Kenneth and Sarah Ramsey have invested considerable time, effort and money in the career of their stallion Catienus. And, while he hasn't become a major commercial hit--he stood the most recent season at Highcliff Farm in Delanson, New York at a fee of \$6,500--Catienus has rewarded his owner's faith by siring nine stakes winners and a total of 19 stakes performers with his first three crops. These include several smart Ramsey colorbearers, most notably the GI Breeder's Futurity S. victor Dawn of War, the GI Belmont S. and GII Super Derby third Nolan's Cat, and Precious Kitten, winner of this weekend's GII Mrs. Revere S.

A son of Storm Cat out of the graded-stakes placed Mr. Prospector mare Diamond City, Catienus actually carried the colors of Sheikh Mohammed through his first 13 starts. He began his career in Europe, and at one stage won three straight--his last two starts at two, and his first at three. Three outings in tougher company--the best of which resulted in a close fourth in the G3 Royal Whip S. against older horses--convinced his connections that Catienus' future might lie in the U.S. In this country, he made three starts at four when his season ended prematurely after a win in an 8½-furlong allowance race on dirt at Monmouth.

After a disappointing debut at five, Catienus was dropped in for a \$60,000 tag at Aqueduct and was promptly haltered from the race, in which he finished second.

The move paid immediate dividends, as next time out Catienus, earned black-type for the Ramseys with a tally in the Charles Staats Memorial S. at Delaware. He demonstrated even better form in his next three starts, with a second, beaten only a half-length to Running Stag in the GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup H.; a second to Behrens in the GII Suburban H., and a third to Victory Gallop and Behrens in the GI Whitney H. Kept in training at six, Catienus, added another second in the Saratoga Breeders' Cup.

Catienus initially stood at Ramsey Farm in Nicholasville, Kentucky, at a fee of \$6,000 (which dropped to \$3,500 the following year), before moving to Highcliff Farm. That first Kentucky crop produced 18 U.S. two-year-old winners, more than any other freshman sire. It also included four stakes winners as well as Nolan's Cat; Dawn of War and Precious Kitten head the four stakes winners from Catienus's second crop, and his third crop, currently two-year-olds, includes stakes winner Lights of Broadway.

Kitten's First, the dam of Precious Kitten, won only one race, but as a broodmare she's been something of a superstar. Her foal immediately preceding Precious Kitten was Kitten's Joy, an El Prado colt who earned honors as champion turf horse of 2004, and captured the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic, GI Secretariat S., GII Firecracker Breeders' Cup H., GIII Virginia Derby, GIII Crown Royal American Turf S. and GIII Tropical Park Derby. Earlier, Kitten's First began her stud career by producing the Broad Brush filly, Justenuffheart. She won three stakes events and was graded stakes placed, but she is now better known as the dam of this year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies heroine, Dreaming of Anna, and is also dam of that filly's multiple stakeswinning and graded-placed brother, Lewis Michael. Precious Kitten's second dam, That's My Hon, a daughter of L'Enjoleur, never won, but she did produce the GI United Nations H. victor Down the Aisle. She was also half-sister to Road Princess, who captured the GI Mother Goose S. and subsequently produced the multiple graded winner Reign Road, and to GIII Breeders' Futurity winner Provante. Precious Kitten's third dam One Lane is a half-sister to Stop On Red, who entered the history books as the granddam of Spectacular Bid, one of the truly great horses of the second half of the 20th century.

Precious Kitten follows Grade I winner Dessert and Grade III winner Phantom Wind (both by Storm Cat) as the third black-type winner by Storm Cat or one of his sons out of a mare by Lear Fan. Catienus might particularly appreciate Lear Fan's sire Roberto since Catienus is out of a mare by Mr. Prospector, and Mr. Prospector's dam Gold Digger is a close genetic relative to Roberto's dam, Bramalea.

L'Enjoleur, the sire of the second dam of Precious Kitten also brings in an interesting element. He is out of the great Canadian runner and producer Fanfreluche, who is by Northern Dancer out of a mare by Chop Chop. This means she is bred along similar lines to Catienus's grandsire Storm Bird, who is by Northern Dancer and who has a second dam by Chop Chop. The combination of Storm Bird and Fanfreluche is found in at least five other stakes winners, including Group/Grade I winners D'Wildcat and Aube Indienne and graded scorer Wandering. BULL MARKET (CONTINUED)

Though Keeneland finished with a rare (and somewhat miniscule) drop in average, combined with Fasig's one-day blockbuster which kicked the November Mixed Sales off, the 15 days of selling saw a \$56-million (17percent) increase in gross. It's a great credit to the Fasig organization that their one-day sale accounted for over half of the increase for the whole fortnight-plus, but it is worth noting that their share of the November market increased only from 10 percent to 17 percent; Keeneland still accounted for 83 percent of it. With 13 percent more horses sold and the 15-day average still edging up four percent, it tends to suggest fears about overproduction have been dispelled; 1,536 horses sold in Keeneland books 3, 4, and 5 jumped 28 percent in average, from \$39,986 to \$51,287, indicating very strong demand for middle-tier horses.

That trend continued in no uncertain terms at Goffs November Sale last week; with five percent more horses sold than last year, the sale showed overall gains of 24 percent in gross and 19 percent in average.

Some observers described the foal market as the strongest they had ever seen, and the figures certainly confirm it was a strong market: 10 percent more foals sold for 32 percent more money and gained 20 percent in average, from €24,945 last year, to €30,040. Mares and fillies were plenty strong, too: though four percent fewer sold than last year, the gross for them was up 13 percent, and the average up 17 percent. Tattersalls December Sale opened the very next day (that's Monday, Nov. 20; 'December,' you see, turns out to be a state of mind), and marched right on. Demi O'Byrne discovered Dalakhani, and for the day nine percent more horses grossed 28 percent more than last year, with the average up 17 percent. Dalakhani was already Europe's leading 'freshman' sire of yearlings (ahead of Oasis Dream, Dubai Destination, and High Chaparral), but Monday's action propelled his average to something in the neighborhood of \$348,465, ranking him second only to Empire Maker (about \$379,000), and ahead of both Vindication (about \$340,000) and Mineshaft (about \$292,000) among his sire group. When we went back and added in Goffs November, in addition to the German and Italian yearling sales we're including for the first time, we found that, at the 15 major sales we're now covering (11 yearling and four Mixed), last year 13,488 horses sold for \$1,242,582,900--nearly \$1.25 billion. This year, as you can see in the accompanying table, at the end of Goffs November, a total of 12,177 horses had sold for \$1,232,471,100--just \$10 million short of last year's total. That figure was surpassed on Monday, at Tattersalls' opening day, the December Yearling Sale. So, from the point of view of the major 15-sale gross, the rest of the December Sale is gravy. Last year the whole December Sale converted to about \$140 million. The entire 15-sale gross, which reached \$1 billion for only the second time in 2004, grew to nearly \$1.25 billion last year. If it misses \$1.4 billion by the end of next week, it won't be by much. Bull Market.

SIRE DEBUTANTS

At the Kentucky November sales, seven stallions had seven or more foals from their first crops of weanlings average over \$100,000, headed by Smarty Jones (eight sold, averaged \$275,625), Speightstown (12, averaged \$217,916), and Medaglia d'Oro (21, averaged \$187,476). Others who achieved a six-figure average included: Strong Hope, who had an impressive 14 sell, of 15 offered, averaging \$131,071; Perfect Soul (seven sold, averaged \$113,428); Tapit (12 sold, averaging \$109,833); and Lion Heart, who had 19 sell (of 39 offered), which averaged \$105,368. Eight first-year covering stallions averaged over \$100,000; runaway leader among these was Ghostzapper, who averaged \$712,500, though only four mares sold in-foal, of 10 offered. Saint Liam (21, averaged \$223,190), Afleet Alex (19, averaged \$181,578), and Rock Hard Ten (10, averaged \$179,000) came next. All three had stood for \$40,000-\$50,000, though, of course, Saint Liam unfortunately died in a paddock accident after the covering season.

Two very well-marketed horses with 44 and 45 mares offered in foal, respectively, came next in average: Roman Ruler (25 sold, averaging \$148,120) and Purge (38 sold, averaging \$126,184). This top eight was rounded off by Taylor Made's Forest Danger, who was very popular, with 26 in-foal mares averaging \$118,384. Equally popular was Claiborne's Eddington, with 12 in-foal mares averaging \$111,833.

There is the usual contingent of 'commercial' stallions with their first foals at the European sales, Goffs last week and Tattersalls this week. Fifteen sires have double-digit representation between the two sales, including Coolmore's One Cool Cat (45 catalogued), Darley's Refuse to Bend (31), and Shadwell's Haafhd (13). It looks like a particularly strong European group of covering sires with their first mares in foal, including Footstepsinthesand (15 catalogued in foal) and Oratorio (23) from Coolmore; Dubawi (15) and Shamardal (7) from Darley; and Azamour (21), Motivator (13), and Starcraft (19) from the Rest of the World.

Fleet Indian, who suffered an injury to her left front suspensory ligament during the Nov. 4 running of the Emirates Airline Breeders' Cup Distaff (gr. I) at Churchill Downs, had surgery Nov. 20 to fuse her left front fetlock. Owner Paul Saylor said the surgery was performed by Dr. Larry Bramlage at Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital near Lexington. "She's doing very well," Saylor said Nov. 21. Saylor said the decision to perform the surgery came after Dr. Bramlage X-rayed the 5-year-old daughter of Indian Charlie's knees and ankles in an effort to determine the best way to stabilize her left front leg support system. "We kept looking to see if she was standing up on her pastern or fetlock and not putting too much weight on her right foot," her owner said. "Dr. Bramlage felt like the best way to stabilize the left front leg support system was to fuse the left front fetlock, which basically means she has a plate that goes in the front and that gives the fetlock support so she can stand up a lot better than she could otherwise once the healing is done. 
