Greeley) did herself and the family proud, eliciting a final bid of \$600,000, the top price during the fourth session of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale in Lexington yesterday. The three-year-old filly, a full sister to GI Futurity S. winner Whywhywhy and a half to GSW Spellbinder (Tale of the Cat), was consigned by Hidden Brook Farm as agent for Mrs.

Einar Paul Robsham. "Mrs. Robsham has a lot of fillies and decided to sell this one," explained farm manager Sergio de Sousa. "She's not really into breeding. This is a really nice filly. The family sold well earlier in the week and she's a very good-looking mare. We love to have those kind. We were a little surprised with the price, but pleasantly so." Hidden Brook also raised Discreet Cat for Robsham, who purchased Pretty Proud for \$290,000 at the 2004 Keeneland September Sale. Trained by Stanley Hough, Pretty Proud broke her maiden over the Gulfstream main track in February and added an allowance victory over a sloppy Belmont main track June 25. The successful bidders were Frankfort Park Farm, operated by Brendan Gallagher and John and Willie Brown. "We're planning on buying some nice broodmares over the next year or so," said Gallagher, also the manager of Emerald Bloodstock in Ireland. He indicated that Pretty Proud, offered as a racing or broodmare prospect, would be retired to stud, but breeding plans have not been made nor has a stallion been selected. Pretty Proud's dam, Thorough Fair (Quiet American), sold Monday for \$1.55 million, while her weanling half-brother by Giant's Causeway made \$1.05 million. Both were purchased by Lincoln Collins, acting for My Meadowview Farms' Leonard Riggio. Keeneland cont. p2

GIACOMO RETIRES TO ADENA SPRINGS

Kentucky Derby winner Giacomo (Holy Bull--Set Them Free, by Stop the Music) has been retired and will stand the 2007 breeding season at Adena Springs Farm in Midway, Kentucky for a fee of \$12,500, live foal. In

addition to his dramatic lateclosing victory in last year's Derby and a third-place effort in the GI Preakness S., the gray four-year-old also won this year's GII San Diego H. He was second in the 2004 GI Hollywood Futurity and last year's GII San Felipe S. and was third in this term's GII

Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. and GII Strub S. In his final career start, Giacomo was fourth behind Invasor (Arg) in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Racing for Jerry and Anne Moss and trained by John Shirreffs, Giacomo hit the board in 10 of 16 starts, with three wins and earnings of \$2,537,316. "Giacomo is a perfect fit for the Adena Springs program," said farm owner Frank Stronach. "He was a Grade I two-year-old, Kentucky Derby-winning three-year-old, and Grade II-winning four-year-old. He showed a consistency at the highest level that is rarely seen today, qualities that we highly value in a stallion. He also offers breeders significant outcross value, as well." Out of multiple stakes winner Set Them Free, Giacomo is a half brother to multiple graded stakes placed Sea Jewel (Sea Hero).

Dr. Phil McCarthy, bidding on behalf of Black Jack Stables, was extended to \$580,000 for the five-yearold mare Exotic Elegance. "She's a beautiful mare obviously out of a great champion mare and we expect that she's going to do very well for us," said McCarthy, partners in Black Jack with Fred. W. Hertrich III. McCarthy said that the foal the mare is carrying was part of the attraction as it will be bred on the increasingly popular cross responsible for champion Folklore, out of a mare by Storm Cat herself; and recent GIII Iroquois S. winner Tiz Wonderful, produced by a daughter of Hennessy. McCarthy added that a decision on whether to keep or sell the mare's offspring will be fluid. "We are market breeders, so I don't know what we're going to do." McCarthy said that Exotic Elegance is likely to visit Unbridled's Song in 2007. That foal would be bred along the same lines as Grade I winners Buddha and Magnificent Song.

Cloverleaf Swoops for Henny Half...

Blue Warbler (More Than Ready), a half-sister to GI Vosburgh S. and GI King's Bishop S. hero Henny Hughes, brought a final bid of \$500,000 yesterday at Keeneland. Bidding on behalf of John Sykes' Cloverleaf Farms II in Reddick, Florida, the farm's general manager Brent Fernung outlasted Stonewall Farm's Richard Haisfield to land the dark bay, carrying a foal by Mr. Greeley, from the consignment of Gainesway, agent. Sykes has undertaken the task of building a solid roster of stallions for the Central Florida market, recently adding the likes of GI Forego S. winners Pomeroy and Mass Media; three-time Grade II winner High Limit; and GSW Congrats. But Fernung indicated a return to the Bluegrass for the 2007 breeding season is more than likely for his purchase. "We haven't got a stallion picked out for her next year, but I'm sure she'll come back up here to breed," he said. "We're trying to collect up some nice mares, and obviously you can't beat that pedigree." Fernung was also attracted to the mare's appearance. "She's a nice, smooth-muscled mare and I actually thought she was an awesome cross to Mr. Greeley just based on their physical types." Fernung indicated that the foal Blue Warbler is carrying is also likely to reappear at a Keeneland sale, but added, "if he looks real fast I might be tempted to sell in a two-year-old sale." A \$20,000 Keeneland September graduate in 2003, Blue Warbler required 14 starts and a drop into a \$16,000 maiden claimer to break her maiden at Woodbine in May 2005, a race from which she was claimed. Eighth for a \$25,000 tag June 19, she was third in a \$20,000 tagger July 1. Enter Henny Hughes. Following a sixlength maiden win at Monmouth June 17, the chestnut ran away with the Tremont S. on Independence Day and all at once, Blue Warbler was worth a whole lot more than \$16,000. Now unwilling to lose her, she made her final appearance a winning one, taking a Fort Erie allowance by a neck last July 18. Just short of four months later, Blue Warbler made her first trip to the November sale, where she was knocked down to Southgate Farm for \$270,000. Bred this past Feb. 12 to Mr. Greeley, yesterday's activity made for yet another profitable transaction.

Streaking Meteor...

A colt by Yes It's True brought the top price for a weanling yesterday at Keeneland. The bay, out of the stakes-winning **Meteor Cap** (Capote), was purchased for Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Stables, LLC, for \$300,000. Hailing from the consignment of Gainesway,

the Feb. 6 foal is from the family of Grade I winners A Phenomenon and Seattle Meteor. "This colt is a serious beast," said Gainesway's Michael Hernon. "He had size, strength, balance. He had motion. He was a very appealing sales horse--what the market is looking for. He's a very good prospect. We were delighted with

the price, which was considerably more than the reserve. We wish the buyers luck." It wasn't the first time Gainesway enjoyed success with a son of Meteor Cap. After purchasing her as a three-year-old broodmare prospect in 1997, the farm sold her yearling colt by Dixieland Band, Al Ash Hab, for \$720,000 in 1999. The 12-year-old Meteor Cap, who is now in foal to Gainesway's freshman sire Orientate, was scheduled to go through the ring after her foal, but Hernon and company had second thoughts. "We felt this colt would sell well, and with Orientate coming on the way he is--his filly Successful Outlook just won the GIII Tempted S .-we felt we should hang on to the mare. She's got this promising colt going for her, and the colt's half-sister, a Came Home filly named Homefortheholidays, is a very promising filly that's owned by Gary and Mary West. Dallas Stewart trains her and has a very high opinion of her."

America the Beautiful...

It was a lovely ride, but eventually it had to come to an end. In 2002, Franck and Capucine Mourier purchased the modestly bred America America as a yearling for \$5,000. Just over four years later, at yesterday's fourth session of the Keeneland November Sale, the couple parted ways with the likeable daughter of Mister Baileys (GB), who was knocked down to Jess Jackson's Stonestreet for \$410,000. In the interim, America America took the Mouriers to four countries and eight states in 15 months of racing. She started 27 times, won a pair of black-type events, placed in stakes ranging from England to Germany to Canada, and earned in excess of \$400,000. "They've had a wonderful spin with her," said Jeffrey Morris, who consigned America America through his Highclere Sales. "She's family to them, so this was very emotional. They lived with her for so long. He was the trainer, she was the hotwalker." America America began her career in April of 2003, when she won a three-furlong Gulfstream maiden before running second by a head in a minor stakes 18 days later. That was about as conventional as her juvenile campaign would get. Shipped to Europe, America America raced in seven events over the summer, mostly stakes, hitting the board in five. Returned to North America, she raced eight more times that term, notching a win against the boys in the Sam Houston Texan Juvenile S., a runner-up finish in the GII Mazarine BC S. and a third in the GIII Natalma S. In all, America America started 17 times at two and earned nearly \$300,000. Put in foal to El Prado (Ire) in the spring of her three-year-old year, America America added a win in the Lone Star Oaks while pregnant before being retired from racing. In their first attempt to sell her, the Mouriers offered America America at the 2004 Fasig-Tipton November Sale, but opted to buy her back when bidding ground to a halt at \$325,000. They sold part of the resulting foal to Morris, who also leased America America for the 2005 season, breeding her to Dynaformer. At this year's September Sale, the Mouriers and Highclere sold the yearling El Prado (Ire) filly to John Ferguson for \$280,000, and yesterday America America was back in the ring herself with her Dynaformer weanling filly in tow. This time around, America America found a new home. Selling in foal to Rock Hard Ten, she was the seventh-highest-priced mare on the day.

America America's daughter, meanwhile, went to Arch Bloodstock LLC, for \$285,000, the second-highest-priced weanling. "She had a tremendous amount of quality," Morris said of the latter. "A lot of the Dynaformers can be very rugged, but she wasn't." Franck Mourier wasn't on hand to see America America sell--he was in Italy on business--but Capucine Mourier was in Lexington. "She had to pull this off on her own today," empathized Morris. "You'd think a sale like this would be exhilarating, but the emotional attachment was such that it was tough. The went around the world in 80 days with that filly, and they were the only ones with her night and day. But she's gone to a good home."

Tidy Profit for Vinery...

When Vinery's Minge Cove (Sandpit {Brz}) finished unplaced in the GI Beverly D. S. earlier this summer, she had a bit of a handicap. She was actually about four months pregnant at the time. The five-year-old mare, acquired privately by the Central Kentucky nursery earlier this year for "a low six-figure price tag," did well yesterday at Keeneland, selling for \$250,000. Vinery's sales arm consigned the bay who was purchased by Deep Spring Farm. Minge Cove began her career under the tutelage of Allen Iwinski, winning two of her first four starts, including the Via Borghese S. in 2004. An allowance winner over the Belmont turf last fall, she joined the Vinery racing stable in March and finished third in a Keeneland turf allowance one day after being bred to More Than Ready. Given some time for the cover to take, Minge Cove resurfaced to win over the Churchill turf June 18 and earned the first graded black-type of her career with a close third-place finish in the GIII Modesty H. at Arlington July 22. "We're always looking for young mares coming off the track," commented Michael Callanan, farm manager at Vinery. "It was huge to get her graded-stakes placed. You want to get as much of that as possible." Callanan points out that the cross has worked on the family. Minge Cove is a half-sister to Gypsy Monarch (Wavering Monarch), the dam of More Than Ready's daughter La Chunga, a dual Group 3 winner in Europe.

Sitting in the front of the sale pavilion just under the press box, trainer John Ward went to \$425,000 for the Storm Cat mare String of Pearls, the sixth-highestpriced mare of yesterday's fourth session. Oxley said he purchased the mare for long-time client John Oxley. "We just liked the Storm Cat mares, and we're hoping to own a few," said Ward. "She's a nice young mare and has a future in front of her." The unraced four-yearold String of Pearls, who sold in foal to Stephen Got Even, boasts an impressive pedigree. Out of GI Ballerina H. winner Pearl City (Carson City), the bay is a 3/4-inblood sister to leading sire Hennessy, a brother of Pearl City's who himself is by Storm Cat. It is also the family of Classic winner Editor's Note and Storm Cat's champion Hold That Tiger. Ward said a 2007 mate for String of Pearls had not been selected. Eaton Sales consigned String of Pearls on behalf of breeder Overbrook Farm.

Full Steam Ahead at Keeneland...

At the close of Book 2, the brisk trading that characterized the first three days of the Keeneland November Sale showed no signs of slowing down. Led by the session-topping sale of the Mr. Greeley mare Pretty Proud for \$600,000, Thursday's action saw 257 head sell for a gross of \$31,626,000. The average was a solid \$123,058 and the median was \$90,000. "It was an exceedingly strong sale [yesterday]," said Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "The strength of the November Sale reflects the strength of the September Sale. We also have a very strong international base that continues to spend. The bull market's been very strong." Russell also said that Keeneland expected to see some new faces for the start of Book 3. "We're starting to see a rotation," he commented. Thursday concluded with Mill Ridge Sales leading the consignor list by gross, with 17 sold for \$3,515,000. International Equine Conseil Agency wound up as the day's leading buyer, purchasing three horses for \$845,000. SUMMERLY TO FALLS CITY Summerly (Summer Squall), purchased by WinStar Farm for \$3.3-million at Fasig-Tipton in Lexington Sunday, will make her next start in the GII Falls City H. at Churchill Downs Nov. 23. Summerly, raced under the colors of Winchell Thoroughbreds, LLC throughout her career, was excluded from last week's GI Breeders' Cup Distaff because of a full 14-horse field. Trainer Scott Blasi said the Falls City would likely be the final race for Summerly before she starts a new career as a WinStar broodmare. "This probably will be it, I'm guessing, but I haven't discussed it with [racing Manager] Elliott [Walden] or [WinStar President and CEO] Doug Cauthen yet," said Blasi. The Falls City would be the fourth start of the 4-year-old campaign for Summerly, who saw her 2005 campaign come to a premature end when she was injured while training toward the Alabama (GI) at Saratoga. She won the \$70,000 Ashado H. at Saratoga Aug. 4, finished fifth behind Pool Land in the Sept. 10 GI Ruffian H. at Belmont and was a close sixth to Asi Siempre in her latest start in the GI Spinster over the Keeneland Polytrack Oct. 8.

"If someone had said to me earlier this year she could win the Slipper and the Oaks in the same year, I would have said I thought it was impossible," Arrowfield chief John Messara said. "We'd love to take her overseas, but there are also some fantastic fillies races including the Arrowfield S. in Sydney next autumn and we want to give [runner-up] Tuesday Joy the chance to have another crack at us."

WHEN OPPORTUNITY KNOCKS

It was at the Keeneland September sale some 20 years ago that owner Jim Tafel went to \$75,000 to acquire Majestic Legend and she repaid that confidence, winning seven times, including one stakes event, and

earning \$200,853. She also became a stalwart of the Tafel broodmare band and her best two offspring came in 1996, when she produced Binalegend (Binalong, MSW, \$288,245) and Bedazzle (Dixieland Band), a four-time winner of \$197,455.

Tafel sold Majestic Legend for \$200,000 at the 2001 November sale and Binalegend for \$160,000 at the 2004 renewal,

and, in an effort to further reduce his bloodstock holdings, parted with Bedazzle, in foal to Distorted Humor, for \$180,000 last year.

At that time, Tafel and trainer Carl Nafzger watched with interest as the mare's foal of 2004, a colt by Street Cry (Ire), was growing into his frame.

"I look at all of Jim's weanlings and yearlings as they come along and we all agreed that [Street Sense] was an 'A' colt," Nafzger said yesterday from Keeneland.

Nafzger was sitting right next to Tafel when Bedazzle was in the ring last year and found himself unable to resist. Still, he wanted his owner's blessing.

"Nobody really wanted her, I turned to Jim and I said 'I'm gonna buy her,' and he said 'Go ahead,'" Nafzger related. "I thought, the mare's carrying a Distorted Humor, [his stud fee] had just went to \$150,000 and I bought her just above her reserve. The whole world was here. I thought it was a steal."

The conditioner signed the ticket on behalf of a partnership headed by Randy Bloch, who is listed as the breeder of the bay filly who sells today as hip 1446 from the Calumet Farm consignment.

"She's a nice filly," Nafzger commented. "I don't know what the partnership is going to do with her--I'm trying to find out myself. I'd like to train her."

He adds that the Mar. 28 foal bears a likeness to her half-brother, the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner.

"They do have the same top line and they are a lot alike, although she might actually have a little more scope than Street Sense did as a weanling."

For his part, Tafel has no second thoughts about having sold the dam of a likely champion.

"To be honest, you have to have regrets, but at the same time, I was trying to cut down on the number of broodmares I have," he explained. "Would I rather still have her after winning the Juvenile? Heck yeah, I would, but is there any remorse? No, because it was part of my plan."

Really, he wouldn't change a thing.

"I'm doing just fine," Tafel said with a broad smile.





NEW WAGERING RECORD AT BREEDERS' CUP

Three wagering records were established at this year's Breeders' Cup held at Churchill Downs in Louisville, Kentucky. Total all-sources handle for the 10-race card was \$140,332,198, a 13.1-percent increase over the previous record of \$123,978,241, which was set last year at Belmont Park. At Churchill Downs, the crowd of 75,132 wagered a Breeders' Cup on-track record \$18,259,971 on the full, 10-race program, and \$17,184,919 on the eight Breeders' Cup races. That full-card, on-track total breaks the previous Breeders' Cup record of \$16,346,688 set at the 2003 Breeders' Cup at Santa Anita Park. A record total of \$26,692,697 was wagered on the final race of the day, the Breeders' Cup Classic. This year's all-sources Classic handle, which included more than \$2.4 million bet on runner-up Bernardini, was 44-percent higher than last year's Classic wagering total of \$18,533,279. A record total of \$134,357,846 was wagered at Churchill Downs and at simulcast outlets around the world on the eight Breeders' Cup World Championships races. This mark breaks the old record of \$116,465,923 set last year at Belmont Park, and is a 15.4-percent increase from 2005 figures. A record was also established for total simulcast handle, with \$122,072,227 wagered on the full 10-race card. Simulcasting accounted for 87 percent of the more than \$140 million total handle. Canada led foreign countries by wagering \$5,392,889 on the eight Breeders' Cup races. International handle represented 13.7 percent of the total handle. A total of \$4,786,481 was wagered on the Breeders' Cup Ultra Pick 6, a 4.4-percent increase over last year's handle of \$4,586,700. There were two winning tickets, each worth \$1,450,707. There were 85 consolation tickets worth \$11,318.





ANIMAL LOVERS FOR INFINITY

Ask Julie Trzcinski, who bristles with enthusiasm, what she does and she starts to ramble a bit. So, here is the short and sweet explanation: she looks out for the underdog.

Trzcinski has a soft spot for horses in need, which is why, some 10 years ago, she created a modest-sized thoroughbred rescue operation based in Brewster, Mass. on Cape Cod. She calls it Animal Lovers for Infinity and she currently cares for 10 retired thoroughbreds on her 15-acre farm who were in danger of being sent to the slaughterhouse. But neither could Trzcinski turn her back on kids with problems. Now she helps both and both help each other.

About three years ago, a friend of Trzcinski's who worked at the Latham School, a residential care center for teenagers requiring special assistance, asked if some of the kids from the school could come by and spend some time around the horses. It wasn't supposed to be any big deal; just a way for the kids to get some fresh air and to be around animals. It has turned out to be much more than that.

"They come just for an hour and they help me with various tasks here, whether it's grooming or wrapping legs or cleaning stalls," Trzcinski said. "They enjoy it so much they don't want to leave. It's been very re-warding to watch them get so much out of coming here and learning about horses. It's really been fascinating."

Kids in the Latham School are there because they have needs and difficulties, impediments that make it hard for them to make it on their own in the world. Society may think there is something wrong with them or that they are different. The horses, they don't care. That's the beauty of this.

"A lot of the kids came from abusive backgrounds and have been placed in various foster homes," Trzcinski said.

"Some have sort of been abandoned by their parents. Some have learning disabilities. To me, they're all wonderful. I understand some have behavioral issues, but I've never had a problem here with anybody misbehaving or acting in a violent way. The animals bring out the best in them

"Why? A lot of people have written books about that. I think it's the unconditional love and appreciation that horses give to people. The horses love to be brushed and petted and talked to. They are wonderful animals and the kids feed off that niceness that horses have. It's a really great thing to see their faces when they are helping me groom or wrap legs. They are so proud of themselves to be able to work around a big 1,000-pound animal who loves the attention."

Her stable pupil is Beau Jones, who has Prader-Willi Syndrome. Prader-Willi Syndrome is a genetic disorder that can include mental retardation or learning disabilities, behavioral problems and an involuntary urge to eat constantly, which, coupled with a reduced need for calories, can lead to obesity. Now 21, Jones started with Trzcinski when he was at the Latham School. When he moved on to an adult group home in nearby West Yarmouth, Mass., he insisted that he continue working with the horses.

"Beau is very special to me because he decided to come on his own personal time," Trzcinski said. "He's not part of the school anymore. He takes a great pride in feeling that he is responsible for the happiness of the horses. He always says that he's so glad he can be here and help these horses have a nice life. He feels really, really good about taking care of them, whether it's feeding or cleaning the stalls. He's the caretaker of the horses and he loves that. Beau is a really special guy."

"Beau's time with Julie has really helped his confidence and self image," said Jones's father, Bob. "He is taking a special course in animal care at Cape Cod Community College, under a program for the disabled called Project Forward. Julie is a gentle and unique character."

Some of the horses that Beau Jones takes care of are named Sunny Lights, Big Shot Scott and Island Skipper. None of them were much on the racetrack, but they are all special to Trzcinski.

"I became fascinated by how beautiful and wonderful these horses are and I hate to see so many have their lives ended at such a young age," she said. "That's very disheartening to me. So, I decided that, with my life, I would save injured, slow or unwanted horses off the track who were destined for the slaughterhouse."

Thanks to Trzcinski, Sunny Lights, Island Skipper and Shot Gun Scott are safe and happy and helping kids. Thank goodness they weren't discarded and sent off to slaughter. So what if they couldn't run? You don't need to win the Kentucky Derby to be special.
