie [Dettori] rode her again in work last week," Lord Derby commented. "He said she's still as keen and felt as good as she's ever felt under him, so we feel pretty good at this stage. She will travel to Tokyo afterwards for the [G1 Japan Cup], but we'll take it each step at the time."

Araafa at the Ready...

Trainer Jeremy Noseda was in bullish mood yesterday ahead of the run of Saleh Al Homaizi and Imad Al Sagar's Araafa (Ire) (Mull of Kintyre) in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, describing the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 St James's Palace S. winner as "made for racing in America." Runner-up to the Classic-bound George Washington (Ire) in Ascot's Sept. 23 G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. on his last start, Araafa will not have to contend with that foe this time. "I think that was Araafa's best run of his life, and if George Washington hadn't been in that race, he'd be getting a lot of accolades and would be heading to the Breeders' Cup with a favourite's chance," Noseda said. "We'll go there with a big, big chance and I'm happier with the way he's training and his general condition than I was before Ascot. As long as he travels well and gets a good draw, I think he's an ideal contender for the race. John Velazquez knows Churchill well and we're in good hands."

The homebred graduated in style when stretched to nine furlongs on the Florida Derby undercard over the Gulfstream main track. He then captured Belmont's off-the-turf Match the Hatch S. May 19 before moving to the grass. Fourth to Showing Up in the Colonial Turf Cup, the chestnut ran seventh in the GII Virginia Derby July 15. He returned Sept. 9 to be runner-up to Valid Notebook in a one-turn allowance at Belmont. At the back of this tightly bunched field early, Roman Dynasty swooped up on the outside to engage his rivals. Valid Notebook was forced to steady and then faded and, despite favored On Board Again fighting back gamely, Roman Dynasty kept his cool on the outside to give trainer Todd Pletcher a record-tying 53rd graded-stakes win on the year. "We gave him a chance on the turf because he is a Theatrical, but he is a dirt horse," Pletcher said. "We're pleased with his progress this year, and we expect him to have a big year next year." 

FOUR HORSES TEST POSITIVE FOR EHV-1 Four horses based at Monmouth Park have tested positive for the respiratory version of Equine Herpes Virus (EHV-1), it was reported late yesterday. The barn housing the infected horses has been under quarantine since last Sunday, when five horses spiked fevers. "We are having 11 horses tested but for now we've only received the report of four positives from the first batch," said Dr. William Keegan, the veterinarian caring for the horses. "[This] morning, we should know which ones [of the others] are positive and which are negative." Keegan added that the horses are "bright and alert" and that their fevers are starting to "wane and normalize." Those horses that remain under quarantine are trained by Justin Nixon, John Forbes, Tim Hills and Bill Anderson. Since Monday, none of the infected horses has left the barn area and others based at Monmouth have been allowed to race at the Meadowlands only. "Since we were informed of this matter, both the Meadowlands and Monmouth Park have been proactive in working with the veterinarians and horsemen to ensure the protection of everyone who could be affected," said Dennis Dowd, senior vice president of racing for the New Jersey Sports & Exposition Authority. "We acted quickly and have followed all the guidelines to continue racing while containing any possible problem." The New Jersey State Department of Agriculture has issued guidelines, which, among other things, calls for the disinfecting of the starting gate and the paddock after every race. Other aspects of the Department of Agriculture protocols include taking the temperature of every horse before shipping to the Meadowlands as well as retaking temperatures before they race. Horses shipping from Monmouth Park to the Meadowlands will be housed separately from any other ship-ins and only "commingle" during the races.



Gulfstream, Palm Meadows Issue Shipper Policy:

In light of the apparent recent outbreak of Equine Herpesvirus (EHV-1) in New Jersey, officials at Gulfstream Park and its satellite training facility, Palm Meadows, have issued a statement stating shipping requirements. All horses arriving at Gulfstream and Palm Meadows in advance of the upcoming race meeting must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, signed and dated by a licensed veterinarian within 72 hours of the horse's arrival. Each horse must also have been vaccinated against EHV-1 between 14 and 90 days prior to arrival.
