traveled mare impressed trainer Ed Dunlop. "She flourishes wherever she goes and puts on weight whenever she goes abroad," Dunlop said. Ouija Board will be making her third appearance in the F/M Turf after winning the race in 2004 and finishing second last year. In 2006, the five-yearold has made seven starts. "There have been a lot of questions

Horsephotos about the amount of racing she

has had this year, but Oujia Board's a freak. She takes her racing well and looks after herself at home. She'll give her best [on Saturday], I hope," Dunlop added. After ending the year with a trip to Asia, Ouija Board will be retired. "It's been well-documented this is her last year--she goes to Kingmambo--and hopefully she'll go from here to Japan and then Hong Kong before retirement. It's been a great story and I'll certainly never have another one like her," her trainer concluded.

JUVENILE HOPEFULS ON TRACK

A pair of juveniles completed preparations for Saturday's Breeders' Cup yesterday at Churchill. English invader Satulagi (Officer), prepping for the Juvenile Fillies, went four furlongs from the gate in :50 4/5. "She was very good at the stalls," said trainer Stan Moore. "She jumped off at the sound of the bell, and breezed to the finish post. The assistant starter said she did everything perfectly and that he was happy with her." The Juvenile Fillies will be Satulagi's first start on the dirt, although she did debut with a third-place finish over the all-weather track at Lingfield in March. She is coming off a fourth-place effort in the Sept. 23 G1 Fillies' Mile S. Juvenile hopeful Street Sense (Street Cry {Ire}), third in the Oct. 7 GI Breeders' Futurity, worked an easy four furlongs yesterday in :50 4/5. "We wanted :51, :52," said trainer Carl Nafzger. "I guess that fifth of a second won't bother us. He did it perfect. I think we're ready."

CLASSIC - POWERED BY DODGE, \$5,000,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/4m

Surrounded by cameras, Classic favorite Bernardini (A.P. Indy) went out for his first visit to the Churchill track yesterday morning. After the striking sophomore galloped 1 1/4 miles and schooled in the gate, trainer Tom Albertrani pronounced himself satisfied with his charge's condition. "He's doing super," Albertrani said. "I couldn't be happier with him at the moment."

MG1SW David Junior (Pleasant Tap), scheduled to make his dirt debut in the Classic, schooled in the paddock and galloped on the main track Thursday. "I was very happy with what I saw today," trainer Brian Meehan said, "We let him stand in the paddock and have a look around to get him used to his surroundings." Meehan isn't concerned about David Junior handling the dirt. "We have a Polytrack at the farm [in Manton, England]," he explained. "And we have several bends on it, so he's trained for American racing, even though he hasn't run on anything but turf."

NETJETS MILE, \$2,000,000, 3yo/up, 1mT

Badge of Silver (Silver Deputy) has not raced since winning his turf debut in the Jan. 1 GII San Gabriel H., but the long layoff does not bother trainer Bobby




Frankel. "I'll be on the lead, I'll be saving all the ground and I'll be 10-1," Frankel said. "There are some reasons to like him." According to Frankel, the Mile might just set up perfectly for Badge of Silver. "I looked at the race pretty good and there's not a lot of Horsephotos speed in it this year," he said. "In other years there has been, but not this

year. I don't think [anyone] is going to want to run with him. If they do, they'll compromise themselves. So if he gets loose up front..." Badge of Silver will retire after Saturday's race. "If he can win a Breeders' Cup race-well, obviously, that's greatly to his advantage," Frankel said. Since running in January, Badge of Silver had surgery to remove chips in his ankle, then an abscess knocked him out of the Saratoga meet, but Frankel thinks the six-year-old will be ready to run Saturday. "I didn't have any trouble getting him fit," the Hall of Famer said. "He's there. He's a very generous horse in the mornings. He's ready--and you never know."

"I was very happy where I was." Prado thinks Sangrita is on the improve. "I think she's getting better," he said. "She ran a good race down at Gulfstream. At the time she had some breathing problems. But Mr. Matz corrected those problems and today you can see what she can do."

Congressional Races Tighten

Democrats need to take at least 15 seats to gain control of the House of Representatives in the Nov. 7 elections. Pollsters predict up to a 30 seat change. The chances of a Democratic takeover have increased due to the President's low popularity numbers, the Iraq war and recent scandals, but running the table of competitive seats remains a tall order for the minority party.

Key states for House races include Pennsylvania, Ohio, Montana, Rhode Island, Missouri, Virginia, Tennessee and New Jersey.

To gain control of the Senate, Democrats need to win a net of six seats for a 51-seat majority.

CAPTAIN SQUIRE RETIRED Millionaire Captain Squire (Flying Chevron--Dolly's Back, by At the Threshold) has been retired after being pulled up as the evenmoney favorite in Wednesday's seventh race. The Grade I-winning seven-year-old was in for an \$80,000 tag in Wednesday's 6 1/2-furlong optional claimer. "He bled and doesn't need to run anymore," said trainer Jeff Mullins. "The owners gave him to my wife. She's going to make a dressage horse out of him." Captain Squire won last year's GI Ancient Title Breeders' Cup S., as well as the 2002 GII Lazaro Barrera Memorial S. He was third in the 2003 G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen and fourth in that race this year. "He was my first graded-stakes winner when I probably had 10 horses," Mullins said. "He's a special horse. He was the first real horse I ever had. He was a little tough, but he had plenty of personality." On the board in 25 of 35 starts, Captain Squire won nine times and earned \$1,304,271.

WUNDERWOOD EUTHANIZED Wunderwood

(Faltaat--Jasoorah {Ire}, by Sadler's Wells), shipped to Australia in hopes of contesting Tuesday's G1 Melbourne Cup, sustained a fractured left pastern and was euthanized, according to Racing Victoria. The sevenyear-old gelding was midway through his morning exercise when the accident occurred. "I hoped he'd pulled a shoe off at the time, but we were fearful that it was something worse, and I'm afraid it was," trainer David Elsworth said at a press conference. "It's the worst kind of thing that can happen. We live with these horses and we get very close to them. It's upsetting and it's like losing a friend or a member of the family." Bred in Kentucky by Darley, the bay didn't race until four, but developed into a useful handicapper and captured the Listed Braveheart H. in 2005. He had been pointed for the Melbourne Cup by Elsworth this season and tuned up for his voyage Down Under by defeating MG1SW Collier Hill (Ire) in a Salisbury conditions race Aug. 31 in what would be his final career start. Wunderwood's record was 27-9-4-2 with earnings of £136,234.

LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON?

Three-year-olds have not always had the best of it in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. While there have been

seven sophomore Classic winners, they are just one-for-six when sent off the favorite. But the one that proved the exception rather than the rule was '92 hero A.P. Indy, who capped a Horse of the Year campaign with a two-length victory over Pleasant Tap as the 2-1 choice. His son, Bernardini, will be much Horsephotos shorter odds to follow in his father's footsteps tomorrow, but

that hasn't discouraged the competition. A dozen rivals will crowd into the starting gate for the opportunity to bring Bernardini back down to earth. Trainer Murray Johnson, who will saddle Perfect Drift (Dynaformer) for an unprecedented fifth Classic attempt, believes the colt can be beaten, "He is an incredible individual, a great horse with impeccable breeding. He's dominated the three-year-olds," Johnson said, but added, "He's going to have to step up. He's in the pros now, against the very best. All the other horses have been doing it for a long time and against other good horses over the years. He's going to have to step up and show he can do it." Bernardini's connections are undaunted. "With every race he gets better and stronger," trainer Tom Albertrani said. "He's an amazing horse. Right now, he's doing as good as he's ever done. This is going to be his most difficult task, but he's up to it." A Classic victory would guarantee Bernardini year-end honors, as it did A.P. Indy, but it will be a loss if his career mirrors that of his father's in another way. A.P. Indy was retired to Lane's End after the Classic; this race could be the last chance racing fans have to see his striking bay son in action if Sheikh Mohammed decides to forego a fouryear-old campaign and send the stable star to stud.

Short on Defense...

For the first time in the event's history, not one Breeders' Cup champion from the previous year will return to strut their stuff at the World Championships. Only two are still in training, with Sprint hero Silver Train on the sidelines after running fifth in the Oct. 7 GI Vosburgh S., and Juvenile winner Stevie Wonderboy trying to get

back on track after a series of setbacks. But three that ran second last year will try to go one better. Flower Alley (Distorted Humor), beaten just a length by Saint Liam at 10-1 in the 2005 Classic, will be less fancied after a disappointing '06 campaign, but trainer Todd Pletcher is hope-

ful the colt will show his true colors tomorrow. "We're hoping he can go back and rediscover his old form, because if he can run back to any of those races, he belongs right with these horses," Pletcher said. Henny Hughes (Hennessy), runner-up in the '05 Juvenile, is the choice for the Sprint, and F/M Turf contender Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) is favored as well. She tries to follow in the footsteps of Da Hoss, who is the only horse to date to skip a year between BC wins, taking the Mile in 1996 and, after a long hiatus, in '98. Ouija Board earned an Eclipse after her popular triumph in 2004, but couldn't catch the free-running Intercontinental (GB) last year, coming up 1 1/4 lengths short.



What a difference six months can make. In May, a regally bred but untested colt named Bernardini was merely a blip on the radar of most racing fans. Now, on

the eve of the Breeders' Cup, all eyes are on the superlative three-vear-old, who rides a six-race winning streak into the Classic. Bernardini's skein includes the GI Preakness S .-at what now seems an absurd 12-1--the GII Jim Dandy S., Adam Coglianese the GI Travers S., and a 6 3/4length tally in the Oct. 7 GI

Jockey Club Gold Cup. The Darley Stable homebred is now just one win away from giving Sheikh Mohammed's operation its first American Horse of the Year. "This was a plan and a vision that Sheikh Mohammed had a few years ago, with the purchase of the Jonabell and trying to establish a meaningful stallion operation in the U.S.," said Darley President Jimmy Bell. "To have Bernardini come along so early is pretty remarkable."

The Contenders...

Playing Seabiscuit to Bernardini's War Admiral is Lava Man. A rags-to-riches story, a \$50,000 claim with a \$3.8 million bankroll, the five-year-old gelding has been

unbeatable on the West Coast this year. A perfect seven-forseven, he completed the sweep of the GI Santa Anita H., GI Hollywood Gold Cup and GI Pacific Classic, all at 10 furlongs, and got the perfect prep for this with a facile win in the GII Goodwood BC H. at Santa Anita Oct. 7. However, there is one knock

against Lava Man. His three starts away from California last year were disastrous, and trainer Doug O'Neill shipped Lava Man to Kentucky just a few days following the Goodwood in an effort to get him as settled as possible for the biggest test of his career.

The Contenders, cont.

The other logical spoiler is Invasor (Arg), the South American sensation. He has annexed all three of his U.S. starts this year, winning the GI Pimlico Special, GI

Suburban H. and GI Whitney H., but did lose valuable training time in late September after spiking a fever. No South American-bred horse has ever hit the board in the Classic, and only two have even started in the race: Festin (Arg) in '91 (6th); and Gentleman (Arg) in '98 (eased). Invasor could reverse that form. There are two Europeans who hope to give the continent its first Classic winner since Invasor Arcangues' 133-1 shocker in

1993. Both are trying dirt for the first time. Last year's juvenile champ in Europe, George Washington (Ire) represents Team Coolmore. He won the English G1 2000 Guineas in May and recently annexed the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot. David Junior's wins this year include the G1 Dubai Duty Free and the July 8 G1 Coral-Eclipse S. Off since, he's got more than the surface switch to overcome to figure in the mix here.

Wild Card...

That would be Sun King. He's tough, durable and is usually right there. Wins have been hard to come by this season for the Nick Zito trainee, but in his last four he's been beaten only a combined 4 3/4 lengths and, if the GI Whitney H. had been nine furlongs and two feet, he likely would have defeated Invasor that day.



"We always knew she was a nice filly and she'd proven that before we got her. But she obviously has exceeded expectations to be perfect this year. We're just hoping she can give us one more big effort."

Wild Card...

Happy Ticket, first or second in 17 of 19 career starts, looks to make amends for an 11th-place finish behind Pleasant Home in last year's Distaff. The pride of Louisiana exited that 30 1/2-length defeat with an entrapped epiglottis and subsequently underwent throat surgery. She returned to her winning ways in her fiveyear-old bow at Evangeline, and added thrilling secondplace finishes in the Mar. 11 GIII Azeri Breeders' Cup S. and the Apr. 8 GI Apple Blossom H. at Oaklawn before annexing the GII Fleur de Lis H. over this strip June 17. Shipped to Del Mar for the GII Clement L. Hirsch H. Aug. 6, she was second-best behind Healthy Addiction. The Stewart Madison homebred figures to go off at a solid number here off a sixth-place finish in the Oct. 8 GI Juddmonte Spinster S. at Keeneland after a tardy beginning.

The Contenders...

Even with morning-line favorite Fleet Indian and Grade I winners Pool Land and Spun Sugar entered in the Distaff, Pletcher remains modest. "Not necessarily," Pletcher said when asked if the Distaff was his best

chance at a Breeders' Cup win. "It's a very competitive race. I think a total of 14 Grade I winners are entered, so it's a large competitive field and obviously a very tough field. I'm very pleased with the way all three fillies are doing. And I think all three have chances to be right there. We're just hoping all three show up and run their race and we'll see what happens." Pool Land enters the Distaff off a two-length tally in Belmont's GI

Ruffian H. Sept. 10. Spun Sugar,

heroine of Saratoga's GI Go For Wand H. July 30, didn't seem to care for the Polytrack last time, finishing eighth in the Spinster. Although winless in six attempts this season since returning from a bout with colic, it's hard not to like Balletto. The chestnut has finished second in four out of her last five starts, including narrow defeats behind Spun Sugar in the Go For Wand and Fleet Indian in the Beldame. The Darley colorbearer was runner-up behind Sweet Catomine in the 2004 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Lone Star.

streak: the GI Shoemaker BC Mile, GI Eddie Read H., GII Del Mar BC H. and, in his latest, the Oct. 7 GII Oak Tree BC Mile. "He's just a tremendous horse, a tremendous athlete," jockey Corey Nakatani said after the Oak Tree. "When you ask him, he gives it to you." Nakatani will have to time Aragorn's impressive kick perfectly in this full field. Trainer Neil Drysdale saddled War Chant to capture the Mile the last time it was con-Aragorn Benoit Photo tested at Churchill; that son of Danzig also prepped with a victory in the

Oak Tree BC Mile. This will be Aragorn's career finale: he is slated to enter stud in 2007 at Lane's End.

The Contenders...

Gorella (Fr) came up 3/4 of a length short last year when third to two of the division's best. Artie Schiller

and Leroidesanimaux (Brz). Her only loss in five 2006 outings came when fifth, beaten 1 3/4 lengths, to the boys in the nine-furlong GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic over this course May 6. Since then, her late burst of acceleration has carried her to victories in the GII Just a Game BC H. at Belmont June 10, the GI Beverly D. S. at Arlington Aug. 12 and the GII First Lady S. at Keeneland Oct. 14. The chestnut will seek to become the fourth individual distaffer to capture the Mile, following Royal Heroine (Ire) Gorella ('84), Miesque ('87-88), Ridgewood

The bay shocked George Washington (Ire) in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and followed up with a victory in the G1 St. James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot. He was fifth as the even-money favorite in the G1 Sussex S., but returned to run an excellent second to George Washington in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. Sept. 23 at Ascot. Three previous Mile winners prepped in the Queen Elizabeth--Miesque ('87), Barathea (Ire) ('94) and Ridgewood Pearl (GB) ('95)-all of them finishing second at Ascot.

There is also the "A" team from Ballydoyle, Aussie Rules and Ad Valorem. Aussie Rules landed the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains before finishing out of the frame in his next four starts. Shipped to Keeneland, the grey had blinkers added and was treated with Lasix for the GI Shadwell Turf Mile Oct. 7. The result? He split horses late and kicked clear, prompting T.J. Comerford, assistant to trainer Aidan O'Brien, to comment, "The horses he's been taking on in Europe have been good, and he's just been knocking on the door. Today, he proved that he's just as good." Ad Valorem, ninth in last year's Mile, returned this season to land the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot and comes here off a rallying third in the GI Woodbine Mile Sept. 17.

Wild Card...

Librettist has a great deal of history to overcome if he is to win: only two of the previous 22 winners had been worse than second in their final prep, and one of those, Singletary in 2004, had finished third. The 1985 hero, Cozzene, checked in sixth in his penultimate outing. But Librettist had a fantastic summer in the Godolphin blue, capturing his first five starts in 2006, including the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville Aug. 13 and the G1 Prix de Moulin de Longchamp Sept. 3. He has been unbeatable in three starts this year, but Henny Hughes will have to buck history to become the seventh sophomore to take the Sprint. A quartet of



three-year-olds have been favored in the race, but all went down to defeat. Groovy, 2-5 in 1986, was an even fourth: Forestry went off the lukewarm 7-2 chalk in 1999 and also finished fourth; Dayjur, the 5-2 choice in 1990, jumped shadows not once, but twice, and ended up a neck behind Safely Kept; and the ill-fated Lost in the Fog, a 7-10 chance last year, tired to be seventh. The six Henny Hughes A Coglianese who have accomplished the feat did so at average odds of 15-1.

Henny Hughes does have the credentials to rewrite the books: the chestnut has won six of seven sprint starts. He trounced the competition in his age group in the GIII Jersey Shore BC S. and GI King's Bishop S., and handled a solid field of older horses in the Oct. 7 GI Vosburgh S. But he may be vulnerable after posting a lackluster final work, a half in :51.12 on the Belmont training track Sunday. "He's feeling so good," said trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "I wanted to do a little more with him [Sunday], but there was a very high wind. All is well."

Wild Card...

Is Henny Hughes the three-year-old to beat in the Sprint...or is it longshot Too Much Bling? The gray colt can handle just about any surface, as he proved winning at tracks as diverse as Thistledown, Santa Anita, Aqueduct and Calder. He is versatile, wiring the field in the GII San Vicente S. and coming from off the pace to take the GII Carry Back S. Trainer Bob Baffert decided after that July 15 score that the next stop would be the Breeders' Cup, and the Ohio-bred has trained like a freak for the race, posting a series of bullet works that have him on top of his game.

The Contenders...

Bordonaro would likely be undefeated this season had he not been hit in the face with his rival's whip in the

GI Bing Crosby H. in July. The fiveyear-old gelding crossed the finish line a half-length in arrears of Pure as Gold in that test, but blazed his way to a front-running victory in the Oct. 7 GI Ancient Title BC S., stopping the timer in 1:07 4/5. He has taken his show on the road with success, winning the Sunshine Millions Sprint at Gulfstream and the GIII Count Fleet Sprint H. at Oaklawn Park. Whoever the winner turns out to be, GII A.G. Vanderbilt Bordonaro BC H. winner War Front is the per-



fect candidate to complete the exacta. The four-yearold has been second in five of six 2006 starts, finishing a neck behind '05 Sprint hero Silver Train in the GII Tom Fool H., 2 1/4 lengths adrift of Pomeroy in the GI Forego S. and missing by 2 3/4 lengths when runner-up to Henny Hughes in the Vosburgh. Can you say back wheel? Kelly's Landing is the horse for the course. The dark bay owns the Churchill track record for six panels, getting the distance in 1:07.59 when taking the GIII Aristides BC H. in 2005, and has been first or second in all four sprint starts at the track. He comes off a rallying victory in the Oct. 7 GIII Phoenix BC S. at Keeneland.

No stranger to Group 1 company, the five-yearold, who comes here off 10 consecutive starts at this level, began the year with a fourth-place finish in the 12-furlong G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Nad al Sheba Horsephotos Mar. 25. Shortened back to 10 panels for the G1 Audemars

Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Sha Tin Apr. 23, the dark bay was only a head back in third behind winner Irridescence (SAf) and Best Gift (NZ). Moved up to face the boys for the 12-furlong G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom June 2, the champion found only last year's Turf winner Shirocco (Ger) too tough, but rebounded to defeat G1 Dubai World Cup hero Electrocutionist by a half length in the June 21 G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot. Fifth after encountering plenty of traffic during the running of Sandown's G1 Coral-Eclipse S. July 8, she recovered to eke out a victory over Alexander Goldrun (Ire) and Nannina (GB) in the G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood Aug. 5. Ouija Board appeared to be en route to another victory a furlong from home in the Sept. 9 G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown, but couldn't hold off the oncoming surge of Dylan Thomas (Ire), who was a neck best at the wire.

Wild Card...

Mauralakana (Fr), winner of last year's G3 Prix de Cabourg at Deauville, kicked off 2006 with a win in the seven-furlong Listed Prix Imprudence Apr. 4. A respectable fifth, beaten only 3 3/4 lengths, in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches May 14, she came from well off the pace to be sixth in the G1 Prix de Diane June 11. The three-year-old concluded her European campaign-and her tenure with Jean-Claude Rouget--with a good third after tracking the early leaders in the 10-furlong G3 Prix de Psyche Aug. 1. Turned over to Patrick Biancone for her U.S. bow, the bay was third behind Karen's Caper and Pommes Frites in the GIII Noble Damsel BC H. at Belmont Sept. 23 before finishing only 3/4 of a length behind winner Vacare in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland Oct. 14.

that track and trip Mar. 5, she had to settle for the runner-up spot behind Bushfire in the GI Ashland S. at Keeneland. Let go at 8-1 for the May 5 GI Kentucky Oaks, Wait a While came home an even fourth behind winner Lemons Forever, runner-up Ermine and Bushfire, but was later moved up to third following Bushfire's disqualification. That's the last time the three-year-old tasted defeat. A runaway winner when Belmont's GIII Sands Point S. was pulled off the turf June 3, the \$260,000 OBSFEB juvenile purchase looked like a monster when shipped to the West Coast for the 10-furlong GI American Oaks at Hollywood July 2. Rolling to a 4 1/2-length winner on the lawn that day, she added another flashy victory in her next outing, the GII Lake Placid S. at Saratoga Aug. 18. "This filly has been most impressive in her races on the grass," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "You don't see many horses dominate on the grass like she has." Not to be denied in yet another sojourn West, Wait a While showed her rivals her heels in the Sept. 30 GI Yellow Ribbon Invitational S., winning by 4 1/2 lengths and giving the sophomore her third consecutive Beyer figure in excess of a 100. "We have a three-year-old going a mile and three-eighths for the first time and going around three turns for the first time," Pletcher cautioned. "Obviously, when you run against a horse like Ouija Board, you have to run a top race to beat her. Hopefully, she is good enough to step up and take on an older, more experienced mare like that." Five-year-old Honey Ryder, winner of last year's GI E.P. Taylor S., gives the Eclipse Award-winning conditioner's team the added edge of experience. Winner of the GIII Orchid H. and GII Sheepshead Bay H. earlier this season, the grey nosed out ultra-consistent Film Maker in the 10-furlong GI Flower Bowl Invitational at Belmont Oct. 7.

She prepped for the Juvenile Fillies at Keeneland, going five furlongs in a bullet :58 3/5 Oct. 25 and a half in a bullet :47 Nov. 1. Trainer Patrick Biancone believes his charge is ready for her Breeders' Cup close-up. "If she were not, she would not run," Biancone said.

NYRA FILES FOR CHAPTER 11 PROTECTION

The New York Racing Association announced yesterday that it has filed a voluntary petition under Chapter 11 of United States Bankruptcy Code with the U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the Southern District of New York. "We always viewed filing for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection as a last option and, regrettably, NYRA's Board of Trustees felt that we were required to take this action to protect New York's Thoroughbred racing industry," NYRA President and CEO Charles Hayward said in a statement. "The goal of the filing is to maintain the current schedule of racing dates, purse structure, stakes program and all other racing operations. Chapter 11 bankruptcy does not mean going out of business. In fact, it is a constructive process that allows NYRA the opportunity to achieve financial reorganization while continuing to conduct world-class Thoroughbred racing without interruption." On Monday, NYRA rejected \$19million of a previously approved \$30-million state bailout, citing concerns over restrictions and conditions imposed by the Non-Profit Racing Association Oversight Board. NYRA continues to wait for final approval for construction of lucrative video slot terminals at Aqueduct. "It is unfortunate and frankly inexplicable why the State Lottery Division could not work out the details necessary to get the VLT construction underway at Aqueduct," said C Steven Duncker, chairman of the NYRA Board of Trustees. "It is all the more mystifying given the fact that VLTs have been put in operation at eight non-NYRA tracks around the state."


