Crystal Spring Dispersal, the dark bay was purchased by agent Ron Gilbert, acting on behalf of the partnership of C. R. Trout and Reata Thoroughbred Farm. The unraced mare is out of stakes winner Far Flying (Far North), runner up in the GIII Affectionately H. and GIII Next Move H., and third in the GI Mother Goose S. Far Flying, who earned \$278,226 in three seasons on

the track, is a half sister to champion three-year-old filly and GI Breeders' Cup Distaff winner Sacahuista and Grade I winner John's Treasure. In foal to Successful Appeal, Dreamingatdaybreak, who was a \$535,000 KEENOV weanling purchase in 2000, is a half-sister to graded stakes winner Dalhart (Forty Niner) and Garimpeiro (Mr. Prospector), dam of GISW Geri and graded stakes second-place finishers A.P. Arrow (A.P. Indy) and Stage Shy (Theatrical {Ire}). Heading the weanling offerings yesterday, hip 2829 was purchased by Pat Garvey for \$180,000 from the Four Star Sales consignment. A Mar. 19 foal, the filly is out of GIII Debutante S. winner Move (Forty Niner), who sold in foal to this filly for \$37,000 at last year's Keeneland November sale. Keeneland's November Breeding Stock Sale surpassed last year's sale gross on Monday, when totals for the eight days of selling reached \$290,807,400. Gross sales for the 14-day auction in 2005 totaled \$289,602,900. "We are very happy to establish such a mark with six more days yet to go," said Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland's director of sales. "Today there was a strong presence of South American and South Korean buyers. The middle market just continues to roll on." Keeneland's November Breeding Stock Sale runs through Sunday, November 19. Sessions begin at 10:00 a.m. each day.



The truth of the saying that nature abhors a vacuum is constantly underlined in the Thoroughbred industry. As the great stallions age and fade away, a new wave invariably comes through to take their place. This is being amply demonstrated at the moment in Britain and Ireland, where several sons of famous stallions are rapidly scaling the heights.

Of course Sadler's Wells--soon to be 26--is still a major force, but he is rapidly being overhauled by his sons Galileo and Montjeu. Galileo's fee has risen from

€37,500 to €150,000 (equivalent to \$192,000), while Montjeu maintains his fee of €125,000 (\$160,000). Other significant rises concern two of Cheveley Park Stud's stallions. Medicean, a son of the deceased Machiavellian, has had his fee raised from

£17,500 to £30,000 (\$57,000) and Pivotal, a grandson of the great Nureyev, is now priced at £85,000 (\$162,000), from £65,000. Two sons of the much-missed Danehill are also on the up-and-up. Danehill Dancer, whose fee was as low as IR4,000gns as recently as 2001, is priced at $\[\in \]$ 115,000 (\$148,000) for the 2007 season, whereas Dansili's fee has been raised to £30,000 (\$57,000) from £12,500.

The hike in Dansili's fee reflects his considerable achievements during the current year. When his daugh-

ter Passage of Time defeated the colts in the Criterium de Saint-Cloud two days ago, she became the third of Dansili's progeny to pass the post first in a Group 1 race in France in 2006, following Price Tag (French 1000 Guineas) and Rail Link (Grand Prix de Paris and the Arc). Although the stewards demoted Price Tag to third, Dansili looks assured of finishing

champion sire in France--an honor taken by Danehill in 2001 and 2002.

The 10-year-old son of that extraordinary mare Hasili has also flourished in Britain and Ireland, where he ranks fifth by number of winners, with a similar percentage to Danehill and Danehill Dancer. His tally of 11 stakes winners places him seventh among the sires of European stakes winners, ahead of Montjeu, Galileo and Pivotal, his biggest British earner being Strategic Prince.

This very talented juvenile followed up a pair of Group 2 victories with a solid third behind Teofilo and Holy Roman Emperor in the G1 Dewhurst S. Dansili has another group-winning two-year-old in Thousand Words, even though juvenile prowess isn't generally what the Hasili clan has been famous for.

Hasili herself showed surprising precocity for a daughter of the Derby-winning Kahyasi, winning four of her eight starts in the French provinces. However,

Dansili made only one appearance at two (which he won), and so did his outstanding sister Banks Hill and their younger brother Champs Elysee. Hasili's excellent Green Desert filly Heat Haze didn't race until she was three and neither did Cacique, the fourth of Hasili's five foals by Danehill. The exception to the rule was Intercontinental, who won her first two starts before tackling the colts in the Grand Criterium. Her refusal to settle in the first half of this G1 contest possibly cost her victory, as she was beaten only two half-lengths into third.

Mention of these illustrious siblings helps explain why Dansili's fortunes have been on the rise this year. When he retired to Banstead Manor Stud for the 2001 season, his fee was set no higher than £8,000, as he had failed to win a Group 1 race during his 14-race career. There was no doubt, though, that he possessed more talent than many a Group 1 winner, as he had run Giant's Causeway to 3/4 lengths in the Sussex S. and he had looked distinctly unlucky when a narrowly-beaten third in War Chant's Breeders' Cup Mile.

By the time he stood his second season in 2002, his sister Banks Hill had won the Coronation S. and the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf. This resulted in his fee

rising to £10,000, at which he sired a crop of 126 foals. There had been another distinct surge in the family fortunes by the time his third season came around: Banks Hill had won the Prix Jacques le Marois; Heat Haze had finished fifth in the French 1000 Guineas; and Intercontinental had already begun to shine. This prompted another rise in fee,

this time to £12,500. While the third-season mares were probably the best Dansili had received, there were fewer of them and the group winners Passage of Time, Strategic Prince and Thousand Words, together with the Group 1 placed Supposition, come from a crop of 68.

Dansili's fourth crop--as is often the case--is his smallest so far, but his promising results with his first two-year-olds in 2004 ensured that he was much busier in 2005, when he attracted more than 130 mares. He again covered a three-figure book this year.

One striking aspect of Dansili's career to date is that he has sired the group winners Passage of Time, Rail Link, Price Tag, Thousand Words and Early March from mares which did not win at stakes level, and the same applies to his Listed winners Don't Dili Dali, High Heel Sneakers, Quenched and Silver Touch. Imagine what he is likely to achieve with the type of mare that his new fee will bring him.

Dansili's family history suggests that his progeny will generally improve from two to three. This bodes well for Passage of Time, as do the subsequent records of the other female winners of the Criterium de Saint-Cloud. Escaline, the 1982 winner, went on to take the Prix de Diane, whereas Goldamix and Paita, winners in 1999 and 2004, were both third in the Diane.

Passage of Time is the third foal, and second talented winner, out of Clepsydra, a minor mile-and-a-half winner by Sadler's Wells. Clepsydra is one of 34 representatives of the Sadler's Wells--Blushing Groom cross, none of which won a group race. However, Clepsydra is the second mare bred this way to have produced a stakes winner, following Balaabel, dam of the Group 2-winning Darshaan filly Sayedah.

Passage of Time's second dam, Quandary, became one of the last stakes winners by the exceptional Blushing Groom when she easily won the James Seymour S. over 1½ miles for Henry Cecil in 1995. Although she was talented, Quandary's main distinction was that she was a half-sister to the top-class racemare All At Sea (Prix du Moulin and second in the Oaks). Juddmonte also enjoyed group success this year with Stronghold, an impressive-looking son of Danehill and All At Sea's daughter Insinuate.

Quandary is also a half-sister to Quack A Doodledoo, the second dam of the champion American filly Banshee Breeze. The CCA Oaks figured among Banshee Breeze's five Grade I successes and it could be that this family, which also produced the outstanding Damascus, will enjoy further Oaks success with Passage of Time.

CHARLES HESSE III PASSES AWAY Owner and breeder Charles Hesse III passed away yesterday after a brief illness. He was 71. The New Jersey native was introduced to racing by his father, Charles Hesse Jr., who owned the construction company that built the original racing strip at Monmouth Park in 1945. The elder Hesse joined the ranks of Thoroughbred owners in

1952, but it would be another 20 years before the son followed suit. Hesse purchased his first horse, Southern Special, as a birthday present for his wife Marianne in 1972. While the mare earned just \$11,525 and won only once, she became the foundation of their breeding operation. She is the third dam of Park Avenue Ball, who carried the silks of Hesse's Char-Mari Stables to victory in the GII Futu-

rity S., GIII Philip H. Iselin BC S. and GIII Long Branch BC S., and was also third in the GI Haskell Invitational H. The four-year-old's earnings stand at \$946,600. The stable also campaigned C.J.'s Boy, who won the first stakes race run at Monmouth after Hesse, then in charge of the construction business, rebuilt the track surface in 1978, taking the 1979 Brookdale H. One of Char-Mari's most accomplished runners was GISW Storm Tower. Purchased for \$245,000 as a yearling, he captured the GI Wood Memorial and GII Fountain of Youth S. in 1993. The bay was sent off at 9-1 in the GI Kentucky Derby and set the pace for seven furlongs before tiring to be 16th. Also the winner of the GIII Salvator Mile H. in 1994 and runner-up in the GI Florida Derby and Haskell, he bankrolled \$823,193. Bloodstock agent Buzz Chace, who knew Hesse for nearly 30 years, said, "He was a great sportsman. They don't make many like him any more. He was a really great guy." Funeral arrangements are pending.

"We think it's important to raise money for research," Phipps said. "It's important for all of us in the business to do something about racing injuries and to minimize them."

Phipps said he does not believe the condition of the Churchill Downs dirt racing surface led to the catastrophic injury to Pine Island's left front fetlock in a race that also saw favorite Fleet Indian pull up at the top of the stretch with a suspensory injury. "I had no concerns about the track," Phipps said about a surface some jockeys and horsemen called inconsistent in its footing. "I had heard some horses liked the track and other hadn't. Never did I hear it was unsafe, or never was there any thought going in that there was something wrong with our filly." For the whole story, click here.

MONMOUTH QUARANTINE PARTLY LIFTED A

quarantine of horses at Monmouth Park, instituted in late October when at least four horses tested positive for the Equine Herpes Virus (EHV), was partially lifted yesterday after tests on two horses showing possible signs of the disease last weekend came back negative, according a New Jersey Department of Agriculture press release. The quarantine was lifted on horses in the general population barns at Monmouth Park. Since the quarantine was put into effect Oct. 26, none of the horses from the general population has become infected. The barns house roughly 1,000 horses. "No other horses from the general population with any clinical signs consistent with the disease have tested positive for more than 12 days since the inception of the quarantine, so we feel confident we can let them leave Monmouth Park," state veterinarian Dr. Nancy Halpern said. "However, the quarantine remains on approximately 100 horses who either tested positive or were directly exposed to infected horses."
