DAIWA MAJOR REIGNS IN MILE CHAMPIONSHIP

Daiwa Major (Sunday Silence) went off the clear-cut favorite in Sunday's G1 Mile Championship at Kyoto and proved that he was deserving of the support when he outlasted the classy filly **Dance in the Mood** (Sunday Silence) by a long neck for his third Group 1 score.

Settled in second under his patient passenger Katsumi Ando while Dance in the Mood, under Yutaka Take, lingered near the middle of the pack early, the five-year-old was finally given the signal turning for home and he responded with authority. Swung

out into the middle of the track, the crowd's choice dispensed of early leader **Suteki Shinsukekun** (Danzig) and had enough left in reserve to fend off the late attention of Dance in the Mood. Closer **Symboli Gran** (Grand Lodge) rounded out the top three. Winner of the G1 Satsuki Sho at three, the chestnut returned in 2005 with a victory in the Listed (G3-Jpn) Lord Derby Challenge Trophy S. and finished runner-up to Hat Trick (Jpn) in this event, his final start of the season. Back better than ever at five, he took the G2-Jpn Yomiuri Mile Cup in April before adding a pair of respectable fourth-place finishes in Group 1 company. Back in the winner's circle following the G2-Jpn Mainichi Okan Oct. 8, he added a win in his latest, the G1 Tenno Sho Oct. 29. racingpost.co.uk chart or brisnet.com catalogue.style pedigree.

KEENELAND NOVEMBER ENDS

The 14-day Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale concluded yesterday with the second-highest gross in the auction's history. Gross receipts for the sale reached \$313,843,800, up 8.4 percent from the 2005 auction and just short of the sale record \$317,666,000 set in 1999. Average price for the sale was \$99,728, down 2.9 percent from the 2005 figure of \$102,734, while the median of \$35,000 remained unchanged from last year. Twenty-seven horses topped the million-dollar mark. "It's been an amazing two weeks," said Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland's Director of Sales. "We've seen major increases at all levels of the market. The strongest segment continues to be the middle market, which saw impressive gains in November. Buyers and consignors have repeatedly used the word fantastic to describe the sale, and I have to echo those sentiments. Keeneland is the place where the world comes to buy horses. We offer a 'quantity of quality' at all levels of the market. The selection is so broad that buyers can go home with all of their orders filled." cont. p3

There are 293 lots catalogued, many of whom have either missed--or failed to change hands at--an earlier yearling sale this year. The likely star of the show, Lot 186, is making her first sale ring appearance. A Dalakhani (Ire) sibling to five black-type performers, including Group 1 winner Cerulean Sky (Ire) (Darshaan), she is offered as part of the dispersal from Roger Baines' Britton House Stud. A select draft from Meon Valley Stud includes Lot 212, an Act One (GB) sibling to the Group 1 winners Kayf Tara (GB) (Sadler's Wells), Opera House (GB) (Sadler's Wells) and Zee Zee Top (GB) (Zafonic). Lot 210, from the same family, is a Red Ransom half-brother to Group 1-winning juvenile Necklace (GB) (Darshaan). Those with sales experience this year include Lot 170, an Intikhab colt offered from Gay O'Callaghan's Yeomanstown Stud who was bought for 62,000 guineas at Tattersalls' October Part 2. Lot 68, a Lando (Ger) colt from a top German family, was bought by consignor Emma O'Gorman for €70,000 at Baden-Baden in September. Lot 45 is a Dixie Union granddaughter of multiple Group 1 winner Wandesta (GB) (Nashwan) offered from Broguestown Stud, while Lot 196 is a Hawk Wing half-brother to recent G2 Diadem S. winner Red Clubs (Ire) (Red Ransom) offered from Islanmore Stud. Keeneland November Concludes (cont. from p1)

The three-year-old stakes-winner Half Ours (Unbridled's Song) topped the Keeneland November sale when he attracted a final bid of \$6.1 million, a salesrecord for a horse in training. Madcap Escapade (Hennessy), in foal to Pulpit, was the top-priced mare, selling for \$6 million. Keeneland sold two record-breaking weanlings during the November sale, establishing a North American record price for a weanling colt at public auction when Japanese agent Nobutaka Tada paid \$2.7 million for a half brother to European champion Electrocutionist. A filly by Gone West out of Islington (Ire) set a Keeneland sale record for a weanling filly, going for \$2.4 million to Spanish businessman Alberto Abajo. For the fifth consecutive year, Taylor Made Sales Agency led the November Sale's consignor's list, selling 321 horses for \$51,558,100. Hill 'n' Dale was the leading buyer at the auction, taking home 29 horses for a total of \$16,122,000 and an average of \$555,931. Keeneland November attracted buyers from 33 countries over six continents. A weanling by Cashel Castle out of Line Shot (Caller I.D.) attracted top bid of \$53,000 at Sunday's final session of the sale. The filly was consigned by TimberView Sales and was purchased by Thomas Meharry.



"Demand for mares from the domestic market was very strong and the presence of buyers from France, Italy, UK, Turkey and India contributed to a very successful sale," concluded Goffs managing director Matt Mitchell. John O'Connor's Ballylinch Stud paid €320,000 for hip 1640, the eight-year-old mare Rain Dancer (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), who proved the stand-out of the final session. From the famed Juddmonte family of Danehill, which also includes Eagle Eyed and the topclass Australian performer Diatribe (Aus), she was consigned by John Kilpatrick's JK Thoroughbreds. Her daughter Boca Dancer (Ire) recently took the Listed Silken Glider S. and has been touted as a possible Classic contender for 2007. She is carrying a half-sibling to that talented filly by Noverre. "I was impressed by Boca Dancer, who looks a very good filly," O'Connor commented. "She's a lovely type of mare and there was a lot of Sadler's Wells about her." As always, His Highness the Aga Khan's draft was towards the fore of proceedings and the highlight proved to be hip 1559 the four-year-old filly Lunathea (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}). Joe Foley's Ballyhane Stud purchased the half-sister to the group scorer Luna Kya (Fr) out of a half to Linamix (Fr) and the 1996 G1 Prix Saint-Alary winner Luna Wells (Ire) for €120,000. Foley revealed that she had been bought for Charlie Mason. "Barathea looks a very promising broodmare sire and she comes from a good family," he said. Shortly after, Hubie de Burgh paid €65,000 for the three-year-old filly Veyana (Ire) (Kahyasi {Ire}) from the same consignment. Hip 1563 is closely related to the 1997 G1 Prix de Diane (French Oaks) winner Vereva (Ire). As he had on Thursday, when he purchased the session-topping Bertolini filly, Brian Grassick made his presence felt and went to €78,000 for Loughbrown Stud's hip 1610, the sevenyear-old Sayuri (Sadler's Wells). In foal to Kingsalsa, she is from the family of Singspiel (Ire) and Rahy.

HOLLYWOOD RACES SUNDAY AFTER ADDRESSING CUSHION TRACK COMPLAINTS

Hollywood Park planned to conduct a full card of racing on its Cushion Track Sunday, one day after jockeys complained late in the day about "waves," or clumps of synthetic material, that a track official said were caused by problems with the equipment used to maintain the new surface. The track was closed at 7:30 a.m. (PST) Sunday morning after a horse broke down while training. Crews worked on the track the rest of the morning and the decision to race was made after an early afternoon trial run involving five horses and jockeys who tested the surface. Post time for Sunday was delayed by 40 minutes to 1:11 p.m. "We had some waves in the track, which we think was from an equipment adjustment," said Martin Panza, vice president of racing for the Inglewood, California, track. "We hadn't had waves in the surface for 2½ months, but we were doing something different in our maintenance. What we were doing renovation-wise we learned doesn't work. The track is good; it's not 100 percent but it's a lot better than vesterday. It should get better and better with each race," jockey Victor Espinoza said immediately after working a horse a half-mile. "It was hard work by those guys [maintenance crew] and they're doing a great job. As I understand it, it's hard to work it at night." Panza said the problem surfaced after a front roller on the equipment used to maintain the track kept breaking and was removed by maintenance crews. The specially designed equipment has a front roller, harrows, and a back roller. "At night, when the weather cooled down, the harrows caused small humps in the track," he said. "It would drag, drag, drag material, then after awhile it would release some of the material, though it was only in a few areas." The equipment has been fixed with the front roller reinstalled, Panza said. "This whole thing is a learning process as we go, but this was a bump in the road," he said. Trainer Jeff Mullins, who keeps the bulk of his stable based at the Inglewood oval, said the problems initially began with the Friday night card when a dip in temperature and a light blanket of fog caused the surface to become uneven and undulating. The unevenness continued during training hours on Saturday and by the final races on the 10-race card that afternoon, riders became concerned about safety. Despite the continued chilly temperatures and fog in the area, Hollywood Park's maintenance crew worked throughout the night Saturday night, but by the time the track opened for training early Sunday, the undulations were so severe that it was closed so the maintenance crew could work on it. "He went really well," said Rick Mettee, Godolphin Racing's New York trainer. "He galloped out six furlongs [in 1:11 2/5]. I'm looking forward to the race because he's facing a good bunch of older horses that all run good numbers on their best day. I'm glad he's going to be pushed. I just hope the track is dry and in good shape." Winner of the G2 UAE Derby in March, Discreet Cat is coming off a 10 1/4-length victory in the Oct. 1 GII Jerome Breeders' Cup H. Also likely for the Cigar Mile are Badge of Silver (Silver Deputy), Dixie Meister (Holzmeister), Mantoloking (Unbridled's Song) and Silver Train (Old Trieste).



Premium Tap Likely for Clark:

Summerly, who was excluded from the Breeders' Cup Distaff field, was purchased by WinStar Farm for \$3.3 million at Fasig-Tipton and will be bred to Distorted Humor next year.
