

#### **REDDAM LOOKING 'SHARP' AT FASIG-TIPTON** It's been some weekend for J. Paul Reddam. On Saturday, the Canadian-born, California-based business-



man was on hand at Churchill Downs to watch his Red Rocks (Ire) stage the 10-1 upset in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. That would be enough for most people to uncork the bubbly, but Reddam had reason to postpone the celebration. After making the 70-mile trip down to Lexington for yesterday's Fasig-Tipton November Selected Mixed sale, Reddam watched as two fillies he raced set off pair of furious bidding duels. When the dust settled, it was Reddam's multiple Grade I winner Sharp Lisa (Dixieland Band) that brought the

sale's top price of \$3.4 million. The BBA Ireland's Adrian Nicol made the winning bid. "It's for an international partnership, but that's all I can say," said Nicol. The sale of Sharp Lisa came about two hours after Andujar (Quiet American), another filly that wore Reddam's purple and white colors, was knocked down to My Meadowview Farm for \$2.5 million. "I was surprised," admitted Reddam. "Actually, I thought Andujar

would bring more than Sharp Lisa. [But Sharp Lisa's] got the bloodlines, she's all racehorse and they made a good purchase. Dixieland Band is a great broodmare sire and having Dynaformer on her bottom side is great. She's a Grade I winner on dirt and a Grade II winner on Sharp Lisa turf and she was all heart."

#### LET THE GOOD TIMES ROLL

There's a generally good feeling in Lexington these days. Keeneland conducted a very successful first meeting over the newly installed Polytrack surface, horses that prepped for the Breeders' Cup performed admirably on championship day for the most part, and, heck, even the University of Kentucky added to the fun, upsetting the University of Georgia in football on Saturday. The November Breeding Stock Sale kicks off this morning and buyers from all over the world--including Japan, Australia and New Zealand--will converge on Central Kentucky for an opportunity to purchase prized racing and broodmare prospects. "We are very optimistic that the record-breaking momentum of our September sale will carry into November," said Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "As always, our November catalog offers an extensive number of stakes producers and stakes-winning fillies and mares, as well as weanlings by some of the hottest young sires around." Mares in foal to 293 different stallions, including such established sires as A.P. Indy, Distorted Humor, Dynaformer, Elusive Quality, Forestry, Fusaichi Pegasus, Giant's Causeway, Gone West, Kingmambo, Pulpit, Redoute's Choice (Aus), Seeking the Gold, Storm Cat and Unbridled's Song, will be offered. Also cataloged are mares in foal to such promising young sires as Aldebaran, Eddington, Empire Maker, Eurosilver, Ghostzapper, Johannesburg, Leroides-animaux (Brz), Limehouse, Mineshaft, North Light (GB), Officer, Orientate, Pollard's Vision, Powerscourt (GB), Purge, Rock Hard Ten, Roman Ruler, Saint Liam, Smarty Jones, Speightstown, Strong Hope and Vindication, among others. #### Looking For Lisa...

Purchased privately by Reddam and partners Pablo Suarez and Mark Schlesinger after beginning her career at Calder, Sharp Lisa ran second in the 2004 GII Alcibiades S., then came back at three to annex the GI Las Virgenes S. and GII Santa Ynez S. As a four-yearold of 2006, she also won the GII Santa Barbara S. on the turf and, in her career finale, finished sixth in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. "She ran very well yesterday and was probably a little unlucky she wasn't closer," said Nicol, who did his bidding from the rear walking ring. "We liked her physique, we liked her page, and we like her racing ability. It's very hard to buy these sort of animals."

#### Distorted Humor Gets a New Girlfriend...

Add one Kentucky Oaks winner to the book of mares set to visit Distorted Humor in 2007. Bidding on behalf of WinStar Farm, Elliott Walden outlasted all competition to land Summerly (Summer Squall), winner in 2005, from the consignment of Eaton Sales, agent. "She's an awesome physical," said WinStar President



Doug Cauthen. "Obviously, it's a great sale and it's tough to buy anything. We've been trying to bid on some horses for Bluegrass Cat and Distorted Humor and we were getting shut out a little bit, but we were happy to get this one. We felt this was a mare we had to get." Cauthen believes the mating to Distorted Humor is a promising one. "She's got great

balance," he explained. "We think it's a great physical match. [Distorted Humor] can go with so many kinds of mares. He can go with a mare that's 15.3 or a mare that's 16.3. She's right in the middle of that and we think it could be a rocket ship." WinStar went deep into the bidding on Sharp Lisa with the intent of sending her to Bluegrass Cat. WinStar bred Sharp Lisa from the Dynaformer mare Winter's Gone. WinStar has that mare in foal to Storm Cat and also own and race Sharp Susan (Touch Gold), a maiden winner over the Belmont turf Sept. 29.

#### Jackson Gets Hooked...

Jess Jackson outlasted Betty Moran after an extended bidding war to land hip <u>102</u>, the 10-year-old mare **Hookedonthefeelin** (Citidancer). Consigned by Taylor Made for the ClassicStar dispersal, Jackson,



seated beside his advisor John Moynihan, responded to a \$2.8-million bid from Moran and company with a \$2.9-million offer of his own and walked away with the attractive chestnut, winner of the 1999 GI La Brea S. "We didn't expect to have to go that high, but she's a very beautiful mare--one of the best in the sale," a smiling Jackson commented while signing the ticket. Added Moynihan, "She's a beautiful, beautiful mare, a Grade I winner, she has beautiful babies. The two-year-old is a very nice

horse and we hope he is going to run well." Owned during her racing career by Mike Pegram, Hookedonthefeelin was logically bred in her first year at stud to Pegram's Real Quiet, the 1998 Kentucky Derby hero. The result was Pussycat Doll, a homebred for Pegram who emulated her dam by winning last year's La Brea. For good measure, she tacked on a win in this year's GI Humana Distaff H., upsetting stablemate Behaving Badly in the process. Pegram sold Hookedonthefeelin in foal to Deputy Minister for \$1.525 million to ClassicStar at the 2002 Keeneland November sale. Moynihan went to \$600,000 for a twoyear-old colt by Unbridled's Song at last year's Keeneland September sale. The dam of a Vindication yearling of this year and a weanling by Unbridled's Song, Hookedonthefeelin sold in foal to Distorted Humor. Moynihan indicated that Stonestreet would sell the subsequent produce from the mare.

#### 'Lady' is a Star...

Hill 'n' Dale Bloodstock went to \$1.3 million for the three-year-old **Diplomat Lady** (Forestry), winner of last term's GI Hollywood Starlet. Stationed to the right of



the press box on the second floor of the sale pavilion, Hill 'n' Dale's John Sikura fought off all challengers for the filly, who was purchased for "a group of us guys," said Sikura. Out of three-time stakes-winner Playcaller (Saratoga Six), Diplomat Lady has won four of her 12 starts for over \$550,000 in

earnings. In addition to the Starlet, she captured the 2006 GII Stonerside Beaumont S. at Keeneland in April. Most recently, she was second in her turf debut, the Oct. 15 Harold C. Ramser Sr. H. at Santa Anita for owner Charles Cono. Cono sold the filly as hip 60 through Taylor Made Sales Agency. "I just thought she was really good value, being a Grade I winner," said Sikura when asked what attracted him to the filly. "I thought she was a \$1.5 to \$2 million mare, so in this market, I thought she was well bought. I really liked her physically." Sikura said Diplomat Lady would stay in training, but said a trainer had not been picked out. "We'll get her home and start all over on her," he said. "We'll figure it out from there. There's no hurry." Asked if he thought one of his stallions matched her particularly well, and if he bought her with that in mind, Sikura said, "We just try to buy a nice horse. If we have success [with her as a racehorse], we'll continue for a while. If not, we'll bring her home and breed her, and who knows what sire opportunities will be available at that time." A \$120,000 Keeneland September yearling in 2004, Diplomat Lady resold for \$400,000 as a Fasig-Tipton February juvenile to trainer Christopher Pasch, who conditioned the filly for Cono.

#### Skar-ing Off the Competition...

He had some determined rivals bidding in the front of the sale pavilion, but Skara Glen Stables' Ira Gumberg held fast and landed the lone offering in the sale he bid on, the Storm Cat filly Kamarinskaya. Gumberg purchased the three-year-old dark bay, who was cataloged as a racing or broodmare prospect, for \$2.2 million from the consignment of Eaton Sales, agent. "I thought she had the best page in the sale, and with her race record, we thought she was an outstanding broodmare prospect," said Gumberg, who did his bidding while leaning against the rail of the rear walking ring. The impeccably bred Kamarinskaya was produced by Mr. P's Princess, a Mr. Prospector half-sister to MGISW Menifee and MGISW Desert Wine, thus making Kamarinskaya a half to dual Group 1 winner and threetime champion Fasliyev. Bred by Pacelco S A and raced by Michael Tabor, Kamarinskaya lived up to her pedigree on the track. At two, she was twice placed in stakes company while still a maiden, in the G3 C.L. Weld Park S. and in the Listed Flame of Tara European Breeders Fund S. She was still a maiden at three when she won the G3 1000 Guineas Trial S. at Leopardstown in her sophomore bow in April. She went unplaced in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 1000 Guineas) and the May 29 G1 Irish 1000 Guineas in what would be her final career start. "We're going to breed her [next year]," confirmed Gumberg. "We haven't decided who we'll go to, but I think with her pedigree somebody like Mr. Greeley, a Gone West stallion, might be good." Skara Glen, an operation that breeds primarily for the sales, bred and sold this year's GI Belmont S. hero Jazil.

#### Vacare Heading East...

Lothenbach Stables' **Vacare** (Lear Fan) is headed to the barn of Christophe Clement after Jon Kelly went to \$2.8 million to acquire the GI Queen Elizabeth II Chal-

lenge Cup winner from the consignment of Drew Nardiello's Chesapeake Farm. Kelly, who was the cobreeder and co-owner of MGISW Borrego, had to work to attract the attention of the closest bidspotter as he jumped into the fray at about the \$2-million mark, but suc-

cessfully saw off all bidders. "Everything," he responded when asked what he liked about the three-year-old. "She can be bred across the board. She a little small, reminded me a little bit of Megahertz, but she's done what she needs to have done this year and I look forward to the next racing season. It's pretty exciting." Vacare will race for Kelly and his wife Sarah and Don Cimpl. Added Nardiello, "It's over 100 times more than what we turned down as a yearling and Mr. Lothenbach is ecstatic. She did everything we asked her to do as a racehorse. She's a delight to be around, she's pure class. She's one of the few fillies you saw here that had a shank over her nose and not a lip shank. It's a pure delight to have raised a Grade I winner like this." A perfect four-for-four in her young career, Vacare took the GII Pucker Up S. in addition to her QE II triumph. She has earnings of \$466,000.

### What They're Saying At The Sales...

#### John Sikura, Hill 'n' Dale Farms:

"I saw a lot of horses bought back early in the sale. I think sometimes people have unreasonable expectations. Sometimes you take them home and that proves correct, and sometimes you wished you would have sold. It's a very fluid thing, values going up and down, and sometimes it takes years to see if you did the right or wrong thing."

#### An Island Unto Himself...

On more than one occasion, Island Fashion (Petionville) has been entered to sell at auction and on more than one occasion, owner Jeff Nielsen decided to hang onto his prized mare, withdrawing her prior to the sales. Nielsen, who operates Everest Stables, finally allowed the gray mare to go under the hammer at Fasig-Tipton last night, but once again, Nielsen decided to retain the mare, as she failed to meet her reserve when bidding stalled out at an even \$2 million. "We were hoping for a little more than that," said Pope McLean, whose Crestwood Farm consigned the sixyear-old. "She's such a nice racemare and we felt she was worth more than that. She was so versatile." Island Fashion proved to be one of the best of her generation in 2003, when she took the GI Alabama S. going 10 furlongs at Saratoga and closed the season with a victory in the seven-furlong GI La Brea S., attracting more than a few votes for an Eclipse Award. She raced

on nicely at four, winning the GI Santa Monica H. before running second to Southern Image in the GI Santa Anita H. and also placed twice in the GI John C. Mabee H. on the turf. In the end, it was too tough to part with the mare if the money wasn't there. "We have mixed emotions about

it," McLean continued. "I know Jeff would hate to see her go, and maybe he's somewhat happy that he still has her. She's like a member of the family for the Nielsens. It's once in a lifetime that you have something that good. In the long run, we'll probably come out way ahead. Hopefully we'll get a good foal out of her and there's no telling what that could bring." McLean added that Island Fashion would return to Crestwood Farm where a decision will be made on her immediate future.

#### First Things First for Reddam...

Playing the warm-up act to Sharp Lisa was Andujar, who sold as hip 135. Reddam was sitting to the left side of the sale pavilion when the Grade II winner stepped into the ring, which, as it happened, put him right in the middle of the action. As bidding raced past the million-dollar mark, two groups near Reddam locked horns and went at it until Lincoln Collins, acting on behalf of My Meadowview Farm's Leonard Riggio, secured Andujar at \$2.5 million. "She's a lovely, big, scopey mare," said Collins. "To me, she's everything you'd want to see in a broodmare. We're starting a broodmare band, and this is the kind of mare you want...if you can afford it." Collins said that Riggio, who sat alongside Collins with trainer Nick Zito, was looking to start a "small but very selective" band of broodmares who will most likely be based in Kentucky. Collins added that Andujar would be bred to A.P. Indy ("If we can get to him," he said modestly), in part because the A.P. Indy/Quiet American cross produced Bernardini and A.P. Warrior. My Meadowview is best known as the owner of Noble Causeway. After the sale, Reddam was all smiles, but admitted to having mixed emotions. "It's kind of bittersweet, because [Andujar] was a big favorite of mine," he said. "She was a fantastic mare and it was unfortunate that she got injured on the racetrack, because I thought her best days were ahead of her. I think she's going to make a great broodmare. If I were in that business, she's the one I'd jump on." After beginning her career in Europe, Andujar was purchased privately by Reddam and brought to America. She won three of her first four starts in the U.S., including a rousing seven-length tally in the GII Milady BC H. in 2005. She also finished a close-up third in last year's GI Vanity H. On a night when several high-profile lots failed to meet their reserve, Reddam said he had come to Newtown Paddocks to sell. "We set a very low reserve, because we weren't here to play games," he said. "The folks at [consignor] Taylor Made said there was enough action on her and weren't really concerned about that. I was confident she'd bring over \$2 million, but how far over, I didn't know." In the 1980's TV show the A-Team, George Peppard's ever-succinct character Hannibal used to say "I love it when a plan comes together," and it's hard to think of a better way to sum up Reddam's weekend. "This is the best of all possible worlds, to buy a horse privately for reasonable money, have a great time racing them and then sell them for a big profit on the end," Reddam said. "It doesn't get any better than that." A-men.

#### Close But No Cigar on Belva...

Always a game performer, the four-year-old grass star English Channel came up a bit short in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Turf, finishing third behind Red Rocks



(Ire). It was a similar story yesterday for his dam Belva, who was led out of the Fasig-Tipton sale ring unsold at \$2 million.
 Things started quickly for the eight-year-old mare, in foal to Horse of the Year Ghostzapper, with bidding escalating past the seven-figure mark. Slowing

as the price neared \$2 million, bidding stalled out completely at that mark as auctioneer Terence Collier implored buyers for more, perhaps indicating the reserve was close to being surpassed. Charlie McKinlay, the farm manager for owner and consigner Keene Ridge Farm, confirmed that was the case. "Yeah, we weren't far away," he said. Standing in front of Belva's stall afterwards, he added, "We're a bit disappointed, but she's still a pretty nice mare to be taking home." McKinlay said that a deal still might be reached in the coming days to sell the mare privately. "There's a couple days of Keeneland, so for those people that get shut out, there's a chance we'll still get some more offers for her," said McKinlay. By Theatrical (Ire), the unraced Belva, bought privately by Keene Ridge in 2001 after she had RNA'd for \$100,000 at the Keeneland November sale, is a full-sister to MGSW Hap and GISW Pharma. English Channel was her first foal.

#### Hamming It Up...

Tim Hamm, a leading trainer on the Ohio circuit, went to \$20,000 for a then two-year-old filly named Rose Colored Lady (Formal Dinner) at the 1996 OBS April Sale and made the most of that purchase, training her to eight wins, including one stakes success, for earnings of \$139,294. As solid as she was as a racemare, the dark bay produced three stakes winners from her first three foals, the third of which is an Ohio-bred son of Rubiano named Too Much Bling. A 19 1/2-length maiden winner at second asking, Hamm and his family, which operate Blazing Meadows Farm, accepted an offer from Stonerside Stables to sell an 80-percent interest in the colt. In 2006, Too Much Bling has become one of the top sophomore sprinters, with wins in the GII Carry Back S., the GII San Vicente S. and the GIII Bay Shore S. Yesterday, Hamm and his family parted ways with Rose Colored Lady, selling her to Jess Jackson for \$750,000. "She was our first stakes winner that we ever raced and trained," Hamm explained. "It's sad to sell a horse that have been with you and that have been good to you, but at the same time, she's getting a great home. We have four daughters out of the mare, all stakes winners. She's been great to us. No regrets." The conditioner also reflected on Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. "In that race, whoever got the best trip--and [Saturday] maybe had the one hole--was going to have a big advantage. He ran a good race, he gets beat seven for all of it and three lengths for second and he had a lot of trouble, as did half the field. But I thought he ran a good race." Hamm estimates that Blazing Meadows has made about \$2.3 million from their original \$20,000 investment. He added that Too Much Bling will likely be pointed for the GI Malibu S. at Santa Anita Dec. 26.

Not seconds after the hammer dropped did John Greathouse have trainer Todd Pletcher on the phone. "I know it's an imposition and all, but I want her back

with you as soon as possible." He was speaking of **Honey Ryder** (Lasting Approval), who was led out of the Fasig-Tipton sales ring unsold after a final bid of \$1.8 million. "She wasn't anywhere close to selling," Greathouse said, adding that they were "a little more than

halfway there." Coming off her third-place finish behind Ouija Board (GB) in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf, Honey Ryder made a lovely appearance in the ring, and Greathouse is only too happy to hang on to her for a six-year-old campaign. "She won \$1 million this year [\$988,500], she won \$1 million last year [\$910,979]," he said. "We always felt that she would be better at four than she was at three and as good or better at five than she was at four and at six the same way. Todd remarked to me the other morning, 'you find me another five-year-old with ankles and shins and knees as cold as this mare.'" And with that, it was off to an awaiting Sallee van. "She leaves in the next five minutes to go right back over [to Churchill Downs] and it's the last time she'll ever go through a sales ring," Greathouse stated unequivocally. "I tried to sell her three times and haven't had any luck yet. She's very special to us and it was a pretty easy decision for us [not to sell]." Currently, Honey Ryder has 12 wins from 27 starts, all on the grass, and earnings of \$2,043,309.

"We really had some great mares and it was a fantastic horse sale," said Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson. A total of 14 horses realized seven-figure pricetags while seven of those eclipsed the \$2-million mark. How has Fasig-Tipton gone about increasing the quality of its catalog over the recent years? "It started a couple of years ago with the dam of Smarty Jones," Robertson said. "Last year we had a great horse sale and we built on that and people rewarded us with nice horses."

Following her 2 1/4-length defeat of old foe Film Maker to record win number two in the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf at Churchill Downs, the seven-time Group 1 winner began her journey to Tokyo for the Nov. 26 G1 Japan Cup, departing Louisville for New York yesterday. "There is no problem at all with her and she's great," said Robin Trevor Jones, assistant to trainer Ed Dunlop. "She ate everything on Saturday night and she didn't have a hard race at all. We'll see

how she is in New York, but the main plan now is to go and head off to Japan and have another crack at the Japan Cup." Lord Derby's pride and joy was fifth to Alkaased last year before winning the G1 Hong Kong Vase at Sha Tin, and that contest should see her sign off her career Dec. 10. "The plan is to go to Hong Kong as well in December and at the moment she's perfectly right," the assistant added.

#### **ROUND POND TO RETURN IN 2007?**

**Round Pond** (Awesome Again), winner of Saturday's Breeders' Cup Distaff, may return to the race in 2007, according to trainer Michael Matz Sunday. "[Rick Porter] was going to retire her before the race, and then yesterday, he said he might race her," Matz explained. "I think after we get her back home, we'll take a look at her and see what he wants to do." The four-year-old filly, who came out of the race with a minor cut on her right front leg, was scheduled to ship to Fair Hill Training Center in Maryland yesterday.

#### **MOTION OUTLINES PLANS FOR DUO**

Trainer Graham Motion outlined plans for his talented pair of Breeders' Cup starters, **Better Talk Now** (Talkin Man) and **Film Maker** (Dynaformer), both runner up in

their respective divisions on the turf Saturday. According to Motion, Better Talk Now may race again this year. "We'll get together and contemplate the Hong Kong Cup if he runs again this year," said Motion. As for a 2007 campaign for the 2004 Breeders' Cup Turf champion? "Who's to

say he won't run next year [at Monmouth Park]? If he runs in Hong Kong, we can give him a break and plan a schedule to get him to the Breeders' Cup, as we did this year," said Motion. Motion indicated that stablemate Film Maker, who had been listed as a possible entrant in the Hong Kong Vase in December, has been retired and will be sent to Lane's End and will be bred to Storm Cat. "It's disappointing that Film Maker had to run against Ouija Board all three years," said Motion. "In any other era, she'd have won at least one of those races."

#### FLEET INDIAN UPDATE

Fleet Indian (Indian Charlie), the post-time favorite who was eased late in Saturday's Distaff, did not suffer a major injury during the nine-furlong test and therefore will not require surgery, trainer Todd Pletcher said Sunday. "We are still waiting for some of the edema to go away before we take an MRI and ultrasound, but so far, X-rays are pretty clean," he said. "There was no fracture, and no broken bones. She suffered a tear in the lateral and medial suspensory branch in her left ankle." The five-year-old mare will get 30-60 days of stall rest.

"There are no races for them now," he explained. "They will get a well-earned rest and I will bring them back next year. Our goal is to come back in the same kind of races with both of them."

#### **ROB ROY TO REMAIN THE U.S.**

**Rob Roy** (Lear Fan), fifth behind Mile winner Miesque's Approval, will not return to England, but instead will be sent to California to continue his career with trainer Neil Drysdale, according to the International Racing Bureau. The four-year-old won the G2 Mile S. and was runner up in the G1 Champion S. earlier this year.



"There's always a concern about supply versus demand," Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell commented. "But the market has been very solid. The market has grown gradually over the past five years and it's been fairly consistent. Eventually it will come to a time where there will be a correction." Last year's auction, topped by the \$9-million sale of Ashado to Sheikh Mohammed, saw gross receipts of \$289,602,900, and an average of \$102,842.





#### On the Cutting Edge...

Over the past several years, Keeneland has reconstructed and upgraded the sales pavilion and the services offered there and has added a new technological advancement for the November sale. In its repository, Keeneland becomes the first Thoroughbred auction house to use digital X-rays, allowing multiple veterinarians to view X-rays on the same horse simultaneously. "It's just the progression of technology," Russell said. "We've been using it here in Central Kentucky for the last two years and it's just the next step along the way. For the last two years, we've been receiving digital X-rays, but in film form. They're already taking them digitally, so now we're putting the images on the screen. It's just another way we try to take care of our clients."






