As for the competition, the Hall of Fame horseman said, "I think it's a good field. Fleet Indian, she hasn't made a mistake so far. Balletto runs hard about every time. I would have to think that she's going to be pretty tough, too, but I think we'll take some beating." Pine Island would benefit from fast fractions, as would Balletto (UAE) (Timber Country), who came up a head short behind Fleet Indian (Indian Charlie) in the Oct. 7 GI Beldame S. "Hopefully it will be strong pace that will suit her and she can come with her late run again, and have a good, clean trip," trainer Tom Albertrani said. "And hopefully she can get that Grade I race this year that we've been looking for."

Trainer Doug O'Neill saddled Stevie Wonderboy to a 1 1/4-length score in last year's Juvenile. Can Great Hunter (Aptitude) make him the first trainer to win the race back-to-back since D. Wayne Lukas completed the three-peat with Capote ('86), Success Express ('87) and Is It True ('88)? Never worse than second, the colt proved he could handle the Juvenile distance with his 1 3/4-length win in the GI Breeders' Futurity. "He's doing fantastic," O'Neill said. "The similarities to 'Stevie' are still there for us. He's a big, strong and very matureacting colt. He's already a Grade I two-turn winner. All of those things have us pretty excited." Lukas, who also captured this race with Timber Country in 1994 and Boston Harbor in 1996, sends out Pegasus Wind (Fusaichi Pegasus). The colt set the pace before finishing third as a 21-1 outsider in the Oct. 14 GI Champagne S. Lukas is confident of his chances at a sixth Juvenile victory. "Sometimes you get the feeling you wanted to do something different or tweak something, but I am comfortable with where he is--he is ready to go," he stated.

JUVENILE FILLIES, \$2,000,000, 2yo, f, 1 1/16m

It's anybody's race--just ask the trainers. Todd Pletcher, conditioner of Cotton Blossom (Broken Vow)

and Octave (Unbridled's Song). termed this "the most wide-open race on the card." Eddie Plesa Jr. agrees. He sends out Adhrhythm (Adhocracy), a Calder-based filly who has won her last three starts by a combined 20 lengths. "You could run this race 10 different times and probably have seven different winners," Plesa said. Gosden, who secured the services of Alex Solis for his charge, said it was difficult to give explicit instructions. "I haven't got a strategy in mind," he said. "I think in the Mile, you just want to break well and hold your position and watch it develop." There are two Mile entrants carrying the Godolphin blue, Echo of Light (GB) (Dubai Millennium {GB}) and Librettist

Reform Act ships in for trainer Dermot Weld, whose overseas raids have proven very successful. The dark bay, produced by a full sister to ill-fated champion Pleasant Stage, landed the 12-furlong Listed Give Thanks S. at Cork Aug. 7 before running third over the same distance in Ascot's G3 Princess Royal S. Sept. 22. She will race with Lasix here. Heroine of the 2005 G2 Prix de Malleret, Royal Highness hasn't visited the winner's circle since, but has acquitted herself admirably in the interim. She began 2006 with a second in the G1 Prix Ganay Apr. 30 at Longchamp and concluded her French campaign with a third in the G1 Prix Vermeille Sept. 10 at the same Paris track. In her final outing for trainer Pascal Bary, the bay finished third to English Channel in the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Oct. 7 at Belmont. She adds Lasix in her first start for trainer Christophe Clement. "She's a very nice filly, but she hasn't won too often," Clement noted. "She's a typical stayer, so I'd say a mile and a half over good to soft ground would be ideal for her."





Flip through Fasig-Tipton's November catalog and it quickly becomes clear that there is a lot riding on today's Breeders' Cup races, and not just for the owners and trainers of the contestants. The results of nearly every Breeders' Cup race today could have direct impli-

cations on the value of several horses in tomorrow's sale. The GI Juvenile finds the GII Sanford S. runner-up **Teuflesberg** taking on the best two-year-olds in the country, a day before his dam **St**. **Michelle** (Devil's Bag) enters the ring as hip 220. The GI Sprint favorite


Henny Hughes will have a cheering section in hips 168 and 169. The latter is his half-sister by Housebuster, Our Donna; the former is Our Donna's Stephen Got Even weanling colt. Rose Colored Lady (Formal Dinner), cataloged as hip 192, is the dam of another Sprint hopeful in Too Much Bling (Rubiano). Miesque's Approval, 10-1 on the morning line in the GI Mile, has a half-sister, Magnificentaproval (Distant View), sell as hip 139. Healthy Addiction, a candidate in the GI Distaff, has two half-sisters sell: hip 16, the Arch filly Arch Lady; and hip 17, the sophomore Ashlee's Lady (Gilded Time). The gutsy English Channel plies his trade in the GI Turf. He is the first

foal out of **Belva** (Theatrical {Ire}), aka hip 30 at Newtown Paddocks.
Even the big one, the GI Classic, could play a major roll in the sale results. Hip 170 is the 12-yearold Irish River (Fr) mare **Paradise River**. In addition to being a half-sister to champion Paradise Creek

and two other Grade I winners, the bay is the dam of **David Junior**, a MG1SW who tries the dirt for the first time in the Classic. **Lava Man**'s dam **Li'l Ms. Leonard** (Nostaglia's Star) is hip 126; his half-sister **Jantastic** (Geri) is hip 112. And, of course, there are three fillies competing in the Breeders' Cup who themselves are part of the November catalog. Whether **Gorella (Fr)** (Grape Tree Road {GB}) and **Honey Ryder** (Lasting Approval), who are the favorite and third choice in the GI Mile and GI Filly and Mare Turf, respectively, will actually sell remains to be seen, while the GI Distaff contender **Sharp Lisa** (Dixieland Band) is one of several J. Paul Reddam horses that are set to go under the hammer at Newtown Paddocks.

'English' Patience Pays Off Big for Small Farm...

Ann McBrayer's Keene Ridge Farm sends just one broodmare to the ring at Fasig-Tipton, but she is a good one. Belva, an eight-year-old daughter of Theatrical (Ire) and a full to MGSW Hap and GISW Pharma, sells through the Keene Ridge consignment as hip 30 tomorrow, but first thing's first. This afternoon, Belva's first foal, English Channel, will look to add to his resume of three Grade I tallies when he takes on a competitive field in the Turf. "We'll be watching pretty closely," laughed Keene Ridge farm manager Charlie McKinlay. But regardless of whether he wins, the four-year-old English Channel has done plenty to recommend his young dam. English Channel was arguably the best sophomore grass horse in the country last year, winning the GIII Virginia Derby and running second in a pair of Grade I events. He has really asserted himself this year, however, with wins in the GI United Nations S., GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational S. and GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic S. Not bad for a horse that sold for \$50,000 as a yearling. It might have been a bad story for Keene Ridge had they parted ways with Belva after selling English Channel for that amount at the 2003 Keeneland September sale. Keene Ridge had purchased Belva privately two years earlier after the unraced filly had RNA'd for \$100,000 at the Keeneland November sale. In a deal brokered by Charlie Boden, Belva was sold to Keene Ridge carrying a Smart Strike colt: English Channel. "They were mostly attracted to her family," explained McKinlay, who joined Keene Ridge a few months after the purchase. "She's a fullsister to Hap and Pharma, out of a champion, and it looked like a good deal. They decided to take a shot." Belva initially paid only modest dividends for Keene Ridge when English Channel was knocked down to James Scatuorchio for what now looks like a huge bargain, but her second foal, a full to English Channel named Sedgefield, did better, selling for \$100,000 as a weanling in 2004. Then English Channel started winning, and Belva's stock soared. At the Keeneland September sale two months ago, her daughter by Street Cry (Ire) was knocked down to John Ferguson for \$750,000. Strike while the iron's hot, reasons McKinlay, and Keene Ridge has decided to offer Belva up at auction as well. "It's a tough decision to sell, but you very rarely catch lightning in a bottle, and when you do you have to take advantage of it," said McKinlay. "We're primarily a commercial farm." Keene Ridge won't be without ties to English Channel if Belva's surpases her reserve, however. They plan to keep and race his weanling half-sister by Aldebaran. "She's a very nice filly," said McKinlay. "She took weaning in stride and is now just hanging out in the field." Remarkably, Keene Ridge, a 170-acre breeding and boarding operation with just 12 permanent broodmares, owns the dam of another Breeders' Cup starter, Honey Ryder's mother Cuando Quiere.

Sale or No Sale? The Question for Gorella, Honey Ryder...
Will they or won't they? Two of the country's top turf fillies, Gorella (Fr) (Grape Tree Road {Fr}) and Honey
Ryder (Lasting Approval), have been cataloged for the Fasig-Tipton sale, but the owners of each have been

open about having reservations. Parting with stars that have great potential as broodmares is tough, but it also stands to reason that both have a lot of racing left in them as well. And that's not to mention sentimental value. Of the two. however, Honey Ryder, owned by Glencrest Farm's John Greathouse in partnership, is the more likely to go under the hammer. "As of right

now, we are planning to sell her," said Glencrest's David Greathouse, John's brother and a partner in Four Star Sales, which consigns the five-year-old. "She's coming into the Breeders' Cup great and, hopefully, she'll run well. That will help us decide what we do with her." Honey Ryder, cataloged as hip 100, has won 12 of 28 races, including two Grade Is, for earnings of over \$1.8 million. David Greathouse said the filly's competitive spirit is what makes her such a desirable horse, either as a racing or broodmare prospect. "Any horse that's been in eight races that have been decided by a half-length or less, and won them all, I don't think there's any question how much heart she has," he commented. "She's got a heart as big as her body." While Honey Ryder is probable, it looks increasingly unlikely that Gorella will go through the ring tomorrow. Owner Martin Schwartz said that he would leave his options open until the last minute, but indicated that he would probably retain ownership of the charismatic four-vear-old.

ClassicStar Disperal Features Big Names...

About four years ago, ClassicStar LLC jumped into the fray of Thoroughbred breeding in a big way. The Kentucky-based company secured premium broodmares, including the likes of Xtra Heat and



Turko's Turn, dam of Horse of the Year Point Given. But legal problems that surfaced earlier this year when the IRS raided its Versailles office have forced ClassicStar to sell off the majority of its breeding and racing stock. In July, it was announced that Fasig-Tipton would handle the dispersal, with Taylor Made Sales Agency consigning. "It's a very, very nice group of horses with some sensational mares in the package,

and we're thrilled to have them," said Fasig-Tipton's Boyd Browning Jr. While Xtra Heat and Turko's Turn, a late scratch, won't be offered, there are some fillies and mares that are sure to be popular with buyers. One of the highlights of the dispersal, the members of which are interspersed throughout the catalog, is hip 22, a full to champion racemare Ashado. In addition to being a sister to the world-record \$9 million broodmare, Ballado's Halo (Saint Ballado) is a full to this year's GII Peter Pan S. winner and GI Belmont S. third Sunriver, as well as to stakes winner Saint Stephen.

Herself stakes-placed, Ballado's Halo sells in foal to Elusive Quality. Hip <u>64</u> is the mare **Drina** (Regal and Royal), whose three stakes winners include Spain, GI Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine and the one-time leading female money-earner. **Hookedonthefeelin** (Citidancer) sells as hip <u>102</u>. In addition to being a Grade I winner, the 10-year-old's first foal is Pussycat Doll, twice a winner at racing's highest level. The smartly bred 10-

year-old mare **Song to Remember** (Storm Cat) is the dam of this year's GI Garden City Breeders' Cup S. victress Magnificent Song. Here as hip 213, she is in foal to leading sire Distorted Humor. One of the last through the ring will be hip 250, the stakes winner **Win's Fair Lady** (Dehere). A full to MGSW Graeme Hall and a half to GISW Harmony Lodge and GSW Win

McCool, she sold to ClassicStar for \$2.2 million at last year's Keeneland November sale. It's a sale company's dream to have horses like these gracing its auction ring, but after lawsuits were leveled against ClassicStar in September, alleging improprieties in its mare lease programs, some wondered whether the status of the dispersal would be affected. Cont. p13

Fasig-Tipton officials, however, say they expect the dispersal to go off without a hitch. "We've been in very regular contact with representatives of ClassicStar, and they've kept us apprised of the situation they've been involved in," said Browning. "We've had confidence all along that the horses would be offered for sale in a straight-forward, professional manner. We're looking forward to Sunday and selling those horses for them."

State of the Market...

Many believe that the performance of bloodstock sales roughly corresponds to that of yearling sales, and with all the major yearling auctions in the books, there is both good and bad news for sellers, according to Fasig-Tipton's Boyd Browning Jr. "I anticipate a continuation of what we saw in the yearling sales," he commented. "There's going to be significant demand for quality offerings, and diminished interest in the lessthan-desirable offerings. There's a very strong market for proven producers or for young mares on an early cover, or for horses coming off the race track with good records. The horses with very few holes will sell very well. But the market's going to be demanding. They're going to want very few question marks and they're going to want quality."



"What more could you ask for?" Good Reward heads to stud with a record of 26-5-2-7 and earnings of \$1,087,687.

RMTC ADDRESSES FUTURE PLANS; RETAINS GALLAGHER AS CONSULTANT

During its meeting Nov. 2, in Louisville, Kentucky, the board of directors of the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC) announced future plans regarding anabolic steroids and out-of-competition drug testing, and received an update on ongoing projects related to the development of withdrawal times for therapeutic medications. The RMTC also announced it has retained Jim Gallagher, who most recently was executive director of the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority, as a regulatory and security consultant. Following a presentation from a sub-committee on the predominately unrestricted use and lack of uniform testing protocols for anabolic steroids in U.S. horse racing, the RMTC reaffirmed its commitment to present recommendations to the industry on the regulation of these drugs in December at the University of Arizona Symposium on Racing. In light of the recently introduced confirmation test for the blood-doping agent Erythropoietin (EPO) by the University of Pennsylvania, the RMTC approved a proposed draft of a rule regarding out-of-competition drug testing that will be forwarded to the Model Rules Committee of the Association of Racing Commissioners International, RMTC Executive Director Dr. Scot Waterman and Dr. Rick Sams of the University of Florida reported that the RMTC will soon complete a pilot project on eight therapeutic medications: acepromazine, lidocaine, mepivacaine, pyrilamine, glycopyrrolate, butorphanol, methacarbomol and detomidine. The goal of the pilot project is to develop the necessary protocols for research into developing scientifically defensible withdrawal times that will begin later this year. NJ Agriculture Department Expands Quarantine:

In an effort to curtail the spread of the equine herpes virus, the New Jersey Department of Agriculture's Division of Animal Health has expanded its guarantine to include the Mid-Atlantic Veterinary Clinic in Ringoes. The new quarantine was issued after a horse recovering from colic surgery at the clinic tested positive for EHV. The horse had been stabled at Monmouth Park, but was shipped out on Oct. 21, six days before the quarantine was imposed. An initial test for the disease was negative, but the horse underwent a second test earlier this week and that proved positive. Thirty-six horses which either came into contact with the horse at the clinic, or with those exposed at the clinic, have now been tested as well. "This case in Ringoes shows the vital importance of quarantines for diseases like equine herpes," said New Jersey Secretary of Agriculture Charles M. Kuperus. "Just one horse that left Monmouth Park before the guarantine was imposed there has now created the necessity for tests of 36 others. Multiply that by the more than 1,000 horses at the racetrack and you can see how diseases like this can spread exponentially unless quarantine measures are taken." All of the horses housed in the medical and surgical barns at Mid-Atlantic were moved, and the barns were cleaned and disinfected twice. With strict biosecurity measures now in place, the clinic will continue to treat patients.


