MONTJEU COLT SETS KEENOV RECORD

A Montjeu (Ire) half-brother to the ill-fated G1 Dubai World Cup winner Electrocutionist fetched a final bid of \$2.7 million yesterday, establishing a new North American record price for a weanling at the Keeneland No-

vember Breeding Stock Sale. Bidding from a seat two rows from the ring, Japanese bloodstock agent Nobutaka Tada went toe-to-toe with representatives of Coolmore, who were putting up a determined fight from the rear holding area. Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne, standing by himself in front of the bidspotter, handled the duties as John Magnier, Michael Tabor and Paul Shanahan gathered a few feet behind him. As the price eclipsed the \$2-million mark, Magnier waved O'Byrne over to talk about

the proceedings. O'Byrne offered \$2.4 million after a long deliberation, came back again at \$2.6 million, then walked away with the rest of the team when the price hit \$2.7 million. "He was a beautiful individual," said Tada, who signed the ticket as Globe Equine Management and was bidding on behalf of a Japanese client he declined to identify. "He walks well and he had the pedigree which is most important. He was a good physical, had a nice walk, a great pedigree. He had everything." Tada also made headlines in his home country earlier this summer. He was the successful bidder on a King Kamehameha--To the Victory (Jpn) filly who established a world-record price for a foal when she was purchased for ¥600 million (\$5,217,391) at the 2006 JRHA Select Sale. **Cont. p2-8**

Timing Really Is Everything...

The disappointment was palpable at this year's January Sale when Elbaaha (GB) (Arazi), the dam of Electrocutionist, was led out of the Keeneland sales pavilion unsold at \$1,175 million. Shack Parrish, whose father's Indian Creek Agency consigned the mare, was understandably frustrated, given what Electrocutionist



had accomplished to that point. Winner of the G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club in 2004, the blaze-faced bay took an exciting renewal of the G1 Juddmonte International S. in 2005, defeating Japanese raider Zenno Rob Roy (Jpn) by a neck. Despite that initial setback, Parrish was Electrocutionist (2001-06) buoyed by the subsequent performances of Electrocutionist,

who was sold privately by Earle Mack to Sheikh Mohammed. He made an immediate impression in Godolphin blue, winning his dirt debut in the G2 Sheikh Maktoum Challenge and added a game victory over Brass Hat in the G1 Dubai World Cup three weeks later. Elbaaha foaled her bay colt 34 days later, and, yesterday, that colt brought a record \$2.7 million. Parrish, who serves his father David as president and general manager of Indian Creek, was pleasantly surprised by the results. "A lot less than that," he said, referring to his expectations. "Maybe \$750,000 to \$1 million. The action [on the colt] was incredible for a foal." Parrish said that the colt had been the subject of 136 individual looks. "He's always been a nice, wellmannered horse, but he had a hell of a pedigree and it got a lot better when [Electrocutionist] won the [G1 Dubai] World Cup." Elbaaha is owned by an entity called Pegasus Stud, whose principal is Sean Mulryan. The mare, who resides at Indian Creek, was barren this year to Kingmambo. Asked to recollect the January sale, Parrish summed it up succinctly. "We're very happy she didn't sell." It turned out to be a headlining sale for Indian Creek; not only did they raise and consign the Montjeu colt, the \$2.4-million Gone West--Islington (Ire) filly (see p3) was also raised at the farm.

Islington's Daughter Brings \$2.4 Million...

The weanling half to Electrocutionist wasn't the only youngster to capture the imagination of Keeneland buyers yesterday. A filly by Gone West out of champion Islington (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) earned the title of the co-second-highest-priced weanling in Keeneland November history after M.A.B. Agency's Marc Antoine-Berghgracht purchased the attractive bay for \$2.4

million. Antoine-Berghgracht was acting on behalf of Spanish real estate magnate Alberto Abajo, a resident of Madrid who is new to the sport. According to Antoine-Berghgracht, Abajo plans to established a band of well-bred broodmares and race their offspring, but the men decided to make a slight amendment to the plan after seeing Islington's second foal. "She's just outstanding," said

Antoine-Berghgracht, who added he had set his limit at \$1.5 million before yet another amendment. "She will race in France," he added. The sale represented a blockbuster score for the late Lord Weinstock's Ballymacoll Stud, which bred the filly and put her in the sale through Pat Costello's Paramount Sales. "We were hoping to get a good price for her, but that exceeded what we thought," said Peter Reynolds, manager for Ballymacoll. "I always thought she was a \$2-million filly and to get nearly \$2.5 [million], it's a good price." One of the best distaffers of her generation, Islington twice won the G1 Yorkshire Oaks and also captured the G1 Nassau S. American fans were well aware of her reputation when she shipped over to compete in the 2003 GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf--she had run third in the previous year's renewal--and the crowd's choice came through with a rousing victory. Islington's racetrack performance reflected her pedigree. Out of Hellenic (GB) (Darshaan {GB}), herself winner of the G1 Yorkshire Oaks, she is a full to champion Greek Dance (Ire) and GSW New Morning (Ire). Islington returned to the States upon retirement. "The mare is based here [at Indian Creek Farm]," said Reynolds, who went on to explain the decision to sell. "Since Lord Weinstock died a few years ago, we've had to make the Ballymacoll operation a more commercial one," he commented. "So therefore we have to sell some horses. We sold some yearlings as well this year." Ballymacoll sold a Red Ransom filly produced by Desert Beauty (Ire), a half to Islington, to John Ferguson for €1.05 million at the Goffs Million Sale in September. Islington, currently in foal to Storm Cat, is booked to Kingmambo for 2007.





"She's for an international breeder," said Lascelles. "She'll probably stay here [in Kentucky] and hopefully go back to Kingmambo." Eaton Sales, agent, consigned Because. Retired after racing in Europe for Roisin Henry, Because produced a filly by Giant's Causeway this year and was bred back to Kingmambo on an Apr. 8 cover. Because is out of the

Darshaan (GB) mare Jude (GB), a half or full to four stakes winners, including champion Alleluia (GB) and multiple group winner Arrikala (Ire). "It's from an absolutely outstanding family," said Lascelles. "[Because is] a sister to a champion, a sister to two really good horses. And the pedigree's really alive. The dam's got about three more Sadler's Wellses coming on. She's exciting." Though Lascelles said the mare's offspring would probably not be offered at sale, he added, "But who knows? She's carrying a colt by a great stallion and she's got a hell of a pedigree." It's not the first time Lascelles has stepped up to land an expensive daughter of Sadler's Wells at Keeneland. In 1999, he purchased Dance Design (Ire), in foal to A.P. Indy, for \$4.7 million at this sale. Lascelles also bought the sale-topping Alydar mare Lydara in foal to Danzig for \$1.8 million at the 1996 January Sale.

Big Score for Ashleigh...

Five years ago, Ashleigh Stud consigned Smooth As Silk (Deputy Minister) to the Keeneland November sale carrying a foal by Thunder Gulch. However, the bidding stalled out at just \$80,000 and she was led out unsold. Suffice to say that things went a little more smoothly yesterday afternoon when the nine-year-old, now the dam of MGSW Private Vow, was knocked down to Jess Jackson for \$1.35 million. "We're very pleased, indeed," commented Ashleigh's Jackie Ramos. "It's very exciting and the people that own her are wonderful people." Smooth As Silk was bred and raced by Robert Witt's Blue Vista Inc., also owner of champion Possibly Perfect, and Louis Scattaglia's Agri-Harvest Stable. The first horse purchased in partnership by Witt and Scattaglia was Sacque (GB), who went on to win the GIII River Cities Budweiser Breeders' Cup H. and \$334,720. She produced Smooth As Silk in 1997; in turn, Smooth As Silk dropped Private Vow in 2003. The mare was sold on a Mar. 22 cover date to Unbridled's Song; the foal she is carrying will be a three-parts sibling to Private Vow. "She's in foal to a very fashionable sire and we know the cross works," Ramos added.





Ballygallon Likes America Just Fine...

Late in 2005, Roy and Belinda Strudwicke, who operate Ballygallon Stud in Co. Kilkenny, Ireland, decided to send their talented turf runner Aragorn (Ire) to this side of the Atlantic in the hopes of securing his preferred



fast ground. The chestnut validated that decision and is a leading candidate for an Eclipse Award off his wins in the GI Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile and the GI Eddie Read H. as well as his runner-up effort in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. The Strudwickes came calling yester-

even \$2 million for the five-year-old Saree (GB) (Barathea {Ire}) from Craig and Holly Bandoroff's Denali Stud. Herself a Grade III-placed runner in Canada, Saree, a 17,000gns TATOCT yearling and selling here in foal to Kingmambo, has seen her page take off this year owing to the on-track performances of her 3/4sister Alexandrova (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). That Coolmore runner won both the G1 English Oaks and G1 Irish Oaks as well as the G1 Yorkshire Oaks, and was most recently third in the G1 Prix de l'Opera. For their part, the Strudwickes fell in love with Saree. "I thought physically, she's a lovely mare," Belinda Strudwicke said. "Obviously, the family's strong. She's got Alexandrova over there. The family seems to be going the right way. To me, she's just a lovely prospective broodmare. We'll most probably leave her here. We'll look at Aragorn maybe covering her, but I don't know about that yet. She could go back to Ireland in a year's time." Reflecting on the results of last Saturday, she added, "It was very exciting for us, to see a horse we bred and still owned racing here. We would have loved to see firmer ground for him. Obviously, the ground in California he's been performing on isn't the same as it was at Churchill Downs. But taking everything into account, I think the horse did himself proud. He got there [for second] on class alone. It was a very brave performance." Ballygallon was also bought SW & GSP Guana (Fr) (Sillery), in foal to Ghostzapper, for \$700,000.

Yoshidas Win On and Off the Track...

A terrific year for Japanese-based horses got that much better Tuesday when Delta Blues (Jpn) held off Pop Rock (Jpn) to win the G1 Emirates Melbourne Cup. It was a guinella for the Yoshida Family, as the winner is campaigned by the Sunday Racing Co. Ltd. That entity is managed by Shunsuke Yoshida, son of Katsumi Yoshida, who races the runner-up under the banner of Shadai. Both horses are trained by Katsuhiko Sumii. Speaking yesterday from Keeneland, Shunsuke, 32, reflected on the Down Under results. "That was really exciting," he said. "I didn't know that I could watch the race at the Irish bar [McCarthy's Pub, a local favorite among visiting horsepeople], so I listened to the race on the phone." Despite his obvious allegiance to Delta Blues, who preceded his Melbourne Cup effort with a third in the G1 Caulfield Cup, Shunsuke insists he remained a team player for the duration of the twomile marathon. "I was cheering for both horses, so it really didn't matter too much. All in the family," he stated. The results of the Melbourne Cup also represented a success for Keeneland, as Dixie Splash, the dam of the winner, was purchased for \$190,000 at the 1997 January sale. On behalf of his father, Shunsuke has been active through the first two days at Keeneland this year, having purchased seven mares for \$3,385,000. Those purchases include Bejoyfulandrejoyce (Dynaformer) for \$700,000. The mares will be exported to Japan, where they will foal and then bred. The importance of the Yoshida Family is not lost on the auctioneer. "The Yoshidas are good and long-standing clients of Keeneland," said Director of Sales Geoff Russell. "They recognize the significance of the international market and want to bring the best mares back to Japan." The Melbourne Cup one-two is just the latest in a string of outstanding international performances for Japan in 2006. Heart's Cry (Jpn) won the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic in March and was a good third in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S.; Cosmo Bulk (Jpn) took the G1 Singapore Airlines Int'l Cup in May; and Deep Impact (Jpn) finished a close third in the Oct. 1 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe.

'Cry' for More...

Given the dominance of Street Sense's 10-length victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile over the weekend, it shouldn't be surprising that staffers came into Darley's Kentucky offices on Monday morning to find a stack of faxes from mare owners looking to get to his sire, Street Cry (Ire), for the upcoming breeding season. Now the leading stallion on the freshman sire list by earnings, Street Cry has seen his fee revised to \$50,000 for 2007, but Darley, in an innovative move, has decided to offer seasons to the son of Machiavellian at his original \$30,000 fee for those breeders who supported him in his first four years. "It was something we talked about after the Breeders' Cup and something that Sheikh Mohammed embraced immediately as a way of demonstrating his gratitude to our client base," said Darley's COO Dan Pride. At yesterday's second session of the Keeneland sale, a filly by the G1 Dubai World Cup winner brought \$275,000. Cataloged as hip 401, the bay is out of the Storm Cat mare Gather the Storm, herself a daughter of German Mare of the Year and multiple champion Martessa (Ger). Hip 401 was consigned by Anderson Farms, agent, and was bred in Canada.

'Alex' Season Sold to Benefit Alex's Lemonade Stand...

A season to dual Classic winner **Afleet Alex** (Northern Afleet), who stood his first season at Gainesway Farm in Lexington, Kentucky this spring, was auctioned off during yesterday's session to benefit Alex's Lemonade Stand. The season was purchased for \$45,000 by Chuck Zacney, who campaigned Afleet Alex in partnership to wins in the GI Preakness S. and GI Belmont S. A portion of Afleet Alex's racetrack earnings went to benefit Alex's Lemonade Stand, which was begun by a cancer-stricken young girl, Alexandra Scott, to raise money for pediatric cancer research. Scott ultimately lost her battle with the disease at the age of 8.

Strength From Top to Bottom...

Reflecting on the day's activity, Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell said he was "pleasantly surprised" at the number of million-dollar horses [10 this year versus just four in 2005]. "We had a North American record colt and a Keeneland record filly, both raised at the same farm [Indian Creek] and also the same farm that sold a very expensive Danzig yearling [son of Al Theraab for \$5.2 million at Keeneland September], so we congratulate them." He continued, "Ballymacoll Stud and Peter Reynolds are good friends, so we were delighted with the success of the Gone West filly. It also shows the international aspect of the market with a European underbidder to the Japanese successful bidder [on the Montjeu colt]." Russell noted a certain evenness to Tuesday's session. "I thought [Tuesday] was more consistent all the way through. The breeding stock sales have started off very strong. The upper end is probably slightly less than last year, but last year had a special horse. If you take Ashado out of last year, it's very comparable." THREE-DAY EVENT

One of those top Irish breeders said to me the other day, enough with all the statistics, just tell us what's going on. Or, as we would say in America, "Cut to the Chase." So here's what's going on: the Fasig-Tipton Sunday sale has effectively become the first day of a three-day top-class kickoff of the Kentucky November mixed sales market. The statistical evidence for this is compelling, especially when compared to Keeneland's Tuesday session. Last year, Fasig's Sunday sale averaged (\$287,348) nearly as much as Keeneland Tuesday (\$308,943), but with only 112 sold, Fasig's 2005 Sunday gross of \$32 million was little more than half that of Keeneland Tuesday's (\$59 million), and in fact constituted only 17 percent of the 'November first three days' combined gross of \$189.6 million. This year, Fasig sold 170 horses for \$64 million, averaging \$377,235. After Monday dropped \$15 million in gross compared to last year, Tuesday was up about \$6.5 million to a gross of \$65.8 million for 178 sold, an average of \$370,112. Fasig Sunday and Keeneland Tuesday were effectively equal this year, which is why Fasig's market share of the first three days has jumped from 17 percent to 30 percent. They also sold seven of the 17 horses (41 percent) which brought \$2 million or more.

Taking the three days together, here is what happened: in 2005, a total of 484 horses sold for \$189,621,000, and averaged \$391,779. This year, 512 horses sold for \$213,805,000, and averaged \$417,588. Taken together, the number sold was up 6 percent, the gross was up 13 percent, and the average was up 7 percent. That is surely an accurate gauge of the market, even given the caveat that the November sales catalogues may differ considerably from year to year, depending upon what mares are actually in the sale. If you look at the sales companies' figures separately, you wouldn't necessarily think that. Fasig's sale had 52-percent more sold than last year, for 99 percent (almost double) more money, and was up 31 percent in average. Keeneland's Book 1, on the other hand, had 8 percent fewer sell, was down 5 percent in gross, and down 8 percent in average. In fact, though, the market isn't down; Fasig just took market share from Keeneland. The conclusion has to be that the market has in fact displayed sustained strength on all three days; there has simply been a redistribution of where the selling is taking place. If the market is in fact up in the region of 10 percent overall, we should see that reflected in the rest of the Keeneland sale. In other words, the rest of Keeneland should be up about 10 percent. We shall see.

The observation that the market is strong but selective is borne out by a look at the table of sires whose first foals are now coming to market: sires with first foals 2006. Three of the top four sires on average so far (just for these three days only, Fasig and Keeneland Book 1)--Smarty Jones, Speightstown, and Strong Hope--had a total of 16 weanlings sell, but they were only 43 percent of the 37 weanlings originally catalogued by the three sires on those three days. A total of 13 of the 37 were withdrawn, then just two-thirds (67 percent) of the remaining 24 were listed as sales. That's a decidedly low 'clearance rate.'

Smarty Jones, as anticipated, is the group's leader on average so far, with six sold (of 11 offered), for an average of \$310,833. Five (of seven offered) by Speightstown have averaged \$280,000, while Medaglia d'Oro has six (of seven), which have averaged \$236,667. The other five with two or more sold (see Table, p10) have all averaged between \$125,000-\$160,000, but none has yet had more than six sold. Among sires who covered for the first time in 2006, and will have their first foals in 2007, 11 had two or more mares sell in foal during the first three days. Ghostzapper, of course, was the leader, with four mares in foal averaging \$712,500, but it is an indication of the market's selectivity that another six in foal to Ghostzapper went through the ring unsold. Four mares in foal to Afleet Alex averaged \$330,000, while eight in foal to Saint Liam, who unfortunately died after the covering season, averaged \$310,625. Given that an in-foal mare average reflects a stallion's book more than anything else, Vinery's Purge (\$20,000) and Hill 'n' Dale's Roman Ruler (\$30,000) both benefited from concentrated efforts to find them good mares, their first-three-days' in-foal mares averaging \$262,000 and \$245,714 respectively.

FRESHMAN SIRE UPDATE

Though there are a few weeks left to the end of the year, for the moment, at least, Darley-at-Jonabell's Street Cry, sire of the devastating GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Street Sense, has wrested top spot on the North American freshman sire list from Coolmoreat-Ashford's Johannesburg. You couldn't fail to be impressed by the winner, whose sire--a son of Machiavellian out of a Troy mare--ran third in the 2000 Juvenile himself (to Macho Uno and Point Given) and went on to win the G1 Dubai World Cup and GI Stephen Foster H. at four. It's looking a pretty strong group of freshman sires: Johannesburg has 20 winners, including six stakes winners, and third-ranked Officer (moved to Taylor Made from Gainesway) has five stakes winners and the earners of over \$1 million as well. Airdrie's Include and Gainesway's Orientate also look good, in fourth and fifth. The top 12 is rounded out by four Kentucky stallions and three from Florida. The Kentucky sires--who all had weanlings or yearlings make big physical impressions at one time or other--are E Dubai, Pure Prize, Yonaguska, and Jump Start; they all continue to look promising, as do the Florida trio of Three Wonders, Graeme Hall, and Snow Ridge.



Japan Runners One-Two in Melbourne (cont. from p1) Delta Blues endured a buffeting from Pop Rock in the final 50 meters but prevailed by a short half-head in yesterday's G1 Melbourne Cup, with the very honest Maybe Better (Aus) (Intergaze {Aus} clinging gamely for third, 4 1/4 lengths back. Pre-race discussion focused on Yeats (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {Ire}) and Tawqeet (Kingmambo) with the pair vying for favoritsm right up until early afternoon on Tuesday, when punters flocked to back Pop Rock, sending him out the \$2.10 on-course favourite. Trainer Katsuhiko Sumii and his team had been confident in the past week that they could run one-two in the "race that stops a nation," but few took their claims seriously, despite the fact that less than a length separated third-placed Delta Blues and seventh-placed Pop Rock in the G1 Caulfield Cup on Oct. 21. Sumii is not new to creating history, sending out Cesario (Jpn) in very similar fashion to become the first Japanese-trained horse to win a Grade I race in North America with a record-breaking four-length victory in the GI American Oaks at Hollywood Park in July 2005. Sumii spent time at Hollywood Park a year ago with trainer Neil Drysdale and dreamed about winning abroad with Northern Farm homebreds such as Cesario, Delta Blues and Pop Rock. Delta Blues was guickest away from the barriers and settled one off the lead from runaway leader Zabeat (NZ) (Rhythm). When Yeats came three wide and took the lead as the pace quickened at the 850-meter pole, Iwata on Delta Blues sat quietly before pouncing with deadly stealth. Yeats wilted as Pop Rock came out wide to challenge his stablemate and create an enthralling duel down the vast straight. "It was very hard to get the tempo of the race right, I am very disappointed," said Kieren Fallon, who partnered Yeats and wore a cashmere sweater under his silks owing to the arctic conditions at Flemington. Geordieland (Fr) (Johann Quatz {Fr}) bled from both nostrils and Frankie Dettori said his race was over at the 400-meter mark and the pair finished 18th. Dwayne Dunn, on Tawgeet, offered: "I got shuffled right out of the race going out of the straight the first time, and I had to make a little bit longer run than we'd thought. I got close to pouncing and he started to feel that foot again." Trainer David Hayes was more succinct about the Australia-wide favourite, saying: "He got it wrong." Third-place finisher Maybe Better pulled up very lame in his offside fore and trainer Brian Mavfield-Smith said if he recovered properly he would have a light autumn campaign ahead of a Cup tilt in 2007. "I am very proud of him, it was all uncharted waters, he's never been even anywhere near this distance, and he fought on very courageously. [Jockey] Chris Munce said he was fired-up and pulled hard mid-race when the tempo slacked off, so to come back and do what he has done is terrific," the trainer said.

"It's been a learning curve, knowing what to do with them when you travel halfway around the world," Poulton said. "He goes to Perth now for the Perth Cup on the 1st of January. Why not?" Poulton said. "And we'll have another go next year at this one."

"Circular Quay beat me a nose the first time we met and I beat him by 10 the second time, so how could you give Circular Quay the award? If he had won by a head, I would say it would be close. But the way this horse won and what he did, I don't know how you couldn't give it to him."

INFECTION SIDELINES PERFECT DRIFT Perfect

Drift (Dynaformer) exited his disappointing eighth-place effort in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Distaff with an infection and will likely get the rest of the year off. Trainer Murray Johnson revealed that the seven-yearold was suffering from chondritis. "He couldn't get his air, basically," Johnson explained. "It's caused from a virus. They breathe all right for a while and it doesn't affect the functions of the throat, but when they become tired they just can't get their air." Current plans call for Perfect Drift to spend a portion of the winter at Dr. William Reed's Stonescrest Farm in Kansas City, Missouri and Johnson expects the gelding to back again next year. "We had a great year and it was a lot of fun," Johnson said. "It wasn't our best year, but we've had five great years. Hopefully, we'll be back next year. I don't see any reason why we won't be back next year to try it again." Perfect Drift was winless in seven starts in 2006, but was second in the GI Stephen Foster H., GII Kentucky Cup Classic and GII Washington Park H.

WAR FRONT STUD FEE ANNOUNCED War Front

(Danzig--Starry Dreamer, by Rubiano), retired after Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, will begin his

stud career at Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky, next season at a fee of \$12,500, live foal. The four-year-old, owned and bred by Joseph Allen, won this year's GII Alfred G Vanderbilt Breeders' Cup H. and was second in the GI Vosburgh H., GI Forego S., GII Tom Fool H., GIII Mr. Prospector H.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES by Alan Porter

BREEDERS' CUP REVIEW

The 2006 Breeders' Cup is now in the record book, and it was a day which brought some surprises, both in terms of race results and pedigrees, as well as some fascinating patterns.

Dreaming of Anna won the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in a fashion which suggests that she might join the ranks of Rahy's brilliant daughters, such as Serena's Song, Tate's Creek and Exotic Wood. Out of the stakes winning and graded-stakes placed Justenuffheart (Broad Brush), Dreaming of Anna is a sister to Lewis Michael, a stakes-winning and multiple graded-placed horse who ran in this year's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. Justenuffheart is a half-sister to Kitten's Joy (El Prado), the champion turf horse of 2004, a year in which he won the GI Turf Classic Invitational and GI Secretariat S., as well as finishing second in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf; and to Precious Kitten, a stakes-winning and graded-stakes placed daughter of Catienus. The family also had earlier success with the male line of Rahy's sire--Blushing Groom--as Dreaming of Anna's third dam, Kitten's First (Lear Fan), is a half-sister to the GI United Nations H. winner Down the Aisle, a son of Runaway Groom.

Rahy is also sire of group-winning English two-yearold Raphane out of a mare by Broad Brush's sire, Ack Ack. Dreaming of Anna herself is 4x5 to Hail to Reason, while Broad Brush supplies two daughters of Hail to Reason's sire Turn-to. Rahy himself is an extended Nasrullah/Hail to Reason cross, and that is reversed in Roberto, who is here through Lear Fan, the sire of Dreaming of Anna's second dam. Roberto appears in four of Rahy's other stakes winners, including graded scorers Mariah's Storm (dam of Giant's Causeway), Hawksley Hill and Apt to Be.

A little under 10 years ago, Darley embarked on a plan to make Machiavellian--the leading European son of Mr. Prospector--a force as a U.S. dirt sire, even paying for U.S. mares to be shipped to Europe and back. Unfortunately, Machiavellian died before the project could have a really fair trial, but one son of Machiavellian who did prove himself on the dirt was Street Cry. Despite being out of the G1 Irish Oaks winner Helen Street, Street Cry never even tried the grass.

A spectacular maiden winner at Del Mar at two, he took second in the GII Del Mar Futurity and GII Norfolk S., both times going down to Flame Thrower in photofinishes, and then taking third to Macho Uno and Point Given in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. At three, Street Cry was off the course for most of the year after winning an allowance race and finishing second in the G2 UAE Derby. He came back at the end of the year to take second to Evening Attire in the GIII Discovery H. He returned to Dubai to take a Group 2 event and the the G1 Dubai World Cup (by 41/2 lengths). Back in the U.S., Street Cry started just twice, but franked the form with a devastating win in the GI Stephen Foster H. and a second to champion Left Bank in the GI Whitney H.

Street Cry's first juveniles hit the track this year, and it was going to be interesting to see whether he was going to throw to his turf pedigree or his dirt performances. In the short term, the answer seems to be both. His first black-type winner came when Big Timer captured the G3 Acomb S. in England. However, what has catapulted him to the top of the Freshman Sire Table is the runaway victory of Street Sense, who stormed through on the rail to take the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile by a record-setting 10 lengths.

Street Sense is the first foal of the Dixieland Band mare Bedazzle. An earner of nearly \$200,000, Bedazzle is half-sister to the multiple stakes winner, Binalegend. Street Sense has something of a ready made stallion pedigree, as his granddam Majestic Legend is a stakes winning half-sister to Mr. Greeley. Street Cry's first two stakes winners are out of mares by sons of Northern Dancer, and Northern Dancer-line mares also account for two of his three stakes-placed horses. It's not surprising to see this cross working.

Street Cry is free of Northern Dancer, but his sire Machiavellian had Raise the Standard, a half-sister to Northern Dancer, as his second dam, so any Street Cry offspring out of a Northern Dancer line mare will be linebred to Natalma (with a another strain of her dam, Almahmoud, via Halo, who is the broodmare sire of Machiavellian).

Swiss Yodeler has primarily made his reputation as a sire in California, and particularly as a prolific sire of two-year-olds (79 juvenile winners in five crops, or nearly 16 per year). However, he jumped into the national spotlight with the decisive victory of his son Thor's Echo in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. Swiss Yodeler himself did all his best work at two, when he took six of nine starts, including the GI Hollywood Futurity, GII Hollywood Juvenile Championship, GIII Best Pal S., Haggin S. and Westchester S. Swiss Yodeler remained in training for three more years, but never won another race. He did earn seven more sprint graded-stakes placings, including a third in the GI Malibu S. A son of the Damascus horse Eastern Echo, Swiss Yodeler had never previously been represented by a graded scorer, but does have 15 stakes winners.

Thor's Echo is out of Helen of Troy, an unraced daughter of the Mr. Prospector horse Mr. Integrity. She is half-sister to Cal-bred stakes winner Smokin' Charlotte and to stakes-placed Thunder's Echo, a daughter of Swiss Yodeler. The granddam is by the very fast Time to Explode out of the minor stakes winner A King's Ransom. Thor's Echo has a son and daughter of Northern Dancer, and another son of that horse's sire, Nearctic. There is a more interesting play in this pedigree, however. Swiss Yodeler has a double of My Babu (once as broodmare sire of Damascus, once as broodmare sire of Swiss Yodeler's own broodmare sire, Raja Baba). Thor's Echo brings in My Babu's close genetic relative Ambiorix, and Raja Baba and Nanticious (granddam of Thor's Echo's broodmare sire Mr. Integrity), are similarly bred, one a Nasrullah/My Babu cross, the other a Nasrullah/Ambiorix cross.

Awesome Again had two shots in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff with Round Pond and Spun Sugar, and the former got the job done in impressive style. Breeders' Cup Day has proved to be a blessed event for Awesome Again and his offspring. In 1998, he concluded an undefeated four-year-old season by defeating a field which included Silver Charm, Swain, Victory Gallop, Coronado's Quest, Skip Away, Touch Gold, Arch and Gentlemen. Since then, he's sired GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Ghostzapper and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero Wilko, and now Round Pond.

Wilko was out of a mare with a European pedigree, and the same applies to Round Pond. Her dam, Gift of Dance, is by Trempolino out of Green Dancer's Group 1-placed daughter, Coral Dance. Gift of Dance never won, but she is half-sister to four stakes winners, three group/graded. The first of these was the Al Nasr colt, Nasr El Arab. Nasr El Arab won two group races at three in France, but proved even better in the U.S. taking the GI Oak Tree Invitational and GI Carleton F. Burke H. as a sophomore, and the GI Charles H. Strub and GI San Juan Capistrano H. at four. Coral Dance's second major winner was Pennekamp, a son of Bering. He won the G1 Prix de la Salamandre and G1 Dewhurst S. at two and the G1 2000 Guineas at three. Coral Dance's trio of Group/Grade 1 stars is completed by Black Minnaloushe, a Storm Cat son who took the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 St. James's Palace S.

Round Pond is the product of a Deputy Minister/ Sharpen Up cross. Despite the fact that Deputy Ministers generally have done best on the dirt, while Sharpen Up has been a turf influence, the cross has produced the three-time Grade I winner Clear Mandate and Flag Down, a graded stakes winner of over \$1.5 million. We can also note that Sharpen Up's son, Diesis, has the Grade I-winning Magistretti out of a Deputy Minister mare. In addition to the Deputy Minister/Sharpen Up cross, something else interesting is apparent in the pedigree of Round Pond. Deputy Minister is by Vice Regent, and Trempolino is out of a mare by Vice Regent's brother, Canadian champion two-year-old Viceregal, so Round Pound has the brothers 3x3.

Miesque's Son has lived most of his life in the shadow of his brother, Kingmambo. Nonetheless, his career has had its bright spots, notably with Whipper, a Group 1 winner at two, three and four in France. Breeders' Cup weekend credited him with another, somewhat surprising, moment in the spotlight, this time as sire of upset GI Breeders' Cup Mile victor Miesque's Approval. A seven-year-old, Miesque's Approval had previously captured six stakes events, two graded, as well as the Sunshine Millions Turf, but until the Mile he had never won a Grade I event.

A half-brother to Revved Up (Sultry Song), a graded stakes winner of over \$1 million, Miesque's Approval is out of the With Approval mare Win Approval. The second dam, Negotiator (Hoist the Flag), never captured a stakes, but did take second in the GI Matron S. and third in the Blue Hen and Colleen S. She was out of Geneva II, a high-class performer in Argentina and subsequently dam of the GIII Seneca H. winner Diveen, and granddam of graded scorer Chocolate Swiss. One of four graded-stakes winners by a Mr. Prospector-line stallion out of a With Approval mare, Miesque's Approval has Northern Dancer 4x5 through a son and a daughter, but otherwise is an outcross. **Cont. p15**

In the GI F/M Turf Ouija Board proved herself one of the greats of the Breeders' Cup by adding another win to the first she achieved in 2004 and a second in 2005. Ouija Board is from the first crop of the excellent English miler Cape Cross (by Green Desert, by Danzig). The dam never won a race, but she is a sister to the tough gelding Teleprompter, a horse best known in the U.S. for his win in the 1985 GI Budweiser-Arlington Million. The granddam, Ouija, is by Paul Mellon's good eight-to-10-furlong horse Silly Season (sire in Australia of Lunchtime) and she is also the grandam of Ibn Bey, a multiple Group 1 winner who also finished second in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic on his only dirt try; and the third dam of the English champion two-year-old filly Red Camellia. Ouija is also half-sister to Sam's Song, the third dam of Owington, who was by Cape Cross's sire Green Desert. Owington is therefore bred on similar lines to Ouija Board, but was a pure sprinter, winning the G1 July Cup at six furlongs. Ouija Board's third dam, Samanda, is a half-sister to the G1 Prix de Diane heroine Tahiti, and to Almah, the granddam of Kingston Town.

Cape Cross's granddam has the genetic relatives, Tudor Minstrel and Fair Trial, and Ouija Board's broodmare sire Welsh Pageant is by a son of Tudor Minstrel out of a mare by a son of Fair Trial. There are a lot of combinations of Fair Trial, his sire Fairway, and Fairway's brother Pharos, with Solario and Hurry On in this pedigree, and in turn there is an unusually high concentration of Sainfoin, the English Derby winner of 1890, and his sister Sierra.

Last year marked the emergence of Montjeu as a long-awaited true European heir to his sire, Sadler's Wells (Americans have already got a pretty good version in El Prado). This year has seen the emergence of a second legitimate successor in the shape of Montjeu's stud companion, Galileo. With his first crop of threeyear-olds, Galileo has eight black-type winners, six group or graded. They include the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas heroine Nightime; the G1 St. Leger victor Sixties lcon; and Red Rocks, who captured the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. Galileo's second crop has already produced Teofilio, a two-time Group 1 winner who is almost certain to be

ranked as Europe's best twoyear-old. Red Rocks is out of the Irish black-type winner Pharmacist, a daughter of Machiavellian, who thus appeared as grandsire and maternal grandsire of a Breeders' Cup winner. The second dam, Pharaoh's Delight, a daughter of Fairy King, was an extremely speedy and precocious filly, who won the G1 Phoenix S. and G3 Princess Margaret S. and also earned places in four other Group 1 events.

Red Rocks possesses one of the most interesting Breeders' Cup pedigrees. He has the brothers Sadler's Wells/Fairy King 2x3 and Mr. Prospector 4x3, and the arrangement of these names makes the pedigree even more complex: Galileo is a Sadler's Wells/Mr. Prospector cross, and the dam Pharmacist is a Mr. Prospector/Fairy King cross.



Having been responsible for the first winner of the Breeders' Cup events, the Blushing Groom line closed out the day with a triumph in the final event, the GI Breeder's Cup Classic courtesy of Invasor. He is a son of Candy Stripes, who, having been represented by champion turf horse Leroidesanimaux last year, looks a lock to be represented by back-to-back Eclipse Award winners. Candy Stripes did all his racing on turf, started only six times, and never won a black-type event, but did finish third (promoted to second by the stewards) in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains.

Retired to stud in Argentina, Candy Stripes made a sensational start to his career, which led to him being imported to stand in the U.S., first in Kentucky and then in Florida. Unfortunately, Candy Stripes seemed less well-suited to the mares he covered in the U.S., and from four crops sired here, his only graded scorer was Canadian champion turf female Sweetest Thing. However, from South American mares (which one suspects fit him better physically) Candy Stripes has several other runners that have made their names in the U.S. In addition to Leroidesanimaux and Invasor, they include the Grade I-winning Different, and graded scorers Lundy's Liability, Victory Stripes and Criollito. Incidentally, Invasor, Different, Lundy's Liability, Victory Stripes and Criollito all scored major victories on dirt, so in this respect Candy Stripes is emulating his sire, Blushing Groom, a turf horse who was able to get Blushing John, Arazi and Sky Beauty, who all earned Eclipse Awards for their achievements on dirt--as well as other major dirt performers, such as You'd Be Surprised, Mt. Livermore and Rahy.

Invasor's dam, Quendom (by the Nashua-line stallion, Interprete), never ran, but her immediate family had already made its presence known in the U.S. prior to the arrival of Invasor. Quendom's dam, the Argentine Group 1 winner Reina Victoriosa, is the dam of the More Than Ready brothers, More Than Regal, winner this year of the Iowa Derby and Sportsman's Paradise S.; and Ready Ruler, winner in 2004 of the El Joven S.

Invasor's pedigree is a complete outcross at five generations, but we can note that, whereas Invasor is out of a mare by Interprete, Candy Stripes has also sired two Group 1 winners out of mares by Interprete's sire Farnesio. He is a horse whose pedigree has some important background similarities to that of Candy Stripes' broodmare sire, Lyphard.

Breeders' Cup Web Traffic Doubles, TV Figures Down:

Unique visitors to the Breeders' Cup/NTRA web site were up 102 percent this year and page views were up 80 percent on Breeders' Cup Championship day compared to last year, but television ratings fell to their lowest levels ever. In addition, visitors and traffic nearly doubled during the two-week period leading up to the event. In all, 422,000 visitors accounted for more than 4.1 million page views at the site. "Cross promotion on the ESPN platforms, our own promotion and a media campaign on leading sports web sites drove record traffic to our site," said Greg Avioli, president of Breeders' Cup, Ltd. "We continue to give fans more options for how and when they can consume Breeders' Cup content and, considering this year's record handle, they are responding positively." Handle on the eight races is expected to be a record \$134 million--up 14 percent from a year ago. In its debut on ESPN, Breeders' Cup coverage drew an overnight rating of .9 percent, down 47 percent from last year's 1.7. The rating represents 770,000 homes.
