#### ROYAL PROCESSION AT TATTERSALLS

Recent G1 Sun Chariot S. heroine Spinning Queen (GB) (Spinning World) brought a sale-record bid of 3million guineas to spearhead a dramatic opening breeding stock day at the Tattersalls December Sale in Newmarket yesterday. Consigned by Faringdon Place



Stables, the three-year-old, who also scored in the G3 Brownstown S., was purchased by James Wigan of London Thoroughbred Services, acting on behalf of an undisclosed client. She will be boarded at the Rothschild family's

Spinning Queen Tattersalls Waddesdon Stud in

Buckinghamshire. Japan's Shadai Farm, London-based agent Jamie McCalmont and finally Sheikh Mohammed's representative John Ferguson provided Wigan's opposition. "She's for an existing client and is going to Waddesdon, where she'll be kept," said Wigan. "It's a great pedigree and she was very impressive when winning at Newmarket." Spinning Queen's price eclipsed the previous December record of 2.5 million guineas paid by Satish Sanan in 1997 for both Dance Design and Padua's Pride. Short Skirt (GB) (Diktat), winner if the G3 St. Simon S. Oct. 21, was another to make seven figures when Ferguson fought off Japanese agent Nobutaka Tada at 1.4 million guineas. Agents Luke Lillingston and John Warren were among the underbidders on the sophomore. "She's a top, top racemare from a fabulous family. [Owner/breeder] John Greetham has done fabulous things with this family, they are all tough sound and there are eight stakes or group winners under the first dam," said Ferguson, a one-time assistant to Stoute. "It's highly likely that she'll continue racing and highly likely that she'll run in [Godolphin's] blue colours before retiring to the paddocks, to hopefully, be a broodmare with a great future." **CLARIFICATION:** (From a New York Racing Association press release) Discreet Cat's winning time for Saturday's Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile was 1:32.46. On April 8, 1989, Easy Goer's 13-length Gotham victory was recorded as 1:32.40. That same year, the NYRA tracks at Aqueduct, Belmont Park and Saratoga became the first to time their races in hundredths of a second; however, it is not certain when the change to hundredths came into being. When translated to fifths of a second, Discreet Cat equaled Easy Goer's mile of 1:32 2/5 in Saturday's Cigar Mile. Easy Goer carried 123 pounds, Discreet Cat carried 124 pounds.

Stables. "Nothing has been set in stone, but looking at the Dubai races my sense is she probably won't run there and she's done plenty already," said Weisbord. "We recently brought another of our mares, Ipi Tombe (Zim), back to America and I think she'll head back home, as Tattersalls well. If she had the pedigree to go with her looks and race re-

cord, she would have made a lot more, but a lot of daughters of these top sprinters who didn't have much pedigree have done well at stud. I didn't see this as a quick-turn deal. In 15 years, I hope to be racing her foals and their progeny." Three-year-old Park Esteem (Ire) (Singspiel {Ire}), a three-parts sister to G1 Italian Derby winner Central Park (Ire) (In the Wings {GB}) offered from Jeremy Noseda's stable, was bought for 580,000 guineas by Australian agent Kieran Moore, acting for the Scone-based Cressfield Stud. Charlie Gordon-Watson was immediate underbidder on the filly. "We may give her a try on the track, but she's been principally bought as a broodmare." said Moore. "She'll go to Redoute's Choice (Aus). I thought she'd make far less, but she was our number one pick and the bar appears to have risen on the price of horses. She was an extremely good individual and was a really good outcross." The sale continues today at 9:30 a.m.

# PEDIGREE INSIGHTS BY ANDREW CAULFIELD

One aspect of American racing which Europeans find hard to understand is the lack of importance seemingly attached to the weights carried in handicaps. Even the *TDN* contributes to this conspiracy. On the day of the Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile H., the *TDN* informed us of the post positions, the runners, their sires, their trainers and their odds, but not the weight they were set to carry. For that information you had to refer to the previous day's issue, where you would discover that Discreet Cat had been set to carry top weight of 124 pounds.

Although the European table of weight for age suggested that Discreet Cat should have been receiving two pounds from his older rivals at this time of year, he was actually set to concede four pounds to Silver Train, winner of the 2005 Breeders' Cup Sprint and the 2006 GI Metropolitan H., and seven pounds to Badge of Silver, a recent third in the Breeders' Cup Mile. Sharp Humor, the only other three-year-old in the field, was set to receive nine pounds, even though he had run Barbaro to half-length in the GI Florida Derby. In other words, in winning the Cigar by more than three lengths, Discreet Cat confirmed that he possesses terrific potential. Indeed, the Racing Post's handicappers were so impressed by his display that his rating has been elevated from 123 to 131, which places him top of the dirt performers, two pounds above Barbaro, three pounds above Bernardini and four pounds above Invasor and Lava Man.

But what is the source of Discreet Cat's potential? Does he owe his talent to the fact that he comes from America's most fashionable sire line and comes from an illustrious female line which traces all the way back to Risque, winner of the Alabama S. in 1931?

Or is he so good because his pedigree features inbreeding to four outstanding racehorses and sires? This inbreeding is 4x5 to Northern Dancer, 4x5 to Buckpasser, 5x5 to Bold Ruler and 5x5 to Ribot. These stallions, respectively, achieved Average Earnings Indices of 5.10, 3.94, 7.73 and 4.09 and jointly sired a total of 331 stakes winners from a total of 1,727 foals-a magnificent 19 percent stakes winners.

While this multiple inbreeding to exceptional stallions may well have something to do with Discreet Cat's rare talent, there is another possible explanation which is simpler and more immediate. *Cont. p5*

Take a look at the six horses in the first two generations of his pedigree and you'll find that both his parents, Forestry and Pretty Discreet, were Grade I winners. Move on to the second generation and you come to Storm Cat, a Grade I winner who has sired 150 stakes winners; Shared Interest, a Grade I winner who is also the dam of Cash Run, one of the highest-priced broodmares ever sold; Private Account, a Grade I winner whose daughters have produced 13 Grade I winners; and Pretty Persuasive, a sister to the GI Kentucky Oaks-winning Buryyourbelief.

This concentration of excellence continues in the eight horses in the third generation, as they include five Grade I winners and the dazzling Terlingua, a triple Grade II scorer who was arguably unlucky not to have won at the highest level.

Yet another possible explanation for Discreet Cat's excellence is that he represents a cross which has already shown itself well capable of producing top runners. He is the fourth Grade I winner sired by sons of Storm Cat from granddaughters of Damascus, his predecessors being the exceptional Johannesburg (by Hennessy out of an Ogygian mare), Forest Secrets (by Forest Wildcat out of a Time for a Change mare) and My Trusty Cat (by Tale of the Cat out of a Private Account mare). Stormy Atlantic has a Grade II winner bred along these lines, as does Hennessy.

Storm Cat himself has a fine record with Damascus line mares, siring the Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Desert Stormer from a daughter of Damascus and four graded stakes winners from his first 20 foals out of Private Account mares, including Vision and Verse, runner-up in the GI Belmont S. and GI Travers S.

While it has to be doubtful whether Discreet Cat will stay quite as well as Vision and Verse, his connections must be confident of his developing into a major performer over 1 1/8 miles, and possibly 1½ miles. Although he has yet to tackle more than a mile in the U.S., he was very impressive in winning the G2 UAE Derby over 1 1/8 miles last March, when he covered the distance in 1:48.59 and had Invasor back in fourth.

Although Forestry struggled with the final 110 yards on the only occasion he ventured beyond 1 1/16 miles, he has sired a Grade II winner over 1½ miles in Woodlander, who was helped by having a Seattle Slew mare as his second dam.

Discreet Cat's dam Pretty Discreet, who also produced the very good juvenile Pretty Wild, gained her finest victory in the GI Alabama S. over 1¼ miles. She had every right to shine over that distance, as Private Account had gained both his Grade I successes over that trip. Also, Private Account had a sire (Damascus) and broodmare sire (Buckpasser) who ranked among the winners of the Jockey Club Gold Cup in the days when it was contested over two miles.


Discreet Cat's second dam, the short-lived Pretty Persuasive, was by Believe It, a Kentucky Derby third, and was a sister to Buryyourbelief, a winner of the GI Kentucky Oaks.

His fourth dam, Christmas Wishes, also had a distinguished sister, namely Cool Mood. This daughter of Northern Dancer was the second dam of the Canadian Triple Crown winners With Approval and Izvestia and of the GI Belmont S. winner Touch Gold. This is also the family of Healthy Addiction, another Grade I winner in 2006, so Discreet Cat has the requisite high-class bloodlines for the time he joins the Darley stallion team.

Hopefully, before then, he will have a lot more chances to show how good he is on the racetrack, and there is every chance there's still improvement in this exciting horse, who has a May 1 birthday.



"We are absolutely thrilled to be standing Badge of Silver," Jones said. "He fills our most important prerequisite for a stallion prospect, and that's brilliance." Prior to his runner-up

effort behind Discreet Cat at Aqueduct Saturday, Badge of Silver ran third in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. He also won the 2003 GIII Risen Star S., the 2005 GII New Orleans H. and 2006 GII San Gabriel H. On the board in 12 of 16 starts, Badge of Silver earned \$1,047,892 for Ken and Sarah Ramsey. Airdrie purchased breeding rights to the bay last month.

wood Derby, was withdrawn from the race after suffering a colic attack. "He got a little colicky [Sunday] morning," confirmed trainer Dan Hendricks. "I got a call at 4 a.m. from the night watchman. The vet, Dr. Blea, was there in a half hour to treat him." Plans for the GI Santa Anita Derby winner are up in the air. "We might nominate him to the [Dec. 10 GIII] Native Diver H., but I'm not sure he

would run there since we don't want to stress him so soon and we have another horse for that race. He will be pointed to the Strub series at Santa Anita."

COIN SILVER RETIRED Grade II winner Coin Silver (Anees--Beyond a Doubt, by Conquistador Cielo) has been retired from racing, according to *The Blood-Horse*. Stud plans have not been announced. Racing for John Fort's Peachtree Stable, Coin Silver won last year's GII Coolmore Lexington S. On the board in four of eight starts, he retires with two wins and earnings of \$233,430.

#### TRAINER LAKE LOSES APPEAL, BEGINS SERV-ING 30-DAY SUSPENSION

Courtesy of The Blood-Horse, by Linda Dougherty Trainer Scott Lake has begun serving a 30-day suspension after a Delaware Superior Court denied his appeal of the ruling handed down by Delaware Park Thoroughbred Racing Commission in June. The commission issued the ban after the Lake-trained Secret Run, who won the fifth race at Delaware on June 7, tested positive for clenbuterol. It was the second clenbuterol positive for Lake at the Delaware meeting. Lake began serving the suspension Nov. 16. Lake, currently the nation's leading conditioner by number of wins with 528 (through racing of Nov. 25), alleged that a disgruntled former employee administered the clenbuterol to Secret Run. At the court hearing on Nov. 20, Lake asked for a second continuance, stating he needed more time to find the employee and question him, but the court denied his request. Deputy Attorney General James J. Hanley, who represented the commission, said that Lake did not show any evidence that the former employee might have been involved. Lake also had clenbuterol positives in March at Philadelphia Park and Aqueduct, and one in July at Belmont Park. ... More
